LEADING OFF: Today the Halos play the third contest (1-1) of six-game home stand vs. Texas (June 1-3; 1-1) and Kansas City (June 4-6)...Halos are 14-7 vs. A.L. West foes...LAA has dropped five of last seven games and are a season-high 5.5 games back of division lead (3rd time)...Went 14-15 in May and are 18-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...Angels are 9-7-2 in 18 series...Following home stand, LAA heads out to Minnesota (June 8-10), Seattle (June 11-13) and Oakland (June 15-17).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Marked Angels' 11th blown save – most in A.L. (3rd in MLB)...Garrett Richards is now 2-1 with a 1.04 ERA (26 IP – 3 ER) with 26 Ks across his last four home outings...Halos fell to 1-5 in extra-inning games...Marked just third loss when leading after eight frames (28-3)...Mike Trout extended his club record with his 10th game with a triple & HR.

SIMBA STAYS HOT: Andrelton Simmons boasts an 11-game hit streak...Has hit safely in 31 of his last 35 games hitting .361 (48-for-133) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span.

YOU READ THAT RIGHT: Mike Trout is on pace for a 15.6 WAR season – would be the best ever by a position player...He is tied for MLB lead with 19 HRs...19 HRs thru 59 games are most in Angels' history...On pace for a career-best 52 homers...Also tied for MLB lead with 143 total bases (Machado).

KINSLER CLIMBING: Ian Kinsler is riding a six-game hit streak going 12-for-24 (.500) to raise his season average from .178 to .222...Has logged three doubles, three HRs and six RBI in the stretch...Was in a 4-for-46 skid before the hit streak.

FROM THE START: Halos have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 27 of last 31 games...Starter ERA of 2.86 (167 IP – 53 ER) for May ranked second in A.L...229 BAA was fourth lowest in A.L. for the month...Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for the month was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

SHO-KKKKK: Shohei Ohtani has 57 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first seven career starts...57 Ks are already a club record through nine starts as well.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: Mike Scioscia posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons Tommy Lasorda (1,599) for sole possession of 20th all-time.

Martín Maldonado has hits in eight of last 11 games...10 RBI his last 11 games...Hitting .313 (25/80) with six doubles and three home runs since May 1 after entering month with a .156 average...Already has five 3-hit contests in 2018 - first Angels' catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009.

MORE THAN GLOVE: Andrelton Simmons has reached base safely in 38 of last 39 games...Leads MLB in PA per SO with 23.7 (237 PA/10 K) and ranks T3rd in A.L. batting .336...Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (57) and ranks tied for second in wins (4)...Quality starts in five of eight outings on the mound...Has a hit in 22-of-31 games with an at-bat...Tied for second in A.L. among rookies in extra base hits with 15...His six HRs are third-most in A.L. amongst rookies (all six hit at home) while his 20 RBI rank fifth...Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April.

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, Albert Pujols...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (Adrián Beltré; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).dd

THE MAN AND ME: Albert Pujols ranks seventh all-time in RBI with 1,948...Stan Musial is next on the list with 1,951 RBI (baseballreference.com).

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 27 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through first 59 games...Halos have issued 213 free passes, second-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has tossed 221.1 IP to rank second in A.L.

THIS N' THAT: Last Saturday, C Jose Briceño became the seventh player in LAA history to homer in MLB debut (3rd catcher)...Halo outfielders lead MLB with 14 OF assists (Calhoun leads MLB with 7)...Halos' average home attendance (37,531) ranks second in A.L...Club boasts nine sellouts thru 31 home games...LAA has 25 errors thru 59 games (third-fewest in A.L.) and rank third in circuit with a .988 fielding pct.

Vs. RANGERS: Halos lead 2018 series 4-1 (swept Texas April 9-11 in Arlington)...Have outscored Rangers 34-96 this season...Texas has won last two season series...After playing eight years with Rangers, Ian Kinsler is batting .345 (40-for-116) with eight home runs against them.

ROYALS ON DECK: LAA leads 2018 season series 3-0...Team will play a make-up game Monday, June 25 in KC (3:15 PM CT)...Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1...LAA is 10-13 in last 23 matchups spanning back to 2015...LAA leads all-time series 293-286...Albert Pujols is a career .312 (115/369) hitter with 24 HR and 80 RBI in 96 career games vs. Royals...Mike Trout is batting .341 (47/138) with 11 HR and 27 RBI in 38 G (.623 SLG) vs. KC...His .623 SLG pct. is highest by any opponent with 100 AB.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 3
(2003) Angels hit 13 HRs in the first two games of the Montreal series in Puerto Rico (June 3-4) to tie the A.L. record for HRs in consecutive games.

June 4
(2014) Garrett Richards strikes out the side on nine pitches in the second inning at Houston, just the 75th occurrence in MLB history; **(2003)** Garret Anderson tied a club record with three home runs vs. Montreal in Puerto Rico, marking 11th time an Angel accomplished feat...In that same game, Jeff DaVanon posted his third consecutive multiple home run game, the fourth player in ML history to accomplish feat - Angels collected a club-record seven HRs in the effort; **(2005)** Garret Anderson collects four RBI at Boston for a total of 991 in career to set Angels RBI record and pass Tim Salmon (989) into first place on club's all-time list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP TYLER SKAGGS

3-4, 3.60 ERA

Earned win in first start of year vs. Texas on April 10 at Globe Life Park (W; 5 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 4 BB, 7 SO)

- Making 12th start of the season and sixth at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Texas...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in eight of 11 starts this season...His eight starts with two-or-fewer runs are tied for third most in the Majors this season among left-handers.
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has yielded six home runs across last four starts after allowing two homers through first seven starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start on Monday at Detroit after pitching five innings and allowing five earned runs on six hits with three walks and five strikeouts...**Has recorded 5+ strikeouts in a career high six straight games.**
- **SIX HIT STREAK:** Has allowed exactly six hits in each of his last five starts (Angels record)...Last Major Leaguer to allow exactly six hits in six straight starts was Rangers' **Kenny Rogers** in 2002.
- **300 K's:** Recorded 300th career strikeout against **Aaron Hicks** in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** Has pitched to a 3-1 record and 2.94 ERA (33.2 IP – 11 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 0-3 record and 4.44 ERA (23.2 IP – 13 ER) at home...His road ERA ranks 10th in the American League.
- **EARLY SUCCESS:** In 27 career regular season starts from March-May, is 9-8 with a 3.77 ERA (167 IP – 70 ER) and 156 strikeouts...From June-October in 40 starts, is 7-17 with a 4.96 ERA (208.2 IP – 115 ER) and 177 strikeouts.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has allowed two home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (243 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 240 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. TEXAS:** In nine career games against the Rangers, is 3-2 with a 6.00 ERA (42 IP – 30 ER)...The ERA is highest of any A.L. opponent and wins are second most against any opponent (most is four wins vs. Houston)...Earned the win in first start of 2018 vs. Rangers on April 10 at Globe Life Park after tossing five innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with four walks and seven strikeouts.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Seeking first winning decision at home since Sept. 13, 2017 vs. Houston...In 26 career starts at the Big A, is 3-10 with a 4.67 ERA (140.2 IP – 73 ER)...In five home starts this season, is 0-3 with a 4.44 ERA (26.1 IP – 13 ER)...Angels have won 13 of his 26 career home starts.
- **NEW CAREER HIGH:** Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati).
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

- Owns a 16-25 career record with a 4.43 ERA (375.2 IP – 185 ER) and 333 strikeouts in 68 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
