BLOW-BY-BLOW

- The Rockies embark on their second road trip of the season with the first of four games at Washington tonight ... they will also play three games at Pittsburgh, April 16-18.
- Won the final game of their six-game homestand yesterday, beating San Diego 6-4 to snap their season-long, three-game losing streak and avoid being swept ... lost two of three games to both San Diego and Atlanta on their first homestand of their 25th Anniversary Season.
- Three Rockies were ejected from yesterday's game after Nolan Arenado charged Padres pitcher Luis Perdomo in the third inning ... Arenado, Gerardo Parra and starting pitcher German Márquez were all ejected from the game as well as Padres catcher A.J. Ellis and Perdomo ... the Rockies eventually scored five runs in the inning, tied for their most runs in a single inning this season.

IN THE PINCH

- Pat Valaika's pinch-hit single in the third inning of yesterday's game snapped the Rockies' 0-for-22 hitless streak in the pinch ... the Rockies' 24 pinch-hit at-bats are the most in the Major Leagues.

SLUGFEST

- The Rockies lead the National League with 17 home runs ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.
- Through 12 games, the Rockies .232 team batting average ranks 12th in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.
- The Rockies .282 batting average on balls in play ranks 12th in the National League ... they led MLB with a .332 BABIP in 2017.

LOTS OF SHRIMP

- The Rockies won Saturday night's game in 10 innings on a walk-off walk to Tony Wolters ... each of the Rockies' last three walk-off wins have come via a bases-loaded walk (also: Aug. 3, 2017 vs. New York-NL, Sept. 4, 2017 vs. San Francisco) ... it is the first time in franchise history that the Rockies have earned three consecutive walk-off wins via walk, and the first time it has happened in the Major Leagues since Toronto in 1997.

GUESS WHO'S BACK

- Rockies infielder-outfielder Ian Desmond is set to play his first games in Nationals Park since his last season with the club in 2015 ... Desmond was with the Rockies when they visited D.C. in 2017 but was on the 10-day disabled list at the time.
- Desmond's 927 games played with the Nationals are the second-most in franchise history ... he hit .264 with 185 doubles, 21 triples, 110 home runs

and 432 RBI ... was named an All-Star in 2012 and won the Silver Slugger at shortstop in 2013 and 2014.

MAIN EVENT

- Colorado will play the Nationals seven times this year, including the Rockies' first four-game set in Washington since 2013.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 107-83 ... the Rockies are 51-37 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005.
- In Washington, the Rockies are 27-16, including 20-12 at Nationals Park ... the Rockies have won two of three in D.C. each of the last three seasons.
- DJ LeMahieu is a career .373 hitter (41-for-110) against the Nationals ... he has reached base safely in 11 games against Washington since the 2016 season with multiple hits in six games.
- In 29 career games against the Nationals, Nolan Arenado has batted .318 (35-for-110) with six home runs ... in 13 games at Nationals Park, Arenado has hit .373 (19-for-51) with two doubles, two triples and four home runs.

HEATING UP

- Shortstop Trevor Story has reached base safely in 10 consecutive games, with at least one hit in eight of 10 games ... over that span, he is batting .257 (9-for-35) with a .381 on-base percentage, two doubles, three home runs and six RBI ... has struck out nine times over his last 11 games after striking out seven times in the first two games of the season.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in six of his seven games, including striking out the side three times ... is currently second in the Major Leagues among relievers with 16 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his eight innings or work across seven appearances.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (587), DJ LeMahieu (567) and Nolan Arenado (560) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .319 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Charlie Blackmon, who has missed the last two games due to right quad soreness, is 11-for-39 (.282) to begin the season with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI ... signed a six-year contract that includes two player options on April 3.
- He hit home runs in three consecutive games March 30-April 2 for the second time in his Major League career (April 20-23, 2014), including his first multi-home run game of the season on March 31 at Arizona.

MOVING UP

- With two hits April 2, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 66 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

BACK IN BLACK

- Manager Bud Black led the Rockies to a postseason appearance in his first season in 2017 with the club going 87-75 and advancing to the National League Wild Card game ... it was the Rockies' first winning season since 2010.

LUBBOCK LIGHTS

- The Lubbock, Texas, native is a member of his third career Opening Day roster, his first since 2016 in his sixth Major League season.
- Selected by the Rockies in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Tech University.
- Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by Houston in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.

WASH THAT

- Is 1-0 with a 4.26 ERA (12.2 IP, 6 ER), three walks and nine strikeouts across four career appearances, two starts, against the Washington Nationals.
- Both his starts came in August of 2016 ... earned the win at Nationals Park after allowing two runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts across seven innings ... both runs came on solo home runs (Turner; Ramos).
- Made two relief appearances against the Nationals in 2014 and allowed two runs across 2.2 innings.

CENTURY MARK

- Did not factor into the Rockies 3-2 win over the Atlanta Braves in his last start, April 7 at Coors Field, his 100th career Major League appearance ... allowed one run over 5.2 innings pitched with four hits, two walks and three strikeouts.
- Allowed the one run in the sixth inning with the Rockies leading 2-1 ... the Rockies eventually won 3-2 in 10 innings.

HIT THE BRICKS

- In 48 career appearances on the road, including 37 starts, is 12-15 with a 4.73 ERA (211.0 IP, 111 ER) ... as a starter, has gone 12-14 with a 4.73 ERA (199.2 IP, 105 ER).
- In 18 starts on the road in 2016, went 6-6 with a 5.06 ERA (105.0 IP, 59 ER). Made his first start of the season at Petco Park against the Padres in a 7-4 Rockies win ... allowed two runs over five innings of work with five hits, four walks and four strikeouts.
- Went 1-3 with an 8.40 ERA (15.0 IP, 14 ER), 22 hits, three home runs, seven walks and 11 strikeouts in four road starts in 2017.

MOUNTAINOUS

- Made five starts at home last season, going 1-1 with a 3.45 ERA (31.1 IP, 12 ER), 30 hits, five home runs, four walks and 19 strikeouts ... pitched seven innings in three separate starts, including consecutive starts Aug. 14 & 19, the first time in his career he pitched at least seven innings in back-to-back home starts.
- Since the beginning of 2016, has gone 9-3 with a 4.04 ERA (118.0 IP, 53 ER) in 20 starts at Coors Field ... the Rockies have gone 16-4 over that span.
- Colorado won 11 consecutive games at Coors Field in games started by Bettis from June 9, 2016-Aug. 14, 2017 ... over that span, he went 7-0 with a 3.50 ERA (64.1 IP, 25 ER).
- Is 13-7 with a 4.50 ERA (196.0 IP, 98 ER) in 34 career starts at Coors Field ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.

CHAD>CANCER

- Returned to the starting rotation in 2017 after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis and subsequent surgery ... was originally diagnosed and underwent surgery in November, 2016 ... a biopsy in March, 2017 showed the cancer had spread and he underwent chemotherapy treatments throughout the spring and beginning of summer.
- Placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13, and was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
- Made his first Major League start of the season on Aug. 14 vs. the Atlanta Braves and Julio Teheran ... pitched seven shutout innings and allowed six hits with no walks and two strikeouts in a 3-0 Rockies win.
- Made nine Major League starts and went 2-4 with a 5.05 ERA (46.1 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks and 30 strikeouts.

TONY C. AWARD

- Was the recipient of the 207 Tony Conigliaro Award, which is given to a Major Leaguer who has overcome adversity through the attributes of spirit, determination and courage that were trademarks of Tony C. ... Bettis became the second Rockies pitcher to receive the award (Aaron Cook, 2005).

SWEET '16

- Went 14-8 with a 4.79 ERA (186.0 IP, 99 ER), 59 walks and 138 strikeouts in 32 starts in 2016, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
- Led the Rockies in wins, starts and innings pitched.
- Pitched his first career complete-game shutout on Sept. 5 vs. San Francisco at Coors Field ... allowed two hits with no walks and seven strikeouts, becoming the seventh Rockies pitcher to throw a nine-inning shutout and allow two hits or fewer, the second to accomplish the feat at Coors Field.
- The Rockies went 21-11 in his 32 starts, including 16-4 over his final 20 starts of 2016 ... Colorado went 10-0 over his final 10 starts at Coors Field.

BACK IN THE DAY

- Made his Major League debut in 2013 and made eight starts and eight relief appearances.
- Was used solely as a reliever in 2014, making 21 relief appearances for the Rockies ... returned to the starting rotation in 2015, making 20 starts.

- Snapped an 0-for-16 streak with a solo home run in the second inning Monday vs. San Diego ... had a hit in each of the first five games of the season.
- Six of his 10 home runs as a Rockie have come against the Padres.
- Appeared in 95 games with Colorado in 2017, his fewest games since his rookie season in 2009, after landing on the disabled list three times ... missed the first month of the season with a fractured left hand suffered in Spring Training ... also had two stints on the DL with a right calf strain.
- Led the Rockies with 15 stolen bases ... started 64 games in left field, 22 games at first base, one game in center field and one game at shortstop.
