LEADING OFF: LAA plays an 11-game homestand vs. Minnesota (May 10-13), Houston (May 14-16) and Tampa Bay (May 17-20)...Club went 3-2 on five-game trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (1-1)...Yesterday's 8-0 win marked third SHO of season...LAA is 6-2 this month to move a half-game behind first place Houston...Halos are 9-11 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA owns an MLB-best 14-4 road record...Halos are 8-3-1 in 12 series played.

MOVIN' ON UPTON: Justin Upton has hit safely in eight of last nine games batting .333 (13/39) with 4 HR, and 12 RBI coming in his last seven games

START ME UP: Angels' starting pitchers have now gone 5+ innings of no-run baseball in six of last eight games.

WALK IN THE PARK: With his 600th career walk Tuesday, Mike Trout became just the fifth player with 600 walks and 200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining Mickey Mantle, Eddie Mathews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.

VIRGIN ISLAND TEAMMATES: Yesterday at Colorado, Jabari Blash and Akeel Morris both appeared in the game for the Angels, the first time two natives of the U.S. Virgin Islands played as teammates since RHP Al McBean and C Elmo Plaskett both played for Pittsburgh from 1961-63.

DID YOU KNOW? With six strikeouts Sunday at Seattle, Shohei Ohtani (32 Ks) became just the third Angel pitcher to reach 30+ Ks thru five outings joining Bo Belinsky (35) and Jered Weaver (31). With the win, he is the 8th Angels' pitcher with a winning decision in three of his first five career starts (first since Sean O'Sullivan in 2009).

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, Albert Pujols...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (Adrián Beltré; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – Beltre).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Beltre & Musial) - STATS LLC.
- Joins Rod Carew (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000th hit in an Angels' uniform.

3x3x3: Pujols has matched Stan Musial and Alex Rodriguez as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.

SIMBA SIZZLIN': Andrelton Simmons had his 12-game hit streak snapped yesterday...During the streak, he batted .438 (21/48) with eight runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI...Hit streak was second of 8+ games this season (March 29-April 6)...His .339 clip season ranks fifth in A.L.

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Shohei Ohtani was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since Fergie Jenkins in Sept., 1971...Ohtani tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (Jackie Warner in 1966)...Ohtani has a hit in 12 of 14 starts at DH this season.

Has a long ball in nine of 12 completed series this season...12 HRs rank 2nd in MLB...His nine HRs in April equaled club record set by Albert Pujols (2014) & Brian Downing (1987).

THIS N' THAT: Halos' average home attendance of 39,525 leads A.L...Club boasts six sellouts already...LAA has committed 15 errors thru 36 games (third fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct...Halos hurlers have issued 140 free passes, second-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has tossed 148.2 IP to lead all of baseball (average 4.1 IP per game)...Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign - Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4)... Angels' pitching staff has recorded 10+ strikeouts 16 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 35 games of the season (previous was 12; three times).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

May 10

(2002) Angels post a 19-0 shutout victory over Chicago White Sox, marking the most runs ever scored at home (until 2004; 21 runs)...Halos collected 24 hits, also the most ever at home...19-0 shutout was the largest margin of victory ever for the club in a shutout...The 19-run victory was the second such margin of victory in 11 days for Angels (also April 30 at Cleveland - 21-2 win).

May 11

(1977) Bobby Bonds, Don Baylor and Ron Jackson hit back-to-back-to-back home runs in the second inning of the Angels' 6-0 win vs. Baltimore; (1990) Angels traded pitcher Mike Witt to the New York Yankees in exchange for outfielder Dave Winfield, who was later named Comeback Player of the Year by The Sporting News; (1962) Bo Belinsky wins his fifth consecutive start, one of only two players (Jered Weaver) in LAA history to win their first five MLB starts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

4-1, 3.93 ERA

Is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (31 IP – 9 ER) in five career games vs. Minnesota

- Making eighth start of the season and fourth at home.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Friday at Seattle after tossing 6.2 shutout innings and allowing four hits and one walk with eight strikeouts...15th career scoreless start (first of 2018); 11th scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP.
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Allowed two-or-fewer runs in five of last six games, including four straight starts from April 3-21 (pitched to a 2.57 ERA (21 IP – 6 ER) in that span)...Longest such streak of career is five straight starts (three times; last April 24 – May 17, 2015).
- **CAREER-HIGH K's:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks tied for second (with **Chris Sale**) in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .218 (.381/1744) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind only **Corey Kluber** (.217).
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 11 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2-1 record and 2.29 ERA (55 IP – 14 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in nine of the 11 starts.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 20-16 record and 3.29 ERA (309 IP – 113 ER) in 58 games (49 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 20 wins are tied for seventh most in the Majors in that span.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, leads all A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.8 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 30 IP), ranks fourth in the A.L. with a 95.7 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, **NY Yankees** (97.8 MPH), **Charlie Morton**, **HOU** (96.0 MPH) and **Gerrit Cole**, **HOU** (95.8 MPH).
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** Tonight marks first start vs. Twins since April 15, 2016 at Target Field...In five career games (four starts) vs. Minnesota, is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (31 IP – 9 ER)...Has registered a quality start in all four career starts vs. Twins.
- **AGAINST THE A.L. CENTRAL:** Owns a 10-5 record and 3.41 ERA (145 IP – 55 ER) in 37 career games (19 starts) against the A.L. Central...In two starts this year, is 2-0 with a 2.53 ERA (10.2 IP – 3 ER) against Central division opponents.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Owns a 24-15 career record with a 3.49 ERA (350.2 IP – 136 ER) in 78 appearances (51 starts) at Angel Stadium...In three starts at home this season, is 2-1 with a 6.08 ERA (13.1 IP – 9 ER)...Since 2014, is 18-11 with a 3.16 ERA (233.2 IP – 82 ER)...Overall as a starter, is 24-13 with a 3.41 ERA (319.1 IP – 121 ER) at the Big A...Angels are 32-19 in his home starts.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **2017 SEASON:** Exited first start of year (Apr. 5, 2017 at OAK) after five scoreless innings with right biceps strain...Missed 135 games on disabled list...Returned to Angels on Sept. 5, 2017 at OAK...Made five September starts and pitched to a 2.74 ERA (23 IP – 7 ER) for the month...Allowed one-or-fewer runs in four of six starts on the season.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 161 career games (106 starts), is 44-35 with a 3.55 ERA (702.2 IP – 277 ER) and 603 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 33-22 with a 3.12 ERA (472.2 IP – 164 ER).
