## WASHINGTON NATIONALS (46-45) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (42-49)

July 11, 2018 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA --- GAME #92/HOME #48

LHP GIO GONZALEZ (6-5, 3.76 ERA) vs. RHP TREVOR WILLIAMS (6-7, 4.60 ERA)

**THE PIRATES...** have won two of their last three games after losing five in a row...Won four-of-six before the five-game skid...Have gone 6-8 in their last 14 games...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Won a season-high five straight games on two occasions (4/25-29 & 5/6-12)...Were 43-48 after 91 games in 2017 (44-48 after 92).

**FACEBOOK LIVE TODAY:** The Pirates and Nationals will be the feature game this afternoon on Facebook (no other TV outlets will carry the game)...The show will not have any commercial breaks and the announcers for the event will be Rich Waltz, Sean Casey, F.P. Santangelo and Stephen Nelson.

**ON THE BUMP:** In his last 19 starts at PNC Park (dating back to 6/27/17), **Trevor Williams** has posted a 3.38 ERA (106.2ip/40er) while allowing two runs or fewer in 14 of the 19 assignments...In 13 home starts since giving up eight runs to the Cardinals on 8/18/17, Williams has gone 6-4 with a 3.10 ERA (72.2ip/25er)...That stretch began with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched against the Dodgers on 8/23.

**PROJECT 34:** Created by Bucco RHP **Trevor Williams**, Project 34 was inspired by the journey of Cory Hahn, a former roommate and teammate of Trevor's at Arizona State University, who suffered a spinal cord injury...Project 34 has a mission to positively impact the lives of those living with a spinal cord injury by providing necessary medical equipment, assistive devices, and aiding in the cost for physical therapy...In Hahn's honor, Williams is wearing uniform #34 this season...For the complete story on Cory, check out the following link: <https://www.theplayerstribune.com/en-us/articles/cory-hahn-arizona-diamondbacks>.

**WHAT'S BREWING:** Tomorrow night the Bucs are scheduled to begin a five-game series against the N.L. Central-leading Brewers, which includes a doubleheader Saturday afternoon beginning at 12:35...Pittsburgh has posted a 3-2 record against the Brew Crew this season, including a 1-1 mark at PNC Park.

**TAYLOR-MADE STARTING ASSIGNMENT:** Double-A Altoona southpaw **Taylor Hearn** will start tonight for the Western Division in the Eastern League All-Star Game...Hearn, who was acquired from the Washington Nationals along with **Felipe Vázquez** on July 30, 2016, ranks 10th among the Eastern League leaders in ERA (3.35), first in batting average against (.195), third in WHIP (1.09) and is tied for third in strikeouts (94).

**OFFENSIVE OUTFIELD:** Pittsburgh's outfielders have combined to produce the second-highest batting average (.280) and OPS (.809) among National League teams, trailing the Cubs (.284 and .817 respectively)...The Bucco outfielders are pacing the senior circuit in total bases (506) and they also lead the league in assists (19).

**LEADING THE WAY:** **Corey Dickerson** has gone 3-for-8 with a walk and two runs scored in two games from the leadoff spot...He hit .285 with 15 homers, 31 RBI and 39 runs in 57 games from the top spot last year while playing with Tampa Bay...Dickerson has six career home runs leading off the first inning (all coming in 2017).

**RECORD BREAKER:** All-Star closer **Felipe Vázquez** has converted 19 of his 23 save opportunities this season and has recorded 40 saves in his two seasons as the Pittsburgh closer, establishing the club record for most saves by a left-handed pitcher (previous mark of 39 saves was held by **Ramon Hernandez**)...The single-season club record for most saves by a LHP was set by **Mike Gonzalez** in 2006 (24)...Vázquez had a career-high 21 saves with the Bucs last season.

**ALL-STAR PERFORMANCE:** **Felipe Vázquez** has made 11 straight scoreless appearances (11.2ip) and has been scored upon just once in his last 15 outings (16.0ip/2er) while converting each of his last nine save chances...Vázquez' 19 saves are tied for seventh among the National League leaders and rank fourth among all southpaws in MLB behind Aroldis Chapman (24), Brad Hand (24) and Sean Doolittle (22).

**SWATTING THE NATS:** **Corey Dickerson** has gone 8-for-24 with two home runs and six RBI in his six games played against Washington this season and is hitting .347 (17-for-49) with five doubles, a triple and three homers in 13 career games against the Nationals...He has reached base safely in all 13 games while hitting safely in 12 of the 13 (10 straight).

**THE MOVE TO 2:** In the last six games while batting second in the lineup, **Starling Marte** has gone 11-for-23 (.478) with two doubles, a home run, four RBI and five stolen bases while producing four multi-hit efforts.

**UP THE CRICK:** **Kyle Crick** has made 11 consecutive scoreless appearances (11.0ip), dating back to 6/15...Crick has held opposing hitters to a .200 average in his 35 appearances this season and to a .154 (6-for-39) clip over his last 11 games.

**PIRATING:** The Bucs have swiped 10 bases in their last four games and have been successful 17 times in their last 18 stolen base attempts...**Starling Marte** currently shares the National League lead with 23 stolen bases.

**GOLDEN ARM:** Bucco Gold Glove outfielder **Starling Marte** shares the Major League lead with nine assists this season...Dating back to the 2014 season, Marte's 54 assists are tops among all Major League outfielders.

**RIGHT ON:** **Gregory Polanco** is tied for third among N.L. right fielders in total bases (127), trailing only Nick Markakis (165) and Andrew McCutchen (137)...In addition, Polanco's 1.073 OPS since 6/10 ranks sixth among all Major League players.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 11, 1999: Rookie Warren Morris recorded his first career four-hit game while also driving in four runs in a 10-2 over the Twins at the Metrodome. Brian Giles and Kevin Young added three hits and an RBI apiece while the Bucs tallied 17 hits in the contest. Todd Ritchie allowed two runs over 7.0 innings while upping his record to 9-6 on the season

**JAMESON TAILLON:** The 26-year-old righthander will be making his 19th start of the season tomorrow night...Took a 2-0 lead into the seventh inning Saturday afternoon, but ended up losing a 3-2 decision to Jake Arrieta at PNC Park (6.2ip/5h/3e/3er/Obb/6so)...Has gone 3-7 with a 4.86 ERA (79.2ip/43er) in his last 15 starts after going 2-0 with a 0.89 ERA in his first three assignments...Has been charged with three earned runs or less in 15 of his 18 starts this season and has pitched into the sixth inning seven times in his last 10 outings...Is 0-4 in his last seven home starts since winning here for the last time on 4/8.
