**ROSTER MOVES**—The Rays have recalled RH **Jake Faria** from Triple-A Durham and reinstated C **Adam Moore** from the restricted list...INF **Daniel Robertson** was transferred from the 10-day DL to the 60-day DL.

**WHAT ZILLA DID**—Today Major League Baseball announced **Blake Snell** as the American League Pitcher of the Month for August...he became the fifth Rays pitcher to receive the monthly honor, joining **Chris Archer** in July 2013, **Jeremy Hellickson** in May 2011, **David Price** in Sep 2010 and **Scott Kazmir** in May 2008...Snell went 4-0 with a 1.04 ERA (26-IP, 3-ER) in 5 starts in August; his 4 wins tied the club record for August and tied four others for the AL lead...min. 25 IP, his ERA led the AL and his 11.77 SO/9 IP ratio ranked 4th in the AL...his ERA was the best in club history for August and 4th-best in club history for any calendar month.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have won three straight games and are 12-2 in their last 14 games to improve to a season-high 11 games over .500, their most since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71 with a win in the tiebreaker game at Texas...only one of the 37 players on the active roster for that game remains in the organization: **Kevin Kiermaier**, who made his major league debut as a defensive replacement in the bottom of the 9th inn.

- + The last time the Rays were 11 games over .500, Miley Cyrus' "Wrecking Ball" was the best performing single in the United States and "The Hunger Games: Catching Fire" and "Frozen" were two months away from their theatrical release dates.
- + This is the Rays best 14-game stretch since July 9-27, 2013 (12-2)...the Rays have outscored opponents, 72-37, over this stretch.
- + With a win tonight, the Rays would improve to 4-1-1 in their last six road series after going 1-7-0 in their previous eight.

**WHERE WE STAND**—At 74-63, the Rays have a better record than the Diamondbacks, Phillies, Nationals and Giants, but they are 20 GB of the major-league-leading Red Sox in the AL East and 8 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card...the Rays are on pace for 87 wins, and no team has missed the postseason with that many wins since the 2014 Mariners...if they Rays gain a game tonight, it will be the closest they've been to the second Wild Card spot since they were 7 GB through June 1.

- + It's worth noting that with 25 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were also 74-63 and 9.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL's lone Wild Card...that season, the Rays passed the Red Sox on the final day.
- + The Rays would need to go 7-18 in their final 25 games to clinch their best record under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash**...they would need to go 8-17 for the first winning season since 2013 and 16-9 for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays are 25-16 (.610) since the All-Star break, 4th-best winning pct. in the majors and 3rd-best in the AL since then.

**RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS**—The Rays are 8-2 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 3-1 on the road), and they are 6-1 in their last 7 games...the Rays have pitched to a 1.62 ERA (89-IP, 16-ER) and .175 opp avg. (53-for-303) in the season series, and have combined to allow 5 runs in the last 6 games...they have allowed 4 runs or fewer in all 10 games against them this season, 2 runs or fewer eight times and 1 run or fewer five times...they have won the season series in eight of the last 10 years and are 193-169 (.533) all-time against them, their most wins against any opponent.

- + This is the second of three consecutive road trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays in the final series of the season from Sep 28-30...this series continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays have recorded double-digit hits in three consecutive games, six of their last 7 games and 10 of their last 12 games...they are averaging 5.75 runs per game over this 12-game stretch, including 4 runs or more 11 times and 5 runs or more nine times...in the last 3 games, 20 of the club's 37 hits (54.1 pct.) have gone for extra bases.

- + The Rays rank 2nd in the AL in both avg. (.257) and on-base pct. (.329), trailing the Red Sox in both categories...last season, they finished 12th with a .245 avg. and 10th with a .317 OBP...never in franchise history have the Rays finished a season among the AL's top two teams in avg. or on-base pct.—their highest finish in avg. was 3rd in 2005 and their highest finish in OBP was 3rd in 2013.
- + The Rays have totaled 122 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors...they are on pace for 144 HR, which would be 84 HR fewer

than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 24 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 26-5 (.839) when hitting multiple homers.

- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 98 SB and 1st with 83 HBP, one hit batter shy of tying the single-season club record (2015).

**PICK YOUR POISON**—The Rays have two players batting at least .300 in **Mallex Smith** (.306, 7th in the AL) and **Joey Wendle** (.302, 9th in the AL and best among major league rookies) and a third player, **Matt Duffy** (.299, 11th in the AL and 2nd among AL third basemen), flirting with a .300 avg. ...never in franchise history have three qualifying players finished with a .300 avg. or better...twice the Rays have had a pair of qualifiers do that—**Jason Bartlett** (.320) and **Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315) and **Melvin Upton Jr.** (.300) in 2007...the Rays haven't had a single qualifier hit .300 or better since **Casey Kotchman** (.306) in 2011.

- + Wendle is attempting to become the first Ray to lead major league rookie qualifiers in avg. ...**Rocco Baldelli's** club-rookie-record .289 avg. in 2003 led AL rookies but ranked 3rd among ML rookies.
- + The Rays, Red Sox, Braves and Brewers are the only teams in the majors with two qualifying players batting .300 or better.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 42nd time the Rays will use an opener and 24th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 73 of 137 games (53.3 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.31 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 40-34 with traditional starters and 34-29 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 55 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—55.1 pct. of the team's innings pitched have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 550 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 674.2 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 51 apps of at least 50 pitches and 25 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 76 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 120 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 2000 Red Sox (120);
- + 59 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1988 Yankees (59);
- + 40 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (40);
- + 28 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

**RUBBER ARM**—Tonight will be the second consecutive game started by **Ryne Stanek**, the third time in club history a pitcher will start in consecutive games and the second time on consecutive days...**Sergio Romo** started on consecutive days, May 19-20 at LAA, and **James Shields** started consecutive games wrapped around the 2009 All-Star break...prior to Romo earlier this season, the last pitcher to start on consecutive days was MIL **Zack Greinke** from July 7-8, 2012 at HOU (ejected after four pitches in the first of those starts)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Stanek will become the first rookie to start on consecutive days since STL **George Munger** from July 28-29, 1943 vs. PHI...he went 0.1 IP in the first of those games and threw a complete game the next day (9-IP, 13-H, 5-R/3-ER).

**YONNY NUT CHIRINOS**—Last night **Yonny Chirinos** threw 25 pitches in the 2nd inning, his first inning of work, then threw 47 pitches over his next 6 IP...he went 7 IP, tying the franchise record for a reliever (5th time, last **Austin Pruitt** on June 7 vs. SEA)...it was the third time this season a Rays reliever went 7 IP, while the other 29 teams have combined to do that once...the Rays are the first team with 3 apps of this type since the 1990 Yankees (3)...Chirinos is the second pitcher since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) to go at least 5 IP in six consecutive apps, all in relief, joining CHC **Charlie Smith** (6) from July 18 (G1)—Aug 12, 1912.

**RUBBER ARM**—Yesterday at TOR, started and pitched a perfect 1st inning on 16 pitches (11 strikes)...tonight will be the third time in franchise history that a pitcher starts in consecutive games and the second time on consecutive days...**Sergio Romo** started on consecutive days, May 19-20 at LAA, and **James Shields** started consecutive games wrapped around the 2009 All-Star break...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Stanek will become the first rookie to start on consecutive days since **STL George Munger** did it from July 28-29, 1943 vs. PHI...he went 0.1 IP in the first of those games and threw a complete game the next day (9-IP, 13-H, 5-R/3-ER).

**A NEW LOOK**—Has made 23 starts, all since May 26 vs. BAL, four more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...is the first pitcher to total 20 starts and 20 relief apps in a season since **TOR Esmil Rogers** (20 starts, 24 relief apps) in 2013, and the first rookie since **MIN Joe Mays** (20 starts, 29 relief apps) in 1999...before Mays, the last rookie to do it was **LAD Orel Hershiser** (20 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1984.

- + This will be the 42nd time the Rays use an opener, all of them since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.67 ERA (33.2-IP, 10-ER) in his 23 starts.
- + Eighteen of his 23 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).
- + Has pitched to a 1.57 ERA (23-IP, 4-ER) in the 1st inning.

**MAKING THE LEAP**—Since the start of June, is 1-2 with a 2.31 ERA (46.2-IP, 12-ER) and .188 opp avg. (31-for-165) in 38 apps (21 starts) to lower his season ERA from 4.66.

- + Ranks among AL rookies in apps (47, 6th) and starts (23, 1st)...min. 50 IP, is 2nd among AL rookies with a .185 opp avg. and 3rd with a 10.86 SO/9 IP ratio.
- + Has only allowed 1 XBH in 85 PA against lefties this season (double).
- + His 0.93 ERA (29-IP, 3-ER) at home is 4th-best in the majors (min. 20 IP).

**BRINGING THE HEAT**—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

- + Last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Fastball in the organization for a second consecutive season.

**WATCH YOUR BACK**—Last night NYM **Jacob deGrom** tied a single-season major league record, allowing 3 runs or fewer in a 25th consecutive start... Stanek has allowed 3 runs or fewer in all 23 of his starts, tied for the 4th-longest single-season streak in major league history.

**QUIRKS OF THE OPENER**—His 11.76 SO/9 IP ratio as a starter is 2nd-highest for a rookie in a season (min. 20 starts) to **CHC Kerry Wood** (12.58) in 1998.

- + Has made 7 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).
- + From June 7-July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing **LAD Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), **LAD Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and **LAD Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).
- + According to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

**FROM THE OTHER SIDE**—Is winless in all 23 starts, passing **Jason Hammel** (17) in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history...his 23 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)—no other pitcher has made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 9 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing **PIT Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH TYLER GLASNOW (1-4, 3.95 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Fri at CLE, faced the minimum through 4 IP and did not allow a hit until a 2-out, 5th-inning single...his only run allowed in a career-high 7 IP was a solo homer by **Edwin Encarnacion** in the 7th... became the fifth Rays pitcher (6th time) to lose a start of 7 IP (or more) and 2 hits or fewer, and the first since **Jake Odorizzi** on May 29, 2016 vs. NYY (7-IP, 1-H, 2-R/ER)...he was the first Rays starter to do this when allowing 1 run or fewer since **James Shields** on Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL (9-IP, 2-H, 1-R/ER)...his line: L, 7 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 79 pit, 56 str.

**vs. TORONTO**—Has faced the Blue Jays once, on the last road trip on Aug 12...his only run allowed came after he left the game...was replaced after a leadoff walk to the No. 9 hitter in the 6th inning, his only batter faced in the frame...pitched around a leadoff double in the 3rd inning, and stranded a runner at third base in the 4th inning with consecutive strikeouts to end the frame...his line: ND, 5 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 SO, 79 pit, 48 str.

### #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
