METSCELLANEOUS: New York snapped its four-game losing streak with last night's win...The Mets are 4-6 in their last 10 games...The Mets are 20-24 vs. the NL East...New York is 20-42 in its last 62 games...The Mets are 13-21 in day games.

AT HOME: New York is 8-9 in its last 17 home games and 10-24 in their last 34 home games...Overall, the Mets are 22-35 at home this year, the second-worst winning percentage (.386) in the National League, behind San Diego (.357).

ATLANTA: The Mets are 4-11 vs. Atlanta with four games remaining...The last time the Mets lost 11 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2012 (6-12)...The Mets snapped their five-game losing streak at home to Atlanta last night.

SHUTOUTS: New York posted its seventh shut out of the year last night...Five of those shutouts have come at Citi Field.

JEFF McNEIL: Went 4-4 last night...He became the seventh Met to register a four-hit game within the first 10 games of his career...The last to do so was T.J. Rivera on August 16, 2016 at Arizona.

MORE McNEIL: He is batting .320 (8-25) with a .452 on-base percentage and a .480 slugging percentage in his first 10 major league games...McNeil split most of the year between Binghamton (AA) of the Eastern League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...At the time of his promotion, his 1.028 OPS was the fifth-highest among all full-season minor league players while his .617 slugging percentage was third-best among full-season minor leaguers...His 71 RBI were the 15th-most in the minors.

GOOD EYE: New York is 10th in the majors with 380 walks and is eighth in the majors with a 9.3 % walk rate.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo is 14th in the NL with a .372 on-base percentage and tied for seventh in the majors with six triples...Nimmo has a career-high 14 homers, but just two in his last 38 games.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 15-for-49 (.306) with three homers, four doubles and nine RBI, a .375 OBP and a .571 slugging percentage in 14 games since the All-Star break...Conforto is hitting .295 (18-61) with four home runs, four doubles, 12 RBI, 13 runs scored and a .389 OBP over his last 18 games (July 12)...Conforto has a 14.4 percent walk-rate, the 11th-best in the majors.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

AUSTIN JACKSON: Has gone 7-20 (.350) since joining the Mets with a .409 OBP and a .500 slugging percentage (seven games).

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets snapped their five-game home losing streak to the Braves last night.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



COREY OSWALT: Has pitched 5.0 innings and allowed three or fewer hits in each of his last three starts...He is the first rookie in team history to do...The last Mets pitcher to do so was Noah Syndergaard from August 21-September 2, 2016...Oswalt earned his first major league win in his last outing, July 25 vs. San Diego...He worked 5.0 innings and allowed two runs in that contest...Oswalt has a 0.85 WHIP since July 4, which is eighth-best in the majors (min. 20.0 innings)...His .162 opponent batting average in that span is the sixth-best in the majors and his .519 OPS against ranks eighth.

VS. TEHERAN: Julios Teheran is 9-6 with a 2.33 ERA in 23 career games, 22 starts vs. the Mets...He is 6-2 with a 2.14 ERA in 11 career starts at Citi Field.

ROBERT GSELLMAN: Notched his sixth save last night...He entered the year with one professional save during his career (2011 in the Gulf Coast League...Four of the six saves are 1.1 innings or more, including last night, which ranks ninth in the majors...Gsellman is tied for fourth among all major league relievers with six wins and is sixth with 61.1 innings as a relief pitcher.

PEN NOTES: New York's bullpen hasn't allowed an earned run in its last 8.0 innings...The Mets have eight saves of more than 1.0 inning, which is tied for the sixth-most in the majors this year.

BOBBY WAHL: Has tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in two appearances with the Mets...Wahl was acquired from Oakland on July 21 as part of the Jeury's Familia trade...He had 73 strikeouts in 45.0 minor league innings and 292 strikeouts in 221.2 career minor league innings.

AMED ROSARIO: Is tied for third in the NL with three stolen bases since the All-Star break...Rosario has been successful in eight of his last 10 stolen base attempts. Overall, is tied for seventh in the majors with six triples.

IN THE MINORS: RHP Justin Dunn, the Mets 2016 first-round pick, went 6.0 innings last night for Binghamton (AA) vs. Harrisburg and allowed one run on three hits and struck out nine...Dunn is 7-7 with a 2.93 ERA (35 earned runs/107.1 innings) and 120 strikeouts in 19 combined starts between Binghamton and St. Lucie (A) this year.

LAST TIME OUT: Oswalt pitched 5.0 innings and allowed a season-high-tying seven runs, earned, on a season-high nine hits vs. Memphis while pitching for Triple-A Las Vegas...Allowed a season-high-tying two home runs and was left with a no-decision in the 51s' 10-8 win.

LAST MLB START: Oswalt earned the first win of his Major League career on July 25 at home against the San Diego Padres...The righty pitched 5.0 innings, giving up two runs, earned, on three hits with two walks and four strikeouts...Was his third-straight start allowing three or fewer hits in at least 5.0 innings (last done in a Mets uniform by Noah Syndergaard, August 21-September 2, 2016).

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has posted a 3.60 ERA (eight earned runs/20.0 innings) in his last four outings after owning a 9.82 ERA (eight earned runs/7.1 innings) through his first two appearances...His 0.85 WHIP since July 4 is eighth-best in the majors (min. 20.0 innings)...His .162 opponent batting average in that span is the sixth-best in the majors and his .519 OPS against ranks eighth.

IN THE MAJORS: Oswalt will be making his seventh-career major league appearance (sixth start)...Will be his fourth appearance at Citi Field...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his MLB debut in team history...Is one of two Mets hurlers in franchise history to record four or more strikeouts in a relief outing for his major league debut (also, Buzz Capra in game one of a doubleheader on September 15, 1971).

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has appeared in six games (five starts) over six stints with the Mets...Has made 11 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 6.02 ERA (35 earned runs/52.1 innings)...Has 52 strikeouts and 20 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso...Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Has four quality starts in 11 outings at Triple-A.

SPRING RECAP: Posted a 2.84 ERA (two earned runs/6.1 innings) this spring in four Grapefruit League games, striking out five and walking none...Did not allow a run in three of his four Grapefruit League outings, all of which came in relief.

IN THE MINORS: In 97 games (91 starts) in the Mets minor league system, Oswalt is 41-22 with a 3.64 ERA (202 earned runs/500.0 innings)...Went 12-5 with a 2.28 ERA (34 earned runs/134.1 innings) in 24 starts with Double-A Binghamton in 2017 en route to being named a Mid-Season and Post-Season Eastern League All-Star as well as the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year.

OSWALT'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Graduated from Madison (CA) High School in 2012...Was committed to UC Santa Barbara as a position player (third base/shortstop).
- » Selected by the New York Mets as a pitcher in the seventh round of 2012 First-Year Player Draft.
- » In 2014, his first season at the A-level, was named to the Mid-Season New York-Penn League All-Star Team representing the Brooklyn Cyclones.
- » In 2016, he pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League, going 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 earned runs/27.0 innings) in seven starts for the Scorpions.
- » Was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after going 12-5 with a league-leading 2.28 ERA with Binghamton...His 2.28 ERA led all Double-A pitchers.
- » Was tabbed as the Mets' Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year for his 2017 campaign at Binghamton.
- » In 2017, finished second in the Eastern League in victories (12), third in WHIP (1.18) and fifth in opponents average against (.236) and fifth in wins against (.236).
- » Also in 2017 was named to the Eastern League's mid-season and post-season All-Star teams.
- » Made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings out of the bullpen with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his major league debut.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP NOAH SYNDERGAARD (6-2, 2.98 ERA)

LAST START: Was defeated by Washington on August 1 at Nationals Park...Pitched 7.0 innings, giving up three runs, earned, on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts...Was his first start since being placed in the 10-day Disabled List on July 23 with hand, foot and mouth disease...Has allowed three runs or fewer in 13-straight starts.

CONTACT: Syndergaard's 22.6 hard contact percentage is the lowest in the majors by more than two percentage points (min. 80.0 innings pitched)...His 26.4 soft contact percentage is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors only behind Boston's Chris Sale (28.8 percent).

- His 10 walk-off RBI are most in the majors since 2014...According to Elias, Flores' franchise-leading 10 walk-off RBI are second-most among active players who lead their franchise in walk-off RBI and still play for that team...Ryan Zimmerman holds the Nationals/Expos record with 16 walk-off RBI.
- Dating to the beginning of last season, 19 of Flores' 27 home runs have come off righthanders.

- Scored multiple runs yesterday for the first time since July 1 (three runs)...The Mets are 6-1 this season when Frazier scores at least two runs in a game.
- Activated from the DL (left rib cage muscle strain) on August 2...Appeared in two minor league rehab games for St. Lucie and went 1-4 with one double and two RBI...Played his last two rehab games for Brooklyn (A) on July 31-August 1 and went 2-8 with a solo home run.
- 13 of his 32 RBI this season (41 percent) have given the Mets a lead (most of any active player on the team).
- Hit his 10th home run of the season with his go-ahead, two-run homer off Marcus Stroman on July 4 at Toronto...Has at least 10 home runs in each of his last seven seasons dating to 2012.
