FISH BITES

The Marlins continue a six-game homestand tonight with game two of this three-game set against the Pittsburgh Pirates. RHP **Trevor Richards** is making his third career start, all this season, and his first career start against the Pirates. Pittsburgh is countering with RHP Jameson Taillon, who in his only career start against the Marlins, April 28, 2017, tossed 5.0 innings with one run and five hits allowed. Miami opened its current homestand by dropping three straight to the New York Mets. On Sunday, the Marlins will hit the road for a two-game series against the Yankees (April 16-17), a four-game series in Milwaukee (April 19-22), and a three-game set at Dodger Stadium (April 23-25).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

Miami established season highs in runs scored (7) and hits (14), and newcomer **JB Shuck** had a career day at the plate as the Marlins downed the visiting Pittsburgh Pirates, 7-2. Shuck got things started for Miami in the second with a one-out triple, and later scored on a wild pitch to give the Marlins a 1-0 lead. The Pirates rallied for two runs in the fifth to take a 2-1 advantage, but **Starlin Castro** lifted a bases-clearing sacrifice fly to center to put Miami up 4-2. The Marlins added an insurance run in the sixth and two in the seventh. Shuck went 4x4 with a triple and two runs scored, while **Miguel Rojas** (3x5), **Derek Dietrich** (2x5) and **Justin Bour** (2x4) all had multi-hit efforts. **Dillon Peters** picked up his second win of the season, holding the Pirates to two runs on four hits and two walks, with three strikeouts, over 6.0 solid frames.

VS. PIRATES

Miami dropped the 2017 season series, 3-4, going 1-2 at Marlins Park and 2-2 at PNC Park. The Marlins .581 winning percentage against the Pirates at home (54-39) is their second-best winning percentage at home against any National League team, behind a .646 mark against the Colorado Rockies (64-35).

SHUCKIN' IT UP

JB Shuck announced his presence with authority last night, going 4x4 with a triple and two runs scored in his Marlins debut. His first hit with Miami was a second-inning triple, becoming only the fourth player in Club history to record a triple in his first plate appearance with the team: the others were Andy Gonzalez (July 9, 2009 vs. Arizona), Darrell Whitmore (June 25, 1993 vs. Expos), and Walt Weiss (April 5, 1993 vs. Dodgers). In addition, he tied a franchise record for most hits in a Marlins debut, joining Emilio Bonifacio (April 6, 2009), Carlos Delgado (April 5, 2005), and Jeff Conine (April 5, 1993). Should he record a hit in his next at-bat, he will stand alone as having the most consecutive at-bats with a hit to start his Marlins career. Three others also had four hits in their first four at-bats with the Club: Bonifacio, Dennis Cook (July 3-Aug. 1, 1007), and Conine. - *Stats LLC*

EXPERIENCED YOUTH

The two teams in this series are showcasing two of the youngest active rosters in Major League Baseball, with Miami ranking as the fourth-youngest (28 years, 25 days) and Pittsburgh as the fifth-youngest (28.040). Philadelphia's current active roster is the youngest at 26.278, followed by Cincinnati (27.224) and the Yankees (27.335). - *Stats LLC*

R32PECT THE PROCESS

Coming into this season, **Derek Dietrich** had made 371 starts at various positions over his career, posting a .249 average (322x1293). This season, his first as a full-time starter, he has gotten off to a solid start with a .310 average (18x58), one double, one triple, one home run and four RBI in 13 games. He leads the Marlins and is tied for fourth in the National League in hits (with Jose Martinez), behind DJ LeMahieu (20), Marcell Ozuna (19) and Jose Pirela (19). Dietrich is also tied for third in the NL in multi-hit games (6) with six others, behind Eric Hosmer (8) and LeMahieu (7).

MIAMI 5-0

Last night, Miami scored its first five runs without the benefit of a run-producing hit (wild pitch, sac fly, error, error, sac bunt). The last team to score its first five-plus runs in a game without the benefit of a run-scoring hit was the Los Angeles Angels on July 6, 2016 at Tampa (also first five runs in a 7-2 win: walk, fielder's choice, error, sac fly, sac fly). - *Elias*

TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami had the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. Using a current 2018 model, Miami has the second-toughest schedule of any team in the Majors, with opponents combining on a .579 winning percentage. The only team with a tougher schedule is the Washington Nationals, whose opponents have combined on a .588 winning percentage. - *Stats LLC*

GETTING CAUGHT RED HANDED

Marlins catchers have combined to throw out six of 14 total attempted base stealers this season (42.8%), which ranks as the fifth-best mark in the Majors. The Cubs lead all teams with 57.1% (4 of-7), followed by Oakland (54.5; 6-of-11), Detroit (50.0; 7-of-14), and Milwaukee (45.5; 5-of-11). Miami leads all NL clubs in caught stealing with six, and is tied with Oakland for second in MLB behind Detroit (7). **Bryan Holaday** has thrown out three attempted base stealers, which is tied for the third-most with Willson Contreras, Manny Pina, and Chance Sisco, behind Jonathan Lucroy (6) and James McCann (5).

YEAR OF THE FAN

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tonight, the fifth of 25 dates this season where a fan (or fans) will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game after tonight will be Saturday, April 28 vs. Colorado.

Trevor Richards is making his third career start in the middle game of this three-game set against the Pirates. Richards had his contract selected on April 2 and made his Major League debut that night against Boston. In four Spring appearances (two starts) with Miami, went 2-0 with 0.75 ERA (12.0 ip/1 er).

Is making first career start and appearance against Pittsburgh.

In last start, surrendered three runs, six hits, and three walks, with two strikeouts, over 4.0 innings at Citizens Bank Park on April 8.

Took loss in debut, allowing five runs on eight hits and a walk, while striking out five, over 4.1 innings. Surrendered just two hits over first three innings, but was touched for three runs in fourth and two in fifth, leaving with one out and a runner on first.

Split second affiliated and third professional season between Single-A Jupiter (13 games, 11 starts) and Double-A Jacksonville (14 starts). Combined to go 12-11 with a 2.53 ERA (146.0 ip/41 er) overall and earned Marlins' Minor League Pitcher of the Year honors.

Led all Marlins farmhands in strikeouts (158), ranked second in wins, ERA and WHIP (1.03), and fifth in innings pitched.

Opened campaign at Jupiter, going 7-4, 2.17 (70.2/17) to earn Florida State League Midseason All-Star honors.

Set career high with 11 strikeouts on June 2 at Dunedin, when he allowed just one hit and no walks over 6.0 shutout innings, earning FSL Pitcher of the Week honors for May 29-June 4.

Did not appear in FSL All-Star Game due to starting three days prior (June 14) at St. Lucie, his final start with Jupiter before June 21 promotion to Jumbo Shrimp.

Tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven of last nine starts for Hammerheads, including 6.1 on May 27 vs. Bradenton, his season-high with Jupiter.

Posted 3-0 record with 0.53 ERA (17.0/1) over final three starts with Jupiter.

Won first start with Jacksonville, on June 23 at Jackson (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, hr, 3 bb, 3 so).

Earned Marlins Pitcher of the Month for June after posting 4-0 record and 1.65 ERA (27.1/5) in five games (four starts).

Over eight-start stretch from May 27-July 9, went 5-0 with 1.35 ERA (46.2/2/7). Of those eight starts, first five were with Jupiter while final three were with Jacksonville.

Signed by Miami as a non-drafted free agent out of independent Frontier League on July 2, 2016. Spent 2015 and start of '16 season with Gateway, going 9-9 with 3.31 ERA (138.2/51) over 23 appearances (22 starts).

José Ureña will be making his fourth start of the season at Marlins Park, going 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (16.0 ip/9 er). Finished 2018 Grapefruit League season with 2-1 record and 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip/7 er) in five starts.

Making his third career start and fifth appearance against Pittsburgh, owning an even 1-1 record and 7.31 ERA (16.0/13). Last faced Pirates on April 28, 2017 at Marlins Park, surrendering two runs and 12 hits over 4.1-inning relief appearance. The 12 hits allowed were the most ever in a game by a Marlins reliever, and most since Jake Westbrook allowed 13 to the Dodgers on August 7, 2013.

Took second loss of season in last start, April 9 at Marlins Park against the Mets. Allowed three runs on five hits with a walk and four strikeouts over 5.0 innings. Miami has dropped each of his last five starts, matching longest such streak of career. Club also dropped five straight from June 17 to August 6, 2015.

On April 3, held Boston to one run on four hits over 7.0 innings. Walked one while struck out career high-tying seven. Also had seven strikeouts on May 28, 2017 vs. Angels (5.0 ip) and July 4, 2017 at St. Louis (5.0 ip).

Earned Opening Day start against Cubs on March 29 at Marlins Park. Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took loss, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in first inning, becoming only second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).
