LEADING OFF: LAA plays the third contest of a five-game road trip (1-1) to Seattle (May 4-6; 1-1) and Colorado (May 8-9)... Halos are off on Monday...**Angels are 11-4 vs. A.L. West foes, winning all four completed series vs. the division...LAA has won four of last five games to move into first place tie with Houston...**Halos are 7-10 since a club-record 13-3 start...**MLB-best 12-3 road record** (LAA won 11 consecutive on road, March 30-April 24) and leads A.L...Halos are 7-3-0 in 10 series played.

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field last night (off Mike Leake), **Albert Pujols...**

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – **Beltre**).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (**Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Beltre & Musial**) - *STATS LLC*.
- Joins **Rod Carew** (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000th hit in an Angels' uniform.

3x3x3: Pujols has matched Stan Musial and Alex Rodriguez as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.

SIMBA SIZZLIN': **Andrelton Simmons** boasts a 10-game hit streak batting .475 (19/40) with eight runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI in the span...**Hit streak surpasses season-high 8-gamer** (March 29-April 6)...**His .357 season average leads the Majors.**

VIRGIN ISLAND TEAMMATES: If **Jabari Blash** and **Akeel Morris** both appear in a game for Angels, it would be first time two natives of the U.S. Virgin Islands play as teammates since **RHP Al McBean** and **C Elmo Plaskett** both played for Pittsburgh from 1961-63.

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: **Shohei Ohtani** was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

THAT'S A NO-NO: Angels' prospects **Jason Alexander** (7 IP), **Zac Ryan** (1 IP), and **Sean Isaac** (1 IP) threw a combined no-hitter for the Inland Empire 66ers on Wednesday...**Marked second combined no-hitter in the Angels' system in five days** (also Double-A Mobile on April 28).

DOUBLE VISION: With a two-bagger Wednesday night, **Albert Pujols** surpassed **Hank Aaron** for 11th place on MLB all-time doubles list with 625 (**David Ortiz** is 10th with 632)...**Pujols currently sits at 626 career doubles.**

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Ohtani** is just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...**Ohtani tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance** (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...**Ohtani has a hit in 12 of 14 starts at DH this season.**

FAST FACT: Angels' pitching staff has recorded 10+ strikeouts 16 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 32 games of the season (previous was 12; three times).

THIS N' THAT: **Halos' average home attendance of 39,525 leads A.L...** Club boasts six sellouts already...**LAA has committed 15 errors thru 33 games (third fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .988 fielding pct...** Halos hurlers have issued 128 free passes, second-most in A.L...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 140 IP to lead all of baseball (average 4.1 IP per game)...** Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby (4)** and **Ty Cobb (4)**...**Kole Calhoun** is tied for A.L. lead with four outfield assists...His 34 assists are second most in A.L. since 2015.

(1983) In a 4-2 win at Detroit, **Rod Carew**, with a 3-for-4 effort, raises his average to .500 (48-for-96). The first baseman will finish 1983 at .339, second best in A.L. as **Wade Boggs** leads at a .361 clip; (1972) Angels played their fastest nine-inning game in club history (1:31) in a 2-0 win over Milwaukee.

May 7

(1983) **Daryl Sconiers** ties an AL record by connecting for his second pinch-hit HR in as many at-bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP SHOHEI OHTANI

26 strikeouts through first four career starts are an Angels record

- **WELCOME TO THE SHO:** Making fifth start as a pitcher and third on the road...Made Major League debut with Angels on Opening Day (March 29 at Oakland) as the starting designated hitter and made pitching debut April 1 at OAK...Signed with Angels as international free agent, Dec. 10, 2017 and had contract selected by Angels on March 27.
- **ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:** Was named the American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 innings pitched and also batting .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...Became the fifth Angels player to win the award, joining **Robb Quinlan** (July 2004), **Mike Trout** (May, June, July & Aug. 2012), **Matt Shoemaker** (Aug. 2014) and **Andrew Heaney** (July 2015)...He also joined **Babe Ruth** (June 1919) and **Walter Johnson** (July 1918) as the only players in the last 100 years (min. 40 PA) with multiple wins and a batting average of at least .359 in a calendar month. (STATS LLC)
- **ON THE LINE TODAY:** Needs nine strikeouts today to match Angels record of 35 strikeouts through a player's first five career games as a pitcher; the mark is currently held by **Bo Belinsky** (1962)...The only other Angels player to reach 30 strikeouts through five career games is **Jered Weaver** (31).
- **LAST TIME ON THE MOUND:** Did not factor in decision in last start as a pitcher on April 24 at Houston after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing a season-high four earned runs on six hits with five walks and seven strikeouts.
- **HISTORIC HOME DEBUT:** Earned the win on April 8 vs. A's at Angel Stadium after tossing seven scoreless innings and allowing one hit and one walk with 12 strikeouts...**Retired each of his first 19 batters faced**...Became third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (**Steve Woodard**, MIL in 1997 and **Juan Marichal**, SF in 1960)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since **Jim Shaw** for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).
- **PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** On April 9, was named by Major League Baseball as the American League Player of the Week...In addition to tossing seven shutout innings with one hit allowed and 12 strikeouts in his start, also slashed .462/.500/1.154 with four runs scored, six hits, three home runs and seven RBI as a hitter.
- **NEARLY PERFECT:** After allowing HR to Matt Chapman in first start of year (April 1 at OAK), retired 35 of 38 batters faced (one hit & two walks) from 2nd inning on April 1 through the end of his second start on April 8...**Had a stretch of 27 consecutive batters retired** between 4th inning of first start and 7th inning of second start.
- **SWING AND A MISS:** 24 of 26 strikeouts this season have come on a swinging strike three...Leads A.L. (min. 20 IP) with 26.5% swinging strike percentage (strikes swinging (without contact)/total strikes).
- **ROOKIE LEADER:** Leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (26) and ranks tied for second in wins (2) and opponent batting average (min. 20 IP) (.197)...As a hitter (min. 20 PA), ranks second among A.L. rookies in HR (4), RBI (14), and leads all A.L. rookies in batting average (.339) & OPS (1.018).
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** Ranks second in Majors this season (min. 20 IP) with an average fastball velocity of 97.4 MPH, behind only Yankees' **Luis Severino** (97.7 MPH)...*On April 27, Ohtani homered on a 97.2 MPH fastball from Severino.*
- **VS. SEATTLE:** Today marks first career appearance as a pitcher vs. Mariners...Started at DH on Friday night and went 2-for-4 with a double, RBI and one walk.
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** Tonight marks first career appearance as a pitcher at Safeco Field.
- **PITCHING DEBUT:** Earned the win in first career start on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum after working six innings and allowing three earned runs on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts; all three runs allowed came on three-run HR by **Matt Chapman** in second inning...Retired 14 of final 15 batters faced...Became second Japanese-born pitcher with 6+ IP, 6+ SO and four-or-fewer baserunners allowed in MLB pitching debut, joining Mets' **Masato Yoshii** (4/5/98 vs. PIT)...Yoshii was Ohtani's pitching coach the last two seasons with the Nippon-Ham Fighters.
- **THE BABE AND I:** With his start on April 1 in Oakland, become first player to *start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher* within his team's first 10 games since **Babe Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC)...Last week, Ohtani became the first A.L. player to homer in 3 straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Ruth**, who did it in five seasons (1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1930). (STATS LLC)
- **TWO WAY COMPANY:** Ohtani is the third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (**Ken Brett** in 1973 and **Babe Ruth** in 1916)...The last time any player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher at any point within the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both **Bullet Joe Bush** (Red Sox) and **Clarence Mitchell** (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was **Rick Rhoden** (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). (STATS LLC).
- **TOPPING THE RANKINGS:** Enters 2018 ranked by *MLB.com* as the #1 prospect in all of baseball...Is rated as top Angels prospect by *Baseball America* and #2 overall in baseball.
- **HALOS FROM JAPAN:** This season, joins **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** as the only two Japanese-born starting pitchers in Angels history...Hasegawa's last start for the Halos came on July 5, 1999 vs. Seattle...The only other Japanese-born pitcher in Angels history was **Hisanori Takahashi** who made 103 relief appearances from 2011-12.
- **AT THE PLATE:** For additional batting notes, please see *Ohtani's section in the Angels hitters section of the game notes.*
- **2017 RECAP:** Made five starts as a pitcher in 2017 for Nippon-Ham Fighters of Japanese Pacific League, and went 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (25.1 IP - 9 ER) with 29 strikeouts...Was limited to five games pitching last season, due to an ankle injury...In his 65 games as a batter, hit .332 with 16 doubles, eight home runs and 31 RBI.

CAREER NOTES:

- In 85 career games (82 starts) as a pitcher for Nippon-Ham Fighters in Japanese Pacific League, went 42-15 with a 2.52 ERA (543 IP - 152 ER) and 624 strikeouts...Named a NPB All-Star each of his five professional seasons in Japan.
- Earned a "Best Nine Award" as a pitcher for the Fighters in 2015 & 2016 after leading the Pacific League in ERA each season (2.24 in 2015 & 1.86 in 2016)...
- In 2016, was named Pacific League MVP...In 21 games (20 starts) as a pitcher, went 10-4 with a 1.86 ERA (140 IP - 29 ER) with 174 strikeouts...Also appeared in 104 games as a hitter and batted .322 with 18 doubles, 22 HR and 67 RBI.
- Native of Ōshū, Japan...Made Pacific League debut with Fighters at age 18.

Making fifth start of the season and second on the road...Earned the win in last start on Wednesday vs. Baltimore after tossing a season-high six innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with one walk and two strikeouts...The victory was his first since Aug. 28, 2017 vs. Oakland...Has yielded exactly one earned run in each of last two starts...Earned win in only previous start vs. Rockies on July 7, 2015 at Coors Field after pitching 7.1 innings (career-high) and allowing two earned runs on eight hits with no walks and five strikeouts.

#38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP) AGE: 25

- Charged with first blown save last night after allowing all three batters faced to score...Yielded go-ahead HR to Mike Zunino in 8th inning.

- Worked season-high 1.2 scoreless innings on Sunday night vs. Yankees.

#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP) AGE: 26

- Retired both of two batters faced last night and stranded two inherited runners.
- Credited with win Tuesday night vs. BAL, but had second blown save of year after allowing two runs in the 9th inning...Fourth career blown save in 9th inning or later.
- Had six straight scoreless appearances, prior to Tuesday night's game.
- Earned first save of the season on April 24 at HOU with 1.1 scoreless innings... Third career 4+ out save.
- Pitched season-high 1.2 scoreless on April 20 vs. Giants.
- Nine of 13 outings this season have been scoreless.
