**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers evened their series against the White Sox with an 8-3 victory on Tuesday night at Guaranteed Rate Field. Grayson Greiner had two hits, including a double, and drove in three runs, while Mikie Mahtook hit his sixth home run of the season and had two RBI. Dawel Lugo also added two hits and two RBI. Francisco Liriano started for Detroit and picked up the win, allowing three runs, two earned, on seven hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings. The Tigers and White Sox conclude their three-game series tonight. Following tonight's game and an off day tomorrow, Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (September 7-9) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

**MAH-TOOK HIM DEEP:** Mikie Mahtook went 2x3 with a two-run homer in last night's game. After not homering in his first 33 games (122 PA) this season, Mahtook has hit six home runs in his last 17 games (66 PA). Over his last 11 games, Mahtook is batting .351/.429/.676 with four home runs and seven RBI.

**V-MART STAYS HOT:** Victor Martinez had a pair of hits in last night's game to record his 28th multi-hit game of the season and his fourth in the last seven games. Martinez has hit safely in 17 of his last 23 games, and is batting .321/.352/.512 with seven doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI during that stretch.

**STREAKING:** Niko Goodrum had a pair of hits in last night's game to extend his hitting streak to six games. During his current streak, Goodrum is batting .417/.481/.792 with seven runs scored, three home runs and four RBI.

**TIGERS TIDBITS:** Dawel Lugo went 2x4 with a double and two RBI last night. Lugo now has three multi-hit games in the first six games of his Major League career...Sandy Baez pitched 2.0 scoreless innings in last night's game, allowing just one hit. Through his first two Major League appearances, Baez has thrown 6.1 shutout innings.

**V-MART ON THE MARK VS. THE SOX:** Victor Martinez has put up impressive numbers in his career against the White Sox. Entering tonight's game, Martinez is hitting .323/.397/.499 with 44 doubles, 32 home runs and 129 RBI in 223 games vs. Chicago (AL). He leads all active players with 257 hits and 129 RBI vs. the White Sox, while he ranks second with 32 home runs, third with a .323 batting average and fourth with a .397 on-base percentage. In 112 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field, Martinez is hitting .341/.413/.539 with 56 runs scored, 18 doubles, 21 home runs and 72 RBI.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers are 3-5 on their current nine-game road trip, which includes two games at Kansas City (0-2), four games at New York (AL) (2-2) and three games at Chicago (AL) (1-1). Detroit is 22-49 (.310) on the road this season and has lost 29 of its last 38 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .233 (568x2440) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.00 ERA (601.1IP/334ER).

**TIGERS AND WHITE SOX:** The Tigers have an 11-7 lead in the season series against the White Sox, including a 7-1 edge in games played at Guaranteed Rate Field. The seven wins in Chicago are the most the Tigers have had in a single season since the unbalanced schedule went into effect in 2001. Detroit has clinched the season series against Chicago (AL) for the eighth time in the last nine seasons.

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** The Tigers are 27-35 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 11-7 vs. Chicago (AL), 4-12 vs. Cleveland, 6-7 vs. Minnesota and 6-9 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY ON DECK:** The Tigers begin a six-game homestand on Friday as they open a three-game Interleague series vs. St. Louis. Detroit has a 21-11 advantage in the all-time series vs. the Cardinals, including a 12-3 edge at Comerica Park. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Tigers won two-of-three games at Busch Stadium. Detroit is 4-10 against National League opponents this season after going 1-3 vs. Chicago (NL), 2-2 vs. Cincinnati and 1-5 vs. Pittsburgh. The Tigers have an all-time record of 210-187 (.529) in Interleague play.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 56-83 (.403) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,124-1,122 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is five victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**MUD HENS, WHITECAPS BEGIN POSTSEASON TONIGHT:** Triple A Toledo and Single A West Michigan begin the postseason tonight. Toledo will host Durham in the best-of-five International League semifinals, while West Michigan will host Great Lakes in the best-of-three Midwest League playoffs.

  - Recalled from Double A Erie prior to Saturday's game vs. New York (AL)...made his Major League debut earlier this season in game one of the doubleheader on June 4 vs. New York (AL), tossing 4.1 hitless innings, allowing three walks and a hit batter, while striking out four...became the first Tigers pitcher and the sixth Major League pitcher since at least 1908 to throw 4.1-or-more no-hit innings in his big league debut.
  - Appeared in 33 games, including 15 starts, with the SeaWolves this season, posting a 1-9 record with a 5.64 ERA (103.2IP/65ER) and 86 strikeouts.
  - Made 19 starts between Single A Lakeland and Double A Erie in 2017, compiling a 6-8 record with a 3.92 ERA (98.2IP/43ER) and 105 strikeouts...made four starts in June for the Flying Tigers, going 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (23.2IP/4ER) and 35 strikeouts...named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending June 11.

  - Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings on August 25 vs. Chicago (AL)...marked his second outing of 2.0-or-more innings this season and 27th of his career...carries a 1-0 record and 2.44 ERA (59.0IP/16ER) in those situations.
  - Earned the win on August 13 vs. Chicago (AL), tossing a scoreless inning in relief...marked his fourth win this season, which establishes a new career high...previous career high was three wins, which he last accomplished in 2013 as a member of the Kansas City Royals.
  - Had his contract selected from Triple A Toledo prior to the doubleheader on May 12...made his Tigers debut in the second game of the doubleheader on May 12 vs. Seattle and tossed 1.2 scoreless innings in relief, with a strikeout.
  - Appeared in 13 games with the Mud Hens this season, notching eight saves with a 2.40 ERA (15.0IP/4ER) and 15 strikeouts.
  - Has played seven Major League seasons with Kansas City (2011-15), Los Angeles (NL) (2016) and Detroit (2018)...has made 256 career appearances, all in relief, posting a 12-6 record with two saves, a 3.58 ERA (269.1IP/107ER) and 267 strikeouts.

  - Has held lefthanded hitters to a .160 (15x94) batting average this season, while righties are hitting .338 (46x136).
  - Snapped a streak of 12.0 scoreless innings on July 14 at Houston, allowing two runs...carried a 2-0 record with eight hits and eight strikeouts over the month-long stretch.
  - Made his first start of the season on August 19 at Minnesota, allowing two runs on two hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 2.1 innings.
  - Earned his third win of the season on June 16 at Chicago (AL), tossing a scoreless inning in relief, allowing a hit and two walks with one strikeout.
  - After giving up five runs in his first outing of the season, allowed three earned runs over a span of 20 appearances (18.2IP) from April 7 to May 17, posting a 1.45 ERA.

  - Ranks fifth in the American League with 28 saves and seventh with an 84.8 save percentage.
  - Has held lefthanded hitters to a .244 (30x123) batting average, while righties are hitting .276 (27x98) against him.
  - Notched the save on August 18 at Minnesota, striking out one in 1.1 innings...marked his second four-out save of the season (other, May 8 at Texas).
  - Earned the save on June 16 at Chicago (AL), tossing a perfect ninth inning...was his fourth save in as many days, becoming the first Tigers closer to accomplish that feat since Todd Jones did so from June 30-July 3, 2000...the last Major League reliever to do so was Milwaukee's Jeremy Jeffress from July 28-31, 2016.
  - Appeared in a career-high 71 games with the Tigers in 2017, posting a 4-3 record with nine saves, a 2.66 ERA (67.2IP/20ER) and 73 strikeouts.
  - Allowed only nine of the 47 runners he inherited to score last season, finishing second in the American League with a 19.1 inherited runners scored percentage (min. 40 inherited runners).

### #36 Blaine Hardy - LHP

  - Reinstated from the disabled list prior to Friday's game at New York (AL)...had been on the DL since August 17, retroactive to August 15, with left elbow tendinitis...made two rehab appearances with Triple A Toledo, tossing 2.0 innings, allowing an earned run on three hits, while striking out four.
  - Has held lefties to a .237 (18x76) batting average, while righthanded hitters are batting .251 (57x227) against him.
  - Recorded the first save of his Major League career on July 2 at Toronto, tossing a perfect 10th inning, striking out one.
  - Has made the first 13 starts of his Major League career this season, posting a 4-4 record with a 4.26 ERA (67.2IP/32ER) and 47 strikeouts.
  - Appeared in nine games, including four starts, with Triple A Toledo this season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.03 ERA (26.1IP/3ER) and 34 strikeouts.

### #77 Joe Jiménez - RHP

  - Ranks tied for fifth in the American League with 20 holds.
  - Has limited lefthanded hitters to a .208 (20x96) batting average this season, while righties are batting .237 (28x118).
  - Named to the American League All-Star Team, marking his first-ever All-Star selection...tossed 0.1 innings and earned a hold, striking out the only batter he faced...at 23 years old, he is the youngest Tigers All-Star since 1992, when Travis Fryman was also selected to the All-Star Team at the age of 23.
  - Appeared in 46 games prior to the All-Star break, which ranks as the fifth-most in franchise history and the most since C.J. Nitkowski appeared in 47 games before the All-Star break in 1999.
  - Earned his first career Major League save on June 2 vs. Toronto, pitching a perfect ninth inning.
  - Picked up his first career Major League win on April 5 at Chicago (AL), after pitching a scoreless inning in relief.

  - Threw 2.0 shutout innings with three strikeouts on August 19 at Minnesota...marked his second career appearance of 2.0 innings (other, July 21, 2016 vs. Miami).
  - Made 14 appearances with the Tigers in March/April, compiling a 1-0 record with a 1.59 ERA (11.1IP/2ER) and eight strikeouts...pitched 1.1 scoreless innings in relief in the first game of the doubleheader on April 25 at Pittsburgh and picked up his first career Major League win.
  - Posted a 1-0 record with a 3.48 ERA (10.1IP/4ER) and 13 strikeouts in nine appearances with Toledo this season.

  - Has allowed eight earned runs over his last 19 appearances, carrying a 2.37 ERA (30.1IP/8ER) with seven walks and 27 strikeouts, while holding opponents to a .200 (22x110) batting average.
  - Tossed 2.2 scoreless innings on August 25 vs. Chicago (AL)...marked his 10th relief outing of 2.0-or-more innings this season, and 19th of his career...carries a 3-1 record with a 2.00 ERA (45.0IP/10ER) and 30 strikeouts in those games.
  - Reinstated from the disabled list on July 9...had been on DL since June 20 with a nasal fracture...made four rehab appearances with Triple A Toledo, going 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (5.1IP/2ER), allowing five hits and two walks, while striking out 10.
  - Named the Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for May, compiling a 2-0 record with a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP/4ER) and 41 strikeouts in six starts with the Mud Hens...he led the International League with a .138 (13x94) opponents batting average in May, while he ranked second with a 1.32 ERA and 0.77 WHIP and third with 41 strikeouts.
