## NEW YORK YANKEES (42-19) vs. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (36-27)

**AT A GLANCE:** Tonight the Yankees begin a six-game homestand, starting with a two-game set vs. the Nationals (tonight-Wed.)...will also play four games vs. the Rays (Thurs.-Sun.)...the team will then make a one-day trip to Washington on Monday to resume their suspended game from 5/15 and play a makeup game for their 5/16 rainout before returning to the Bronx for 3G vs. the Mariners (6/19-21)...went 7-2 on their rain-shortened, four-city road trip, going 2-0 vs. Baltimore, 1-1 vs. Detroit, 2-0 vs. Toronto and 2-1 vs. the Mets.

- ▶ At 42-19 (.689), have the Majors' best winning percentage...is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 28-20, the Yankees are 33-10).
- ▶ Are 23G over .500, one shy of their season high (24G over .500 at the end of play on 6/9).
- ▶ Marks the ninth time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 42 wins over their first 61 results...each of the other eight Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42)...joins the 1998 team (47-14) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 61G start over the last 65 seasons (since 1954).
- ▶ Over their last 15 completed series (since 4/19), are 13-1-1.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 11-4 so far.
- ▶ Are 15-9 vs. the AL East and 27-10 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 33-3 (.917) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season.
- ▶ Have not lost more than two consecutive games this season...their last losing streak of at least three games was from 8/28-8/30(G2)/17.
- ▶ Are tied for the second-most wins in the Majors' (42) despite playing just 62 games (tied for fewest).

**WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** The Yankees had their four-game winning streak snapped in a 2-0 loss in Sunday's series finale to the Mets at Citi Field...snapped a six-game winning streak in the Subway Series...**RHP Luis Severino** (5.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR) took the loss, snapping a 10-start undefeated streak (since 4/16)...allowed both runs on a two-run HR in the fifth...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-3) had his second straight multi-hit game, and leads the team with 22 such games...**Yankees relievers** (3.0IP, 1BB, 4K) allowed just 1-of-10BF to reach base and extended their scoreless inning streak to 18.1IP.

**BLANK SPACES:** Sunday's shutout loss was the first time the Yankees have been shut out this season and was their first shutout since 8/10/17 vs. Toronto (111 games in between, including the Yankees' suspended game on 5/15)...were the final Major League team to be shut out in 2018...are one-of-two teams to only suffer one shutout this season (also Cleveland).

- ▶ Is the longest streak between shutouts in the Majors since Detroit went 158 straight games without being shutout from 7/17/11-7/16/12.
- ▶ The 111-game stretch between shutouts is the longest such stretch by a Yankees team since 7/11/77-5/31/78 (123G).

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees are 17-4 in their last 21G at home...are 22-9 (.710) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the Majors' best win. pct. and the second-most home wins (BOS - 23).

- ▶ Since 8/31/17, are 36-13 in their last 49 regular season home games (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 14-1-1 in their last 15 home series (since 8/31/17), with five home series sweeps over that stretch...have won their last seven home series.
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in HR per game (1.58) and OBP (.353)...are tied for the lead in runs per game (5.84), are second in HR (49) and tied for second in runs (181)...have homered in 21 of their last 25G at home since 4/16 (42HR total).
- ▶ **RF Aaron Judge** is batting .349 (38-for-109) with 28R, 7 doubles, 12HR, 33RBI and 33BB in 31 games at Yankee Stadium this season...leads the Majors in home OBP (.500) and is tied for second in HR...ranks third in RBI and fifth in batting average.



**HOPE WEEK 2018 (June 11-15):** This year marks the 10th annual HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of

good will provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 30-12 (.714) during the event...have won 18 of their last 22 games during HOPE Week.

**NATIONAL PASTIME:** The Yankees are 3-2 in their first five completed Interleague games this season...are 9-2 in Interleague play since 7/25/17.

**JUNE SWOON:** Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.06 ERA (83.0IP, 19ER) in June (9G), the lowest ERA in the Majors in that span...have held opponents to a .175 BA this month.

- ▶ Have allowed a run in just three of their last 41.0IP (6ER).

**PEN PALS:** Yankees relievers did not allow a hit or run in 3.0IP on Sunday at the Mets (1BB, 4K)...allowed just 1-of-10BF to reach base...own a 18.1 scoreless inning streak since 6/4-G2 (7H, 6BB, 24K, 1HP).

- ▶ Lead the Majors in strikeouts (289) and rank second in opponents' BA (.204), trailing only Chicago-NL (.202).
- ▶ Since 4/21, Yankees relievers have posted a 2.31 ERA (140.0IP, 36ER) with 178K, the lowest bullpen ERA in the Majors over the span.
- ▶ Over his last 7G, **RHP Dellin Betances** has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (1H, 5K, 11K, 1HP)...ranks second in the AL and fourth in the Majors with 49K.

**CC THE STOPPER:** Since the start of 2017, **LHP CC Sabathia** is 10-0 with a 2.71 ERA (93.0IP, 28ER) in 16 regular season starts following a Yankees loss.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.45), HR (103), HR per game (1.66), SLG (.462), OPS (.795)...rank second in runs (338), OBP (.333), XBHs (233) and are tied for second in walks...are third in total bases (984).

- ▶ Have homered in 49 of their 62 games, tied for the most in the Majors (Toronto-42)...are on pace to hit 269HR...the MLB single-season HR record was set by the 1997 Mariners (264).

**HOLD IT RIGHT THERE:** **RHP Jonathan Holder** has not allowed an earned run in 17G since being recalled on 4/21, retiring 58-of-68 batters (19.0IP, 8H, 3R/0ER, 2BB/11BB, 19K).

**MIGGY, MIGGY, MIGGY:** **INF Miguel Andújar** is hitting .393 (24-for-61) with 12R, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR, 13RBI and 6BB in his last 17 games (since 5/20).

- ▶ Leads all MLB rookies with a .552 SLG and 31 extra-base hits and ranks second with 22 multi-hit games, a .310 batting average and 63H.
- ▶ Has six multi-hit games in his last 10G.
- ▶ Nine of his last 14H have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 3HR).

**YOUTH BEING SERVED:** Yankees rookie batters lead the Majors in hits (133), doubles (32), RBI (80) and runs scored (66)...are one of two teams with more than 15HR from rookies (SD-31, NYY-27)...also lead the Majors with a .282 batting average (133-for-472)...rookies in MLB are hitting .232.

**THE GLEY-HEY KID:** Since his debut on 4/22, **2B Gleyber Torres** leads Major League rookies 11HR and 29RBI and ranks third with a .297 (43-for-145) batting average.

- ▶ Recorded 11HR in his first 41 career games, tied for 10th-most in AL history through a player's first 41 career games...tied with Shane Spencer (11) for third-most by a Yankee through 41 games (Gary Sánchez and Kevin Maas-14 each).
- ▶ Each of his 11HR have come in the ninth spot in the lineup, tied with Alfonso Soriano (11HR in 2001) for the most by a Yankee in the No. 9 slot (credit: YES Network).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**June 12, 2009:** With two out in the ninth inning and the Yankees trailing the Mets, 8-7, Alex Rodriguez's pop fly is misplayed by Luis Castillo, allowing two runners to score and giving the Yankees a 9-8 "walk-off" win.

**June 12, 2008:** Hideki Matsui becomes the only Yankees player to hit a grand slam on his birthday, in a 4-1 win at Oakland.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**June 13, 2003:** In a 5-2 win vs. St. Louis at Yankee Stadium, Roger Clemens records both his 300th career win and 4,000th career strikeout (Edgar Renteria).

**June 13, 1948:** An ailing Babe Ruth makes his final appearance at Yankee Stadium as the Yankees retire his No. 3 during ceremonies commemorating the 25th anniversary of the Stadium. A little more than two months later, the 53-year-old Ruth will pass away after a battle with throat cancer.

**MONDAY:** The New York Yankees kicked off 2018 HOPE Week on Monday by honoring the Muddy Puddles Project. It was inspired by 5-year old Ty Campbell, a little boy who loved the children's cartoon Peppa Pig throughout his fight with cancer. His biggest dream was to jump in muddy puddles just like his animated hero. Sadly, he lost his battle with the disease, but his mother, Cindy, and father, Louis, started the Ty Louis Campbell Foundation and Muddy Puddles Project. Their mission is to inspire parents to embrace the simple joys of kids being kids while raising much-needed attention and funding for pediatric cancer research.

**HOPE Week Surprise:** **Manager Aaron Boone, Brett Gardner, Sonny Gray, Didi Gregorius, Bench Coach Josh Bard and NYCFC Goalkeeper Brad Stuver** surprised Cindy and Louis Campbell along with over 40 other families who have been affected by cancer at Mohawk Day Camp in White Plains as the group honored Ty by engaging in kid-inspired activities, including playing in a mud pit, water fights, "color-runs" and "pie-face."

**WEDNESDAY:** Founded by Reno, Nevada, native **Brian Williams**, "Think Kindness" visits schools in an effort to inspire measurable acts of kindness in schools and communities around the world. His group teaches that each act of kindness, no matter how small, has an unforeseeable ripple effect that makes the world a better place and each life more fulfilled. During each assembly, students learn the three most important lifeskills needed to change the world: Have no fear of being made fun of for doing the right thing, be committed to be a good person no matter how mean someone may be, and always live your life as if you were the hero of your dreams.

**HOPE Week Surprise:** The Yankees will join Brian Williams at a local elementary school, for a motivational assembly for 200 fourth and fifth graders about the virtues of being kind.

**THURSDAY:** **Wish of a Lifetime** is an organization that connects senior citizens to people and passions to eliminate feelings of isolation and help them live vibrant, purposeful lives. The organization's mission is to shift the way society views and values our oldest generations by fulfilling seniors' dreams and sharing their stories to inspire those of all ages. This organization has asked us to honor St. Petersburg, Fla., resident Sal Reale, who grew up in New York and went to Yankees games a child. He served as a radio operator in the Korean War in the 1950s, then upon returning home, served as a New York City transit officer for a few years before embarking on a 20-year career with the New York City Fire Department.

**HOPE Week Surprise:** Wish of a Lifetime and the Yankees are granting his wish to visit his old firehouse in Queens so he can reminisce about the old days and swap stories with the firefighters who currently serve there.

**FRIDAY:** The Yankees will recognize **Mark Bustos**, founder of **Be Awesome to Somebody**. For the last six years, the Manhattan-based hairdresser has set aside his Sunday afternoons to give haircuts to members of New York City's homeless community. Once a week, rain or shine, the 33-year-old packs his clippers, scissors and a smile, ventures out in Manhattan, and tries to leave a positive impact on as many people as he can. Bustos was first exposed to the reality of poverty during a childhood visit to see family in the Philippines. On a return visit to the island in 2012, he rented a barber's chair for the day and provided free haircuts to as many impoverished children as he could find. Encouraged by that enlightening experience in the Philippines, he vowed to continue making a difference once he returned home to New York, and brought the concept with him. Mark now travels the globe to give talks about how he balances his time between his hairstyling career and his volunteering efforts, inspiring others along the way. On every trip, no matter where in the world he is, he always finds time to go out and find people to give haircuts to.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (3-1, 3.59 ERA)

**LHP CC Sabathia** will make his 12th start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Washington...the 37-year-old will pitch on extended six days' rest...is 3-1 with a 3.51 ERA (48.2IP, 44H, 26R/19ER, 13BB, 37K, 7HR, 1HP) in nine starts since returning from the D.L. on 4/19...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,890), complete games (38) and quality starts (306)...ranks second in wins (240), innings pitched (3,374.2) and starts (520) to Bartolo Colon (243 wins, 3,386.2IP, 539 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,890K), third all-time among left-handers...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...is one of four players currently on a 40-man roster who were active in 2001 (Adrián Beltré, Bartolo Colon, Albert Pujols)...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins).

**LAST START:** Earned his third win and matched his longest start of the season (also 4/29 at Los Angeles-AL) on 6/5 at Toronto (7.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 1BB, 6K, 2HR)...snapped a five-start winless streak...was his 266th start as a Yankee, surpassing Fritz Peterson (265) for sole possession of 10th place on the Yankees' all-time starts list...also reached 1,715.1IP as a Yankee, surpassing Ray Caldwell (1,713.0) for 12th place on the club's all-time list...was his 123rd win as a Yankee, tying Mike Mussina for 12th place on the franchise's wins list...was his 240th career win, breaking a tie with RHP Mordecai Brown and LHP David Wells (239 each) and tying LHP Frank Tanana (240) for 55th place on the all-time wins list...now ranks 14th in wins among LHP all time.
