### FEELING GOOD ON A WEDNESDAY

- The Rockies continue the first homestand of their 25th Anniversary Season with the final game of a three-game set against the San Diego Padres.
- Fell 5-2 last night despite a second consecutive quality start from Tyler Anderson, who pitched six innings and allowed two runs on seven hits with one home run, two walks and eight strikeouts ... had eight or more strikeouts in three of his 15 starts in 2017.
- Colorado has lost the first two games of the series and have now dropped three straight games for the first time this season ... their 5-7 record to start the season is their worst since going 4-8 to start the 2009 season.

### UP IS DOWN

- The Rockies lead the National League with 17 home runs ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.
- Through 12 games, the Rockies .227 team batting average ranks 14th in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.

### BLACKJACK

- Rockies hitters have gone 0-for-21 with 11 strikeouts in pinch-hit at-bats so far this season ... they are one of three National League teams without a pinch hit while their 21 pinch-hit at-bats are the most in the Majors.

### AMBULATORY

- The Rockies won Saturday night's game in 10 innings on a walk-off walk to Tony Wolters ... each of the Rockies' last three walk-off wins have come via a bases-loaded walk (also: Aug. 3, 2017 vs. New York-NL, Sept. 4, 2017 vs. San Francisco) ... it is the first time in franchise history that the Rockies have earned three consecutive walk-off wins via walk, and the first time it has happened in the Major Leagues since Toronto in 1997.

including 10 times this month ... played a four-game series last week (Colorado won 3-1), play three this week (April 9-11) and then three times at Coors Field April 23-25.

- The Rockies have not been swept at home by the Padres since Sept. 19-21, 2011.
- Colorado is 25-17 vs. the Padres since April 10, 2016 ... the Rockies have also won 19 of the past 32 meetings since Sept. 11, 2016 ... Colorado was 12-7 vs. San Diego last season, including 6-4 at Petco Park ... prior to '17, the Rockies had not had a winning record at Petco Park since going 5-4 in 2013.
- At Coors Field, the Rockies went 6-3 against San Diego in 2017, including a three-game sweep July 17-19 ... outscored the Padres 67-35 at home last year.
- The Rockies have finished at or above .500 at home against San Diego each season since 2012, and have outscored the Padres 337-274 over that span with a record of 36-22.

### WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (587), DJ LeMahieu (564) and Nolan Arenado (560) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .318 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

### WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Charlie Blackmon, who was scratched from last night's lineup with right quad soreness, is 11-for-39 (.282) to begin the season with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI ... signed a six-year contract that includes two player options on April 3.
- He hit home runs in three consecutive games March 30-April 2 for the second time in his Major League career (April 20-23, 2014), including his first multi-home run game of the season on March 31 at Arizona.

### MY COUSIN VINNY

- With two hits last Monday, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 67 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

### PHOENIX RISING

- Bryan Shaw allowed his first runs of the season last night following a streak of six scoreless outings to begin his Rockies career ... his strikeout of Hunter Renfroe on Monday night was the 400th of his career.

### OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in five of his six games pitched, including striking out the side three times, and is currently tied for the Major League lead among relievers with 14 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his seven innings or work across six appearances.

### HIT CHARITABLY

- New at Coors Field this season is a 18'x30' "Hit the Mitt" target beyond the wall in the left-field corner ... each time a Rockies hitter strikes the target with a home run, UCHHealth will make a donation in the amount of \$5,000 via the Colorado Rockies Foundation to Gold Crown Foundation, a Colorado nonprofit 501(c)(3) that offers youth sports and education programs to nearly 20,000 children throughout Colorado and the surrounding areas ... UCHHealth will be tracking the accumulating donation throughout the season and present a check to Gold Crown Foundation at the end of the 2018 season.

**PHENOM**

- 23-year-old right-handed rookie a member of his second career Opening Day roster, his first as a starting pitcher ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Made his debut on Sept. 16, 2016 vs. San Diego, pitching an inning of relief in Denver.
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced HAIR-mahn MAR-keh

**HOME OPENER**

- Walked a career-high six batters, giving him 10 over his first two starts of the year, en route to a 8-3 loss in Friday's Home Opener at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start in club history.

**POWERFUL PADS**

- Is 2-1 with a 6.30 ERA (20.0 IP, 14 ER) in five games, three starts vs. the San Diego Padres ... won 8-4 on Sept. 24, 2017 at San Diego (5.0,5,2,2,3,3), allowing two home runs (Myers, Solarte).
- Made three starts vs. the Padres, all last year, going 2-1 with a 5.94 ERA (16.2 IP, 11 ER), six walks and 21 strikeouts ... Pads hit .313.
- Is 1-0 with a 3.52 ERA (7.2 IP, 3 ER) in two games, one start, vs. San Diego at Coors Field ... is 1-1 with an 8.03 ERA (12.1 IP, 11 ER) in three games, two starts, at Petco Park.

**FIRST TIME OUT**

- Started the Rockies' third game of the year, the series finale at Arizona on March 31 ... pitched five innings and allowed one run, unearned, on four hits with four walks and four strikeouts in the 2-1 Rockies win ... the four walks were then a career high.

**COORS HEAVY**

- In 17 career appearances, 16 starts, at Coors Field, is 7-4 with a 4.73 ERA (97.0 IP, 51 ER).
- Went 6-3 with a 4.59 ERA (80.1 IP, 41 ER) in 13 starts at Coors Field in 2017 ... averaged 9.07 H/9, 2.24 BB/9 and 8.51 SO/9 ... eight of his 13 starts at Coors Field were quality starts.
- From May 10-Aug. 29, 2017, he went 6-0 (Rockies 9-0) with a 3.24 ERA (58.1 IP, 21 ER), 55 hits, 13 walks and 60 strikeouts over nine home starts.

**KEROUAC**

- Went 5-4 with a 4.19 ERA (81.2 IP, 38 ER) in 16 road starts in 2017 ... averaged 10.25 hits per nine innings, 3.20 BB/9 and 7.82 SO/9.
- In 18 career starts on the road, has gone 5-5 with a 4.35 ERA (91.0 IP, 44 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA) ... combined, is 5-5 with a 4.44 ERA (95.1 IP, 47 ER).

**DESERT AIR**

- Made four Cactus League starts in Spring Training and went 2-1 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 IP, 12 ER), 18 hits, five walks and 13 strikeouts ... allowed eight of his 12 earned runs in his start on March 11 vs. Los Angeles-NL
- Made his last official Cactus League appearance on March 16 ... pitched on the back fields on March 26 vs. the Los Angeles Angels in his final Spring work.

**A YEAR TO REMEMBER**

- Was named to the *Topps* All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
- Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
- Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
- Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).

**A GAME TO REMEMBER**

- Pitched a career-high eight shutout innings, with six no-hit innings on May 10 vs. Chicago-NL ... allowed a double to Kris Bryant in the top of the seventh inning to break up the no-hitter.
- Became the fifth Rockies pitcher (sixth time) to pitch at least six no-hit innings at Coors Field (also: De La Rosa, Chacin, Thomson, Astacio 2x).
- Became the third rookie to pitch eight shutout innings at Coors Field, the youngest pitcher to accomplish the feat.
