TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Cubs meet today to make up the game from April 15 postponed due to inclement weather...The clubs split the two games played here earlier this season, with the Braves blowing a 10-2 lead on April 14 in a 14-10 loss...The clubs will both travel to Atlanta later today to open a three-game series tomorrow night at SunTrust Park.

A The Braves have lost 16 of their last 21 games at Wrigley Field, getting outscored 126-72 over this stretch, which dates to July 18, 2015.

A RHP Julio Teheran is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 ER/20.0 IP) in three career starts at Wrigley Field...The right-hander tossed 7.0 shutout innings in his last start here, a 4-3 no-decision on May 1, 2016.

A LHP José Quintana allowed seven hits and seven runs over 2.1 innings in that April 14 start against the Braves this season...For his career, he is 2-0 with a 7.71 ERA (12 ER/14.0 IP) in three career games against Atlanta.

WINS: The Braves took three-of-four games against Miami this weekend to improve to a season-high nine games over .500 at 24-15...They also own the best record in the N.L. and the fourth-best mark in the majors.

A The last time the Braves were nine games over .500 was after play on July 29, 2014, when they were 58-49...They were 10 games over the previous day.

A The Braves collected their ninth series win of the season yesterday, improving to 5-1-2 in road sets...The club did not collect their ninth series win last season until winning two of three over Miami on June 16-June 18.

NEWCOMB: LHP Sean Newcomb shut out Miami yesterday over 6.0 innings, allowing just one hit...Newcomb ran his scoreless streak to a career-best 20.0 consecutive innings...The lefty started his run with a scoreless inning on April 26 at Cincinnati, before 7.0 shutout innings on May 2 at New York...He then blanked Tampa Bay for 6.0 innings on May 8.

A Newcomb became the only Braves pitcher over the last 110 seasons to allow two hits or less and no runs in three consecutive starts...He allowed two hits against the Mets and two hits to the Rays before his performance yesterday.

A The last major leaguer to have a similar streak was Detroit's Michael Fulmer in 2016, who also had a three-game run.

A Over the last 110 seasons, no pitcher has had a four-start streak of two hits or less and no runs in each turn.

A After allowing six runs, five earned, in his season opener, Newcomb has gone 4-0 with a 1.70 ERA (8 ER/42.1 IP)

THE OFFENSE: The Braves offense leads all of the majors in batting average (.269), while leading the N.L. in on-base percentage (.337), slugging percentage (.442), runs (213), hits (376), doubles (81) and extra-base hits (137).

A They also lead the N.L. with a +56 run differential, two ahead of today's opponent, the Chicago Cubs...The Philadelphia Phillies are third at +39.

WITH TWO OUTS: The Braves scored all four of their runs with two outs yesterday, and in the four games with Miami, the Braves scored 21 of their 26 runs with two outs...They now have a MLB-most 109 two-outs runs this season...They also lead the majors with 153 hits, a .309 batting average, a .529 slugging percentage and a .391 on-base percentage in these situations.

A The club's .921 OPS with two outs is tops in baseball...Los Angeles (AL) is second at .836

ON THE ROAD: The Braves have won 10 of their last 11 road games, outscoring the opposition 67-22 over this stretch that dates to April 28 at Philadelphia.

A Overall, the Braves are 16-8 (.667) on the road this season, the best road record in the N.L. and a half game behind Boston for the best in the majors.

A The Braves have played 24 road games this season, tied for the most in the N.L. with San Francisco and one off the lead of the Boston Red Sox.

DAY GAME: The Braves are 10-2 in day games this season, while averaging 6.75 (81 total) runs per game...They have averaged 4.89 (132 total) runs in their 27 night games.

A The Braves have 22 home runs in their 12 day games...They have 27 in their 27 night games.

INCIARTE: OF Ender Inciarte finished 2-for-4 yesterday and homered for the second consecutive day.

A Inciarte has gone 9-for-20 (.450) with two doubles and two home runs over his last five games following a career-worst 0-for-19 skid.

A Since beginning the season 11-for-60 (.183) with just two doubles in 14 games, Inciarte has gone 31-for-98 (.316) with four doubles, one triple, and three home runs in his last 24 games.

ANOTHER LEFTY: The Braves face another lefty starter today, their eighth in their last 11 games...Prior to this stretch, which began against Jason Vargas on May 3 at New York (NL), the Braves faced just three lefty starters all season...Today's starter José Quintana was one of those three.

A The Braves have the second-best OPS (.815) in the majors against all lefties.

A Overall, they are 7-3 against lefty starters, and 5-2 over this recent seven-game stretch.

Today's Game

- A* Set to make his ninth start of the season and the 171st (174th appearance) of his career.
- A* Was also Atlanta's scheduled starter on the date for which today's game was originally slated, 4/15.
- A* Has thrown 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the fourth-longest active run in the majors...His current run is tied for the second-longest such streak of his career, and trails just a career-most 23.0-inning scoreless stretch from 6/14-25/2016.
- A* Ended his start on 4/27 at PHI with 2.0 scoreless frames before tossing 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing just two hits, 5/3 at NYM...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings with just four hits allowed in his last turn, 5/9 at TB.
- A* In three career starts at Wrigley Field, has limited Cubs batters to a .183 (13-for-71) average with just four extra-base hits (two doubles, two home runs).
- A* Among all active starters with at least 20.0 innings at Wrigley Field, Teheran's .183 opponents' batting average ranks third...He trails just Mike Fiers (.141) and Jake Arrieta (.182).
- A* Is undefeated at Wrigley Field, going 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 ER/20.0 IP)...Tossed 7.0 shutout innings in his last start here, 5/1/16...The Braves are 3-0 when Teheran starts at Chicago.
- A* Is 2-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 ER/43.2 IP) and 43 strikeouts over seven career starts against Chicago overall...Atlanta as a team is 6-1 against the Cubs in Teheran's seven starts, outscoring Chicago 35-25.

2018 Recap

- A* Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last turn, 5/9 at TB...Allowed four hits and fanned seven...Logged consecutive scoreless starts for the fifth time in his career and the first since his final start of 2016 (10/2 vs. DET) and his first turn in 2017 (4/3 at NYM).
- A* The outing vs. TB snapped a streak of 11 consecutive starts within the N.L. East, dating to 9/6/17...According to STATS, LLC, Teheran was the first Braves pitcher to make 11 consecutive starts against his own division since RH Phil Niekro also made 11 straight in 1979-80.
- A* Held the Mets to two hits and two walks over 7.0 scoreless innings in his last start, 5/3 at Citi Field...Fanned six.
- A* Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before Asdrúbal Cabrera doubled with two outs...Was his longest no-hit bid since holding Pittsburgh without a hit for 7.2 innings on 6/5/13.
- A* Since his first full season in 2013, Teheran's 2.11 ERA (30 ER/128.0 IP) against the Mets is the second-best mark against the club among qualified starters in the majors...Only Max Scherzer (1.92) has a lower ERA against New York in that span.
- A* Allowed two hits and three runs over 3.0 innings, 4/27 at PHI...Left the game after 3.0 innings with right upper trap tightness.
- A* Threw just 43 pitches, the fewest he has thrown in a start in his career.
- A* Turned in 7.0 scoreless innings, 4/21 vs. NYM...Allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out six...Was his 11th straight start of at least 6.0 innings against the Mets.
- A* Earned his first win of the season, 4/16 vs. PHI...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just five hits and one run, striking out a season-best nine.
- A* Snapped a six-start winless stretch with the victory, which dated to 9/17/17...Went 0-3 with a 5.18 ERA (19 ER/33.0 IP) during his winless stretch.
- A* Made his second consecutive start against Washington, 4/9...Took the loss despite holding the Nationals to five hits and two runs in 6.0 innings of work...Struck out seven.
- A* In eight career instances in which he has faced the same opponent in back-to-back starts, is 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (14 ER/50.0 IP) and 31 hits allowed in the first meeting and 2-3 with a 3.61 ERA (19 ER/47.1 IP) and 52 hits allowed in the second.
- A* Went 2.1 innings and allowed six hits and five runs, 4/3 vs. WSH...Surrendered three home runs, which accounted for four of the five runs he allowed.
- A* Entered the game with a 19.0-inning scoreless streak against the Nationals before allowing three runs in the first...The 19.0-inning stretch was tied for the longest active scoreless streak by a starter against any one opponent in the majors...Research courtesy of STATS, INC.
- A* Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start, which set the Atlanta era (since 1966) record for a pitcher...Only two other Atlanta pitchers (Greg Maddux from 1993-96 and Rick Mahler 1985-88) went four straight...Only Phil Niekro (8), Maddux (7) and Mahler (5) made at least five Opening Day starts in total for Atlanta.
- A* The last Braves pitcher to make more than four consecutive Opening Day starts was Hall-of-Famer Warren Spahn, who started six straight Milwaukee openers from 1957-1962.
- A* Allowed four runs over 5.2 innings in a no-decision against Philadelphia, and is 1-1 with a 2.73 ERA (9 ER/29.2 IP) in five Opening Day starts.

Career Recap

- A* Signed a six-year contract through 2019, with an option for 2020, on February 14, 2014.... Is a two-time National League All-Star (2014, '16).

Season Long Streak: 3 games, 4/25-4/27 (6-13, .462, HR)

- Has six hits in his last 35 at-bats over an nine-game span dating to 5/4.
- Became the youngest player (20 years, 141 days) to homer in a 1-0 game (5/8 at TB) since 1935, when the Cubs' Phil Cavarretta did it at 19 years, 68 days.
- Became the youngest player to homer for the Braves since Andruw Jones in 1997, hitting a solo shot off Homer Bailey for his first career homer on 4/26 at CIN.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25, for his first appearance on a major league roster...Is the youngest player in baseball.
- Opened the season with Gwinnett and batted .232/.321/.304 over 17 games...Had 11 hits, seven runs, two extra-base hits and three steals in his last eight games.
- Entered the 2018 season tabbed as Atlanta's top overall prospect by both Baseball America and MLB.com, and as the top overall outfield prospect in the minors... MLB.com named him as the No. 2 prospect overall in the minor leagues.
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by both Baseball America and USA Today, Hitting Prospect of the Year by MLB Pipeline.com and Organizational Player of the Year by the Braves last season.

- Hitless over his last 12 at-bats.
- Leads the N.L. in extra-base hits (26), runs (37) and total bases (97)...Is tied for first in doubles (13), is second in home runs (12), seventh in hits (46) and slugging percentage (.564).
- Is hitting a .436 (17-for-39) in the first inning this season...His 17 hits and nine extra-base hits in the first inning are both the most in the majors, while his five home runs and 12 runs are tied for the most.
- Set the franchise record for most extra-base hits (22) by the end of April and tied for the second most in MLB history...Broke the Atlanta record of 17 held by Dale Murphy, Chipper Jones and Justin Upton...Finished one shy of Jermaine Dye's 2000 record.
- Hit his first career grand slam, 5/10 at MIA, becoming the youngest Braves player (21 years, 123 days) to hit one since fellow Curaçao native Andruw Jones on 8/31/97 at BOS.

- Hit his first home run with the Braves, 5/12 at MIA, to snap a 0-for-13 skid.
- Has gone 4-for-25 (.160) in nine games with the Braves after making his ATL debut on 5/4 when the club selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett...The club signed him to a minor league deal on 4/18.
- Appeared in 12 minor league games, going 11-for-43 (.256) with one home run, five RBI and eight walks.
- Started with Single-A Florida, appearing in two games and collected two hits in seven at-bats...Made his Strippers debut on 4/23 and hit .250 (9-for-36) with his lone home run.
- Appeared in 157 games with Toronto last season, hitting .203 (119-for-587) with 23 home runs and a .308 on-base percentage.
- Played third base eight times last season, making four starts there...Entering this season, played 394 career games at third base, 349 starts.

- Returned from his rehabilitation assignment, 4/18 and struck out as a pinch hitter... Missed 16 games with a right oblique muscle strain.
- Went 3-for-5 for Triple-A Gwinnett on 4/18 to become the first player to play in both a minor league and major league game on the same day since Lane Adams did it for the Braves last June 7.

- Is 2-for-12 (.167) as a pinch hitter with seven strikeouts.
- Acquired from LAD along w/three other players, 12/16/17 in exchange for M. Kemp.
- Split the 2017 season between the Dodgers and their Triple-A team at Oklahoma City before making the club's league championship and World Series roster.
- Played in 10 total postseason games in 2017, including five during the NLCS and five WS contests...Hit a combined .500 (8-for-16) with four extra-base hits.

- Made two starts in the MIA series, his first starts since 5/2...Started at third base in 23 of Atlanta's first 26 games.
- Combined with Johan Camargo to hit the Braves second pair of consecutive home runs this season, 5/2 at NYM.
- Hit in six straight games to open the season, 3/29-4/5 (.434, 10-for-23), his longest such streak since hitting in a career-best eight consecutive games, 6/18-29/13 (.483).
- Finished the 3/31 game going 4-for-5 with a career-most four runs...Became just the third 3B in Atlanta franchise (since 1966) history to score four runs and have four hits in a game joining C. Jones (3x, 1995, 2000, 2001) and T. Pendleton (1991).
- Appeared at five different positions in 2017, including 2B (12 games), 3B (5), SS (5), left field (1) and right field (1), despite playing in just 23 games.

- Is 6-for-23 (.261) since returning from the DL.
- The Braves returned him from his rehab assignment, 4/27, and reinstated him from the 10-day disabled list...Missed 23 games with a left oblique strain...Left Opening Day - his first career Opening Day start - during his second inning at-bat due to the injury.
- Batted a career-best .281 (89-for-317), with 12 HR and 49 RBI last season, his ninth at the MLB level...Also posted a career-best .378 OBP, which ranked 2nd on the team.
- Reached base at a .380 clip in 2017 while playing the catcher position, the second highest on-base percentage for a MLB catcher trailing only SF's Buster Posey.
- Returned to the Atlanta organization prior to the 2016 season...Signed a two-year contract through the 2017 season with the Braves on 12/17/15.
