HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 7-3 in their last 10 games since July 22.
- ♦ Arizona is 9-5 in its last 14 home games vs. San Francisco.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA (9 ER in 53.0 IP), .212 opponents average, 53 strikeouts and 7 walks in his last 8 starts since June 18.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is 1 home run shy of 200 for his career...is hitting .419 (18-for-43) with 7 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI vs. Giants this season.

TUESDAY NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs recorded their sixth shutout of the season, beating the Rangers 6-0.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** equaled his career-high with 10 strikeouts and allowed 2 hits in 7.0 shutout innings.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** went 1-for-4 with a home run (15)...**Paul Goldschmidt** was 1-for-3 with a double and a RBI...**Jon Jay** went 2-for-5 with a RBI.

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

- ♦ RHP **Brad Ziegler** reported to the D-backs following his acquisition from the Marlins on Tuesday...to make room on the 25-man roster, Arizona optioned RHP **Silvino Bracho** to Triple-A Reno following Tuesday night's game.

ZACK TAKES HOME THE HARDWARE

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** was named NL Pitcher of the Month for July after he went 4-0 with a 1.60 ERA (6 ER in 33.2 IP), .208 opponent average, 35 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts...he led all NL pitchers last month in ERA, ranked second in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.00; Jacob deGrom, 7.50), tied for second in wins, tied for fourth in strikeouts and sixth in opponent average.
- ♦ It is his third career monthly award (also: Aug. 2013, April 2009).

WELCOME BACK, BRAD!

- ♦ **Brad Ziegler**, who played for the D-backs from 2011-16 and was named to the D-backs' 20th Anniversary Team, owns numerous club career records, including the most wins (21), innings pitched (335.2) and appearances (348) by a reliever, and is second in ERA (2.49), sixth in opponent on-base pct. (.294) and tied for 11th in opponent average (.230) [min. 75.0 IP].

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt's** 21 hits are the most off Bumgarner all-time, and **A.J. Pollock** is tied for third with 15 (also: Kiké Hernández and Chris Denorfia).

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Is a 5-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17-18), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH

- ◆ Named NL Pitcher of the Month for July after going 4-0 with a 1.60 ERA (6 ER in 33.2 IP), .208 opponent average, 35 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts.
- ◆ He led all NL pitchers last month in ERA, ranked second in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.00; Jacob deGrom, 7.50), tied for fourth in strikeouts and ranked sixth in opponent average.
- ◆ It marks his third award (April 2009, Aug. 2013).

- ◆ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 7 consecutive starts, tied for the fourth-longest streak in club history...Dan Haren is third with 8 (June 12-July 25, 2008).

- ◆ Earned his seventh straight win on July 27 @ Padres, allowing 1 run on 6 hits with no walks and 6 strikeouts.

VS. GIANTS

- ◆ Is 12-2 with a 2.31 ERA (30 ER in 117.0 IP) in 18 career starts...won his only start in 2018 on April 19 @ Chase Field (1 ER in 7.0 IP).
- ◆ Has gone 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (3 ER in 21.2 IP) in his last 3 starts.
- ◆ In 5 starts @ Chase Field, is 2-2 with a 3.52 ERA (12 ER in 30.2 IP)...has gone 2-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 ER in 18.2 IP) in his last 3 starts @ Chase Field.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year at Apopka (Fla.) High School...played shortstop...transitioned to pitcher as a senior.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University.
