HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 9-7 vs. Dodgers this season and 5-2 at home, their 11th season with a winning/tied record (2017: 6-3, 2016: 5-5, 2012: 6-3, 2008: 5-4, 2006: 6-3, 2005: 5-4, 2003: 5-5, 2001: 5-5, 2000: 5-1, 1999: 5-2).
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 4-0 with a 2.19 ERA (9 ER in 37.0 IP), .211 opponent average and 62 strikeouts in 6 starts vs. Dodgers since the start of last season.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base via hit or walk in 18 of his last 22 home games, hitting .284 (23-for-81)/.945 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 11 RBI, 1 HBP and 13 walks.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is batting .333 (17-for-51)/.386 OBP/.510 SLG with 3 home runs, 10 RBI and 8 runs in his last 15 games.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs dropped the season finale vs. Rockies, 2-0.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (14-11) took the loss, allowing 2 runs in 5.0 innings with 5 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** (1.0 IP), **Jake Diekman** (1.0), **Yoan López** (1.0) and **Silvino Bracho** (1.0) combined to allow 1 hit in 4.0 frames.
- ♦ **David Peralta** and **Chris Owings** both went 2-for-3...**Steven Souza Jr.** left the game with lower back spasms.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

- ♦ The D-backs announced today they named INF **Jazz Chisholm** and RHP **Taylor Widener** the organization's Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Year.
- ♦ Chisholm, 20, hit .272 (124-for-456)/.329 OBP/.513 SLG with 23 doubles, 6 triples, 25 home runs, 70 RBI, 39 walks, 17 stolen bases and 79 runs scored in 112 games between Single-A Kane County and Single-A Advanced Visalia.
- ♦ Widener, 23, was named *Baseball America's* Double-A Pitcher of the Year, going 5-8 with a 2.75 ERA (42 ER in 137.1 IP), .197 opponent average, 176 strikeouts and 43 walks in 26 games (25 starts) for the Southern League Champion Jackson Generals.

A RECORD-SETTING STRETCH

- ♦ The D-backs tied the Major League record with 14 straight games, from Sept. 6-19, against teams in first place at the time of the series (Braves, Rockies, Astros and Cubs), along with the 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers, per Elias Sports Bureau.
- ♦ Including the current series vs. Dodgers, 17 of the D-backs' last 20 games will have come against first place teams.

DOMINATING THE DODGERS

- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 7-3 with a 2.63 ERA (25 ER in 85.2 IP), .195 opponent average and 114 strikeouts in 14 career starts... **his career 11.98 strikeouts per 9.0 IP is the highest rate by a pitcher all-time vs. Dodgers (min. 75.0 IP):**

- ♦ Since the start of last season, Ray is 4-0 with a 2.19 ERA (9 ER in 37.0 IP), .211 opponent average and 62 strikeouts in 6 starts vs. Dodgers.

PERALTA'S POWER SURGE

- ♦ **David Peralta's** 29 homers are 1 shy of becoming the sixth D-backs outfielder to reach 30+ homers [stats as OF only], joining Luis Gonzalez (2x; 2000-01), Steve Finley (2x; 1999-2000), Reggie Sanders (2001), Justin Upton (2011), Chris Young (2007).
- ♦ Should Peralta reach 30 homers, it would mark the first time Arizona boasted multiple 30-homer hitters in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2001...Paul Goldschmidt (36) and Jake Lamb (30) each reached the milestone last year.

HIRANO AMONG JAPANESE & ARIZONA ROOKIE RELIEVERS

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 73 relief appearances are tied for the most by a Japanese rookie reliever with Akinori Otsuka/SD in 2004, ahead of Takashi Saito/LAD in 2006 (72), Hideki Okajima/BOS in 2007 (66) and Kazuhiro Sasaki/SEA in 2000 (63).
- ♦ Hirano's 2.09 ERA is the lowest by a D-backs rookie reliever in club history, ahead of José Valverde (2.15 in 2003) and Oscar Villarreal (2.46 in 2003), while his 73 appearances are second to Oscar Villarreal (85 in 2003).

GOLDSCHMIDT AND .300

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached the .300 plateau twice recently (Sept. 7 and 12) after being at .198 on May 22.
- ♦ Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau, Goldschmidt is the first player in the liveball era (since 1920) to increase their batting average to .300 or higher in a season in which it was under .200 at some point after at least 200 plate appearances.
- ♦ In 105 games since May 23, is batting .335 (135-for-403)/.426 OBP/.625 SLG/1.051 OPS with 27 doubles, 3 triples, 28 homers, 70 RBI, 3 HBP and 61 walks.

EDUARDO A GO-GO!

- ♦ **Eduardo Escobar's** 47 doubles are tied with José Altuve/HOU in 2014 for the fourth most all-time by a Venezuela-born player behind Miguel Cabrera/DET 52 in 2014, 50 in 2006, 48 in 2011.
- ♦ His 47 doubles are tied for 10th most all-time in a season by a switch-hitter with Randy Winn/SEA & SF (2005), Pete Rose/CIN (1975) and Wes Parker/LAD (1970) [next: Dmitri Young/CIN (48 in 1998), Jed Lowrie/OAK (49 in 2017) and Brian Roberts/BAL (50 in 2004)].

- ♦ Overall, Arizona has drawn 2,159,705 fans to Chase Field this year, surpassing the 2,134,375 it drew in 2017...if the D-backs draw more than 17,912 tonight, they will surpass the 2012 club (2,177,617) for the 10th best single-season attendance in team history.

DESCALSO HAVING A CAREER YEAR

- ♦ Daniel Descalso has set career highs with 13 homers, 57 RBI, 63 walks, .355 OBP, .440 SLG, .795 OPS and is approaching other milestones, including 81 hits (86 in 2011), 21 doubles (25 in 2013), 412 plate appearances (426 in 2012).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MATT KOCH (5-5, 4.26)

- ♦ 4 of his last 5 outings have been scoreless (3.38 ERA; 4 ER in 10.2 IP).
- ♦ Has won each of his last 3 starts at home since May 28, posting a 3.50 ERA (7 ER in 18.0 IP).
- ♦ Did not factor into the decision in his lone career outing vs. Dodgers on May 1 (3 R/2 ER in 5.0 IP).
