LEADING OFF: Angels open a seven-game home stand vs. Texas (Sept. 10-12) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16)...Halos went 7-3 on the 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (2-1) & Chicago White Sox (3-0)...Sweep of White Sox marked seventh sweep of season...LAA has won four straight, five of last six, are 5-3 this month & 8-4 last 12 games...Club looks to get back to .500 for first time since August 19 (63-63)...Halos are 22-24 since the break...Angels have spent last 74 days in fourth place...18 remaining games are with divisional foes: Five with Texas (6 at home), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston...Angels are 20-20-7 thru 47 series.

ROAD WORK: Halo starters logged a 1.92 ERA (56.1 IP – 12 ER) on the 10-game trip, the second lowest mark in club history for a trip of at least 10 games...Lowest ERA in club annals was a 1.85 mark over 13 road affairs July 17-26, 1964 (STATS LLC).

BARRIA BACK AT IT: Rookie Jaime Barria is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (21 IP – 2 ER; 8 BB, 19 K) in four starts vs. Texas this season...In his last eight overall starts, Barria is 6-1 with 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER)...Allowed one earned run or less in five of last six starts...Leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 15 GS).

OHTANI NAMED A.L. PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Today, Angels' RHP/DH Shohei Ohtani was named American League Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 9 – his second such honor this season...In five games, the rookie batted .474 (9/19) with eight runs, a double, a triple, four home runs, 10 RBI and two stolen bases (1.828 OPS).

SUNDAY'S SUMMARY: Yesterday's 1-0 win at White Sox completed a three-game sweep and marked Angels' eighth shutout win of season (also second 1-0 win of 2018; June 5 vs. KC)...Andrew Heaney (7 IP, 3 H, 12 K) logged a career-high 12 strikeouts en route to his ninth win...In the process, he joined Frank Tanana as only left-handers team history to record 12+ Ks with zero walks in a game...A Mike Trout single in the first inning ran his streak to 10 consecutive plate appearances reaching base safely (struck out next AB)...Streak fell one shy Trout's career-best streak of 11 plate appearances set last season...Angels' record is 12 set by Bobby Grich in 1982...Shohei Ohtani extended his hit streak to seven games (.440; 11/25) with an eighth inning double.

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney has set new career highs in wins (9), starts (27), strikeouts (161) and innings pitched (165.0) this season...He is the first Halo to reach 160+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season.

FISH FACTS: On Saturday at CWS, Mike Trout went 5-for-5 with two HRs and five RBI – marked his 14th career multi-HR game, fourth this season (second in 2018 vs. CWS)...Also second career five-hit game (May 26, 2018 at NYY)...On Friday Trout tied the Angels' record reaching base 4+ times for the 16th time this season to equal the mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...This season, Trout joined Willie Mays as the only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Trout's 62.8 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

SHO OFF: In his last four games, Shohei Ohtani is 8-for-15 with seven runs scored, a double, a triple, three HRs and nine RBI...He is riding a season best seven-game hit streak (.440; 11/25, 10 R, 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 10 RBI) and has homered in three of five games and five of last 11 contests overall (6 HR total)...With his 19th HR Friday night, Ohtani passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani has 19 HRs in 85 non-pitching games...With next HR, he will be second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82nd game in 1986)...With his next home run, he will be the eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...Ohtani is lone MLB player this season with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base – ESPN STATS.

OHTANI MEDICAL UPDATE: On Sept. 5th, Ohtani underwent an MRI on his right elbow which revealed new damage to his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL). UCL reconstruction surgery is the recommended plan of care. Updates to come when appropriate.

PUJOLS SURGERY: Albert Pujols underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee (8/30). A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks...Pujols ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & ARod).

DID YOU KNOW? RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Ohtani).

2019 SCHEDULE: Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

HI, MY NAME IS... 59 players (35 pitchers-15 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

THE NEW ME: In 69 games in return from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .277 (70/253) with 52 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 HRs & 45 RBI (hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games)...Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18th rank tied for fourth in A.L.

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 209 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 910 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

GLOVE STORY: With 67 errors committed, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks tied for third in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 155 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 40.6 caught stealing pct. (28 of 69), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.68 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 21.8 % to score (50 of 229)...Bullpen has logged 540 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 199 games pitched lead A.L. (165.0 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 135 games pitched and Blake Parker ranks tied for third in the span (133 games pitched).

THIS N' THAT: With yesterday's 1-0 win, Angels are now 21-14 in one-run games...35 players on Angels' current active roster...Club is 19-26 when lefty starts (52-46 vs. RHS)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+42)...Halos' 186 HRs hit rank fifth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.76 (536 PA/34 K) – also ranks second in MLB batting .296 (50/169) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,641 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Trout leads the Majors with 111 walks...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS).

HOT HALOS: Ohtani is batting .368 (29/79) with four doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 22 runs scored and six stolen bases over his last 28 games (raised average from .267 to .291 in span)...Over his last five starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.81 ERA (32 IP – 10 ER)...Andrelton Simmons has 10 RBI his last 10 games (3 HR last 8 G)...Jose Fernandez has hit safely in 15 of 21 games with Angels this season (hits in 12 of 15 starts)...19 of last 22 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless...David Fletcher has hits 19 of last 23 games (10 multi-hit efforts) and is batting .337 (32/95) with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple and 11 RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 19 of last 21 outings (1.00 ERA; 18 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has successfully reached base in 24 of his last 25 games with 21 runs, eight home runs, 18 RBI and 27 walks in that span.

Vs. TEXAS: Halos lead 2018 season series 8-5 (3-1 at home)...Five games remain with Texas (all at home)...Angels are 29-19 in Arlington since 2014...David Fletcher is batting .414 (12/29) against Texas this season.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 10

(2008) Angels clinched their fourth division crown in five seasons and seventh overall...The Sept. 10 clinch date (Game #145) earliest any A.L. West team ever clinched the division; (1986, '88, '89) Angels were involved in three "marathon" games on this same date: the 7-6 win in 14 innings at Cleveland in 1986, a 3-2 loss in 17 innings at Texas in 1988, and a 2-1 win in 14 innings vs. Texas at Anaheim Stadium in 1989

September 11

(2001) MLB halted play for six days due the terrorist attacks that took place at the World Trade Center and the Pentagon; (2011) Bobby Abreu steals 2 bases, reaching 20 SBs for the 13th consecutive season...Longest such streak in the majors since Rickey Henderson had 23 straight from 1979-2001

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

10-8, 3.30 ERA

In four starts vs. Rangers this season, is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (21 IP – 2 ER)

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Is making 23rd start of the season for Angels and 12th at home...Fifth start of season vs. Rangers (second consecutive)...Recalled from Adv.-A Inland Empire on July 23 for sixth stint of season with Angels (did not pitch for 66ers during stint with the team).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Enters tonight's start with active streak of 11 consecutive scoreless innings pitched...Longest streak in career is 11.2 IP (Aug. 3-14).
- **GENERATION GAP:** When they faced off on June 1 at Angel Stadium, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history...They matched that record when they faced off again on Sept. 5 at Globe Life Park.
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE THE ROAD:** Is pitching to a 2.53 ERA (57 IP – 16 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 4.12 ERA (54.2 IP – 25 ER) at Angel Stadium...His road ERA ranks third in the American League (min. 50 IP) this season.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Wednesday at Texas after tossing five scoreless innings and allowing two hits and three walks with five strikeouts; fifth scoreless start of the season (second consecutive).
- **THREE-OR-FEWER:** Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in 13 of last 16 starts and in 18 of 22 starts on the season.
- **WALKS UP:** Has walked 24 batters across last 14 starts after walking nine in previous eight starts to begin the year.
- **HOT AND COLD:** In last eight starts, is 5-1 with a 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER)...During seven game period from June 12 – July 23, was 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) but allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of the seven games...In his first seven starts, Angels were 5-2 and he went 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP – 10 ER).
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Ranks second among Major League rookies in wins and is sixth in innings pitched...Is third (min. 75 IP) among A.L. rookies in ERA and fourth in batting average against (.247)...Is the first Angels pitcher to record 10+ wins in his first Major League season since **Jose Arredondo** (10 wins in 2008); last Angels pitcher with 11 wins in first season was **Jered Weaver** in 2006.
- **VS. TEXAS:** In four starts vs. Rangers this year, is 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (21 IP – 2 ER) and 19 strikeouts...Has pitched at least five innings and allowed one-or-fewer runs in all four contests; last player to go five straight games vs. Rangers with 5+ IP and one-or-fewer earned runs allowed was **Justin Verlander** for Detroit from June 6, 2007-May 20, 2009.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 11 starts at Angel Stadium, is 4-5 with a 4.12 ERA (54.2 IP – 25 ER)...Has won two of last three home starts after Angels lost his previous four...Pitched career-high seven innings on May 15 vs. Houston...Carried no-hitter through 5.1 frames of start on May 3 vs. Orioles.
- **STREAKING:** Won four straight decisions between May 3 – June 1, which is longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 85 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization & was top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** was ranked #1)...Also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as international free agent, April 11, 2013.
