### ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (46-43) at CHICAGO WHITE SOX (30-60)

#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost five straight games, nine of the last 11 and 18 of 24 as they begin their final homestand before the All-Star break tonight vs. St. Louis.
- RHP Dylan Covey is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high 30 games under .500 for the first time since the end of the 2013 season (63-99).
- The Sox went 2-8 on their last trip ... they were swept in four games at Houston and lost two of three at Texas and Cincinnati.
- Following this brief two-game set vs. the Cardinals and an off day Thursday, the Sox will conclude the pre All-Star portion of their schedule with three games vs. Kansas City from 7/13-15.
- Chicago will open the second half with a seven-game trip at Seattle (7/20-22) and Los Angeles-AL (7/23-26).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) from 5/22-28 (rainout on 5/21).

#### TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are off to their third-worst start in franchise history (29-61 twice; last 1948) ... their 60 losses are the most before the All-Star break in club history.
- Chicago is 4-2 over its last six games at Guaranteed Rate Field, outscoring opponents by a 37-21 margin ... the club has hit eight home runs during that span.
- The Sox have homered in six of their last seven games (12 home runs total), and hit 22 in the last 16 contests.
- The White Sox have alternated wins and losses in each of their last seven interleague games ... they have not won consecutive IL games since 9/9-10/17 vs. San Francisco.
- Chicago is batting .304/.359/.516 with 20 homers and 87 runs scored in 11 home games (7.9 R/G) all-time vs. St. Louis.

#### ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to tonight's game vs. St. Louis, Chicago placed OF Avisail Garcia on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 7/9) with a strained right hamstring and added OF Ryan LaMarre to the 25-man roster.
- LaMarre, who will wear uniform No. 25, was claimed off waivers yesterday from Minnesota ... he batted .263 (26-99) with five doubles, eight RBI and seven runs scored in 43 games over four stints with the Twins this season before being DFA on July 2.
- Garcia is hitting .282 (40-142) with six doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 17 RBI over 35 games this season.

#### NEXT MAN UP

- White Sox pitching coach Don Cooper will miss tonight's game after undergoing successful hand surgery yesterday in Chicago ... he is expected to return to the club for tomorrow's contest.
- Bullpen coach Curt Hasler will be in the dugout handling pitching-coach duties for tonight's game.

#### SUNDAY'S RECAP

- Houston limited the White Sox to two hits over the final four innings, and Héctor Rondón retired the side in order in the ninth to close out a 2-1 win and cap a four-game series sweep.
- Marwin González snapped a 1-1 tie with a suicide squeeze bunt in the seventh after Tim Anderson hit a sac fly in the top half.
- Lucas Giolito suffered the loss despite allowing two runs on three hits (José Altuve solo homer) over a career-high 7.1 IP.
- Avisail Garcia (1-3) left the game with right hamstring tightness ... the Sox went 0-7 with RISP and left eight on base.
- Chicago was swept in a season series of seven games or more for the first time in franchise history.

#### MR. ABREU GOES TO WASHINGTON

- José Abreu has been selected by the fans to be the starting first baseman for the American League in the 2018 All-Star Game at Nationals Park on 7/17 ... it marks the second All-Star selection of his career (reserve in 2014).
- He paced AL first basemen with 1,829,598 votes.
- Abreu is the first White Sox to be voted into the ASG by the fans since first baseman Frank Thomas in 1996 ... Thomas did not play in the game due to injury.
- He is the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan elected as a starter, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).
- Abreu is the fourth Chicago first baseman since 1970 to make multiple All-Star teams, joining Allen, Thomas and Paul Konerko.

#### DENNIS THE MENACE SIGHTING

- Former Sox C.A.J. Pierzynski will be at the ballpark tonight to introduce his limited-edition bobblehead that will benefit White Sox Charities ... the bobblehead features Pierzynski's bleach blonde hair during an at-bat from the 2008 "Blackout Game."
- It will be available for purchase online at whitesox.com/ajbobble (\$35) beginning today and at home games later this month.

#### WHITE SOX VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS

- St. Louis leads the season series, 2-0, after sweeping a brief two-game set from 5/1-2 at Busch Stadium.
- Chicago is hitting .190/.268/.222 with zero homers, own a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP) with two QS and have been outscored, 6-4.
- The White Sox have lost four consecutive games and six of the last eight ... the Sox and Cardinals split four games in 2015.
- The Sox trail in the all-time series, 11-16, going 6-5 in Chicago and 5-11 on the road (3-4 at new Busch Stadium).
- The Cardinals own a 144-143 edge in runs scored all-time.

#### CARDINAL CONNECTIONS

- White Sox bench coach Joe McEwing began his MLB career with the Cardinals, appearing in 162 games from 1998-99.
- Sox OF Charlie Tilson originally was drafted by St. Louis in the second round of the 2011 draft ... he was acquired by Chicago in exchange for LHP Zach Duke on 7/31/16.
- Cardinals INF José Martínez originally was signed by the White Sox as an international free agent in 2006 ... his father, Carlos, played for the White Sox from 1988-90.
- Cardinals INF Paul DeJong (Antioch) and RHP Luke Gregerson (Park Ridge) are natives of the Chicagoland area.
- St. Louis radio broadcaster John Rooney called White Sox games for 18 seasons, including the 2005 championship year.

#### INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 4-11 during interleague play, winning four of the last nine games after losing each of the first six contests ... they have been held to three runs or less seven times in 2018.
- The Sox will finish with a losing record vs. the National League for the fourth consecutive season (went 11-9 in 2014).
- Chicago is 4-3 over its last seven but 4-8 in its last 12 IL games at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox went 6-14 in 2017.
- The Sox are 210-188 all-time during IL play (since 1997).

#### 1993 WHITE SOX REUNION

- The White Sox will welcome back coaches and players from the 1993 American League West Division Championship team on Saturday vs. Kansas City.
- Among those scheduled to appear in honor of the 25-year anniversary include: Ozzie Guillén, Bo Jackson, 1993 AL Cy Young winner Jack McDowell, Hall-of-Famers Tim Lincecum and Frank Thomas; pitchers Wilson Álvarez and Jason Bere, INF Craig Grebeck; OFs Mike Huff, Lance Johnson, Warren Newson and Dan Pasqua; and manager Gene Lamont.

#### ON THE MEND

- OF Nicky Delmonico is 1-8 with a run scored in three injury rehab assignment games with Class AA Birmingham.
- Delmonico has been on the DL since 5/19 with a fractured third metacarpal on his right hand suffered on 5/18 vs. Texas.

#### BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .355 (49-138) with seven doubles, two homers, 18 RBI and 15 multihit efforts in 38 games since 6/1 ... they have hit safely in 32 contests.
- Narváez (1st, .400) and Smith (3rd, .321) rank in the Top 3 among MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 65 PAs).
- Narváez owns nine multihit efforts and has hit safely in 15 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 18 of his 20 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.

#### POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (13 HR/21 SB) is the only player in MLB this season with 13-plus home runs and 20-plus stolen bases.
- His 21 steals are a career high, and his 13 homers are four shy of his career-high 17 last season.
- Anderson is on pace for 23 home runs and 38 stolen bases in 2018 ... the 23 homers would tie Juan Uribe (2004) for the sixth-highest total by a White Sox shortstop, and the 38 steals would be the most since Luis Aparicio in 1961 (53).

#### STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox rank second in MLB with 70 stolen bases in 2018 ... they are on pace for 126 steals, which would be their most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB in steals since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 21 steals in 2018 ... he has stolen a base in four of his last five games.

#### TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox rank second in the major leagues this season with 27 triples, trailing Arizona (31) ... Chicago led the American League with 37 triples last season.
- Yolmer Sánchez leads the major leagues with nine triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

### COVEY AT A GLANCE

- The 26-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, fifth at home and first career appearance against St. Louis.
- Is 0-3 with a 13.20 ERA (22 ER/ 15.0 IP), five strikeouts, six home runs allowed, 13 walks and a .333 (21-63) opponents average over his last four starts ... went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA (5 ER/29.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, eight walks and a .246 (28-114) opponents average in his previous five starts.
- Was selected by the White Sox from the Athletics in the major-league portion of the Rule 5 Draft on 12/8/16 ... entered the 2017 season with zero major-league experience.
- Has gone 20-26 with a 4.06 ERA (181 ER/401.1 IP) and 288 strikeouts over 81 appearances (78 starts) over five minor-league seasons in the Athletics (2013-16) and White Sox (2017-18) organizations.
- Attended the University of San Diego from 2010-13 ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Was originally selected by Oakland in the fourth round of the June 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
- Bio is on page 63 of the 2018 Chicago White Sox media guide.

### LAST START

- Suffered his third consecutive loss and fourth of the season on 7/4 at Cincinnati after allowing six runs on five hits and one walk with two strikeouts over 3.2 IP.
- Allowed all six runs in the fourth inning ... Scooter Gennett recorded a RBI single, Jesse Winker and José Peraza both recorded two-RBI singles and Sal Romano drove in a run on a sacrifice bunt.
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 6-3, in the fourth inning ... tossed 78 pitches (45 strikes) ... Chicago went on to lose, 7-4.

### HOME SWEET HOME

- Is 2-0 with a 2.74 ERA (7 ER/23.0 IP), one home run allowed, eight walks, 21 strikeouts and a .244 (22-90) opponents average over four home starts this season, compared to 1-4 with a 7.90 ERA (24 ER/27.1 IP), five home runs allowed, 16 walks, 17 strikeouts and a .306 (34-11) opponents average over six road starts.
- Received a no decision in his last home start on 6/23 vs. Oakland after allowing four runs on two hits with four walks and a strikeout over 4.0 IP ... left the game after the fourth inning due to right hip soreness.

### WHERE'S THE RUN SUPPORT?

- Received one run or less of support in four of his last seven starts, after receiving 17 runs of support in his first three starts of the season.
- Has received one or no runs of support in 10 of his 22 career starts ... his career run support breakdown: zero (three), one (seven), two (five), three (three) and four-plus (four).

### 2018 MINOR LEAGUE STARTS

- Went 3-1 with a 2.33 ERA (10 ER/38.2 IP), 36 strikeouts and a .226 (32-141) opponents average over seven starts with Class AAA Charlotte this season.
- Did not receive a decision in his last start with Charlotte on 5/15, allowing one unearned run on four hits with one walk and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.

### LOOKING BACK AT 2017

- Made his major-league debut on 4/14/17 at Minnesota ... did not receive the decision after allowing one run on five hits with three walks and one strikeout over 5.1 IP.
- Went 0-7 with a 7.71 ERA (60 ER/70.0 IP) in 12 starts with the Sox ... the last Sox pitcher to begin his MLB career winless over seven or more starts was Ramon Garcia from 5/31/91-7/6/91 (eight straight starts) ... source: STATS LLC.
- Was on the 10-day disabled list from 5/26-8/15/17 (retroactive to 5/24) with a strained left oblique.
- Made two appearances with Class AAA Charlotte, going 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 ER/6.0 IP), one walk and three strikeouts ... opponents batted .227 (5-22) with one home run.

### COVEY'S COVER STORY

- Originally was selected by Milwaukee in the first round (14th overall) of the June 2010 First-Year Player Draft ... following his post-draft physical and before signing a contract, was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.
- Following the diagnosis, elected not to sign with the Brewers and committed to play at the University of San Diego ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Pitched for the Toreros from 2010-13 before being drafted by Oakland in the fourth round in 2013.
- Former White Sox and current Boston Red Sox left-hander Chris Sale was selected one spot ahead of Covey with the 13th overall pick in the 2010 draft.

### VS. INTERLEAGUE OPPONENTS

- Is scheduled to make his sixth career appearance (fifth start) during interleague play.
- Has gone 0-2 with a 7.16 ERA (13 ER/16.1 IP), four home runs allowed, seven walks, 19 strikeouts and a .299 (20-67) opponents average lifetime.

### VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS

- Is scheduled to make his first career appearance against St. Louis.

### TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- LHP Carlos Rodón (1-3, 4.29) is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, third at home and second career against St. Louis.
- Received a no decision in his last start on 7/5 at Houston ... allowed two runs on five hits with six walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.
- Is 0-1 with a 15.75 ERA (7 ER/4.0 IP) and .368 (7-19) opponents average in his only start vs. St. Louis on 7/21/15.
- Will make his 11th career start against an interleague opponent ... is 3-5 with a 5.81 ERA (34 ER/52.2 IP) and .265 (52-196) opponents average lifetime.
