**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees begin a seven-game road trip tonight, the first of 4G at Boston (through Sun.)...will also visit Chicago-AL for 3G (Mon.-Wed.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand (3-1 vs. Kansas City, 1-1 vs. Baltimore).

- ▶ **At 68-38 (.642), have the Majors' second-best record** behind Boston (75-34, .688)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 83 of the last 91 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ **Are 30G over .500, 1G under their season high watermark** (31G over at the end of play on Tuesday)...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ **Are 5.5G behind first-place Boston** in the AL East.
- ▶ **Have lost just four of their last 31 series**, going 21-4-6 since 4/19...are 59-29 in their last 88G...are 50-8 (.862) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Had a three-game winning streak snapped** on Wednesday...marked their longest winning streak since winning four straight from 6/18-21...have just one losing streak longer than two games this season (went 0-3 from 6/22-24, all at Tampa Bay).
- ▶ **Are 1-1 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days** (7/31-8/19).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees had their three-game winning streak snapped in a 7-5 loss vs. Baltimore on Wednesday...**RHP Sonny Gray** (2.2IP, 8H, 7ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HR) started and took the loss...tied career highs in runs (ninth time) and earned runs (eighth time); had not allowed more than 6R in any of his first 31 starts as a Yankee...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4) hit a solo HR in the second and three-run HR in the ninth, his second career multi-HR game...**SS Didi Gregorius** (3-for-5, 1R) extended his on-base streak vs. Baltimore to 28 games...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-4, 2R, 1BB) walked for the ninth consecutive start...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the eighth inning to snap a team streak of 19 hitless plate appearances with the bases loaded...**RHP Lance Lynn** tossed 4.1 scoreless innings (5H, 0BB, 5K) in relief in his Yankees debut.

▶ **Yankees relievers** threw 6.1 scoreless innings (7H, 0BB, 6K), their first scoreless game since 7/23 at Tampa Bay (3.0IP)...was their second-most innings pitched in a game this season in which they did not allow a run.

**JUST DÚ IT:** **3B Miguel Andújar** has hit safely in 22-of-25 games since the start of July, batting .337/.384/.446 (31-for-92) with 13R, 7 doubles, 9RBI, 6BB and 1HP.

▶ Has RBI in four straight games (6RBI) after collecting just 3RBI in his previous 22G.

**SHOWER HOUR:** The Yankees and Orioles sat through a 39-minute rain delay in the middle of the third inning on Wednesday...was the Yankees' fourth in-game rain delay this season...have had 18 of their 106 games affected by weather (also 9 postponements, 4 pre-game delays and 1 suspended game).

**FAN FAVORITES:** Through 54 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (2,340,346) and average attendance per home gate (43,340), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,562,299 / 46,587).

▶ **Their 21 sellouts this season are a single-season record for the current Yankee Stadium** (previous: 20 in 2011)...have sold out 14 of their last 19 home games (since 6/16).

**ALL THAT'S LEFT:** The Yankees are 12-1 in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers since 5/25...are a Major League-best 24-6 (.800) when they face a left-handed starter in 2018.

▶ Have faced just one left-handed starter in their last 19 games since 7/9 (Steven Matz on 7/21 vs. the Mets).

▶ **Yankees batters** are hitting .263/.351/.489 vs. left-handers in 2018...**their .839 OPS vs. southpaws leads the Majors**...only one other team is within 50 points (Colorado, .801)...have an MLB-best 18.41 AB/HR ratio against lefties and rank second with 51HR.

**MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING:** According to *Elias*, tonight marks the latest in a season that the Yankees (68-38) and Red Sox (75-34) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since the teams played an AL East tiebreaker game in Game 163 on 10/2/78 at Fenway Park when they were both 99-63 (the Yankees won, 5-4).

▶ The Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the two best records in the Majors on 83 of the last 91 days (since the end of play on 5/3).

**RED SCARE:** **LHP CC Sabathia** is 6-0 with a 1.83 ERA (44.1IP, 9ER) in his last seven starts vs. Boston (since 9/29/16)...**is the first pitcher from either side in this series to win six consecutive decisions since the Yankees' Ron Guidry went 6-0 vs. Boston from 9/13/77-9/13/79**...the last longer streak by a Yankee over Boston was Mel Stottlemyre's streak of eight wins from 8/22/64-6/29/66...is just the third pitcher from any team since 1999 with a winning streak this long over Boston, joining Chicago-AL's Gavin Floyd (7-0 from 8/10/08-4/29/12) and Toronto's Gustavo Chacin (6-0 from 5/26/05-4/17/07).

▶ Is unbeaten in his last eight starts vs. Boston, tied for the second-longest unbeaten run by a starter against the Red Sox in the last 10 years behind teammate J.A. Happ (nine starts from 5/15/15-4/24/18).

▶ Overall, since the start of 2017, is 12-0 with a 2.72 ERA (116.0IP, 35ER) in 20 regular season starts following a Yankees loss.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Since the start of July, **Yankees batters** are hitting .282/.355/.468 with 47 doubles, 2 triples and 39HR...over that span, lead the Majors in HRs and OBP, and are pct. points behind Cleveland for the lead in BA...are tied for second in runs and runs per game (5.58, 145R/26G).

▶ **Have hit a Major League-leading 170HR**...are on pace to hit 260HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

▶ Have homered in six straight games (8HR total) after hitting just 1HR in their previous 5G...have 9HR in 11G since the All-Star break after hitting 30HR in their first 15G in July.

▶ Lead the Majors in SLG (.458) and OPS (.791) and rank second in runs per game (5.20)...are tied for second in XBH (379).

▶ **Torres' 2HR game** was the Yankees Major League-leading 18th multi-HR game this season...are tied for fourth-most through a team's first 106G in Major League history.

**VIC-TORR-E.S.:** **2B Gleyber Torres** recorded his second career 2HR game on Wed. vs. Kansas City, hitting a solo HR in the second inning and a three-run HR with two outs in the ninth...also hit 2HR on 5/21/18 at Texas...set a career high with 4RBI.

▶ Is the second player in Yankees history to record at least two multi-HR games before turning 22 years old, joining Joe DiMaggio, who had three in 1936...at 21 years, 231 days old, **was the youngest Yankee ever to record a second career multi-HR game**, 10 days younger than DiMaggio was on 7/23/36 at St. Louis-AL (21 years, 241 days).

▶ Leads the Majors with seven three-run HRs...are tied with Aaron Judge (2017), Brett Gardner and Brian McCann (2015), and Jason Giambi (2006) for the most by a Yankee in a season since Gary Sheffield had 10 three-run HRs in 2005.

▶ Is the fourth player in Yankees history to hit at least 17HR in his first 70 games, joining Gary Sánchez (23), Aaron Judge (19) and Kevin Maas (19)...is the eighth player in Major League history (and the first Yankee) to hit at least 17HR in his first 70 career games before turning 22 years old, joining Cody Bellinger, Albert Pujols, Adam Dunn, Jose Canseco, Frank Robinson, Willie Mays and Bob Horner.

**SAVES THE DAY:** **LHP Aroldis Chapman** has struck out each of his last 7BF...is one shy of his career-long strikeout streak (8BF from 4/11-19/18)...prior to the current stretch, had struck out only two of his previous 15BF.

▶ Has converted 22 straight save chances since 5/8, the third-longest streak of his career (29 straight from 7/4/14-5/30/15; 27 straight from 6/26-9/4/12)...is the longest streak by a Yankee since Andrew Miller converted 24 in a row from 4/8-8/6/15.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 2, 2009:** Melky Cabrera becomes the 11th Yankee to hit for the cycle in an 8-5 win over the White Sox in Chicago. Cabrera is the most recent Yankee to accomplish the feat.

**Aug. 2, 1979:** Yankees captain Thurman Munson passes away in a plane crash in Canton, Ohio, at age 32. His No. 15 is immediately retired.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 3, 1959:** In the second All-Star game of the 1959 season, Yogi Berra connects for his first and only All-Star Game home run, helping lead the AL to a 5-3 win at Los Angeles' Memorial Coliseum.

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 5-4 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the 10th of 19 games against the Red Sox tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 19-12 in 31G vs. Boston since 9/27/16... **IN 2017:** Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park... held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954... **SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span... **AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-2 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 8-14 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-27 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-13 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-4-1)...are 498-478-4 (.510) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there... **IN POSTSEASON:** Have met in the postseason three times, going 11-8 in games and 2-1 in series (2004 ALCS, 3-4; 2003 ALCS, 4-3; 1999 ALCS, 4-1).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CC SABATHIA (6-4, 3.53 ERA)

**LHP CC Sabathia** will make his 20th start of the season in tonight's series opener at Boston...the 38-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...took a no-decision in his last start in Game 2 of Saturday's doubleheader vs. Kansas City (4.2IP, 6H, 2ER, 2BB, 8K, 1HR, 1HP)...is seeking his third straight season with a sub-4.00 ERA after recording at least a 4.50 ERA in all three seasons from 2013-15...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...has 243 career wins, **tied with Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list** (next up is Jack Powell-244)...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,931), complete games (38) and quality starts (309)...ranks second in wins (243), innings pitched (3,421.2) and starts (528) to Bartolo Colon (245 wins, 3,438.2IP, 548 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,931), third all-time among left-handers...his 2,803K in the AL are sixth-most in AL history (most among left-handers)...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...is one of four players currently on a 40-man roster who were active in 2001 (Adrián Beltré, Bartolo Colon, Albert Pujols)...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins)...is in his 18th Major League season, second-most among active pitchers (Colon, 21).

**LAST START:** Took a no-decision in Game 2 of Saturday's doubleheader vs. Kansas City (4.2IP, 6H, 2ER, 2BB, 8K, 1HR, 1HP)...his 8K were his second-most in a game this season (10K on 6/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...surrendered a solo HR to Salvador Perez in the third and allowed a bases-loaded walk to Lucas Duda in the fifth.  
 ✦ Marked his 274th start as a Yankee, tying Bob Shawkey for eighth place on the club's all-time starts list.

**KEEPIN' IT 🔥:** Reached 100.0 innings for the season on 7/14 at Cleveland...marks his 17th season with at least 100.0IP (2001-13, '15-18), the most by any pitcher since Tim Wakefield did it in 18 seasons (1993, '95-2011).

**CC THE STOPPER:** Since the start of 2017, is 12-0 with a 2.72 ERA (116.0IP, 35ER) in 20 regular season starts following a Yankees loss.

**2018:** Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in six of his last nine starts (since 6/5)...has held lefties to a .183 BA (13-for-71) with 3HR, 10BB and 20K this season...his .178 opp. BA (16-for-90) with RISP is the **third-lowest in the AL and seventh-lowest in the Majors**...has retired 86-of-110 batters leading off innings (.218 opp. OBP).
