COLORADO ROCKIES (32-33) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (33-30)

Tuesday, June 12, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 64; Home 32

RHP Jon Gray (6-6, 5.66) vs RHP Aaron Nola (7-2, 2.35)

- SUNDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Milwaukee Brewers, 4-3, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Zach Eflin (W, 3-2) went 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 3 hits with 1 walk and a career-high-tying 9 strikeouts ... Philadelphia was paced on offense by Rhys Hoskins (2 RBI), J.P. Crawford (2-4, R, 2B) and Cesar Hernandez (1-3, R, BB, RBI).
- SEND THIS MAN TO WASHINGTON:** Tonight's starter, **Aaron Nola**, heads back out on the campaign trail with a little over a month remaining before the Midsummer Classic, July 18 at Nationals Park ... Over his last 31 starts (6/22/17-current), Nola is 16-8, 2.73 ERA (61 ER, 201.1 IP) with 217 strikeouts to 55 walks (3.95 SO/ BB ratio), while limiting opposing hitters to a .217/.272/.341 slash line ... In that span, Nola's 201.1 innings pitched rank 1st in the National League and 5th in the majors, behind only CLE's Corey Kluber (238.0 IP), HOU's Justin Verlander (211.2 IP), NYY's Luis Severino (203.0 IP) and CLE's Carlos Carrasco (202.2 IP) ... This season, Nola's 2.4 fWAR ranks 3rd among all National League starters trailing only WSH's Max Scherzer (4.0) and NYM's Jacob deGrom (3.1) ... Additionally, he ranks 2nd in OPP OPS (.537) & SLG (.281), 3rd in OPP AVG (.200) & OPP OBP (.255), 4th in groundball % (53.7%), 6th in ERA (2.35) and 9th in strikeouts (80).
- COLD HARD FACTS:** Since the start of the 2008 season, the Phillies are 42-24 (.636) in 66 games against the Rockies which is their 2nd-best win percentage against a club they have played 15 or more times in that span (best: SD, 44-23, .657 win %).
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** This season, at 20-11 (.645), the Phillies own the best home record in the National League and are tied with the Indians (10-11, .645) for third-best in the majors, trailing only the Yankees (22-9, .710) and Red Sox (23-11, .676) ... Philadelphia's +36 run differential at home is the top mark in the NL (next: ARI, +27) ... Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 31-16 in their last 47 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .660 win percentage over that stretch ranks 3rd in the majors behind the Yankees (.733) and Indians (.674).
- 20/20 VISION:** With their win on Sunday, the Phillies secured their 20th victory at home on June 10 ... It marked the earliest in the season the Phillies reached the 20-win mark at CBP since 2011, when they started 20-10, clinching their 20th victory on June 6 of that season ... Below are the dates listed from 2011-2018 when the Phillies clinched win #20 in South Philly and their respective record at the time.

- BOHM SWEET HOME:** On June 4, the Phillies selected **Alec Bohm**, a 21-year-old third baseman from Wichita State University, in the first round (No. 3 overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft ... Bohm, an Omaha, Neb., native, batted .339 (76-224) with 14 doubles, a triple, 16 home runs, 55 RBI, 39 walks, 57 runs, nine stolen bases, a .436 on-base percentage and a .625 slugging percentage during his junior season ... At the time Wichita State's season ended, the 6-foot-5, 220-pound Bohm led the American Athletic Conference in home runs, pacing the Shockers for the second straight year ... He also led the AAC in runs, tied for first in total bases (140) and finished in the top five in hits, RBI, on-base percentage and slugging percentage ... The right-handed-hitting Bohm was named a Baseball America Second-Team All-American, as well as a semifinalist for both the Dick Howser Trophy, given to the nation's college player of the year, and the Golden Spikes Award ... He leaves Wichita State with a career .317 average, 40 doubles, 33 home runs and 125 RBI in 166 games over three seasons.
- SLAMTANA:** Since May 1, when he entered that night's game with a .153/.295/.276 slash line in 122 plate appearances, **Carlos Santana** has hit .274/.381/.556 with 18 extra-base hits (9 2B, 3B, 8 HR) and 22 walks to 16 strikeouts over 147 plate appearances ... The only other player in the majors with 22 or more walks and 16 or fewer strikeouts since May 1 is CHI's Anthony Rizzo (also 22 BB & 16 SO).
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 59 consecutive games (since 4/4) ... The only club in the majors with a longer extra-base hit streak this season is the Chicago Cubs (62 G, 3/29-current) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 7/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 9,551 pitches over 2,371 plate appearances this season and their 4.03 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL and 3rd in the majors (best in both: LAD, 4.04) ... **Philadelphia has the best walk rate in the majors this season at 10.2 % (next: NYY, 10.1 %) and they rank 4th in the majors in walks with 242 (best: CHI, 248) ... Cesar Hernandez (44, 4th), Carlos Santana (42, 5th) and Rhys Hoskins (34, T-11th) all rank within the top 11 in the NL in walks this season, while Hernandez and Santana rank T-6th and 8th, respectively, among all ML players ... The Phillies have not led the majors in walks for a full season in over 30 years (last: 1983, 640 BB).**

LAST START: 6/6 at CHI: ND, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 4 BB, 6 SO, HR ... Nola vs Quintana ... The Phils trailed 3-0 as Cubs starter Jose Quintana was lifted in place of reliever Steve Cishek to face Aaron Altherr in the 6th inning ... Altherr crushed a 3-run home run on the first pitch he saw to tie the game at 3-3 ... The clubs would trade zeroes until the 9th when Dylan Cozens belted his first career home run to left field to give the Phils a 7-5 lead ... Jason Heyward would follow in the bottom of the 9th with a walk-off grand slam.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Go Home:** Has tossed 6.0 innings or more in 21 straight home starts, becoming one of just 6 Phillies to do so since at least 1908 (Steve Carlton-5x, Curt Schilling, Roy Halladay, Cliff Lee, Grover Cleveland Alexander) ... He has made 10 straight quality starts at home ... **Since 6/22/17, Nola is 13-3 with a 2.07 ERA (27 ER, 117.1 IP), 0.93 WHIP and has held opponents to a .195 AVG with 138 SO in 17 starts at home** ... All 4 of his career 10+ SO games have come at home in that span ... He has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 15 of those 17 starts and 1 or 0 in 11 of them ... In that same span (since 6/22/17), Nola ranks 1st among all qualifying ML pitchers in wins at home and is 2nd in ERA (best: Kluber, 1.09)
- Can't Touch This:** Has allowed only 7 total hits in his last three starts combined (19.2 IP), holding opponents to a .106 AVG (7-66)
- Stellar Start:** Posted a 2.18 ERA (19 ER, 78.1 IP) and 0.932 WHIP over his first two months of the season ... per Elias, since the NL started recording ER in 1912, the only other two Phillies pitchers (min. 10 GS) to have both a lower season ERA and lower season WHIP through the end of May than Nola were Hall of Famers Robin Roberts (1.99 ERA, 0.919 WHIP, 1952) & Grover C. Alexander (1.58 ERA, 0.928 WHIP, 1915)
- 2018 ML Starter Rankings:** 3rd in OPP OPS (.537) and fewest pitches/IP (15.0), 4th in WHIP (0.96), IP (84.1) and OPP AVG (200), 6th in ERA (2.35), & HR/9.0 IP (0.53)
- vs NL West:** 5-4, 4.18 ERA (35 ER, 75.1 IP) in 12 starts

HOME:

- 2018:** 5-0, 1.94 ERA (9 ER, 41.2 IP) in 6 starts
- Career:** 19-12, 3.24 ERA (80 ER, 222.1 IP) in 35 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Posted a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) with 46 SO and a 0.90 WHIP in 6 May starts
- Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillies since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced ... Recorded 9 straight outs via strikeout during his start vs SF (last out of 2nd to 2 outs in 5th)
- His start on 5/2 at MIA (7.1 IP) was the 2nd-longest scoreless start of his career (longest: 8.0 IP, 8/23/15 at MIA)
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established (had a PHI record 10 straight last season)
- Allowed 4 or fewer hits in each of his first 4 starts of the season, the first Phillie to do so in his first 4 starts since 2005 (Rob Tejada, 5)
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

2017 SEASON:

- Had the most SO (184) ever by a Phillies pitcher who made fewer than 30 starts in a season
- Averaged 9.86 SO/9.0 IP (184 SO/168.0 IP), becoming the 2nd qualifying Phillie with a SO/9.0 IP that high (other: Curt Schilling, 11.29 in 1997 and 10.05 in 1998)
- Had 10 straight starts with 2 or fewer runs allowed (6/22-8/12), the longest such streak by a Phillie since the current mound distance was established in 1893

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
