RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped their fourth straight game as they lost to the Brewers, 6-5, on Saturday night at Miller Park. Niko Goodrum drove in three runs and went 2x3 with a triple, while Nicholas Castellanos also had two hits, including a solo home run. Pete Kozma contributed a hit and a RBI in the game. Daniel Stumpf took the loss in relief, giving up a run in two thirds of an inning. The Tigers conclude the 2018 season this afternoon as they play the series finale at Milwaukee.

NICK THE STICK: Nicholas Castellanos went 2x5 with a solo home run, his 23rd of the season, in last night's game. Castellanos' two hits marked his 56th multi-hit game of the season, which is the third-most in the American League. Through 26 games in September, Castellanos is hitting .354/.414/.594 with 15 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, four home runs and 16 RBI. He ranks tied for second in the AL in doubles this month, while he is third with 34 hits, sixth in batting average and 10th in on-base percentage.

GOODY TWO HITS: Niko Goodrum had a pair of hits, including a triple, and drove in three runs in last night's game to extend his hitting streak to seven games. During his current streak, Goodrum is batting .345/.367/.448 with three runs scored, one double, one triple and eight RBI. Goodrum's triple last night was his 48th extra-base hit of the season, which is tied for the ninth-most by a rookie in franchise history and the most since Austin Jackson also had 48 in 2010.

FARMER'S ALMANAC: Buck Farmer tossed a scoreless eighth inning in last night's game. Farmer has not allowed a run in nine consecutive appearances, throwing 10.1 shutout innings and limiting the opposition to a .189 (7x37) batting average.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 52nd one-run game of the season last night, falling to 22-30 with a 6-5 loss. The 52 one-run games are the most the Tigers have played in a season since 1988 when they also played 52. Detroit's 52 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 59 and Seattle, 57). In addition to the 52 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 31 games that have been decided by two runs.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Today's game marks the 43rd time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 19-23 (.452) against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .262/.322/.405 as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank second in the American League with a .262 batting average vs. lefties. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .386 (55x145) batting average vs. lefties, while he is seventh with a .438 on-base percentage.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 71st day game of the season (out of 162 games, 43.8%). Detroit has posted a 30-40 (.429) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 34-57 (.374) at night.

VMART CONCLUDES IMPRESSIVE CAREER: Victor Martinez wrapped up an impressive 16-year Major League career on September 22 vs. Kansas City, starting at first base and going 1x1 with an infield single. In 1,973 games in his big league career, Martinez hit .295/.360/.455 with 914 runs scored, 423 doubles, three triples, 246 home runs and 1,178 RBI. Among all switch-hitters in MLB history, Martinez ranks 15th in RBI, tied for 16th in home runs, 18th in doubles and 23rd in hits (2,153). Martinez will finish his career as the Tigers all-time leader in RBI among switch-hitters, with 540. He is a five-time All-Star selection, a two-time Silver Slugger Award winner and the 2014 Edgar Martinez Award winner.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 1-4 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Minnesota (1-2) and three games at Milwaukee (0-2). Detroit is 26-54 (.325) on the road this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .235/.294/.370 on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.09 ERA (677.1IP/383ER).

TIGERS AND BREWERS: The Brewers have a 2-0 lead in the season series after winning the first two games of

this weekend's series. Detroit has a 222-201 advantage in the all-time series vs. the Brewers. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Brewers won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. This weekend marks the Tigers second regular season series at Miller Park with the other coming in 2006, when Detroit won two-of-three games.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 6-13 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 212-190 (.527) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 141-104 (.576) in IL play, which ranks third among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (166-80, .675) and New York (AL) (144-102, .585).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 64-97 (.398) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,132-1,136 (.499) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 52nd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT SPENCER: Turnbull will make his fourth appearance overall and third start of his Major League career this afternoon in the 2018 finale at Milwaukee.

LAST TIME OUT: Turnbull recorded the first quality start of his Major League career on Tuesday at Minnesota, allowing one run on six hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings. With the outing, Turnbull became the first Detroit pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more innings and allow one run-or-less in one of his first two Major League starts since Kyle Ryan tossed 6.0 shutout innings in his Major League debut on August 30, 2014 at Chicago (AL).

VS. MILWAUKEE: Turnbull is making his first career appearance against the Brewers this afternoon.

ON THE ROAD: Turnbull has made two appearances, including one start, on the road this season, compiling a 0-0 record with a 1.29 ERA (7.0IP/1ER) and six strikeouts.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Turnbull made his Major League debut on September 14 at Cleveland, throwing a perfect inning in relief with one strikeout. Turnbull struck out Yan Gomes for his first Major League strikeout.

AT ERIE/TOLEDO: Turnbull spent most of the season with Double A Erie, starting 19 games and posting a 4-7 record with a 4.47 ERA (98.2IP/49ER) and 105 strikeouts. He also started two games for Triple A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA (13.1IP/3ER) and 19 strikeouts. For the Minor League season, Turnbull struck out 133 batters, which were the third-most in Detroit's player development system.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: In 21 starts between Double A Erie and Triple A Toledo this season, Turnbull limited lefties to a .222 (45x198) batting average, while righthanded batters hit .252 (55x218).

EASTERN LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Turnbull twice earned Eastern League Player of the Week honors during the season. His first award came for the week ending May 13 when he had a 2-0 record and threw 11.0 scoreless innings with 12 strikeouts. The other honor came for the week ending June 10 when he threw 12.2 innings, striking out 14 and giving up three runs.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Turnbull threw a shutout for Double A Erie on June 10 vs. Reading, allowing just four hits and striking out a season-high 11 batters. The shutout was the first of his career, while it was his second complete game (other, May 31, 2015 at Fort Wayne as a member of Single A West Michigan).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Turnbull was selected by the Tigers in the second round of the June 2014 draft out of the University of Alabama.
