## SAN DIEGO NOTES

- **The Padres earned their fifth walk-off victory of the season** and their first since Aug. 30 vs. COL when Franmil Reyes recorded a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup> inning.
- **Francisco Mejia recorded his first career walk-off hit and grand slam**...it was the second walk-off grand slam by a rookie in Padres history (Everth Cabrera on Aug. 9, 2009 vs. NYM) and the fourth grand slam hit by a Padre this season (last: Freddy Galvis on Aug. 12 vs. PHI)...is batting .241 (7-for-29) with three home runs and eight RBI in 11 games as a Padre.
- **Jacob Nix** tossed his third quality start of the season...has worked at least 5.0 IP in five of his seven starts, posting a 2-2 record and a 3.45 ERA (12 ER, 31.1 IP) over that span.
- **Hunter Renfroe** belted his team-leading 23<sup>rd</sup> homer...hit safely in 17 of his last 21 games since Aug. 23, batting .282 (24-for-85) with a .635 SLG...his nine home runs in that time are tied with MIL's Christian Yelich for the most in the N.L.
- **Manuel Margot** logged his sixth triple of the season and first since Aug. 7 at MIL...is hitting .310 with RISP this year after slashing .194/.253/.306 with RISP in 2017.
- **Franmil Reyes** is riding an eight-game hitting streak since Sept. 7 at CIN (.393, 11-for-28)...has hit safely in 21 of his last 23 games, going 27-for-70 (.386) with two doubles and six home runs.
- **Andy Green** received his fourth ejection of the season and the ninth of his career.

## TEXAS NOTES

- **Mike Minor** has posted a 6-1 record with a 2.72 ERA ( 16 ER, 53.0 IP) in nine starts since the All-Star break...entering the day, his 2.70 ERA since the break ranked 9<sup>th</sup> in the A.L. among pitchers with eight-or-more starts.
  - Logged his first hit since Aug. 28, 2014 at NYM (while with ATL)...his double snapped an 0-for-34 span for Texas pitchers at the plate (last hit was Andrew Cashner's single on June 9, 2017 at WAS)...it was the first extra base hit by a Texas pitcher since Yu Darvish on Aug. 24, 2016 at CIN and the first double by a Texas pitcher since Yovani Gallardo on Sept. 1, 2015 at SD.
- **Jurickson Profar** went 2-for-4 and belted his 18<sup>th</sup> homer of the season...extended his hitting streak to four games (.438, 7-for-16) and has nine RBI over his last 15 games.
- **Willie Calhoun** recorded his second home run of the season and first since July 24 vs. OAK.
- **Robinson Chirinos** was hit by a pitch for the 17<sup>th</sup> time this season...surpassing Alex Rodriguez for the second-highest single-season total in Rangers history and two shy of tying Carlos Gomez's 19 set in 2017.
