### TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** dropped the first of three against the Rangers and drop to 33-39 on the season...are now 19-19 at home and 9-15 in series openers...the Twins are 9-12 against left handed starters...are now 16-12 within the division...drop to 268-270 against Texas all-time and 145-121 at home vs. the Rangers...with two doubles, the Twins have successfully recorded at least one double in all but two home games this year.
- **FERNANDO ROMERO** suffered the loss, his third of the season in his 10<sup>th</sup> start...went 6.0 innings, just the third time this season he has recorded 6.0+ innings of work...walked two batters and struck out four while allowing four runs on four hits and one home run.
- **MAX KEPLER** (1-for-3) recorded a double in the sixth inning off of Mike Minor...marks his 21<sup>st</sup> hit off of a left handed pitcher, after recording just 19 off lefties all last season...entering tonight's game he ranked ninth in hits in the American League of lefties vs. left handed pitchers...this was his 18<sup>th</sup> double of the season, he ranks third on the team behind Eddie Rosario (20) and Eduardo Escobar (32).
- **JOE MAUER** (1-for-4) recorded an RBI double in the sixth inning scoring the first run for the Twins...was his 410 career double, needs four more doubles to tie Kirby Puckett (414) for first on Twins all-time list.

### RANGERS NOTES:

- **THE RANGERS** won the first of three against the Twins, improve to 33-45 on the season and 18-20 on the road...are 4-0 on their current six-game road trip after sweeping Kansas City...are now 25-28 when they record a home run...extend their season-long win streak to six, longest active win streak in MLB...are 10-8 vs. the American League Central this season, 6-5 on the road.
- **MIKE MNOR** earned the win in his 14<sup>th</sup> start of the season...went 6.0 innings and allowed one run off three hits...striking out three while walking two...earned his first decision in June and improved to 5-4 on the season...is his fifth quality start of the season...did not allow a home run for the second consecutive start...his three strikeouts are the second fewest of the season (fewest, 2, 2x, last, May 31 at Seattle).
- **NOMAR MAZARA** (2-for-5) extended his current hitting streak to five games, hitting .500 (11-for-22) during the streak...recorded his 26<sup>th</sup> multi-hit game of the season, leading the Rangers.
- **SHIN-SOO CHOO** (2-for-4) recorded his 14<sup>th</sup> home run of the season...entering the game he was third on the team behind Nomar Mazara (14) and Joey Gallo (18)...extended his current hitting streak to six games, hitting .375 (9-for-24)...has now reached safely in 35 straight...hitting .374 (43-for-131) with 35 walks during the streak...marks the second longest on-base-streak in MLB behind Herrera of the Phillies with 40 games...is longest single season streak in Choo's career...recorded his 23<sup>rd</sup> multi-hit game of the season, entering tonight's game ranked second most on the team behind Mazara (25).
- **ROBINSON CHIRINOS** (2-for-4) recorded a single in the seventh inning, snapping an 0-for-13...recorded his ninth multi hit game of the season.
- **ELVIS ANDRUS** (1-for-4) extended his hitting streak at Target Field with a single in the fourth inning...hitting .444 (12-for-27) during the streak.
