PITCHER OF THE MONTH

RHP Luis Castillo (5gs, 3-1, 1.09) is making a bid to become the first Reds pitcher to win a National League **Pitcher of the Month Award** since LHP Denny Neagle in September 1999 and the first righthander since Jeff Shaw in September 1997...Castillo this month leads the Major Leagues in innings pitched (33.0), leads the National League in ERA (1.09), and ranks T2nd in the NL in wins (3).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (1-2) of a 4-game series vs Gary Denbo's Marlins and Game 10 (3-6) of the Reds' last road trip of the season (1-2 at Cubs, 1-2 at Mil, 1-2 at Mia)...the Reds are 8-24 in their last 32 road games...beginning Tue the Reds will finish the 2018 championship season with a 5-game homestand vs the Royals (2g) and Pirates (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds haven't produced a winning season vs the Marlins since they went 4-3 in 2014...since then are 10-17 vs Mia (3-4, 3-4, 2-5, 2-4)...the Reds have lost 10 of their last 11 games at Marlins Park and 11 of their last 14 games here...Cin is 3-0 with the Marlins Park roof open and 7-14 with the roof closed...Reds vs Marlins info on Page 323.

ROYALS UP NEXT: The Reds and Royals meet Tue & Wed for their second series of the season...the Reds are 10-13 all-time vs the Royals, including a 2-game series sweep at Kaufmann Stadium earlier this season (6/12-6/13)...Reds vs Royals information is on media guide Page 334...this season the Reds are 10-8 vs the American League, including a 6-game winning streak vs the AL from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their longest interleague winning streak...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 148-205 all-time vs the AL, at .419 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 156-218, .417)...Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the AL since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 33-65 vs AL (.337).

SHUT OUT: The Reds have been shut out 13 times this season, their highest total since 2015 (13 SHO) and including 4 times in the last 8 games...Reds batters were held to 3 runs or fewer in 10 of the last 11 games...over the last 11 games Reds batters hit .197 (70-355), including .079 with RISP (5-63), with 16 runs scored (1.45 r/g)...Reds pitchers over the last 11 games went 4-7, 3.05 (94.1ip, 32er)...the Reds have been shut out by the Marlins twice this season...are coming off 2 shutout losses in the series at Miller Park and were shut out 5 times overall by the Brewers this season...were shut out 5 times in a season by a single team for the first time since the 1960 Pirates shut out the Reds 5 times.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 63-75 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

HURLING: The Reds have used 32 pitchers, tying the 2016 franchise record for pitchers in a season and including 4 position players (Cliff Pennington on 4/12 vs StL; Alex Blandino on 7/11 at Cle; Dilson Herrera on 8/8 at NYM; Brandon Dixon on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and 7 rookies (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went 17-28-3 in their previous 48 series, including 12-12-2 in the last 26 series beginning 6/19...beginning 6/21, the Reds went 5-2-2 in their last 9 series vs teams in first place when those series began (16-15, .516, 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cle, 3-1 vs Phi, 2-1 vs Ari, 0-3 vs Cle and 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 at Chi)...the Reds' 2-1 series loss at Cubs completed on 7/8 snapped their 5-series unbeaten streak, their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in June (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFELD: The Reds' infield includes 3 National League All-Stars and collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (694), batting average (.284) and on-base percentage (.358)...All-Stars 2B Scooter Gennett and 3B Eugenio Suárez are finalists for the Silver Slugger Award at their positions, along with RHP Michael Lorenzen...Gennett leads the National League in 3-hit games while ranking second in hitting, T2nd in multi-hit games and third in hits...Suárez is 1 of only 5 Major League players to hit at least .285 with at least 32 HR and 101 RBI...All-Star 1B Joey Votto is on pace to lead the NL in on-base percentage for the seventh time...SS José Peraza ranks second in the Major Leagues in hits among shortstops (Cle's Francisco Lindor 1st) and leads the National League at that position in batting average (minimum 200ab); joins Lindor as the only players in the Major Leagues with at least 176 hits, 31 doubles, 13 HR and 23 stolen bases; and among all National League batters ranks T4th in hits and T5th in multi-hit games.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 11 grand slams, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the National League record (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is 14 (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1...the Reds produced 9 grand slams in the first half, tying the 2010 Yankees for the most ever prior to the All-Star break...the Reds hit 5 in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...the Reds' 11 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Joey Votto (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, pitcher Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit), José Peraza and Scott Schebler...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 off Mil's Jacob Barnes became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since Tommy Byrne of the WSox on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP Michael Lorenzen is trying to become the first relief pitcher ever to win a Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...has been named a finalist for the award...prior to Tue's start at Mil, was trying to become the first player in the live ball era to produce at least 4 HR in a season without starting a game...he has 4 HR, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off Jacob Barnes)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for HR as a pitcher is 4 by converted outfielder Hal Jeffcoat, who hit 4 HR in 1957, all as a pitcher...Tom Parrott hit 4 HR in 1894, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman.

Today's Pitcher - #21 Michael Lorenzen, RHP

RED HOTS

Michael Lorenzen this afternoon is making his **second consecutive start** after beginning the season with **42 relief apps**...his start in Tue's 3-1 win at Mil was his first since **2015**, when he made 21 starts and 6 relief apps during his rookie season...between starts on **9/16/15 at SF** and **Tue at Mil**, made **151 consecutive apps in relief** (13-6, 3.60)...overall in his career has posted ERAs of **5.25 in 22 starts** and **3.68 in 153 relief apps**...while pitching out of the bullpen this season made 20 apps of **more than 1.0 inning** and 15 apps of **at least 2.0 innings**, including apps of **3.0 innings** 3 times (6/15 at Pit, 6/29 vs Mil, 9/7 vs SD), **4.0 innings** twice (6/1 at SD, 7/26 vs Phi) and a **career-high 4.1 innings** in relief on **8/14 vs Cle**...from **3/29-5/22** was on the 10-day disabled list with a **right shoulder strain**, including a 3-game rehab stint for Class AA Pensacola from **5/14-5/20** (4ip, 1h, 0r, 1bb, 3k)...in spring training made 4 apps before he suffered the injury...was disabled on Opening Day...didn't make his season debut until **5/23 vs Pit**...in the ninth inning of the 10-3 loss on **8/13 vs Cle** played right field, his first Major League appearance at a defensive position other than pitcher, and singled...is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award**...before joining the rotation, was making a bid to become the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher is 4** by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...is a career **.250 hitter** (6hr, 17rbi, .790ops), including **.296 this season** (4hr, 9rbi, 1.123ops).

RED HOTS

Matt Harvey on Tue vs KC will make his 24th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **second career** appearance and **start vs the Royals**, his first since **2016**...will be his first start of the season vs an **American League** opponent...in **12 career starts vs AL teams** is **4-4, 2.40**...his **27 starts** and **150. innings pitched** are his highest totals since **2015** (29gs, 189.1ip)...from **9/3-9/14** made 3 straight quality starts (**1-1, 2.50, 18ip, 5er**) for the first time since **5/30-6/10, 2016**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00 in 4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...the Reds were **8-27** before he was acquired on **5/8** and **58-63 since then**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66 in 104 starts** and **5 relief apps**...in **12 career starts at Great American Ball Park** is **7-1, 3.86** and in **10 starts at GABP** this year is **5-1, 4.37**.

16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

Road Trip: 2-23, 6k

- Has 2 hits in his last 25 at bats, including an 0-for-13 skid snapped Tue at Mil and an 0-for-10 snapped in his final plate appearance Sat at Mia.
- Is making a bid to win his second Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence...in 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Gold Glove, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).
- Is the Reds' nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award for representing baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.

38 CURT CASALI, c

Road Trip: 5g, 3gs, 5-13, 2 2b

- In his last 27 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .317 (26-82, 7 2b, 2hr, 12rbi).
- Hit safely in each of his last 3 starts (5-11, .455, 2 2b) and in 6 of his last 7 starts (8-27, .296, 3 2b).
- Has made 30 starts at C, most recently in Fri's 10-inning, 1-0 loss at Mia...this season also made his first career apps at 1B (6g, 3gs) and at 2B (1g on 7/20 vs Pit).

- In 49 apps for Louisville hit .346 (18 2b, 2 3b, 6hr, 23rbi, 9sb).
- Made 2 scoreless pitching apps (1ip on 8/13 vs Cle, 0.1ip on 8/31 at StL).

27 PHILLIP ERVIN, of

Road Trip: 6gs in LF, 1gs in RF, 4-25, 1 2b, 1hr, 1rbi

- Fri at Mia made his first start in RF since 8/23 at Cubs.
- Since his All-Star break promotion, has started 44 of the Reds' 60 games (29gs in LF, 13gs in RF, 2gs in CF)...also was with the Reds from Opening Day-4/25 (16g, 8gs) and then again from 6/21-6/23 (3g).
- In 54 apps overall for the Reds since the All-Star break is hitting .268 (44-164, 9 2b, 1 3b, 7hr, 27rbi, .333obp).
- In 48 games overall for Louisville hit .289 (12 2b, 4 3b, 5hr, 38rbi, 10sb).

17 TIM FEDEROWICZ, c

Road Trip: 2g at C, 1-1, 1 2b

- Last name is pronounced fed-ah-ROW-vitch.
- Hasn't started a game but has made 4 apps for the Reds, on 9/8 vs SD (PH), 9/12 vs LAD (C), Mon at Mil (C), Wed at Mil (C).
- In the sixth inning of the rain-shortened 7-2 win on 9/8 vs SD, pinch hit and walked in his Reds debut...in the ninth inning of Mon's 8-0 loss at Mil doubled off Brandon Woodruff for his first hit as a Red.
- On 9/4 was promoted from Louisville with OF Gabriel Guerrero and RHP Tyler Mahle.
- On 12/6/17 was signed by the Astros to a minor league contract...on 6/8 was designated for assignment and then outrighted to Fresno...on 7/26 was designated for assignment a second time, refused the outright assignment and elected free agency...on 8/3 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract and was sent to Louisville.
- Hit .328 in 38 apps for Fresno (13 2b, 6hr, 22rbi), .244 in 23 apps for Louisville (6 2b, 1hr, 9rbi) and .206 in 10 apps for the Astros (3 2b, 2rbi).

3 SCOTTER GENNETT, 2b

Road Trip: 6-28, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi

- The first-time All-Star is a finalist for the Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...leads all Major League second basemen in hitting, hits, RBI and slugging percentage and is tied with Atl's Ozzie Albies for the lead at that position in HR.
- Leads all National League batters in 3-hit games (18) while ranking second overall in hitting, T2nd in multi-hit games (53) and third in hits.
- His 85 runs scored are a career high...his 30 doubles are 1 shy of his career high and 92 RBI are 5 shy of his career high.
- In the first half hit .326 (.521slg, .373obp) to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...no Reds batter has finished a season leading the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973.
- Is trying to become the first Reds batter to lead the National League in hits since Pete Rose in 1976 (215 hits)...see media guide pages 393-394.
- Since All-Star break is hitting .299 (64-214, 9 2b, 2 3b, 7hr, 29rbi).

61 GABRIEL GUERRERO, OF

Road Trip: 5g, 3g as PH, 1-3, solo HR

- Sat at Mia hit his first Major League home run, a pinch-hit solo HR off Nick Wittgren.
- On 9/4 was promoted from Louisville with C Tim Federowicz and RHP Tyler Mahle.
- In the sixth inning 9/4 at Pit made his Major League debut, pinch hit and played center field for 1 inning...on 9/11 vs LAD made his only career start, played CF and recorded his first career hit (single off Hyun-Jin Ryu).
- Led all Reds minor leaguers in RBI (81) while ranking third in HR (19) and eighth in hitting (.293)...began the season at Class AA Pensacola (26g, .296, 9 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 16rbi, 3sb)...on 5/7 was promoted to Louisville and for the season led the Bats in HR (104g, .292, 15 2b, 4 3b, 17hr, 65rbi, 87gs in RF, 15gs in CF).
- In 2017 was a non-roster invitee to Reds Major League spring training camp but spent 2018 spring training in minor league camp.
- His throwing arm was rated the best in the International League in a poll of managers.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, IF Blake Trahan).

6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

Road Trip: 2-25, 4bb, 2sb

- Has 1 hit in his last 24 at bats...in his last 17 apps is hitting .137 (7-51, .222obp), including an 0-for-15 skid from 9/4-9/9 and an 0-for-16 skid snapped in his final plate appearance on Thu at Mia.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13, leads all Major League players with 275 stolen bases and leads all Major League center fielders with 52 assists.
- With 32 stolen bases ranks third in the National League (Trea Turner 41, Starling Marte 33)...in each of the last 4 seasons finished second in the league in stolen bases.
- His 275 stolen bases rank fifth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Bob Bescher is fourth with 320 steals and Joe Morgan the all-time leader with 406.
- Has 12 assists, 1 shy of last year's career high and tied with Sea's Mitch Haniger & Bos' Andrew Benintendi for the Major League lead among outfielders...LF Adam Duvall led the Major Leagues last season with 15 outfield assists...no Reds CF has produced more than 13 assists in a season since Vada Pinson had 19 assists in 1961.
- Hit .306 in August but .159 so far in September (10-63).

15 DILSON HERRERA, inf

Road Trip: 5g, 1gs at 2B, 1gs in LF, 1-8

- Last played in Fri's 10-inning, 1-0 loss at Mia, started in LF (0-4).
- Was promoted on 7/6...has made 6 starts at 2B (last, 9/15 at Cubs), 2 starts at 3B (8/21 at Mi, 8/22 at Mil) and 6 starts in LF (last, 9/21 at Mia).
- This season made his first Major League apps in LF (10g, 6gs), at 1B (1g on 8/8 at NYM) and at 3B (4g, 2gs).
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Road Trip: 8-33, 1 2b, 2hr, 3rbi, 1sb

- Has a 9-game hitting streak vs the Marlins (12-35, .343, 2 2b, 1rbi).
- Is 1 of only 2 players in the Major Leagues with at least 176 hits, 31 doubles, 13 HR and 23 stolen bases (Cle's Francisco Lindor, 178-42-36-23).
- Ranks second in the Major Leagues in hits among shortstops (Lindor 1st) and leads the National League at that position in batting average (minimum 200ab)...among all NL players ranks T4th in hits, just 3 behind team leader Scooter Gennett, and T5th in multi-hit games.
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.2)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).
- Hit safely in 14 of his last 16 apps (23-66, .348, 4 2b, 4hr, 11rbi, 3sb), including an 11-game hitting streak snapped Mon at Mil.
- In his last 99 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .314 (126-401, 22 2b, 4 3b, 11hr, 44rbi, 15sb), since then the sixth-highest BA in the Major Leagues (Paul Goldschmidt .341, J.D. Martinez .334, Christian Yelich .330, Anthony Rendon .319, Trevor Story .314).

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Road Trip: 6-31, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi

- Has 3 career leadoff HR, including 2 this season (7/2 off James Shields, 9/16 off José Quintana)...hit all 3 of his career leadoff homers on the first pitch.
- Made his last 12 starts batting leadoff (11-49, .224, 3hr, 8rbi, 9r)...has made 43 career starts batting first (51-182, .280), including 38 times this year (44-160, .275).
- His grand slam on 9/7 off SD's Rowan Wickwer was the second of his career and the 10th by a Reds batter this season, setting a new club record (9 grand slams, 2002).
- Sat at Mia made his first start of the season and 13th career start in LF...has made a team-high 72 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- Missed 43 games during 2 stints on the 10-day disabled list, from 4/9-4/19 with a right ulnar nerve contusion (Sean Doolittle HBP) and from 7/18-8/24 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder (collision with outfield wall).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Road Trip: 5-27, 4bb

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (4-11, .364) following a 7-game stretch in which he went 1-for-20, including an 0-for-15 skid snapped Thu at Mia.
- In his last 19 apps has 1 HR and 1 RBI, a solo HR off Alex Wood on 9/10 vs LAD...since then has gone 11 apps and 37 AB without a home run or RBI.
- Is a finalist for the Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...his 144 hits, 32 HR, 101 RBI and .896 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks fifth in the National League in RBI and T9th in HR.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.
- Is on Major League Baseball's roster for the November 8-15 Japan All-Star Series with Nippon Professional Baseball.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf

Road Trip: 3g, 1gs at SS, 1-5

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- Last played Fri at Mia, started at SS (0-3) after Peraza was scratched with an illness.
- Made both of his starts at SS (9/3 at Pit, 9/21 at Mia).
- In the 5-1 loss on 9/3 at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- On 9/1 was promoted from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS...for the Reds has played 2B, 3B and SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (.429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 10-32 (.313), 1 2b, 1hr, 1rbi, 3bb

- In his last 6 apps is 4-for-21 (2bb), including 3 hits on Tue at Mil.
- Is on pace to lead the National League in on-base percentage for the seventh time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- In 22 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on 8/30 is hitting .282 (22-78, 3 2b, 3hr, 12rbi)...from 8/17-8/29 was disabled with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016...missed 12 games while he was disabled.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5).

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Trip: 1gs in CF, 1gs in LF, 1gs in RF, 3-13, 1 2b

- In his last 26 apps beginning 8/18 is hitting .309 (17-55, 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi).
- Has made 17 starts in RF (last, 9/22 at Mia), 5 starts in CF (last, 9/18 at Mil) and 4 starts in LF (9/2 at StL, 9/5 at Pit, 9/12 vs LAD, 9/20 at Mia).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
