Eugenio Suárez, hitting .292, is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...Bos' **J.D. Martinez** (.332, 39 HR, 117 RBI) is the only other player in the Major Leagues to match those numbers in the **Triple Crown** categories...Oak's **Khris Davis**, hitting .248, is the only other player in the majors with at least **31 HR** (41) and **100 RBI** (108).

HOTTEST CORNER

Eugenio Suárez (.292, 31 HR, 100 RBI) is the fourth player in franchise history to hit **30 HR** in a season while playing primarily third base (list below)...is the 18th Reds player to produce at least **30 HR** and **100 RBI** in a season...is trying to become the ninth Reds player to produce **30 HR** and **100 RBI** while hitting at least **.300**.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 4** (2-1) of a 4-game series vs **Darren Feeney's Padres** and **Game 4** (2-1) of a 7-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game series vs the **Dodgers**...the Reds preceded this homestand with a **4-12 stretch vs National League Central** rivals that featured **13 games on the road** (1-2 at Mil, 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 vs Mil, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 at Pit)...following this homestand, the Redlegs head out for their final road trip (3g at Cubs, 3g at Mil, 4g at Mia) before finishing the 2018 championship season with a 5-game homestand vs the **Royals** (2g) and **Pirates** (3g).

BLUE WAHOO: With Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** hosting his annual charity golf tournament, Class AA Pensacola's **Tommy Thrall** is joining **Jeff Brantley** on **700 WLW Radio's** game broadcasts this weekend at **Great American Ball Park**...Thrall is in his seventh season in Pensacola after working 8 seasons with the **Kansas City T-Bones**, **Myrtle Beach Pelicans** and **Quad Cities River Bandits**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds haven't won a **season series vs SD** since **2012** (6-2) and since then are **15-23**, including **12-20** the last 5 years...**Reds vs Padres** information is on media guide **Page 329**.

DODGERS UP NEXT: The Reds and Dodgers begin a 3-game series here tomorrow...LAD's **.615 winning percentage** at **Great American Ball Park** (32-20) is the second-best by any National League team here (Mets, .667, 30-15)...the Reds swept the 4-game series in May at **Dodger Stadium**...in their **6 series** covering the **previous 3 seasons** (2015-2017), the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...entering this season, Cin had lost **17 of 19 games vs LAD**...in May, the Reds produced their **first series win vs LAD** since **September 2013**, their **first series win at Dodger Stadium** since **June 2011** and their **first 4-game sweep** of the Dodgers since **August 1976**...prior to that **May series win**, the Reds had gone **0-6-2** in the **previous 8 series vs LAD**...that winning **May series** snapped the Reds' **6-series losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...the Reds' **4-1 win on 5/10** snapped their **8-game losing streak** to the Dodgers and their **9-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

POSTSEASON: Class AA Pensacola last night was eliminated from the **Southern League playoffs** with a 9-1 loss at **Biloxi** in **Game 4** of the semifinal...last night at Hammond Field at CenturyLink Sports Complex, Class A **Daytona** lost to **Fort Myers**, 12-2, in **Game 2** of the **Florida State League** best-of-5 finals...the **Tortugas** face elimination in tonight's **Game 3**...rookie **Billings** last night was eliminated from the **Pioneer League** playoffs with a 9-2 loss at **Great Falls**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **58-67** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

HURLING: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **16-26-2** in their **44 completed series**, including **11-10-1** in the **last 22 completed series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2** in their last 8 series vs **first-place teams** (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle**, **3-1 vs Phi**, **2-1 vs Ari**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.360)...All-Star **1B Joey Votto** leads the NL in on-base percentage...All-Star **2B Scouter Gennett** leads the National League in hitting and 3-hit games while ranking second in multi-hit games and third in hits...All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** ranks among the NL leaders in several statistical categories...he is the leader in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6).

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **11 grand slams**, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the **National League record** (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the Reds produced **9 grand slams** in the first half, tying the **2010 Yankees** for the most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **11 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Joey Votto** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit), **José Peraza** and **Scott Schebler**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the **WSox** on **5/16/1953** at **NYC**.

Today's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...is taking **Homer Bailey's** spot in the rotation...is making his 23rd start of the season, his first for the Reds since **8/2 at Wsh**, and the 27th appearance and start of his **career**...following that 10-4 loss on **8/2 at Wsh** was optioned to Class AAA Louisville, where he went **2-1, 2.73** in 5 starts until he was recalled after the Bats' season ended (29.2ip, 22h, 9er, 11bb, 20k, 4hr)...hasn't pitched since an 8-1 Bats win on **8/30 at Columbus** (5.2ip, 4h, 1er, 4bb, 5k, 1hr, 103 pitches)...when optioned to Louisville on 8/3, he led the staff with **7 wins**, was tied with **Sal Romano** for the staff lead with **7 quality starts** and led National League rookies in **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts** while ranking sixth in **ERA**...from **6/1-7/6** went in the **4-0, 2.04** in the **first winning streak** of his career...his career-high **12 strikeouts** in the **12-3 win on 6/30 vs Mil** still are the most by a Reds pitcher this season, were the most by a Reds pitcher since rookie **LHP Amir Garrett** had **12 strikeouts** on **4/19/17 vs Bal** and were the most by a Reds righthander since rookie **Raisel Iglesias** had **13 strikeouts** on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scooter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (**RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin, OF Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs was **23 years, 185 days old**.

- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including 3 multi-hit games (8-16, .500, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).
- In his last 87 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .316 (111-351, 19 2b, 4 3b, 8hr, 37rbi, 12sb, .462slg, .356obp), raising his season BA from .243.
- Leads the team in starts at 2 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (48gs) and second (56gs), and ranks second batting seventh (22gs, Barnhart 28gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...from 7/15-8/15 made a season-high 26 consecutive starts batting first and since then has made his last 20 starts batting second.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Homestand: 3-11, 2hr, 6rbi

- Has a 5-game hitting streak (7-19, .368, 2hr, 6rbi, .684slg, .400obp) and at least 1 RBI in each of his last 3 apps (2hr, 6rbi)...in his last 10 apps is hitting .353 with 3 multi-hit games (12-34, 3 2b, 3hr, 8rbi, .706slg, .463obp).
- In 14 apps since he came off the disabled list on 8/25 is hitting .255 (13-51, 3 2b, 3hr, 9rbi)...had been on the DL since 7/18 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder suffered on 7/14 at StL when he hit the outfield walk while making a catch.
- Made his last 2 starts batting first...has made 33 career starts batting leadoff (42-140, .300), including 28 times this year (35-118, .297).
- Fri's grand slam off Rowan Wick was the second of his career and the 10th by a Reds batter this season, setting a new club record (9 grand slams, 2002).
- Has made a team-high 63 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Homestand: 3-9, 2bb, 2r

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- His 31 HR, 100 RBI and .923 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with three 10-game hitting streaks (13g, 13g, 14g), joining Atl's Nick Markakis (12g, 11g, 11g) and Freddie Freeman (16g, 10g, 10g), Hou's Yuli Gurriel (11g, 12g, 13g) and Alex Bregman (12g, 10g, 11g) and KC's Whit Merrifield (12g, 12g, 12g)...Suárez' career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10) are the longest by any Reds batter this season
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf Homestand: 1g as PH, 1g at 2B, 0-1

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In Mon's 5-1 loss at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- On 9/1 was promoted from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (.429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Homestand: 2-8, grand slam, 4bb

- Yesterday's grand slam was his first home run since 7/9 at Cle, snapping a 36-game homerless streak that did not include his HR in the All-Star Game...was the second-longest single-season homerless stretch of his career (40g, 6/25-10/3, 2012).
- Reached base safely in each of his last 9 apps (9-29, .310, 1 2b, 1hr, 6rbi, .462obp).
- In 10 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on 8/30 is hitting .265 (9-34, 1 2b, 1hr, 6rbi, .409obp)...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of Homestand: 1g as PH/CF, 1gs as CF, 2-5, 1hr, 1rbi

- In the seventh inning of Thu's 6-2 loss vs SD hit his first career pinch-hit HR (solo off Trey Wingenter).
- In his last 17 apps beginning 8/18 is hitting .351 (13-37, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi, .541slg, .400obp), raising his season BA from .267.
- Has made 16 starts in RF (last, 8/24 at Cubs), 4 starts in CF (last, 9/7 vs SD) and 2 starts in LF (9/2 at StL, Wed at Pit).
- During Scott Schebler's most recent stint on the disabled list started 18 of the Reds' 26 games (17gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 13 of those 18 starts (19-68, .279, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, 6r).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
