## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 7-5 vs. Rockies this season, including 4-2 @ Coors Field.
- ♦ Arizona is 12-5 in its last 17 games at Coors Field, including 9 straight wins from June 21, 2017-July 10, 2018.
- ♦ 16 of the D-backs' last 20 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 10 times; 2 runs - 4 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ The D-backs' 3.56 ERA ranks third in the Majors behind the Astros (3.10) and Dodgers (3.43).
- ♦ **Zack Godley** is 4-0 with a 3.15 ERA (12 ER in 34.1 IP) in 7 career appearances (5 starts) vs. Rockies...has allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in 5 career appearances (3 starts) @ Coors Field.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base safely in a club-record 45 straight road games, since May 27, hitting .397 (69-for-174) with 14 doubles, 1 triple, 15 homers, 37 RBI and 28 walks.
- ♦ Against German Marquez, **David Peralta** has gone 10-for-23 (.435) with 3 doubles, 1 home run and 5 RBI, **Goldschmidt** is 9-for-20 (.450) with 2 doubles, 4 home runs and 7 RBI and **A.J. Pollock** is 8-for-13 (.615) with 1 double and 1 triple.

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost 9-5 vs. Braves.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** opened with 5.1 hitless frames, then allowed 2 runs in 6.0 innings...has a 1.59 ERA (4 ER in 22.2 IP) in his last 4 starts.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** reached base 3 times with a 2-run single and 2 walks...**Jon Jay** went 2-for-4 with 1 RBI.

## HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO A PAIR OF D-BACKS LEGENDS

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** (31) and **Randy Johnson** (55) are celebrating birthdays today...Johnson (50.8) and Goldschmidt (40.2) are the D-backs' top 2 all-time leaders in Wins Above Replacement (WAR) according to Baseball-Reference.com

## ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH? THAT JOHN DENVER WAS FULL OF IT

- ♦ In 109 all-time, regular-season meetings between the D-backs and Rockies in September or later, Arizona is 63-46 (.578), including 15-4 (.789) in 19 meetings since 2015.

## DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 19 games remaining (9 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .541 winning pct. is higher than the Rockies (.516) and Dodgers (.487) [source: ESPN.com].
  - 13 games vs. NL West foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
  - 7 games vs. first place teams from other divisions: 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).
- ♦ Entering last Thursday's game, the D-backs next 17 games were against teams currently in first place: ATL, COL, HOU, CHC and COL...per Elias Sports Bureau, if each team leads their respective divisions at the time of those games, the 17-game streak vs. first-place teams would be a Major League record...the current record is 14 by the 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers.

## LIFE ON THE ROAD

- ♦ The D-backs' .549 road winning pct. (39-32) is fifth in the NL behind the Braves (.583, 42-30), Dodgers (.574, 39-29), Cardinals (.560, 42-33) and Rockies (.556, 40-32).
- ♦ Among NL teams on the road, D-backs pitchers have allowed the fewest runs (257), have the second-lowest ERA (3.50), rank third in strikeouts (625) and fourth in opponent average (.233).

## THE ROAD IS PAVED WITH GOLD(SCHMIDT)

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base safely in a club-record 45 straight road games, since May 27, hitting .397 (69-for-174) with 14 doubles, 1 triple, 15 homers, 37 RBI and 28 walks.
- ♦ The 45-game streak is tied with Edwin Encarnación/TOR (June 12-Oct. 3, 2015) and Bryce Harper/WSH (April 14-July 30, 2015) for the ninth longest in the Majors since 1998...Alex Bregman/HOU has an active streak of 48 consecutive games.
- ♦ He has reached base safely in 50 consecutive road games while playing first base, tied for the second-longest streak in NL history and tied for fifth longest in Major League history:

## LUCKY NO. 13 IS DOING STUFF

- ♦ **Nick Ahmed's** 19 defensive runs saved are the most by a NL shortstop and are second in the Majors, trailing only Andrelton Simmons/LAA (20), ahead of Francisco Lindor/CLE (14), Addison Russell/CHC (13) and Paul DeJong/STL (12).
- ♦ Ahmed's 2.6 defensive WAR is third in the Majors behind Matt Chapman/OAK (3.3) and Simmons/LAA (2.9) [source: baseball-reference.com].
- ♦ Offensively, his 16 homers and 64 RBI are third most by a D-backs shortstop...needs 1 RBI to tie Stephen Drew (65 in 2009) for second place [stats as SS only].

## THAT ALTITUDE ATTITUDE

- ♦ **Zack Godley** is 4-0 with a 3.15 ERA (12 ER in 34.1 IP) in 7 career appearances (5 starts) vs. Rockies.
- ♦ Has allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in 5 career appearances (3 starts) @ Coors Field.

## GOLDSCHMIDT HITTING .300

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** reached .300 for the first time this season on Friday, after being at .198 on May 22...in 93 games since May 23, is batting .346 (125-for-361)/.442 OBP/.657 SLG/1.099 OPS with 22 doubles, 2 triples, 28 homers, 69 RBI and 59 walks.
- ♦ Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau, Goldschmidt is the first player in the liveball era (since 1920) to increase their batting average to .300 or higher in a season in which it was under .200 at some point after at least 200 plate appearances.

## WALKING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** drew his 651st and 652nd career walks yesterday vs. Braves, a franchise record...the previous record was held by Luis Gonzalez (650).
- ♦ Goldschmidt is also the franchise leader (min. 1000 PA) in average (.299), on-base pct. (.400) and slugging pct. (.535).

## PITCHING IN

- ♦ The D-backs' 3.56 ERA ranks third in the Majors behind the Astros (3.10) and Dodgers (3.43) and ahead of the Red Sox (3.66), Rays (3.67) and Cardinals (3.69)...their .234 opponent average is tied for fifth in the Majors with the Yankees behind the Astros (.216), Rays (.229), Braves (.232) and Dodgers (.232).
- ♦ Their ERA and opp. average are the club's lowest in a season.

- ♦ **Double-A Jackson:** Defeated Montgomery, 11-7, yesterday in the deciding Game 5 of the Southern League playoffs, and have advanced to the SL Finals to take on Biloxi...Game 1 is tomorrow in Jackson @ 4:05 AZT.
- ♦ **Single-A Adv. Visalia:** Blanked Stockton, 3-0, yesterday to advance to the California League Championship Series vs. Rancho Cucamonga...Game 1 is tomorrow in Visalia @ 7:05.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GREINKE (13-9, 3.08)

- ♦ Is 11-5 with a 3.75 ERA (70 ER in 168.0 IP) in 28 career games (27 starts) vs. Rockies, including 2-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5 ER in 19.1 IP) this season.
- ♦ Owns a lifetime 4-1 record with a 4.20 ERA (30 ER in 64.1 IP) in 11 games (10 starts) @ Coors Field.
- ♦ Is 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA (23 ER in 69.1 IP) and .210 opponent average in 11 starts vs. NL West opponents this season, allowing 3 earned runs or fewer 10 times and 2 or fewer 7 times.

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Acquired from the Cubs on Dec. 9, 2014, with RHP Jeferson Mejia, for C Miguel Montero.
- ◆ Cubs 10th-round pick in the 2013 draft.

**THINGS TO KNOW...**

- ◆ His career-high 14 wins this season are tied for fourth most in the NL (also: Jhoulys Chacin, Kyle Freeland and Miles Mikolas), trailing Max Scherzer (17), Aaron Nola (15) and Jon Lester (15).
- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (6 ER in 25.1 IP) in his last 4 starts immediately following a losing decision... overall is 5-1 in 6 starts after taking a loss
- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.
- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 3.15 ERA (12 ER in 34.1 IP) in 7 career appearances (5 starts) vs. Rockies.

- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (6 ER in 25.1 IP) in his last 4 starts immediately following a losing decision... overall is 5-1 in 6 starts after taking a loss.

**GETTING SOME HELP**

- ◆ Is averaging 5.13 runs of support in his starts this season (91 runs), the 10th-highest average in the NL behind Jon Lester (6.44), German Marquez (5.97), Sean Newcomb (5.79), Miles Mikolas (5.75), Jon Gray (5.66), Max Scherzer (5.51), Kyle Hendricks (5.30), Mike Foltynewicz (5.27) and Jhoulys Chacin (5.14).

- ◆ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ◆ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ◆ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidentally sunk 2 boats.
- ◆ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ◆ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ◆ Married to Autumn.

**18+ OUTS**

- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.
- ◆ Is 23-6 with a 2.43 ERA (65 ER in 241.0 IP) in 37 career starts of 6.0+ innings (Arizona is 28-9).

**GOOD 'OLE UNCLE CHARLIE**

- ◆ Leads all Major League starters by throwing a curveball 40.8 pct. of the time, ahead of Jose Berrios/MIN (30.3 pct.).
- ◆ His 40.94 percent swing-and-miss rate on his curveball, the fourth-best mark among all starters [min. 500 pitches] behind Charlie Morton/HOU (46.27), Andrew Heaney/LAA (43.49) and German Marquez/COL (42.45).

- ◆ Leads all starters [min. 200 pitches] with 119 strikeouts on his curveball, ahead of Morton (111).

**COOL UNDER PRESSURE**

- ◆ Owns a .211 opponents average against (12-for-57) with runners in scoring position in his last 12 outings.

**RIGHT ON**

- ◆ Is holding righties to a .226 average (45-for-199) in his last 19 games (18 starts).

**GODLEY'S PLAN**

- ◆ Is 13-4 when issuing 3 or fewer walks (20 starts), posting a 3.40 ERA (46 ER in 121.2 IP).
- ◆ Has limited batters to a .206 AVG (46-for-223) the first time through the lineup.
