**RAY AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs (2015-present) after spending parts of 5 with the Nationals (2010-13) and Tigers' (2014) organizations.
- ◆ 2017 NL All-Star Team @ Marlins Park (DNP).
- ◆ Acquired from Tigers with INF Domingo Leyba for INF Didi Gregorius on Dec. 5, 2014.

**HERE'S THE STORY**

- ◆ Is 3-0 with a 1.85 ERA (7 ER in 34.0 IP), .134 opponent average and 46 strikeouts (12.18 per 9.0 IP) in his last 6 starts.
- ◆ Has not allowed more than 3 runs in 12 consecutive road starts dating back to Oct. 1, 2017, tied for the second-longest such streak in team history (also: Miguel Batista in 2003)...Brandon Webb owns the record with 13 straight in 2003.
- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 3.09 ERA (16 ER in 46.2 IP) and 68 strikeouts in his last 8 starts vs. San Diego.

**LAST TIME OUT**

- ◆ Did not factor into the decision on Sept. 24 vs. Dodgers, allowing 2 runs on 4 hits with 7 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 6 consecutive home starts, the longest streak of his career.

- ◆ Is 5-4 with a 3.99 ERA (30 ER in 67.2 IP) in 12 career starts.

- ◆ Boasts a career-high in homers (16), doubles (33) and RBI (70).
- ◆ His 69 RBI are the most by a D-backs shortstop all-time and his 16 homers are third [stats as SS only].
- ◆ His 57 defensive runs saved at shortstop since 2015 are tied for most in the NL with Addison Russell (57) and ahead of Brandon Crawford (54).

**#5 • ALEX AVILA • R/L** **5-11 • 210 • 31 (Jan. 29, 1987)**  
**SD Series:** - **Trip:** -

- ◆ Has an .824 OPS with 6 doubles, 5 home runs, 16 RBI, 22 walks in his last 36 games.
- ◆ Fifth in the NL [min. 50 G] with a 30.0 caught stealing pct. (9-for-30).
- ◆ Made his first appearance as a pitcher on July 11 @ Rockies (0 ER in 2.0 IP).
- ◆ Reached base a career-high-tying 5 times on July 7 vs. Padres.

- ◆ Recorded the 12th pinch-hit triple in D-backs history on Sept. 14 @ Astros.
- ◆ Acquired from the Royals on June 6 for LHP Gabe Speier and RHP Elvis Luciano.
