AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 4-4 on their nine-game, 10-day road trip, which wraps up tonight...are 1-1 in their three-game series at Minnesota...won 2-of-3 at Seattle after losing 2-of-3 at Oakland...following an off day Thursday, return to the Bronx for their final homestand of the season, incl. 3G vs. Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 3G vs. Boston (Tues.-Thurs.) and 3G vs. Baltimore (9/21-23).

- ▶ Are 6-7 in their last 13G, but are 15-9 in their last 24G and 22-13 in 35G since 8/6...are 81-46 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 90-55 (.621), have the Majors' third-best record and third-most wins behind Boston (99-46, .683) and Houston (91-54, .628)...this marks the first time the Yankees do not have at least a share of one of the top-two records in the Majors since the end of play on 8/8...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records for 117 of the last 132 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 35G over .500, 1G under their season-high watermark of 36G over .500 (five times, most recently at 90-54 at the end of play on Monday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10.
- ▶ Are 9.0G behind Boston in the AL East...lead Oakland by 2.0G for the first AL Wild Card spot.
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road (are 4-4 so far).
- ▶ Have lost just 9-of-43 series since 4/19 (26-9-8).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (57-9, .864)...have the second-best record when scoring first (63-14, .818) behind Boston (65-13, .833).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost, 10-5, to the Twins on Tuesday in Minnesota...**RHP Sonny Gray** (3.0IP, 4H, 3R/2ER, 3BB, 2K) started and took the loss...**SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-3, 2R, 1BB, 4RBI) tripled and scored in the second inning, then hit a grand slam in the sixth inning, either scoring or driving in all 5R...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4, 1R) had his third multi-hit game in his last 4G...**RF Andrew McCutchen** (1-for-2, 2BB, 1CS) reached three times...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (0-for-2, 1R) walked twice.

- ▶ According to YES Network research, marked the sixth game in Yankees history in which they both hit and allowed a grand slam (Joe Mauer off Tommy Kahnle in the fifth), most recently on 4/28/17 vs. Baltimore (Jacoby Ellsbury, Mark Trumbo)...was the first time in Yankees history that grand slams were hit in consecutive half-innings in a game.

DIDI DOES IT: SS Didi Gregorius tripled and scored in the second inning, then hit a grand slam in the sixth inning, playing a part in all five Yankees runs on Tues. at Minnesota.

- ▶ Marked his third career grand slam (also 4/23/18 vs. Minnesota and 7/1/17 at Houston), tying Frankie Crosetti for the most grand slams by a shortstop in Yankees history...is the first Yankees shortstop to hit multiple grand slams in a single season.
- ▶ Is the second player this season to hit a grand slam and a triple in a game, joining Detroit's Leonys Martin (4/19 vs. Baltimore)...is the first Yankee to do so since Robinson Canó on 9/15/05 at Tampa Bay.
- ▶ Has 51XBH this season, three shy of his career high (54XBH in 2016)...is his third straight season with at least 50XBH, one of just two shortstops in Yankees history to reach the mark in multiple seasons (Jeter, 7x: 1998-2001, '04, '06-07)...all three of his hits since returning from the 10-day D.L. have gone for extra bases (1 double, 1 triple, 1HR).

CUTCH ON BASE: RF Andrew McCutchen has 5BB in his last 2G, 8BB during his five-game walk streak and 10BB in his last 7G...is second in the AL with 10BB this month (Kole Calhoun-11BB).

- ▶ Has reached multiple times in five consecutive games...has reached safely (via H/BB/HP) in 13 of his last 22PA.
- ▶ Despite a .172 BA (5-for-29), ranks fourth in the AL with a .419 OBP since joining the Yankees at the start of September (min. 40PA).
- ▶ Ranks fifth in the Majors with 36BB since the All-Star break.

BEAN COUNTING: Any combination of nine Boston wins or Yankees losses will eliminate the possibility of the Yankees winning the AL East...in the AL Wild Card race, the Yankees have magic numbers (Yankees wins or opp. losses) to clinch better records than the following teams: Houston (19), Oakland (16), Seattle (8) and Tampa Bay (8)...will secure a postseason berth by clinching a better record than two of these teams.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 234HR...is the sixth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 261HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
▶ Have homered in 17-of-19 games since 8/24 (32HR total)...have hit 59HR in the last 35G (since 8/6).

JUST DÚ IT: 3B Miguel Andújar went 2-for-4 with 1R on Tues. at Minnesota, his third multi-hit effort in the last 4G...was his 48th multi-hit game, most among MLB rookies and tied for 11th-most in the Majors...only six Yankees rookies in the last 100 years have totaled 50 multi-hit games in a season.

- ▶ Leads Major League rookies in BA (.299), hits (153), doubles (40), RBI (79), XBH (65) and OPS (.853)...is tied with **Gleyber Torres** for the AL rookie lead with 23HR.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers have 654K, the third-highest bullpen strikeout total in Major League history...is the second-highest in 2018 to Tampa Bay, which entered Wednesday with 659K in 719.1IP...with 8K, would match the strikeout record of 662K set by Houston relievers in 2017.

- ▶ Have an 11.38 K/9.0IP ratio (654K/517.1IP) this season, and are on pace to break the Major League record of 10.92, set by the 2017 Yankees.

DELLIN DONUTS: RHP Dellin Betances has at least 1K in an AL-record 39 consecutive relief appearances (since 5/29)...is tied with Bruce Sutter (6/1-10/2/77) for the third-longest streak in Major League history, behind Cincinnati's Aroldis Chapman (49, 8/21/13-8/13/14) and Milwaukee's Corey Knebel (46, 10/2/16-7/15/17)...has recorded at least 1K in 57-of-59 games this season.

- ▶ Is the only reliever in Major League history to record at least 100K in five consecutive seasons.
- ▶ With his next appearance, will reach 60 appearances for the fifth straight season (since 2014), joining seven other pitchers to do it in that span...ranks fifth in the Majors with 342 appearances since 2014.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 23-10 (.697) vs. the AL Central this season...are 27-10 in their last 37G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 56-29 (.659) outside the AL East and 34-26 (.567) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ Are 83-49 (.629) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015.

TWIN KILLING: The Yankees had their eight-game winning streak over the Twins snapped on Tuesday...was tied for their longest winning streak over one opponent since the start of 2014 (also 8-0 vs. Minnesota from 7/25/15-6/18/16)...are still 19-5 vs. Minnesota since 7/25/15.

ROAD TRIPPIN': The Yankees are 4-4 on their nine-game road trip...are 12-5 in their last 17 road games (since 8/6)...are 42-31 (.575) this season, the fifth-best road record in the Majors.

- ▶ Have clinched a winning road record for the first time since 2015 (42-39)...are tied for their most road wins since going 44-37 in 2012.
- ▶ Of their 16 road games this month, 13 are against teams with winning records...are 4-4 so far (3-3 vs. teams above .500).

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees lead the AL in road attendance at 31,568 per game...also lead the AL and rank second in the Majors in both average and total home attendance at 43,122 per game (3,104,802 total), behind only the Dodgers' 46,771 per game (3,507,792 total).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 12, 1996: Bernie Williams hits a home run from both sides of the plate and drives in eight runs in the Yankees' 12-3 win at Tiger Stadium. Of the 14 Yankees to homer from both sides of the plate, Williams is the only one to record at least 8RBI in such a game.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 13, 1973: Thurman Munson hits a 12-inning, "walk-off" single to defeat Boston, 2-1, in the last game played at the original Yankee Stadium in which the monuments for Miller Huggins, Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth were still on the field of play.

Sept. 13, 1927: The Yankees sweep a doubleheader vs. Cleveland, winning 5-3 in both games, to clinch the AL pennant for the fifth time in club history.

RECENT MAJOR LEAGUE TRANSACTIONS. Sept. 1: Returned C Gary Sánchez from rehab and reinstated him from the 10-day disabled list...added OF Andrew McCutchen and SS Adeiny Hechavarria to the active roster...recalled RHP Luis Cessa and INF Tyler Wade from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...signed LHP Stephen Tarpley to a Major League contract and selected him from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...designated OF Shane Robinson for assignment. Sept. 2: Recalled RHP Jonathan Loaisiga from Double-A Trenton. Sept. 3: Outrighted OF Shane Robinson and LHP Ryan Bollinger to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Sept. 7: Reinstated SS Didi Gregorius from the 10-day disabled list.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (17-7, 3.52 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his 30th start of the season tonight at Minnesota...the 24-year-old will start on extended six days' rest...took the loss on 9/5 at Oakland (2.2IP, 6R/5ER), but recorded his 200th strikeout of the season...his **career-high 17 wins** are third-most in the Majors behind Corey Kluber and Blake Snell (18 each)...is fifth in the AL and eighth in the Majors with 202K...is one of three pitchers in Yankees history with multiple 200-strikeout seasons (also David Cone, 1997-98 and Ron Guidry, 1978-79)...on 7/23 at Tampa Bay, became just the third Yankees pitcher to reach 500K prior to his 25th birthday...was named to his second career All-Star Game in 2018 and tossed a scoreless second inning (1H, 2K)...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: Took his seventh loss on Wed. at Oakland (2.2IP, 6H, 6R/5ER, 1BB, 3K, 2WP)...was his shortest start of the season and shortest since 5/14/17-G1 vs. Houston (2.1IP)...had thrown at least 5.0IP in each of his previous 29 regular season road starts dating to the start of 2017...gave up 4R in the first (Lowrie RBI single, two run-scoring wild pitches, Olson RBI double) and 2R in the third (Piscotty two-run single).

GAME OF 500: Reached 500.0 career innings pitched on Wed. at Oakland, becoming the 11th Yankee to reach the milestone prior to his 25th birthday, and the first to do it since Dave Righetti from 1979-83.

THIRTY-SOMETHING: Will make his 30th start of the season tonight after making 31 starts in 2017...is the first pitcher to have multiple 30-start seasons in his age-24 seasons or younger since Atlanta's Julio Teheran from 2013-15.

THE WIN IS IN: Ranks third in the Majors with 17 wins, behind Corey Kluber and Blake Snell (18 each)...are the most in a season by a Yankees pitcher since CC Sabathia went 19-8 in 2011...are the **third-most wins by a Yankees pitcher, age-24-or-younger, in the last 50 seasons** (since 1969), behind Phil Hughes (18-8 in 2010) and Andy Pettitte (21-8 in 1996)...are tied for the third-most wins by any pitcher in his age-24 season or younger in the last seven years (since 2012), behind Pittsburgh's Gerrit Cole (19-8 in 2015) and San Francisco's Madison Bumgarner (18-10 in 2014)...is the first AL pitcher this young to win 17 games since Tampa Bay's Matt Moore (17-4 in 2013).

✦ The Yankees are 22-7 in his 29 starts, **the most team wins started by one pitcher in 2018**...is just the third time since 2012 that a pitcher has started at least 20 Yankees wins in a season (Severino, 20 in 2017; Tanaka, 23 in 2016)...the Yankees won 10 straight Severino starts from 4/16-6/4 and were 16-1 from 4/16-7/12.

STRIKEOUT MACHINE: Is fifth in the AL and eighth in the Majors with 202K...is **one of three pitchers in Yankees history with multiple 200-strikeout seasons** (also David Cone, 1997-98 and Ron Guidry, 1978-79).

✦ Has 432K over the last two seasons (2017-18), **the second-highest total over a two-season span in Yankees history** behind Ron Guidry (449 in 1978-79).
 ✦ His 202K are the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher through the club's first 140G of a season (David Cone-215K in 1997, Ron Guidry-215K in 1978, and CC Sabathia-211K in 2011).

VS. MINNESOTA: Will make his second career regular season start against Minnesota, his first at Target Field...went just 3.0IP (5H, 3ER, 1BB, 3K) in a no-decision on 9/20/17 at Yankee Stadium.
