## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 8-2 start matches the best 10-game start in team history (also: 2008)...they have started 9-2 once ('08).
- ♦ With a win today, Arizona would open the season with 4 consecutive series victories for the first time in franchise history... prior to this season, the D-backs had never won more than their first 2 series of a season in a row.
- ♦ The D-backs are 26-9 (.743) vs. NL West opponents since Aug. 25 of last season.
- ♦ The D-backs are 8-2 in their last 10 games vs. Giants...Arizona went 12-7 vs. the Giants in 2017, including 4-5 at AT&T Park.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** is looking to start 3-0 for the second time in his career (9-0 in 2013).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a .309 career hitter with 16 doubles, 9 home runs and 42 RBI @ AT&T Park.

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs defeated the Giants, 2-1.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** threw 7.0 shutout innings with 9 strikeouts, all of them on curveballs, 4 hits and no walks allowed...**Archie Bradley** tossed 1.0 perfect frame for his first save of the year.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 1-for-4 with a triple and a RBI...**Chris Owings** (1-for-4) extended his hitting streak to 9 games.

## FROM THE LEAGUE OFFICE

- ♦ Major League Baseball announced today that **Torey Lovullo** received a 1-game suspension and an undisclosed fine for his actions on Sunday @ St. Louis...D-backs bench coach **Jerry Narron** will serve as manager for tonight's game @ Giants.
- ♦ Narron has 5 years of managerial experience with the Rangers (2001-02) and Reds ('05-'07), posting an all-time 291-341 (.460) record.

## FAST START

- ♦ Arizona's 8-2 (.800) record is tied for the best 10-game start in team history (also: 2008), and is the second-best record in the NL behind the Mets (.889; 8-1).

## FOUR SCORE AND MANY WINS AGO

- ♦ Arizona has won 8 consecutive games when scoring 4 or more runs since Sept. 26, 2017, as well as 12 of its last 13 since Sept 13, and 22 of its last 26 since Aug. 22.

## SLINGIN' SOUTHPAW

- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** is looking to start 3-0 for the second time in his career (9-0 in 2013).
- ♦ With a win tonight, he would tie Ian Kennedy (48) for fourth place on the D-backs' all-time list and own a career winning record for the first time since he was 30-29 on July 15, 2016.
- ♦ Seeking his first win @ AT&T Park since Sept. 19, 2015.
- ♦ Was 3-1 with a 1.82 ERA (6 ER in 29.2 IP) in his final 5 road games (4 starts) in 2017.

## FROM THE TRAINING TABLE

- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** went 2-for-7 with 2 home runs in an extended spring game yesterday @ Salt River Fields, but underwent an MRI following the game after feeling soreness...will resume baseball activities in a couple of days.
- ♦ **Randall Delgado** will make the start tonight for Single-A Adv. Visalia...also started for the Rawhide on Saturday (0 ER in 1.0 IP).
- ♦ **Jake Lamb** began playing catch over the weekend and will take flips in the cage today.

## ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 23 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 16-7 (.696), the best record in the NL and third best in baseball behind the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 11-6 with a 2.64 ERA (38 ER in 129.1 IP), 143 strikeouts and 50 walks.

## BATMEN

- ♦ **Chris Owings** ranks second in the NL with a .400 average, tied for sixth with a .455 on-base pct. and ninth with a 1.021 OPS.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is tied with Eric Hosmer for the NL lead with 6 doubles, and is tied for second in the Majors with Dixon Machado/DET and Didi Gregorius/NYY, behind Xander Bogaerts/BOS (7).
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** is tied for eighth in the NL with 8 RBI...is hitting .360 (9-for-25)/.429 OBP/.600 SLG in 7 games.

**CORBIN AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ Sixth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Makes his first career Opening Day start today.
- ◆ Selected to the 2013 NL All-Star Team, named D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA and was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- ◆ Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

**WHAT TO KNOW...**

- ◆ Is looking to start 3-0 for the second time in his career (9-0 in 2013).
- ◆ With a win tonight, he would tie Ian Kennedy (48) for fourth place on the D-backs' all-time list.
- ◆ Aims for his first win @ AT&T Park since Sept. 19, 2015.
- ◆ Last owned a career winning record on July 15, 2016 (30-29).

**LAST START**

- ◆ Set a career high with 12 strikeouts on April 4 vs. Dodgers and allowed 1 hit over 7.1 scoreless innings.
- ◆ Matt Kemp's 2-out double in the fifth inning accounted for the Dodgers only hit.
- ◆ Became the third D-back to throw 7.0+ innings with 12+ strikeouts and no more than 1 hit and 1 walk allowed (also: Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 vs. Rockies & May 18, 2004 @ Braves; Ian Kennedy on Sept. 19, 2011; Robby Ray on Aug. 20, 2016 @ Padres).
- ◆ Was the first D-backs pitcher with 2+ hits and 12+ strikeouts since Javier Vazquez on Sept. 25, 2005 vs. Padres (2 H/12 SO).

**VS. GIANTS**

- ◆ Was 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (6 ER in 10.2 IP) in 2 starts in 2017 and is 5-7 with a 3.33 ERA (39 ER in 105.1 IP) in 19 games (17 starts) in his career.
- ◆ Is 1-4 with a 4.61 ERA (21 ER in 41.0 IP) in 7 starts @ AT&T Park.
- ◆ Owns a 2.21 ERA (5 ER in 20.1 IP) over his last 5 games (3 starts).
- ◆ Won his last start on Aug. 27, 2017 @ Chase Field (0 ER in 7.0 IP).

- ◆ Left-handers are 1-for-10 (.100).

- ◆ 2007 graduate of Cisero North Syracuse (N.Y.) High School...did not play baseball until his junior year...went to tryouts wearing jeans and told coaches he wanted to be a pitcher.
- ◆ Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
- ◆ Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

**OPENING DAY NOD**

- ◆ Won his first career Opening Day start on March 29 vs. Rockies (2 ER in 5.2 IP).
- ◆ Was announced as the D-backs' 2014 Opening Day starter vs. Dodgers in Sydney, Australia, before undergoing Tommy John Surgery...left his final Cactus League start on March 15 with elbow discomfort.

**2017 REVIEW**

- ◆ Tied his career highs in wins (14), starts (32) and strikeouts (178).
- ◆ Among all Major League pitchers, was seventh in ground ball percentage (51.5) and eighth in ground ball-to-fly ball ratio (2.01, 296:147).
- ◆ Posted a career-high 20.1-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 6-22, the seventh longest streak in the NL in 2017.

**TENURE**

- ◆ Made his Major League debut for the D-backs on April 30, 2012 @ Marlins, the third-longest tenured player with the club currently on the roster, behind only Paul Goldschmidt (debut: Aug. 1, 2011) and A.J. Pollock (April 18, 2012).

**ON THE D-BACKS LEADERBOARD**

- ◆ His 47 career wins are second most by a D-backs lefty behind Randy Johnson (118), and fifth-most in team history behind Johnson (118), Brandon Webb (87), Curt Schilling (58) and Ian Kennedy (48).
- ◆ His 671 strikeouts are second-most by a lefty behind Johnson (2,077) and fourth-most in club history behind Johnson (2,077), Webb (1,065), Schilling (875).
- ◆ His 123 career starts for Arizona are the fourth most in club history, trailing only Randy Johnson (232), Brandon Webb (198) and Brian Anderson (129).

  - ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
  - ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
  - ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
  - ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

**#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R**

- 6-4 • 225 • 25 (Aug. 10, 1992)**  
**SF Series:** 1-1 SV, 0 ER/1.0 IP, 2 K
- ◆ 6 of his appearances have been scoreless.
  - ◆ Registered at least 1 strikeout in 8 straight outings dating back to 2017 (13 SO total).
  - ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
  - ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA.
  - ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

  - ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
  - ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).
  - ◆ Has lived in a RV during the season since 2016.

- ◆ Has an 8-game scoreless streak (5.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 22, 2017.
  - ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
  - ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017, his first as primarily a reliever since 2006 with the Brewers and Royals...lefties hit .194/.253 OBP/.292 SLG.
  - ◆ Led the Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR) in 2017, tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010)...stranded his first 24 inherited runners to start the season (allowed run on Aug. 18 @ Twins).
  - ◆ 1 of 5 Mexican-born pitchers with 100+ wins (104), joining Fernando Valenzuela (173), Esteban Loaiza (126), Yovani Gallardo (113) and Ismael Valdez (104).

- ◆ Has held opponents scoreless in 5 of 7 outings...has not issued a walk.
  - ◆ Earned his first Major League win on April 8 vs. Cardinals.
  - ◆ Is the second player of Japanese descent to play for the D-backs (also: Takashi Saito).
  - ◆ Appeared in 58 games for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017, going 3-7 with 29 saves and 2.67 ERA.
  - ◆ Led the NPBL in saves (40) in 2014 and earned the league's Most Valuable Middle Reliever honors in 2011...played 12 seasons (2006-17) with Orix, going 48-69 with 156 saves, a 3.10 ERA and 884 strikeouts in 549 appearances (68 starts).
  - ◆ Signed a 2-year contract with the D-backs on Jan. 12.

  - ◆ Made 61 appearances with the Mets and Angels in 2017, going 2-2 with a 5.22 ERA.
  - ◆ Began 2017 with the Mets and pitched in 48 games before his release on Aug. 15...signed with the Angels as a Minor League free agent on Aug. 19 and was 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA and 0.66 WHIP in 13 games.
  - ◆ Is 1 of 2 players from Huatabampo, Mexico to play in the Major Leagues (also: Mel Amada, who was the first Mexico-born player to play in the Majors).
