## BALTIMORE ORIOLES (24-60) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (46-37)

Wednesday, July 4, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 84; Home 46  
RHP Yefry Ramirez (0-1, 2.89) vs RHP Aaron Nola (10-2, 2.48)

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** Philadelphia took the first game of a short two-game series with Baltimore, 3-2 at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Zach Eflin built on a dominant month of June, beginning July with 7.0 innings and 2 runs allowed on 5 hits with no walks and 6 strikeouts ... Rhys Hoskins drove in two runs with an RBI double in the third and Andrew Knapp tripled home a run in the fourth ... Seranthony Dominguez locked down his eighth save of the season.
- RHYS BEING RHYS:** Rhys Hoskins gave the Phillies the lead in the third inning yesterday with a two-run double, his 19<sup>th</sup> go-ahead RBI of the season ... He is T-2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors in go-ahead RBI with SEA's Mitch Haniger, trailing only COL's Nolan Arenado (20) ... He also surpassed the 100 career RBI mark with that hit, doing so in his 124<sup>th</sup> game ... Per *Elias*, that is the fewest number of games from the start of a ML career with the Phillies to reach 100 RBI, surpassing Chuck Klein (143 G in 1929), and the second-lowest by any ML player since 1951 (fewest: Ryan Braun, 118 G in 2008) ... **Since coming off the disabled list on 6/9, Hoskins has batted .294 (25-85) with 6 2B, 8 HR, 25 RBI, 12 BB, a .380 OBP, .647 SLG % and 17 runs scored in 22 games** ... He is T-2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors in RBI in that stretch, T-7<sup>th</sup> in extra-base hits and T-8<sup>th</sup> in homers ... The Phillies have gone 14-8 since he returned to the lineup after going 2-7 while he was on the disabled list.
- THE BIG EASY:** Aaron Nola has won seven straight decisions at home this season, and seven of his eight starts overall at Citizens Bank Park in 2018, posting a 1.77 ERA (11 ER, 56.0 IP) with two home runs allowed and 63 strikeouts (3 double-digit SO games) ... **Per *Elias*, the only Phillies pitchers to have ever gone 7-0 or better at home before the All-Star Break were Tommy Greene (9-0 in 1993) and Steve Carlton (7-0 in 1981)** ... If he wins today, he and NYY's Luis Severino will be the only pitchers in baseball with an 8-0 home record this season ... He is T-2<sup>nd</sup> in home wins this season and ranks 6<sup>th</sup> among qualifying pitchers in home ERA in 2018 ... **In 35 overall starts since 6/22/17, Nola is 19-8 with a 2.75 ERA (69 ER, 226.0 IP), 1.08 WHIP, 244 strikeouts, a .218 OPP AVG and 27 quality starts.**
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** The Phillies have won five of their last six home games, and are 29-16 (.644) at Citizens Bank this season ... **They have the second-best home winning percentage in the NL (best: Giants, .650), and 6<sup>th</sup>-best in baseball trailing only the Yankees (.711), Red Sox (.700), Indians (.675) Mariners (.674) and Giants** ... Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 40-21 (.656) in their last 61 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current).
- WHAT A RELIEF:** The Phillies bullpen has tossed 13.0 straight scoreless innings dating back to the 7<sup>th</sup> inning on 6/30 vs WSH ... **In the last three games overall, they have allowed 1 ER in 17.0 IP (0.53 ERA), held opponents to a .193 AVG (11-57) and stranded all 6 inherited runners** ... Philadelphia's bullpen is coming off a series where they totaled 23.2 innings pitched in four games against WSH ... It marked the first time the Phillies bullpen tossed 23.2 innings in a series of four games or less since June 9-11, 1947 vs STL (25.0 IP in 4 G) ... In Sunday's game, eight different pitchers made scoreless appearances in relief of Jake Arrieta ... It marked the first time in franchise history eight or more relief hurlers made scoreless appearances in the same game.
- SERIESLY SPEAKING:** A win today would give the Phillies their sixth sweep of the season, their last of which was one-game sweep of BAL on 5/16 ... **Six sweeps would already match their total from 2017, and the last time they had more than six in an entire season was in 2012 (7) ... 2009 was the last time they had six before the All-Star break (7), per *Elias*.** The Phillies are 7-4 against AL teams this season, winning three straight against them.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 13 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3<sup>rd</sup>, 17.7%) and **Cesar Hernandez** (10<sup>th</sup>, 15.2 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (13<sup>th</sup>, 14.6%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.3 %, next-closest: CIN, 9.9 %) and also rank 1<sup>st</sup> in pitches per plate appearance (4.04) and are 2<sup>nd</sup> in walks (325) ... Pitch tracking data dates back to 1988 and over the last 30 years, the previous high for a Phillies team was 3.93 pitches per plate appearance in 2017 ... Philadelphia has finished a season with a walk rate greater than 10.0% only eight times in franchise history (last: 2002-05, 4 straight seasons).
- SAVE IT, SER:** Seranthony Dominguez locked down his eighth save last night, making four straight appearances with a save for the rookie right-hander ... He is 8-for-9 in save opportunities since his debut, posting a 1.59 ERA (2 ER, 11.1 IP) and allowing only nine baserunners (6 H, 3 BB, 0.79 WHIP) while striking out 14 batters in save opportunities ... He has pitched more than 1.0 inning in 4 of those saves and 2.0 innings in 3 three of them ... **Since appearing in his first save situation on 5/19, only three National League closers have more saves than his eight: LAD's Kenley Jansen (16), WSH's Sean Doolittle (11) and SD's Brad Hand (10).**
- POWERADE SHOWER:** Prior to **Andrew Knapp's** walk-off home run in the 13<sup>th</sup> inning on Sunday against the Nationals, the Phillies had gone 194 straight home games without a walk-off home run (last: **Ryan Howard**, 11<sup>th</sup> inning, 4/29/16 vs CLE) ... The 194-game stretch without a walk-off home run at home was the longest for the Phillies since a 202-game stretch at home from 1950 (Andy Seminick, 5/21/50 vs STL, G2) to 1952 (Del Ennis, 9/6/52 vs BOS Braves, G1).

**LAST START:** 6/28 vs WSH: 6/28 vs WSH: W, 7.2 IP, 5 H, R, ER, 2 BB, 8 SO ... Nola vs Roark ... Rhys Hoskins crushed a 2-run home run and Seranthony Dominguez picked up his second save in as many days as the Phils took the first game of the four-game set.

**TODAY'S START:**

- Go Home:** Since 6/22/17, Nola is 15-3 with a 1.98 ERA (29 ER, 131.2 IP), 0.91 WHIP and has held opponents to a .193 AVG with 156 SO in 19 starts at home ... He is the first Phillie to:
  - Win 7 straight decisions at home since 6/18-10-5/14/12 (Joe Blanton, 8)
  - Make 12 straight QS at home since 7/16/97-5/7/98 (Curt Schilling, 15)
  - Allow 1 or 0 R in 5 straight home starts since 6/6-7/9/11 (Cliff Lee, 5)
  - He is 1 of 6 different Phillies to toss at least 6.0 IP in 23 or more straight home games (others: Steve Carlton 3x, Grover Cleveland Alexander 2x, Roy Halladay, Robin Roberts & Curt Schilling)
- Winner Take All:** Became 1 of just 7 Phillies in the last 20 seasons (since 1999) with 10 wins before July 1 (Hamels in 2012, Halladay in 2011, Milton in 2004, Padilla in 2002, Byrd in 1999, Schilling in 1999) ... As it stands, his .833 winning percentage would be T-4<sup>th</sup> best by a Phillies starter before the All-Star break (min. 10 starts), trailing Steve Carlton (.900, 9-1 in 1981), Tommy Greene (.846, 11-2 in 1993) & Eric Milton (11-2, 846 in 2004)
- This Means WAR:** Per Baseball Reference, Nola's WAR of 4.8 is already the highest by any Phillies pitcher since 2014 (Hamels, 6.6)
- NL Starter Rankings:** 2<sup>nd</sup> in HR/9.0 IP (0.50), T-2<sup>nd</sup> in wins (10), 3<sup>rd</sup> in OPP OPS (.560), 4<sup>th</sup> in WHIP (1.01), IP (109.0) and OPP AVG (.205), 5<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.48), T-6<sup>th</sup> in SO (107)
- vs AL East:** 0-2, 4.79 ERA (11 ER, 20.2 IP) in 4 starts
- vs Interleague:** 3-5, 4.86 ERA (29 ER, 53.2 IP) in 10 starts

**HOME:**

- 2018:** 7-0, 1.77 ERA (11 ER, 56.0 IP) in 8 starts
- Career:** 21-12, 3.12 ERA (82 ER, 236.2 IP) in 37 starts

**2018 SEASON:**

- Per *Elias*, he had the 2<sup>nd</sup>-most strikeouts (467) through 75 career starts by any pitcher that began his career with Philadelphia (Cole Hamels, 469) and the 5<sup>th</sup>-most by any pitcher in his first 75 starts in a Phillies uniform
- Became the first Phillies pitcher 25 or younger to have multiple starts in a season with 10+ SO and no walks
- Since the NL started recording ER in 1912, the only other two Phillies pitchers (min. 10 GS) to have both a lower season ERA than his 2.18 and lower season WHIP than his 0.932 through the end of May were Hall of Famers Robin Roberts (1.99 ERA, 0.919 WHIP, 1952) & Grover C. Alexander (1.58 ERA, 0.928 WHIP, 1915) - Elias
- Posted a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) with 46 SO and a 0.90 WHIP in 6 May starts
- Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillies since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7<sup>th</sup> time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

**2017 SEASON:**

- Had the most SO (184) ever by a Phillies pitcher who made fewer than 30 starts in a season ... Averaged 9.86 SO/9.0 IP (184 SO/168.0 IP), becoming the 2<sup>nd</sup> qualifying Phillie with a SO/9.0 IP that high (other: Curt Schilling, 11.29 in 1997 and 10.05 in 1998)
- Had 10 straight starts with 2 or fewer runs allowed (6/22-8/12), the longest such streak by a Phillie since the current mound distance was established in 1893

**CAREER:**

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7<sup>th</sup> overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22<sup>nd</sup> round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
