**THE OTHER CATWALK**—The 12th annual Rays on the Runway returns tonight at the Hilton St. Petersburg Bayfront...Rays players, coaches and special "Dream Children" from the Children's Dream Fund will walk the fashion runway to make dreams come true for children with life-threatening illnesses...players and coaches expected to participate include **Jake Bauers, José De León, Matt Duffy, Jake Faria, Kevin Kiermaier, Daniel Robertson, Jaime Schultz, Mallex Smith, Ozzie Timmons, Joey Wendle** and **Ryan Yarbrough**...proceeds from the event benefit the Children's Dream Fund, a local nonprofit organization that makes dreams come true for seriously-ill children living on the West Coast of Florida.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost consecutive games, both by 1 run, despite yielding 3 runs and 2 runs in those games...they would need a win today to avoid a .500 record for the 11th time this season...the Rays entered Friday's game riding a 3-game winning streak and with a chance to return to a season-high-tying 4 games over .500 (48-44, end of play on July 11)...the Rays are 7-8 since the All-Star break and 8-11 in their last 19 games, going 5-1 over that stretch against teams entering the series with a .500 record or better and 3-10 against teams with a record under .500.

- + The Rays have lost two of their last four home series (Marlins, White Sox) following a stretch of five consecutive series wins at home...they are 6-5 in their last 11 home games, after going 14-1 from June 11-July 11...this is the second series of a 9-game homestand against the Angels (3-0), White Sox (0-2) and Orioles...the end of this homestand concludes a stretch of 15 of 19 games at home.
- + The Rays have yielded 3 runs or fewer in four consecutive games (2-2), including 2 runs or fewer in three of those 4 games.
- + The Rays have recorded 3 SB (or more) in back-to-back games for the first time since July 3-4, 2012 vs. NYY...they haven't done this in three consecutive games since Aug 19-21, 2011 vs. SEA.
- + The Rays have gone 27 innings since their last home run (8th inning, Wed vs. LAA)...they have 18 wins this season without the benefit of a homer, tied with the Cubs for most in the majors.

**NO BROOMS ALLOWED**—Today the Rays will attempt to avoid being swept for the seventh time this season and fourth time in a series of 3 games (or more)...they were last swept from June 5-6 at WAS (0-2), and last in a 3-game series from June 1-3 at SEA (0-3)...their last sweep in a series of at least 3 games at home was from April 13-15 vs. PHI (0-3)...while the Rays were swept three times in five series within the first 2½ weeks of the season, they have been swept only three times in 30 series since.

- + Four times in franchise history the Rays have been swept by the White Sox: May 28-30, 2012 vs. CWS (0-3), Aug 27, 2007 at CWS (0-1), June 25-28, 2007 vs. CWS (0-4) and July 4-6, 2005 at CWS (0-3).
- + In addition to being swept six times, the Rays have also swept eight series—meaning 40 pct. of their series have ended in a sweep.

**RAYS vs. WHITE SOX**—The Rays are 69-85 (.448) all-time against the White Sox (38-40 at home, 31-45 on the road)...the Rays trail the season series, 3-2, entering today's final game—all 5 games have been decided by 1-run margins, and all 3 losses have come after allowing the go-ahead run in the 8th inning or later...since Sep 28, 2016, 12 of the 13 games between the clubs have been decided by 2 runs or fewer...the Rays are 11-6 at home against them since the start of 2013...the clubs split the season series last year, with the Rays going 2-1 at home and 1-2 in Chicago.

**OLD FRIENDS AS FOES**—Today's encounter with **James Shields** will mark the 12th time in 112 games this season the team will face a starting pitcher who was a former Ray...they are 5-6 thus far in games started by **Alex Cobb** (3-0), **Jason Hammel** (1-0), **Matt Moore** (0-1), **Jake Odorizzi** (0-1), **David Price** (1-3) and Shields (0-1)...Cobb, Moore, Odorizzi, Price and Shields all rank among the Rays Top 10 in career ERA, wins, starts and strikeouts...today is the fifth time the Rays will face Shields, who remains the club's all-time leader in starts (217), innings (1,454.2), wins (87), complete games (19), CG shutouts (8) and Opening Day starts (4, tied for 1st).

- + Shields is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (26.1-IP, 4-ER) in his previous 4 starts against the Rays, most recently April 11 in Chicago (no decision).
- + Today will be the 39th time a pitcher from the Rays 2008 AL Championship team will start against the Rays...the club is 20-18 in those games against Shields (0-4), **David Price** (6-6), **Jason Hammel** (5-3), **Edwin Jackson** (3-3), **Scott Kazmir** (4-2) and **Matt Garza** (2-0)...the Rays defeated the White Sox, 3-1, in the ALDS that season.

**CLOSE SHAVES**—The Rays are 20-25 (.444) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 41) and 1-run losses (Mets/Orioles, 20)...the Rays have played consecutive 1-run games for the first time since July 25-26 vs. NYY, at BAL (2-0), and lost consecutive games, both decided by 1 run, for the first time since July 20-21 vs. MIA...the 45 1-run games are the most for a team through 111 games since the 2005 Nationals (45) and most for an AL team since the 1993 Royals (49), while the 25 1-run losses are the most for an AL team through 111 games since the 2015 Athletics (26)...40.5 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.3 pct. of games in the majors...45.5 pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest rate in the majors, ahead of the Astros (43.9 pct.).

- + The Rays are on pace for 36 1-run losses, while the club record for 1-run losses in a single season is 30 (2015)...44.0 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 32 games at home: 23 wins, 8 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

**PITCHING PLANS**—Today's game will be started by **Hunter Wood**, the 28th time the Rays will use an opener and their fifth time using Wood in that role...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 4th in the majors and 3rd in the AL with a 3.49 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays announced in spring a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer** (traded), **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** (traded) and **Jake Faria**, but they have used other starters in 53 of 111 games (47.7 pct.).
- + The Rays have used an opener in 27 games, and they are 13-14 in these games...the openers have pitched to a 3.89 ERA (37-IP, 16-ER), including a 1.55 ERA (29-IP, 5-ER) in the last 19 games...the team has a 3.80 ERA (241.1-IP, 102-ER) in games started by openers.
- + The Rays have employed a bullpen day in an additional 20 games this season, and are 10-10 when doing so...they have used a traditional starter in 64 games, and have gone 33-31 in those games.
- + For clarification, an opener is used to face 3-9 batters, depending on matchups, while a "bullpen day" starter tends to pitch deeper but generally no more than two times through the order.

**PITCHING POINTS**—The Rays have a major-league-most 19 losses when yielding 3 runs or fewer—no other team has more than 15 losses when doing so...this is the 4th-most in a single season in franchise history; the club record is 24 (2014)...they also have a major-league-most 11 losses when yielding 2 runs or fewer—no other team has more than 8 losses when doing so...this is the 2nd-most in club history behind 2012 (12).

- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 41 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 32 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).
- + No Rays starter has recorded a win since **Nathan Eovaldi** on July 8 at NYM...Rays starters are 0-6 in 22 games since then...the bullpen's 58 decisions are the most in the majors (Dodgers, 46).
- + 21 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays this season, most in the majors (Dodgers/Marlins, 20) and a single-season club record (20, 2017)...the Rays have used a major-league-most and club-record 15 different starting pitchers, as well as a club-record 31 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors to the Cubs (32).

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**—With his major league debut, **Brandon Lowe** will become the 20th rookie used by the Rays this season, extending the club record (18, 2015) and breaking a tie with the Marlins for most in the majors...he will become the 10th player to make his major league debut for the Rays this season, which will tie the Angels, Mets, Orioles and Padres for the most in the majors, according to Baseball Reference.

- + Rays rookies have combined for 434 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (416)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 42 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (49)...the Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher in 10 of their 15 games since the All-Star break.
- + 17 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 12 players with less than 1 year of service time...the only pitchers on the active roster with more than 2 years of service time are **Sergio Romo** (10.055) and **Blake Snell** (2.030).
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 26 years, 8 months.

**LAST OUTING**—On Thurs vs. LAA, recorded a career-high 5 SO in his 13th career app (fourth start)...went 2 IP, and his only baserunner allowed was a 2-out double by **Justin Upton** in the 1st inning...got **Albert Pujols** on a 1-3 groundout to end the frame, then struck out all 3 BF in the 2nd inning...got a career-high eight swings and misses on 31 pitches (19 strikes)...his line: ND, 2 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 5 SO.

**A NEW LOOK**—Will be making the fifth start of his career, all since July 11 vs. DET, and a second start in a 4-day span...has pitched to a 1.35 ERA (6.2-IP, 1-ER) with 12 SO (16.20 SO/9 IP) and a .231 opp avg. (6-for-26) in 4 starts, compared to a 3.86 ERA (14-IP, 6-ER) with 3 HR and .245 opp avg. (13-for-53) in 8 apps out of the bullpen...the Rays are 4-0 in his 4 starts, the fourth time in franchise history they've won at least the first 4 starts of a pitcher's career, following **Tanyon Sturtze** (7-0) in 2000-01, **Bobby Witt** (5-0) in 1999 and **Cory Lidle** (4-0) in 1999-2000.

**THIRD STINT**—Has a 2.95 ERA (18.1-IP, 6-ER) in 11 apps (4 starts) since his June 30 recall, his first extended action in the majors...all 3 HR allowed have been solo (MIA **JT Riddle**, MIA **Cameron Maybin**, BAL **Austin Wynns**)...was in the majors earlier this season from April 17-24, pitching once, and a 1-day stint on May 14 (did not pitch).

- + Has gone at least 2 IP in six of his 12 apps (4 starts) this season, and has recorded 4 outs or more in 8 apps...his starts have been 1 IP, 2 IP, 1.2 IP and 2 IP.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Went 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (42-IP, 14-ER) and 63 SO in 24 apps (2 starts) with Triple-A Durham...went at least 2 IP in 14 of his 24 outings there, and his season high was 3 IP (twice, last June 7) and 49 pitches (May 6).

- + After his last option, pitched to a 1.75 ERA (25.2-IP, 5-ER) in 14 apps (1 start).
- + Has spent parts of the last two seasons with the Bulls, and is 5-3 with a 3.78 ERA (95.1-IP, 40-ER) and 110 SO in his career at the Triple-A level.
- + Has made 73 career starts in the minor leagues.

**MIX & MATCH**—Is one of 15 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels/Athletics/Mets (12)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2004 (14) and 2003 (14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

- + This will be the 43rd time the Rays start a rookie pitcher, the most in the AL and 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (49).
- + The Rays have used 31 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Cubs (32)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2017 (30).

**LAST SEASON**—Spent all of last season in the minors aside from a one-day stint on May 30 at TEX...made his major league debut that night, retiring **Nomar Mazara** for the final out of the 8th inn. ...received the news of his call up with roughly an hour to catch the flight...the family missed baggage check-in at the Montgomery airport by two minutes and had to drive to Birmingham for an alternate flight...he arrived at Globe Life Park in the 2nd inning.

- + He and **José Alvarado** both bypassed Triple-A for their major league debuts, the first Rays to do that since **Scott Kazmir** in 2004.
- + Optioned back to Montgomery after his debut...made 12 starts with the Biscuits and was promoted to Triple-A Durham on June 16...combined for a career-high 115 SO...made 6 starts with the Bulls before making his final 13 apps of the season out of the bullpen.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
