THE GIANTS: Finished the 2018 season (61st in San Days IN FIRST PLACE IN Francisco and 136th overall) with a record of 73-89 (.451), placing fourth in the National League West and 12th in the National League...SF did have a nine-win improvement from 2017 (64-98)...SF has now had back-to-back seasons of sub .500 records...this is the first time since 2005-08 that the Giants have had consecutive losing seasons.

AROUND .500: The Giants hovered around the .500 mark for the vast majority of the season, having a franchise record 82 days where they were one or fewer games from .500...they were exactly .500 24 different times.

THANK YOU FANS: The Giants topped three million in attendance for the ninthstraight season and for the 17th time in 19 years at AT&T Park...SF's overall attendance of 3,156,185 was the fifth-best in MLB...SF sold out 21 home games.

STARTING PITCHING: SF's starting pitching ERA of 4.06 was 10th in the NL and their 73 quality starts were tied for the seventh-most in the league...the biggest impact was that they reduced their HRs per 9.0 innings allowed from 1.3 to 1.0... they decreased homers allowed from 134 to 102 (in 68.0 fewer innings)...Giants starters struck out 7.1 batters per 9.0 innings, which ranked 27th in MLB...they allowed a HR every 8.8 fly balls, which ranked second-best.

ON THE MOUND: The Giants ranked last in the NL in starts made by the five pitchers who opened the season in the starting rotation with 78 (Marlins also had 78)...SF used 10 different starting pitchers, the most they've used in a season since 2013.

TOP THREE STARTERS: The Giants' top three starters - LHP Madison Bumgarner, RHP Johnny Cueto and RHP Jeff Samardzija - were in the same rotation at the same time for a total of just seven games and that came in mid-July.

PITCHING LAST FOUR MONTHS: With the return of Bumgarner, the Giants' pitching was one of the best in the league...beginning June 1, Giants pitchers posted a 3.61 ERA, the fourth-lowest figure in the Majors behind the Dodgers (3.28), Astros (3.36) and Indians (3.53).

WITH THE BATS: San Francisco ranked near the bottom of almost every offensive category...among the 15 NL teams, SF was 10th in team batting average (.239) and next-tolast in runs per game (3.72), on-base pct. (.300), slugging pct. (.368), OPS (.667), home runs (133) and extra-base hits (418)...they were third-to-last in batting average with RISP (.239) and batting average with RISP and two outs (.209).

BEFORE/AFTER: The Giants were 50-48 (.510) at the All-Star break and in fourth place in the NL West, just 4.0 games behind the leading Dodgers...following the break, SF posted a record of 23-41 (.359), tied with Detroit for the third-lowest winning pct. of any MLB team...only the Marlins (22-41, .349) and Orioles (19-46,

.292) had a lower winning pct. following the break.

BEFORE/AFTER PART II: SF had a .711 OPS in the first half, which ranked 21st in MLB...however, in the second half, they were over 100 points worse, ranking last with a .598 OPS...SF averaged 4.07 runs per game in the first half but then fell to 3.19 after the break.

BETTER D: The Giants finished 12th in MLB with 32 Defensive Runs Saved...that was a 75-run improvement from last season, fifth-best in MLB (Diamondbacks had a 134-run improvement, which ranked No. 1) (Baseball Info Solutions).

HOME/ROAD: The Giants were 3.0 games over .500 at home at 42-39 (.519) but posted a record of 31-50 (.383) on the road...SF won a total of just seven road series and had one winning road trip...SF scored more runs at home (4.0) than on the road (3.5) and had a higher OPS at home (.681) than on the road (.654)... the Giants struggled in some hitters' parks, going 0-4 at Citizens Bank Park, 0-3 at Great American Ball Park, 0-3 at Miller Park and 1-8 at Coors Field.

WITHIN THE WEST: The Giants were an even .500 against NL West opponents and were 16 games under the even-water mark when stepping outside the division.

SCORING FOUR: When the Giants scored at least four runs they were 52-20 (.722) compared to a 21-69 (.233) record when they scored three runs or fewer.

END OF SEASON NOTES

OPENING DAY LINEUP: The Giants' projected Opening Day lineup all appeared together in just four games in 2018 (CF Jackson, 2B Panik, RF McCutchen, C Posey, 3B Longoria, LF Pence, 1B Belt, SS Crawford).

KEY INJURIES: The Giants had 1,101 total player days on the disabled list in 2018, 15th-most in MLB...over the past two seasons combined, the Giants have 2,122 total player days on the disabled list, 14th-most in MLB (Stats, LLC).

- IF Brandon Belt missed 44 games (appendix removed, hyperextended right knee, surgery on right knee).
- LHP Madison Bumgarner missed 60 games (fractured fifth metacarpal).
- RHP Johnny Cueto missed 126 games (sprained left ankle, right elbow sprain & Tommy John surgery).
- OF Steven Duggar missed 28 games (torn labrum, left shoulder).
- IF Evan Longoria missed 34 games (fractured left hand).
- RHP Mark Melancon missed 56 games (right elbow flexor strain).
- IF Joe Panik missed 48 games (left thumb sprain & left groin strain).
 C Buster Posey missed 32 games (right hip impingement).
- RHP Jeff Samardzija missed 118 games (right pectoral strain, right shoulder tightness & right shoulder inflammation).
- IF Pablo Sandoval missed 55 games (right hamstring strain).
- RHP Hunter Strickland missed 50 games (fractured right hand).

CLOSE GAMES: The Giants played 90 games that were decided by just two runs or fewer (42-48 record), the most such games of any MLB team...SF also had 56 games decided by just one run (26-30).

HOME RUNS: In a season where 100 players hit at least 20 home runs, none of them were Giants...IF Evan Longoria led the team with 16...SF's 133 home runs ranked 14th out of 15 NL teams...the Giants were the only team without a grand slam in 2018...in fact, it was just the third time in SF-era history that the Giants did not hit a grand slam (others: 1975 & 1979).

GIANTS ROOKIES: 14 different rookies appeared with the Giants this season, with nine making their MLB debuts: IF Abiatal Avelino, RHP Tyler Beede, RHP Ray Black, OF Steven Duggar, C Aramis Garcia, RHP Dereck Rodriguez, OF Chris Shaw, LHP D.J. Snelten, LHP Andrew Suárez...SF had 50 starts from rookie pitchers (Suárez - 29, Rodriguez - 19, Beede - 2), their most in a season since 2003 (60 starts from rookies).

MID-SEASON TRADES: The Giants made two mid-season trades: RHP Cory Gearrin, OF Austin Jackson and minor league RHP Jason Bahr traded to Texas in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...OF Andrew McCutchen traded to New York-AL in exchange for minor league IF Abiatal Avelino and RHP Juan De Paula.

ALL-STARS: IF Brandon Crawford earned his second All-Star selection and his first as a starter...C Buster Posey earned his sixth All-Star selection and his third as a reserve...Posey did not participate in the Mid-Summer Classic as he had been battling hip inflammation and he was scheduled to receive a cortisone shot during the break...IF Brandon Belt was one of five players selected for the Final Vote but he finished second to Milwaukee's Jesús Aguilar.

FREE AGENTS: The following Giants players are free agents following the 2018 season: OF Gregor Blanco, LHP Derek Holland, OF Hunter Pence and C Nick Hundley.

ARBITRATION ELIGIBLE PLAYERS: The following Giants players are eligible for arbitration in 2019: RHP Sam Dyson, OF Gorkys Hernandez, IF Joe Panik, LHP Will Smith, RHP Hunter Strickland and IF Chase d'Arnaud.

NUMBER 10 PICK: San Francisco will have the 10th overall selection in next year's 2019 First Year Player Draft...SF finished 2018 with the ninth-worst record, however Atlanta slipped ahead at nine because they did not sign this year's No. 1 pick.

MANAGER BRUCE BOCHY

Bruce Bochy completed his 12th season at the helm of the Giants, the longest stint by a Giants manager in SF-era history and the second-longest in franchise history behind John McGraw (31 years)...overall, it was his 24th season as a big league skipper... Bochy's 1,926 career wins are the most among active managers and are the 11thmost all-time...the 10 managers ahead of Bochy are all in the Hall of Fame...Bochy won 951 games as manager of the Padres and has won 975 games as manager of the Giants...he's the only manager in MLB history to win 900+ games with multiple franchises...was ejected from a game just twice in 2018 and has 74 career ejections.

MADISON BUMGARNER

#40 LHP Madison Bumgarner 6-4, 243, 29 years old (August 1, 1989) 6-7 Record, 3.26 ERA

Season Notes

- A displaced fracture of the fifth metacarpal on his left hand suffered in his final Spring Training start when a comebacker by the Royals' Whit Merrifield forced the lefthander to miss the first two months of the season...made 21 starts with the Giants, going 6-7 with a 3.26 ERA (47er, 129.2ip)...San Francisco went 9-12 in his 21 outings.
- Had never been on the DL in his first eight MLB seasons but has now twice been placed on the DL the last two years, missing a total of 135 games...SF has gone 59-76 (.437) with Bumgarner on the DL.
- Won six games to bring his career total to 110...his 110 career wins are the third-most in SF-era history (since 1958) behind Juan Marichal (238) and Gaylord Perry (134).
- Notched his 1,500th career strikeout on June 27 vs. Colorado, striking out DJ Le-Mahieu...Bumgarner became the fourth-fastest left-hander to reach 1,500 strikeouts in the live-ball era, doing it in his 239th career game...only Randy Johnson (206 games), Clayton Kershaw (218) and David Price (236) did it faster (Stats, LLC).

LHP. FEWEST GAMES TO

- Struck out 109 batters and has fanned 1,591 batters in his career...is 15 strikeouts shy of tying Gaylord Perry (1,606) for the fourth-most in SF era history.
- Averaged 7.57 strikeouts per 9.0 innings, the lowest rate of his career since 2010...his 2.98 walks per 9.0 was the highest of his career.
- Did not record a double-digit strikeout game this season... marked the first time he's failed to record at least one 10-or-more strikeout game since 2010.
- Finished the year with a 1.63 home ERA (12er, 66.1ip) in 10 starts at AT&T Park...the 1.63 home ERA was the fourth-lowest in the Majors behind TB's Blake Snell (1.27), NYM's Jacob deGrom (1.54) and MIA's Wei-Yin Chen (1.62).
- Did not allow a run at home in 22.0 innings from August 7-September 28...the 22.0-inning home scoreless streak marked the longest by a Giants' starter since **Johnny Cueto** had a 29.1 inning scoreless streak at home from April 21-May 23, 2016.
- Allowed three runs or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts and turned in 14 quality starts, tied for the most on the team with **Dereck Rodriguez.**
- Had a 2.4 WAR according to Baseball Reference, his lowest WAR since 2012 (2.0)...his 2.4 WAR was tied with **Dereck Rodriguez** for best among the team's starters.
- Owned a 1.71 ERA (12er/63.0ip) in innings 1-3 this season but had a 4.73 ERA (35er, 66.2ip) through the rest of the game.
- Opponents had a .624 OPS vs. Bumgarner the first two times through the order but an .868 OPS the third time through the order.
- Tossed back-to-back scoreless games June 21 vs. SD and June 27 vs. COL, going 8.0 scoreless and 7.0 scoreless, respectively...marked the first time in his career he pitched at least 7.0 scoreless innings in consecutive starts.
- Posted a 5.28 ERA (17er, 29.0ip) in five September starts...marked the first time since May 2013 (5.17 ERA) that Bumgarner posted an ERA of five or more in a single month where he made at least five starts.

HITTING NOTES: Went 7-for-44 (.159) with four RBI this year...delivered a pinch-hit, walk-off RBI single on Sept. 25 in the Giants' 5-4 win in 12 innings over SD...was the first Giants pitcher with a walk-off RBI since **Don Robinson** did so as a pinch-hitter vs. HOU on July 31, 1990...was held without a home run for the first time since 2013 after hitting at least three homers in each of his last four seasons (2014-2017).

Single-Game Notes

- June 11 at Miami Received his first career ejection after exiting the game in the 6th inning and arguing with home plate umpire Jeremie Rehak.
- June 22 vs. San Diego Twirled 8.0 shutout innings and allowed three hits to earn his first win of the season in SF's 3-0 triumph... Bumgarner struck out eight and walked two...also drove in his first run of the season with sacrifice fly on June 22...marked the fourth time in his career that he made a scoreless start and had the game-winning RBI, tying Stephen Strasburg and Fernando Valenzuela for the most such games by any pitcher in the last 40 years (Stats, LLC).
- July 21 at Oakland Lasted 4.0+ innings in his first second-half start, snapping his streak of 89 consecutive games completing at least 5.0 innings...the streak was the longest active streak in baseball and the longest by a Giants pitcher since the mound was moved in 1983 (Elias).
- September 25 vs. San Diego Delivered his first career game-ending hit, hitting a single off RHP Rowan Wick to score **Gorkys Hernandez** from third base in the 12th inning in a 5-4 Giants win...became the first pitcher to have a game-ending RBI since Yovani Gallardo did it for MIL on May 27, 2014 vs. BAL...the last Giants pitcher to accomplish the feat was **Don Robinson** on July 31, 1990 vs. HOU (also a pinch-hit RBI single) (Stats, LLC).

- Missed the Giants' first 60 games with a broken pinky finger on his left hand, an injury he suffered on his final start in spring training on March 23 after Royals' hitter Whit Merrifield hit a line-drive comebacker off of his left hand.
- Placed on the 10-Day DL on March 29 (retro to March 26)... transferred to the 60-Day DL on April 11.
- Was reinstated from the 60-day DL June 5 after making two rehab starts, one with triple-A Sacramento and one with Class-A Advanced San Jose.

JOHNNY CUETO

#47 RHP Johnny Cueto 5-11, 229, 32 years old (February 15, 1986) 3-2 Record, 3.23 ERA

Season Notes

- The two-time All-Star (2014 & 2016) spent the season on and off the disabled list before undergoing seasonending Tommy John surgery on Aug. 2.
- Made just nine starts overall for San Francisco, going 3-2 with a 3.23 ERA (19er, 53.0ip) and a .238 opponents average...his nine starts marked the fewest he's made in a single season over his career (previous: 11 starts in 2013 with Cincinnati).
