LAST SEASON:

2017 SEASON: Set career high in appearances, one more than he made with Arizona in 2016...Posted a 2.75 ERA (36.0ip/11er) in 39 games at home and a 6.66 ERA (25.2ip/19er) in 32 road games...Produced a 3.43 ERA (39.1ip/15er) and a .211 batting average against (30-for-142) in his final 46 games, beginning on 6/2...Made his debut with the Pirates on Opening Day (4/3 at

Boston) and struck out three batters in his 1.0ip; it was also his 200th career game in the Majors...Did not allow an earned run in 13 appearances from 6/27 thru 8/2 (10.0ip)...Tied career high (second time) with four strikeouts in relief on 8/25 at Cincinnati...Won his two games on 6/10 vs. Miami and 7/17 vs. Milwaukee.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

2016: Set career highs in saves in his sixth and final season with Arizona...Held the opposition scoreless in 52 of his 70 outings, including in 21 of his final 25...Stranded a team-high 17 of his 22 inherited runners (77%)...Posted a 2.75 ERA (52.1ip/16er) in 51 outings when pitching 1.0 inning or more...Tossed a season-high 2.0 innings on 4/18 at San Francisco...Held right-handed batters hitless in their first 26 at bats thru 5/14...Began the season with a 1.55 ERA (29.0ip/5er) and a .130 opponent average after his first 30 appearances thru 6/21...Was scored upon in 10 of his 15 outings between 6/23 and 8/2, giving up 31 runs (26 earned) in 9.2 innings of work...Produced a 1.66 ERA (21.2ip/4er) and a .235 opponents average over his last 25 games, beginning with the action on 8/5...Went 11 games (8.0ip) without allowing a run from 8/5-25.

2015: Was used almost exclusively in relief for the first time in his career; his first full season after returning from two Tommy John surgeries...Tied for third on Arizona staff in appearances...Averaged a career-best 9.44 strikeouts per 9.0ip...Made his only start on 5/10 vs. San Diego (3.1ip/0r) - his first big league starting assignment since 6/26/12 at Atlanta...His win on 5/19 at Miami was his first victory in the Majors since 6/14/12 at Texas...Recorded his first career save on 6/14 at San Francisco...Went 4-for-6 in save opportunities...Struck out in his only plate appearance on 5/10 vs. San Diego.

2014: Spent majority of season on Arizona's disabled list following his second ligament surgery in 2013...Made first rehab appearance with the Arizona League Diamondbacks on 8/5 - his first game action since 6/4/13...Posted a 1.50 ERA (6.0ip/1er) in six total rehab starts with the AZL D-Backs and Reno between 8/5-29...Was reinstated from D.L. on 9/1 and threw 1.0 perfect inning of relief on 9/3 at San Diego, his first big league outing since 6/26/12...Was the fourth pitcher to have ligament replacement surgery in consecutive years and return to the Majors; also Doug Brocail, Mike Lincoln and Denny Stark (source: Jeff Passan)...Did not pitch after 9/13.

2013: Began season making three starts in Arizona's Extended Spring Training program, recovering from Tommy John surgery...Made one rehab start with Double-A Mobile (2.0ip/1er) on 6/4; left the game with right elbow soreness...Underwent his second Tommy John surgery on 6/18 in Birmingham, AL (performed by Dr. James Andrews).

2012: Was victorious in his first start on 4/7 vs. San Francisco...Made three starts before going on the 15-day disabled list for the first time in his career due to a right shoulder impingement...Made rehab start with Reno on 5/21 prior to being reinstated

from D.L. on 5/27...Pitched a season-high 8.0 innings on 6/2 at San Diego...Was removed from his start on 6/26 at Atlanta with right forearm tightness (an MRI the following day revealed a torn ulnar collateral ligament)...Underwent Tommy John surgery on 7/9 in Los Angeles (performed by Dr. Lewis Yocum).

2011: Spent first full season with Arizona and established career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts...Ranked among National League leaders in starts (T-4th), innings (T-5th) and wins (T-6th)...Won his first N.L. Silver Slugger Award, hitting .277 (18-for-65) with three doubles, one home run and 14 RBI...Joined Micah Owings (2007) as the only two D-backs pitchers to garner the honor...Led all N.L. pitchers in average, RBI, hits, on-base percentage (.209) and slugging percentage (.369)...Went 16-8 with a 3.19 ERA (197.2ip/70er) after losing each of his first four starts...Tied career high (second time) with 10 strikeouts on 4/15 vs. San Francisco...Was named co-N.L. Player of the Week, along with the Brewers' Shaun Marcum, for the week of 5/16-22 after going 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0ip/1er)...Threw his first career complete game in a 4-1 win on 6/17 vs. Chicago (AL)...Notched second complete game and hit his first career home run (off Ted Lilly) on 7/17 vs. Los Angeles (NL)...Became the first pitcher to throw a complete game and hit his first homer since the Mets' Johan Santana on July 6, 2010 vs. Cincinnati...Won career-high seven straight decisions between 5/17 and 7/17...Tossed his third complete game on 9/9 vs. San Diego (his final win of the season)...Suffered the loss in Game Two of the N.L.D.S. vs. Milwaukee on 10/2 (5.1ip/5er).

2010: Began season with Charlotte (White Sox' AAA) and was selected to the International League mid-season All-Star Team...Was also named to the U.S. roster for the MLB All-Star Futures Game in Anaheim, CA (did not participate)...Was recalled by Chicago on 7/11...Made three starts with the White Sox before being acquired by Arizona on 7/30...Combined to go 8-2 with a 2.45 ERA (95.1ip/26er) in 14 starts between the White Sox and Diamondbacks...His 0.997 combined WHIP with the two clubs led all Major League pitchers (min. 10 starts)...Led all Major League rookie pitchers (min. 10 starts) in ERA and opponents average (.202)...Made debut with Arizona on 8/1 at New York (NL) and gave up one run in 8.0ip for the win; also singled off Elmer Dessens for first big league hit...Recorded first career 10-strikeout performance on 8/17 vs. Cincinnati; struck out eight batters in the first 3.0 innings, becoming the first rookie pitcher to accomplish the feat since Rick Ankiel on July 27, 2000...Named National League Rookie-of-the-Month for August after going 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA (43.2ip/9er) in six starts...Was named Rookie-of-the-Year by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA.

2009: Was a September callup by the White Sox and made Major League debut on 9/4 vs. Boston (tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief)...Suffered first big league loss while making first start on 9/21 vs. Minnesota (5.0ip/3r/1er)...Earned first win while making second start on 9/27 vs. Detroit (6.0ip/2er).

2009: Went 14-5 with a 2.32 ERA (147.1ip/38er) and 166 strikeouts in 26 starts over four stops in the White Sox system, including Single-A Kannapolis, Single-A Winston-Salem, Double-A Birmingham and Charlotte...Was named Minor League Baseball's overall Starting Pitcher-of-the-Year after leading the organization in ERA and strikeouts and tying for first in wins... Was named Pitcher-of-the-Week in the South Atlantic League for week of 4/8-19 and in the Southern League for week of 6/15-21.

2008: Spent first professional season with Great Falls and led Pioneer League in strikeouts...Named co-Pitcher-of-the-Week for week of 7/21-27... Received honorable mention on the post-season All-Star Team.

- Has a career batting average of .303 over eight minor league seasons.
- Compiled a career batting average of .324 vs. left-handed pitching (226-698), including hitting over .400 in each of his first three seasons.
- Posted a positive career walk to strikeout ratio (260 to 236) and has a career on-base percentage of .359.
- Has appeared defensively at seven positions throughout his seven-year minor league career, missing only catcher and pitcher.
- Named to three Mid-Season All-Star Games (2012 New York-Penn, 2013 Midwest and 2014 Florida State).
- Recognized as the Most Valuable Player of the 2016 Venezuelan Winter League while playing for Bravos de Margarita.
- Has a .305 career batting average (250-821) over the last five seasons playing in 232 games in the Venezuelan Winter League.
