THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY

1961 - The Tigers took over first place with a doubleheader sweep of the Angels. Frank Lary picked up his 13th win of the season in the opener, a 1-0 three-hitter, while Jim Bunning earned the win in the nightcap.

1970 - Dalton Jones lost a grand slam against the Red Sox when he passed teammate Don Wert on the basepaths. Jones pinch hit for Jim Price and belted a 2-2 pitch from Vicente Romo into the right field upper deck for an apparent grand slam. However, he passed Wert between first and second and was called out, ending up with a three-RBI single.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers were shut out by the Rangers, 3-0, in the series finale on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Michael Fulmer pitched 7.0 innings for Detroit, but took the loss, giving up three runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts. Offensively, Niko Goodrum, José Iglesias, JaCoby Jones and James McCann each had one hit. The Tigers tonight begin a six-game road trip as they open a three-game series at Tampa Bay. Following the series vs. the Rays, the road trip continues with three games at Houston (July 13-15).

ROSTER MOVES: The Tigers have announced the following roster moves:

* Following yesterday's game, the Tigers optioned RHP Artie Lewicki to Triple A Toledo.

* The Tigers today have reinstated RHP Drew VerHagen from the 10-day DL. VerHagen, who had been sidelined since June 20 with a nasal fracture, made four appearances with Triple A Toledo during an injury rehab assignment, posting an 0-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (5.1IP/2ER) and 10 strikeouts.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Joe Jiménez was selected as an American League All-Star for the first time in his career last night. In 44 appearances this season, Jiménez has posted a 4-1 record with three saves, a 2.85 ERA (41.0IP/13ER) and 46 strikeouts. He has limited opponents to a .224 (35x156) batting average and has a 1.15 WHIP. Jiménez currently ranks tied for fourth in the American League with 44 appearances, while he is tied for eighth four wins and tied for ninth with 13 holds. At 23 years old, Jiménez is the youngest Tigers All-Star since 1992, when Travis Fryman was selected to the All-Star Team at the age of 23.

START ME UP: Michael Fulmer threw 7.0 strong innings in yesterday's game, allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts. With Fulmer's outing, Tigers starting pitchers have thrown 6.0-or-more innings in 11 of the last 12 games, dating back to June 27. Prior to June 27, Detroit starters had gone at least 6.0 innings just once in the previous 12 games. Since June 27, the Tigers starting rotation leads the Majors with 79.0 innings pitched, while they are third in the American League with a .224 (66x295) opponents batting average and fourth with a 3.30 ERA (79.0IP/29ER).

GOODY TWO SHOES: Niko Goodrum went 1x4 in yesterday's game and has now hit safely in seven-of-eight games in July. In eight games this month, Goodrum has a slash line of .438/.455/.719 with seven runs scored, four doubles, one triple, one home run and two RBI.

ZIP, ZERO, ZILCH, NADA: The Tigers suffered their 11th shutout of the season yesterday vs. Texas. Detroit's 11 shutouts are the most in the Majors. Last season, the Tigers were shut out 12 times.

RECAPPING THE HOMESTAND: The Tigers went 2-2 on their four-game homestand, splitting a series against the Rangers. Detroit hit .252 (33x131) as a team during the homestand, while the pitching staff compiled a 2.75 (36.0IP/11ER). Individually, Niko Goodrum finished the homestand hitting .375 (6x16) with three runs scored, one double, one home run and one RBI, while Victor Reyes batted .400 (4x10) with a RBI.

V-MART VS. THE RAYS: Victor Martinez has performed well in his career against the Tampa Bay Rays. In 89 career games against the Rays, Martinez has posted a .342 (120x351) batting average with 45 runs scored, 18 doubles, 14 home runs and 71 RBI. Among active players, Martinez ranks third with a .342 batting average vs. Tampa Bay, while he is sixth with a .394 on-base percentage and seventh with a .513 slugging percentage. Martinez has a .353 (66x187) batting average with 25 runs scored, eight doubles, 10 home runs and 35 RBI in 46 career games at Tropicana Field.

TIGERS AND RAYS: The Tigers have a 2-1 lead in the season series against the Rays after winning two-of-three games from the Rays earlier this season at Comerica Park. The Tigers were swept in a three-game series at Tropicana Field last season and have an all-time record of 36-36 in Tampa Bay. Detroit is 3-2-2 in season series against the Rays since 2011.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers tonight begin a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Tampa Bay (July 9-11) and three games at Houston (July 13-15). Detroit is currently in a stretch that will see them play 20-of-28 games away from Comerica Park leading up to the All-Star break. The Tigers are 15-29 on the road this season and have lost nine of their last 11 games away from home. As a team, Detroit is hitting .237 (359x1516) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.69 ERA (372.1IP/194ER).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 40-52 (.435) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,108-1,091 (.504) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 14th start of the season tonight in the series opener at Tampa Bay.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano turned in his seventh quality start of the season, but suffered his fourth consecutive loss on Wednesday at Chicago (NL), allowing three runs on five hits with five walks and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. TAMPA BAY: Liriano has faced the Rays 15 times in his career, including 13 as a starter, compiling a 3-4 record with a 5.40 ERA (68.1IP/41ER) and 69 strikeouts. He made five appearances, including four starts, against Tampa Bay last season and went 1-1 with a 6.61 ERA (16.1IP/12ER) and 21 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Liriano has made 170 career appearances, including 145 starts, on the road, posting a 52-61 record with one save, a 4.43 ERA (826.2IP/407ER) and 818 strikeouts. In eight road starts this season, Liriano has a 1-4 record with a 3.23 ERA (47.1IP/17ER) and 30 strikeouts.

AT TROPICANA FIELD: Liriano is making his eighth career appearance and sixth career start at Tropicana Field tonight. In seven previous outings in St. Petersburg, Liriano has a 1-2 record with a 9.43 ERA (21.0IP/22ER) and 22 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Liriano has pitched in 57 games, including 50 starts, against teams from the American League East, compiling a 15-22 record with a 4.65 ERA (272.2IP/141ER) and 267 strikeouts. In three starts vs. AL East teams this season, Liriano is 2-1 with a 4.15 ERA (17.1IP/8ER) and 12 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Liriano has made 54 starts in his career during the month of July, posting a 24-16 record with a 3.64 ERA (316.2IP/128ER) and 334 strikeouts. In six July starts last season, Liriano went 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA (26.2IP/20ER) and 20 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded batters to a .217 (307x1413) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .248 (1212x4895). In 13 starts this season, lefties are hitting .098 (5x51) and righthanded batters are hitting .249 (52x209) against Liriano.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL: Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters tonight's game with 1,699 strikeouts in his Major League career, which is the sixth most among Dominican-born pitchers. He is 21 strikeouts away from tying Ubaldo Jimenez for fifth.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).
