MILWAUKEE BREWERS (37-25) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (32-28)

Friday, June 8, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 61; Home 29

RHP Vince Velasquez (4-6, 3.82) vs RHP Jhoulys Chacin (4-1, 3.39)

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies dropped the rubber match of a three-game set with the Cubs, 4-3 at Wrigley Field to conclude the road trip ... Starter Nick Pivetta threw 5.0 innings and allowed 4 runs on 6 hits with a walk and 6 strikeouts ... Philadelphia had scoring chances, but left 13 men on base as their comeback fell short ... Scott Kingery drove in two runs and the bullpen tossed 3.0 perfect innings in relief.
- HOME SWEET HOME:** The Phillies return home today following a season-long 11-day, 10-game road trip to LAD (2-2), SF (0-3) and CHI (1-2) ... Philadelphia, whose 28 home games are tied for 3rd-fewest in baseball behind only TB (25) and COL (27), will play 18 of their next 24 games at home through July 4 ... **Philadelphia is 19-9 (.679) this season at Citizens Bank Park, the best home winning percentage in the National League and 3rd-best in baseball, trailing only BOS and NYY (.710 each)** ... The Phillies have lost consecutive games at home only one time this season ... **On the mound, Phillies pitchers have posted the best home ERA (2.77) by far, nearly 30 points ahead of the next closest club (HOU, 3.06)** ... Phillies starters have allowed one earned run or none in 9 of their last 12 starts at home (1.74 ERA) and the bullpen is coming off a homestand where they posted a 1.37 ERA in 6 games against ATL and TOR.
- GRAND CENTRAL:** The Phillies are in the midst of a 25-game stretch during which they do not play a single divisional opponent (5/26 vs TOR – 6/20 vs STL), but play their National League Central foes 12 times, all of which occur in a span of 15 games, 6/5 at CHI to 6/20 at STL ... Philadelphia is 10-4 against the NL Central this season, starting the year with an eight-game winning streak against teams from the division ... They are 15-6 against the division dating back to 7/6/17 at MIL ... The Phillies are looking to win consecutive series against Milwaukee for the first time since 9/8/11-7/25/12 (3-1, 3-0).
- BREW MASTERS:** Two Phillies, **Odubel Herrera** and **Maikel Franco**, have haunted the Brewers since the start of 2015 ... Herrera is batting .420 (29-69) with 9 doubles, 4 home runs, 12 RBI, 9 walks and 5 steals in 19 games against MIL ... In that span, he has the highest batting average against the Brewers in baseball by more than 60 points (2nd: Nola Arenado, .367), and he ranks 2nd in OBP (.481) and SLG % (.725) ... Herrera has hit safely in his last 7 games against the Brewers, slashing .556/.600/1.074 with 8 extra-base hits (5 2B, 3 HR) ... Franco is batting .300 (21-70) with 5 doubles, 5 home runs and 15 RBI in 17 games.
- YES SER!** Prior to allowing two runs in his second inning of work on 6/6 at SF, **Seranthony Dominguez** extended his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to begin his career to 15.2 with a perfect 8th ... **Per Elias, it was the longest scoreless streak by a Phillies' pitcher to begin a career since Marty Bystrom began his with 20.0 scoreless innings in 1980** ... During the streak, he faced 49 batters, allowed 3 baserunners (2 H, HB) and struck out 16 ... Additionally, Dominguez drew a walk in his first career plate appearance in the top of the ninth, recording his first walk at the plate before walking his first batter of his career on the mound.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 56 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just four teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 59 straight games (3/29-current), Detroit Tigers – 56 straight games (4/10-6/7) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 7/30/2008-6/25/2009, when they did so in 97 straight games.
- FIRST THINGS FIRST:** On Wednesday in Chicago, **Dylan Cozens** belted his first career home run, a two-run shot to give the Phillies the lead in the 9th inning ... Cozens became the fourth Phillie already to hit his first career home run this season, joining Zach Eflin, J.P. Crawford and Scott Kingery ... Only STL has had as many players hit their first career home run in 2018... Since the start of 2017, 11 different Phillies have hit round-tripper No. 1 (reverse chronologically: Cozens, Eflin, Crawford, Kingery, Cameron Perkins, Jorge Alfaro, Rhys Hoskins, Nick Williams, Ben Lively, Andrew Knapp, Brock Stassi), most in baseball by two (CWS and STL, 9 each) ... 19 clubs have had four or fewer players do so since the start of last season.
- STAFF NOTES:** Over their last 29 games (5/5-current), the Phillies starting rotation has posted a 2.66 ERA (50 ER, 169.0 IP) and has struck out 182 of the 683 batters they have faced (26.6%) ... **Philadelphia's 2.66 ERA in that span ranks 2nd in the majors (best: WSH, 2.52 ERA, and their 182 strikeouts rank 5th (best: BOS, 202)** ... The staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 24 of those 29 games and 2 ER or fewer in 21 of 29.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 9,113 pitches over 2,263 plate appearances this season and their 4.03 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL and 4th in the majors (best in both: LAD, 4.05) ... **Philadelphia is averaging a walk every 9.71 plate appearances this season, the best ratio in the major leagues, and ranks 3rd in baseball overall in walks with 233** ... Cesar Hernandez (42, 2nd), Carlos Santana (40, T-3rd) and Rhys Hoskins (34, 10th) all rank within the top 10 in the NL in walks this season, while Hernandez and Santana rank 4th and T-5th, respectively, among all ML players.

LAST START: 6/2 at SF: L, 6.1 IP, 5 H, R, ER, BB, 9 SO ... Velasquez vs Suarez ... The Phils could only muster 3 hits as the Giants took the game and the series.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Punch Out:** Velasquez is averaging 11.17 SO/9.0 IP (79 SO, 63.2 IP), which is the 9th-highest among all qualifying ML starters ... In his last 5 starts, has struck out 35.0 % of the batters he has faced (41 of 117)
- Last 6:** Is 3-2 with a 2.14 ERA (8 ER, 33.2 IP), holding opponents to a .203 AVG ... Has faced only 1 batter with RISP in 3 of those 6 starts
- Right On:** Has held RHH to a .171 (14-82) mark with 34 SO in his last 9 starts, and a .196 (22-112) AVG overall this season ... He has not allowed a home run to a RHH all season (127 batters faced) ... **Of the 115 pitchers to face at least 125 RHH this season, the only 2 that have not allowed a HR to a RHH are Velasquez and Max Scherzer**
- Put Him Away:** When ahead in the count 0-2, Velasquez has held opponents to a 0.69 AVG (2-29) with 19 SO ... Last season, had trouble putting batters away 0-2, as they hit .222 (8-36), the 11th-highest AVG among all NL pitchers (min. 30 BF)
- vs NL Central:** 2-3, 5.68 ERA (24 ER, 38.0 IP) in 8 games (8 starts)

- 2018:** 2-3, 2.79 ERA (12 ER, 38.2 IP) in 7 starts
- Career:** 7-9, 4.17 ERA (74 ER, 159.2 IP) in 36 games (29 starts)

2018 SEASON:

- Went 3-1 with a 2.30 ERA (7 ER, 27.1 IP) with 36 strikeouts in 5 May starts ... It was the lowest ERA of any month of his career (min. 5 starts)
- Tied a career-high three-game win streak, 5/5-17
- On 5/10 vs SF Became the first Phillies pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts and multiple hits at the plate since 9/16/13 (Cliff Lee, 14 SO, 3 H), per *Elias* ... His 12 strikeouts were his 2nd-most ever in a start
- On 5/5 at WSH made the first start of his career of at least 5.0 IP and 1 or 0 hits
- Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer walks
- Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
- Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
- Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster

2017 SEASON:

- Made his 2nd consecutive Opening Day roster
- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
