TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 4, 2010: Alex Rodriguez becomes the seventh (and youngest) player in MLB history to hit 600 home runs, accomplishing the feat at 35 years, 8 days old in a 5-1 win vs. Toronto off Shaun Marcum.

Aug. 4, 2007: Alex Rodriguez hits his 500th career home run off Kansas City's Kyle Davies in a 16-8 Yankees victory. At 32 years, 8 days old, Rodriguez becomes the youngest player ever to reach the 500HR plateau.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 5, 2001: Former Yankee Dave Winfield is inducted into the Hall of Fame. Though he dons a Padres cap on his plaque, Winfield played with the Yankees from 1981-90, hitting 205HR in pinstripes.

Aug. 5, 1939: Red Ruffing earns the win in a 6-1 victory vs. Cleveland. It is his 169th win as a Yankee, surpassing Bob Shawkey for tops on the all-time franchise list among right-handed pitchers -- a mark Ruffing still holds today with 231 wins in pinstripes.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 0-2 so far on their seven-game road trip...includes 4G at Boston (0-2, through Sun.) and 3G at Chicago-AL (Mon.-Wed.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand (3-1 vs. Kansas City, 1-1 vs. Baltimore).

- ▶ **At 68-40 (.630), have the Majors' third-best record** behind Boston (77-34, .694) and Houston (70-41, .631)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 93 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ **Are 28G over .500**, 3G under their season-high watermark (31G over at the end of play on Tuesday)...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ **Are 7.5G behind first-place Boston** in the AL East, matching their largest deficit this season (were also 7.5G back at the end of play on 4/20).
- ▶ **Have lost just four of their last 31 completed series**, going 21-4-6 since 4/19...are 59-31 in their last 90G...are 50-9 (.847) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Are 1-3 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days** (7/31-8/19).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees matched their longest losing streak of the season, dropping a third straight game with a 4-1 loss at Boston on Friday...**Yankees batters** had a season-low 1H and 28 plate appearances...**RHP Luis Severino** (5.2IP, 7H, 4ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR) took the loss...**DH Miguel Andújar** hit a solo HR in the third inning for the Yankees' only run and only hit of the game...**LF Brett Gardner** (0-for-3, 1HP) was the Yankees' only other base runner, getting hit by a pitch to start the game before being erased on a double play by the next batter...**RHP David Robertson** tossed 1.1 scoreless innings (1BB)...**RHP Tommy Kahnle** was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/WB before the game and retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0IP, 1K) in his first Major League appearance since 5/28.

▶ Rick Porcello was the first pitcher to toss a complete-game one-hitter vs. the Yankees since the Blue Jays' Roy Halladay on 9/4/09 in Toronto...was the first Red Sox to do so since Pedro Martinez on 9/10/99 in the Bronx.

ONE CHANCE AT A FIRST IMPRESSION: **RHP Chance Adams** will start today for the Yankees, making his Major League debut.

- ▶ **Is the fourth Yankee pitcher since 1965 to draw a start vs. Boston for his Major League debut**, joining RHP Luis Severino (8/5/15 at Yankee Stadium: L, 5.0IP, 2R/1ER), LHP Randy Keisler (9/10/00 at Fenway Park: W, 5.0IP, 1ER) and RHP Sam Miltello (8/9/92 at the original Yankee Stadium: W, 7.0IP, 1H, 0R)...each of the other three completed at least 5.0IP and allowed one-or-zero earned runs.
- ▶ **Is the fifth Yankee since 1945 to start at Fenway Park** in his Major League debut, following Keisler, LHP Bob Meyer (4/20/64), RHP Bill Stafford (8/17/60) and RHP Ralph Terry (8/6/56).
- ▶ **Is the second player from the Yankees' 2015 draft class** to reach the Majors, and the first to make it as a Yankee...was beaten to the Majors by just three days by RHP Cody Carroll...Carroll -- who was traded to Baltimore in the Zach Britton deal on 7/24/18 -- made his MLB debut on Wednesday with the Orioles at Yankee Stadium (1.0IP, 1H, 0R).

WALK WITH ME: **CF Aaron Hicks** went 0-for-3 on Friday to snap his streak of consecutive starts with at least 1BB at 10...was the second-longest start in the Majors this season (Joey Votto-11G from 6/15-26).

- ▶ **Has still reached safely in 18-of-32 plate appearances in his last 7G**, batting .409/.563/.727 (9-for-22) with 9R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI and 9BB.
- ▶ **Has set career highs with 18HR and 34 extra-base hits** (also 14 doubles, 2 triples).
- ▶ **Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders** with a career-high-tying 3.3 WAR (FanGraphs).

ROUGH PATCH: The Yankees have lost a season-high-tying three straight games (also from 6/22-24, all at Tampa Bay)...have not lost at least four straight games in exactly one year, since they went 0-4 from 8/1-4/17.

- ▶ **The Yankees and Red Sox are the only clubs in the Majors that have not lost four straight games at any point in 2018.**

BEHIND ENEMY LINES: Boston **RHP Nathan Eovaldi**, who pitched for the Yankees from 2015-16, **will become just the 11th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start a game both for the Yankees against the Red Sox and the Red Sox against the Yankees**...joins Roger Clemens, David Cone, Ramiro Mendoza, Bill Monbouquette, Rollie Sheldon, Frank Tanana, Luis Tiant, Mike Torrez, Gary Waslewski and David Wells.

- ▶ **Would be the second pitcher since 2007 to come back and start for Boston against the Yankees after pitching for the Yankees**...Rich Hill started for the Red Sox on 10/1/15 at Yankee Stadium and took the loss in what was the 10,000th win in Yankees history and clinched a postseason berth for the Yankees.

HEAT CHECK: The Yankees bullpen features five pitchers averaging at least 95.0 mph on their fastballs this season (per FanGraphs): Aroldis Chapman (99.2), Dellin Betances (97.9), Chad Green (96.2), Zach Britton (95.7), Tommy Kahnle (95.1).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** were held to a season-low 1H on Friday...since the start of July, however, are hitting .274/.345/.466 with 48 doubles, 3 triples and 44HR...over that span, are tied for the Major League lead in homers and rank second in OPS (.812).

- ▶ **Have hit a Major League-leading 175HR**...are on pace to hit 263HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ **Their 4HR on Thursday were their most since hitting a season-high 6HR on 7/1 vs. Boston**...have homered in eight straight games (13HR total) after hitting just 1HR in their previous 5G.
- ▶ **Rank second in the Majors in runs** (559), runs per game (5.18), SLG (.458), OPS (.789) and XBH (386).
- ▶ **With Aaron Judge (26HR), Giancarlo Stanton (25HR) and Didi Gregorius (20HR)**, the Yankees are one of three teams this season that have three players with at least 20HR, joining Cleveland (Encarnacion/Lindor/Ramirez) and Colorado (Arenado/Blackmon/Story).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors with 19 individual multi-HR games**, six more than any other clubs (Chicago-AL/Washington, 13)...have had multi-HR games in two of their last three games (Gregorius on Thursday, Torres on Wednesday vs. Baltimore)...the Major League record is 24, done by the 1961 Yankees and 1966 Braves.

JUST DÚ IT: **3B Miguel Andújar** hit his 14th home run of the season on Friday...was his second HR in four games after a 24-game homerless drought.

- ▶ **Leads all rookies in BA** (.292), doubles (30), extra-base hits (46), total bases (183) and slugging (.499), and is second in hits (107) and runs (50) and third in RBI (48).
- ▶ **Has hit safely in 23-of-27 games since the start of July**, batting .323/.368/.455 (32-for-99) with 14R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 6BB and 1HP.
- ▶ **Has RBI in five of his last six games** (7RBI) after collecting just 3RBI in his previous 22G.
- ▶ **Leads the Yankees with a .292 BA** (107-for-367) this season...only 10 rookies in Yankees history have qualified for the batting title with BA of .290-or-better, most recently Robinson Canó in 2005 (.297).

DELLIN DONUTS: **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 1R in 24.0IP (8H, 13BB, 41K, 3HP) over 25 appearances since 5/27...opponents are hitting .104 (8-for-77) in that span.

- ▶ **His current streak of 24 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K (since 5/29) is the second-longest in Yankees history**, behind Andrew Miller's streak of 28G from 5/6-7/17/16...has at least 1K in 42-of-44 appearances this season.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 5-6 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the 12th of 19 games today (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 19-14 in 33G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**IN 2017:** Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park...held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954... **SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span... **AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-4 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 8-16 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-29 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-13 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-4-1)...are 498-480-4 (.509) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there...**IN POSTSEASON:** Have met in the postseason three times, going 11-8 in games and 2-1 in series (2004 ALCS, 3-4; 2003 ALCS, 4-3; 1999 ALCS, 4-1).

INTO THE FIRE: Is the fourth Yankees pitcher since 1965 to draw a start against Boston for his Major League debut, joining RHP Luis Severino (8/5/15 at Yankee Stadium: L, 5.0IP, 2R/1ER), LHP Randy Keisler (9/10/00 at Fenway Park: W, 5.0IP, 1ER) and RHP Sam Militello (8/9/92 at the original Yankee Stadium: W, 7.0IP, 1H, 0R)...each of the other three completed at least 5.0IP and allowed one-or-zero earned runs.

- ✦ Is the fifth Yankee since 1945 to start at Fenway Park in his Major League debut, following Keisler, LHP Bob Meyer (4/20/64), RHP Bill Stafford (8/17/60) and RHP Ralph Terry (8/6/56).

WIN-PLACE-SHOW: Is the second player from the Yankees' 2015 draft class to reach the Majors, and the first to make it as a Yankee...was beaten to the Majors by just three days by RHP Cody Carroll...Carroll – who was traded to Baltimore in the Zach Britton deal on 7/24/18 – made his MLB debut on Wednesday, with the Orioles at Yankee Stadium (1.0IP, 1H, 0R).

ROLL CALL: Will slot in eighth alphabetically on the Yankees' all-time roster, behind INF/OF Dustin Ackley and ahead of INF David Adams (see 2018 Yankees Media Guide p. 275).
