## NATIONALS NEWS

### SWEEPS AND STREAKS

The Washington Nationals return to D.C. for one day after completing the sweep of the Philadelphia Phillies on Wednesday night and extending their winning streak to five games...**Stephen Strasburg** tossed 7.0 strong innings, striking out nine batters without issuing a walk, while **Bryce Harper** (2-run), **Ryan Zimmerman** (solo) and **Juan Soto** (solo) clubbed home runs in the 5-1 victory...The Nationals and Chicago Cubs will cap their 2018 season series today with the makeup of the game originally scheduled for Sept. 9

- The Nationals' current five-game winning streak is its longest winning streak since their season-high six-game winning streak from May 25-30.

### DOING. JUAN. SOTO. THINGS.

Including his solo home run on Wednesday night, **Juan Soto** has hit safely in six straight games, hitting 10-for-26 (.385) with two doubles, three homers, seven RBI, two walks and five runs scored during this stretch.

- He has clubbed three homers in his last two games, including his third career multi-homer game on Tuesday night...His three multi-homer games are the most by a teenager in Major League history.
- Soto is on pace to have one of the best seasons for a teenager in Major League Baseball history...See boxes to the right and additional note sheets about Soto's 2018 season.

### CHASING 100-100-100

**Bryce Harper** enters Thursday with 93 runs scored, 94 RBI and 112 walks in 2018...He is looking to become the sixth player since 2014 to record at least 100 runs, RBI and walks in a season...He would join **Joey Votto** (2017), **Aaron Judge** (2017), **Mike Trout** (2016), **Paul Goldschmidt** (2015) and **Jose Bautista** (2015, 2014).

- Since the All-Star break, Harper ranks in the National League in doubles (T5th, 14), RBI (2nd, 40), OBP (3rd, .439), runs (T4th, 36) and OPS (6th, 1.023)
- On the season, he ranks in the NL in homers (T3rd, 33), RBI (6th, 94), OBP (5th, .389), OPS (7th, .896) and SLG (11th, .507)

### ARMS OF NOTE

Some notes on a few members of Washington's bullpen that have been offering strong relief as of late:

- Koda Glover** has tossed scoreless relief in nine straight outings dating to Aug. 26...During this stretch, he has allowed just two hits and issued two walks while striking out four batters in 7.2 innings...Opposing batters are 2-for-25 (.080) against him.
- Since Aug. 22, **Matt Grace** has struck out seven batters without issuing a walk in seven straight scoreless outings (5.1 IP)...Opposing batters are hitting .158 (3-for-19) against him during this stretch.
- Greg Holland** has pitched to a 0.56 ERA (1 ER/16.0 IP) with 18 strikeouts and a .118 (6-for-51) opp. AVG since joining Washington Aug. 7... He is 2-0 with three saves and two holds with Washington.

### TONY TWO BAGS

Anthony Rendon's 39 doubles rank fourth in the National League, but are just one of the pace set by **Matt Carpenter** (40), **Nick Markakis** (40) and **Trevor Story** (40)...Rendon has been a doubles machine since Sept. 3...In nine games since that date, seven of his 13 hits have been doubles...All told, he is hitting .351 (13-for-37) with five RBI, four walks and 11 runs scored.

- Rendon's 39 doubles are tied for the second-most for him in a season (2014) and are two shy of his career-high 41 in 2017.
- Since 2016, his 118 doubles are the most in the National League and are good for third in all of Major League Baseball behind **Jose Ramirez** (137) and **Mookie Betts** (130).

### BEST OF THE BEST

Since the All-Star break, Washington's offense ranks in the National League in OPS (1st, .790), on-base percentage (1st, .346), slugging percentage (1st, .444), batting average (1st, .267), doubles (1st, 98), runs (2nd, 267), walks (2nd, 191) and stolen bases (T3rd, 33).

- Washington's second-half surge has placed them among the top five offenses in 2018 in on-base percentage (3rd, .330), home runs (5th, 174), OPS (5th, .747) and runs scored (5th, 684).

## NATIONALS HISTORY

### September 13 (6-5 on this date)

2013 — **Ryan Zimmerman** homered for the third straight game to power Washington to the 6-1 in over the Philadelphia Phillies for their seventh win in a row. The solo home run of the season was his 24th of the season and the ninth in his last 11 games.

## DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

## #41 - JOE ROSS - RHP

Tall, athletic right-handed pitcher with smooth mechanics and a downhill delivery that deceives hitters, especially righties...Uses a power sinking two-seam fastball and a sharp slider to get batters out...Commands the strike zone, having issued just 70 walks and posting a 3.29 strikeout-to-walk ratio during his first three big league seasons...Displays composure and mound presence beyond his years...Burst on the Major League scene in 2015 after being acquired as part of a three-team deal, that also yielded infielder **Trea Turner** in December of 2014

**AGAINST THE CUBS:** Is 0-2 with a 3.44 ERA n three career starts against the Cubs...Has 20 strikeouts against just five walks in 18.1 IP...Made his MLB debut against the Cubs on June 6 at Nationals Park (5.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 4 SO).

**LAST START:** This marks his first official Major League start of the 2018 season...He started on Sept. 7 vs. Chicago, but it was cut short due to rain... He threw 1.2 innings (24 pitches).

### 2018 NOTES

- Made six rehab starts, going 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA between the Gulf Coast League, Single-A Potomac, Double-A Harrisburg and Triple-A Syracuse.
- Had his third season in Washington cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" ligament-replacement surgery in July.
- Made his final start of the season on July 9 vs. ATL...In previous four starts, was 2-1 with a 2.36 ERA (7 ER/26.2 IP), 22 strikeouts and eight walks.
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on June 8 vs. BAL.
- Matched a career-high with 8.0 innings on May 23 vs. SEA (8.0 IP, 5 H, ER, 6 SO).
- Opened the season by receiving 62 runs of support, the most in MLB history through a pitcher's first four starts of the season, per *Elias*...His 10.14 average run support would have been first in MLB, if qualified.
- Opened the season with Triple-A Syracuse, but was recalled on April 19...Was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on May 1 before being recalled on May 23.

### 2016 NOTES

- Began the season in Washington's rotation before being placed on the disabled list on July 3...Missed 66 games with right shoulder inflammation.
- Posted a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts against just three walks in three games after reinstatement on Sept. 18.
- Posted a 19.2 scoreless innings streak from April 10 to April 30, the longest of any Washington pitcher and 13th-longest in the NL in 2016.
- Struck out 28 batters against just four walks (7.0 strikeout-to-walk ratio) over his five starts prior to his DL stint.
- Surrendered a home run to Nick Castellanos on May 10 vs. DET, the first home run he had allowed in 160 at bats, a streak that dated to August, 2015...He entered that game as the only qualified (3.09 batters faced/ team game) starting pitcher in MLB to not allow a home run to that point in 2016, and, via the *Elias Sports Bureau*, his 160 at-bat streak was the third longest in MLB at that time behind only CIN's **Blake Wood** (174 at-bats) and BOS's RHP Carson Smith (172 at-bats).
- Made his first Postseason appearance, starting Game 4 of the NLDS at Los Angeles.

### 2015 NOTES

- In his first season in Washington's system, started at Double-A Harrisburg before having his contract selected on June 6 and made his MLB debut that day vs. CHI (5.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 4 SO).
- Solidified his spot in the rotation with his next two starts, June 13 at MIL (8.0 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 2 ER, BB, 8 SO) and June 19 vs. PIT (7.1 IP, 6 H, R, ER, BB, 11 SO)...With that 11 strikeout effort, Ross became just the third rookie to strike out at least 10 batters in a game in Nationals history joining **Stephen Strasburg** (14 - 6/8/10; 10 - 6/18/10) and **John Lannan** (11 - 4/7/08).
- Allowed three or fewer earned runs in his first seven career starts, tying **Micah Bowie** (7 GS, 5/20-6/22/2007) for the second-longest such streak by a starting pitcher to begin a career in Nationals history (2005-present).
- Ranked among National League rookie starting pitchers (min. 13 GS) in opp. OBP (2nd, .280), WHIP (3rd, 1.11), fewest walks (4th, 21), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 3.29) and strikeouts per nine innings (8th, 8.10).
- Set a Nationals record (2005-present) by starting his career facing 51 consecutive batters before issuing his first walk (June 13 at MIL, **Adam Lind**)
- Prior to **Yasiel Puig's** home run on August 11 at LAD, Ross faced 100 right-handed batters before surrendering an extra base hit.
