DOG DAYS OF WINTER: The Colorado Rockies will play as the visiting team at Salt River Fields today against the Arizona Diamondbacks ... right-hander Chad Bettis will make his third start of Spring Training, and he will be opposed by right-hander Kris Medlen.

COULDN'T DODGE IT: The Rockies lost 13-7 yesterday to the visiting Los Angeles Dodgers ... Rockies starter German Márquez pitched 2.2 innings and allowed eight runs on nine hits with two walks and two strikeouts ... catcher Chris Iannetta hit his third home run of Spring, and left-hander Sam Howard pitched three scoreless innings of relief with two hits allowed and four strikeouts.

SEAFARING: The Rockies will host the Seattle Mariners tomorrow afternoon at Salt River Fields ... left-hander Kyle Freeland will make his fourth start of the Spring ... he will be opposed by right-hander Rob Whalen ... the game will be broadcast on AT&T SportsNet at 2:10 p.m. MDT.

NIGHT DRIVING: Colorado will play their second night game of Spring tomorrow, as they travel to Glendale to face the Dodgers at 7:05 p.m. ... Jon Gray will start for the Rockies, opposed by right-hander Ross Stripling ... the game will be broadcast on KOA NewsRadio 850 AM / 94.1 FM.

BULLETIN BOARD: The Colorado Rockies announced Saturday that they have optioned right-handed pitcher Zach Jemiola to Triple-A Albuquerque, and have optioned right-hander Jesus Tinoco, catcher Chris Rabago and outfielder Yonathan Daza to Double-A Hartford ... additionally, right-hander Peter Lambert, catcher Dom Nuñez and outfielder Sam Hilliard have been reassigned to Minor League camp ... the Rockies have 50 players remaining in Major League camp, including 14 non-roster players.

CARRY A BIG STICK: Through 17 games so far this Spring, the Rockies are batting .285 (173-for-606) the fourth-highest batting average in MLB ... the Rockies 21 stolen bases are the most in the Cactus League ... Ryan McMahon leads all of Spring Training with 15 hits, including five doubles and one home run ... Trevor Story is batting .450 (9-for-20) with five doubles, two triples, one home run, four walks and six strikeouts ... DJ LeMahieu is batting .417 (10-for-24) with two doubles ... David Dahl and Chris Iannetta lead the team with three home runs apiece.

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTY: Both Jairo Díaz (4.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 5 SO) and Adam Ottavino (4.0 IP, 2 H, 3 BB, 3 SO) have yet to allow a run this Spring.

TRAINING ROOM: Outfielder Gerardo Parra, who underwent surgery prior to camp to remove the broken hook of the hamate bone in his right hand, made his Cactus League debut yesterday in a start in left field ... he went 0-for-1 with one walk and one run ... infielder Shawn O'Malley fractured a metacarpal in his left hand on March 2 while making a diving play at second base ... infielder Pat Valaika and right-hander Carlos Estévez each have a left oblique strain ... Estévez is scheduled to throw a bullpen today ... right-hander Jeff Hoffman has been down with right shoulder soreness.

TV ON THE RADIO: The next television broadcast on AT&T SportsNet will be tomorrow at home vs. Seattle ... today's game will not be broadcast on either radio or television.

BACKFIELDS: Minor League games will begin on March 15, with Triple-A and Double-A players traveling to Oakland ... the Triple-A and Double-A squads will host Oakland on the Salt River Fields backfields on March 16.

IS IT OPENING DAY YET?: The Rockies will open the regular season March 29 with the first game of a three-game series at Arizona with first pitch set for 7:10 p.m. MT ... the Rockies will play their home opener on Friday, April 6 against the Atlanta Braves to begin a three-game series ... tickets to the home opener are available by purchasing a mini-plan or season ticket package ... for ticket information, call (303) 762-5437 or visit www.rockies.com/tickets.

Chad Bettis, RHP - #35: Made nine starts with the Rockies in 2017 after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis and subsequent surgery ... recipient of the 2017 Tony Conigliaro Award ... made his first rehab appearance with Hartford on July 13 ... returned to the Rockies rotation on Aug. 14 vs. Atlanta and pitched seven shutout innings in a 3-0 Rockies win ... set career-highs in wins, starts, innings and strikeouts in 2016 ... selected by Colorado in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.
