ROSTER MOVE: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets recalled RHP Corey Oswalt from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League and optioned LHP P.J. Conlon to Las Vegas...Oswalt will wear #55 and will be available for tonight's game in Cincinnati... Oswalt, 24, was with the Mets earlier this year from April 10-April 11 and April 21-27...He made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis with 4.2 innings of relief...Oswalt was 2-2 with a 6.62 ERA (13 earned runs/17.2 innings) in four starts for the 51s...He had issued seven walks and struck out 20.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets snapped their six-game losing streak last night...New York is 11-5 on the road this season...The .688 winning percentage away from Citi Field, is the third-best in the majors, behind the Angels (.813, 13-3) and Red Sox (.737, 14-5)...The Mets are 11-7 in games decided by two or fewer runs.

VS. CINCINNATI: The Mets are 22-5 (.815) against the Reds since 2014, which is the highest winning percentage by any major league team against an opponent in its own league over the last five seasons...Research courtesy of Elias...New York has outscored the Reds, 145-89 during that span...The Mets won a franchise-record 14 straight games from September 7, 2014-September 7, 2016.

IN CINCY: New York is 13-4 in its last 17 games at Great American Ball Park...The Mets have outscored the Reds, 93-60, over those 17 contests.

HOME RUN NOTES: The Mets hit four homers in a game last night for the first time since August 10, 2017 at Philadelphia...New York has hit 28 homers in its last 14 games at Great American Ball Park dating to 2014...In addition, the two clubs combined for seven home runs last night, tied for the seventh-most in the ballpark's history.

GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK: Jay Bruce ranks second in the ballpark's history with 136 homers, Todd Frazier is sixth on the list with 63 homers...Joey Votto is first with 144.

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Collected the 22nd multi-home run game of his career and first since August 22, 2016, with the Dodgers at Cincinnati last night with his two homers...González has 14 homers and 33 RBI in 33 career games at Great American Ball Park...He has three career multi-home run games at Great American Ball Park, including five homers and 10 RBI in his last two games.

LEADOFF HOMERS: Michael Conforto hit the club's first leadoff home run this season...It was Conforto's seventh career leadoff homer, which is the fifth-most in team history...José Reyes and Curtis Granderson are first with 21, Lenny Dykstra and Tommie Agee are tied for third with eight...Since 2017, Conforto's seven leadoff homers are tied for the third-most in the majors with Ian Kinsler and Charlie Blackmon...Brian Dozier is second with nine and George Springer is first with 12.

YO!: Yoanis Céspedes is fourth in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 27 RBI...He is tied for ninth in the NL with seven homers...Céspedes is hitting .313 (21-67) with a .351 OBP, five doubles, four home runs, 11 runs scored and 15 RBI in his last 18 games.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



JAY BRUCE: Jay Bruce hit his first home run as a visitor at Great American Ball Park last night...Bruce played with Cincinnati from 2008 until the Mets acquired him on August 1, 2016 where he was a three-time All-Star (2011-2012, 2016)...During that span with the Reds, Bruce ranked first in games (1,220), homers (233), RBI (718), triples (27), second in doubles (238), slugging (.470) and walks (454)...Bruce is hitting .309 (17-55) with two doubles, one triple, two home runs and seven RBI over his last 14 games dating to April 20.

TODD FRAZIER: Is tied for 12th in the NL with 21 walks and tied for 13th with 21 RBI...He has seven RBI in his last nine games...Frazier has 65 doubles, 63 homers and 180 RBI in 321 career games at Great American Ball Park...Frazier played with the Reds from 2011-2015, where he was an All-Star in 2014-2015 and won the Home Run Derby in his home park in 2015.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is fourth in the National League with a .320 batting average, 10th in the NL with a .555 slugging percentage, is tied for fifth in the NL with 17 extra-base hits, tied for 11th with 22 runs scored and tied for fifth in the NL with 10 doubles and tied for 13th with 21 RBI...He has 16 RBI in his last 18 games...Cabrera is hitting .324 (24-74) with six doubles, three homers, 16 RBI and 10 runs scored over his last 18 games.

FROM THE LEFT SIDE: The Mets will start consecutive lefthanded pitchers (P.J. Conlon and Jason Vargas) for the first time since September 6-7, 2015 when Steven Matz and Jonathon Niese did so...Courtesy of Elias.

BULLPEN NOTES: The Mets have 10 wins from their bullpen, the most in the majors...Robert Gsellman picked up his fourth win in relief last night, tied for the most among all major league relievers with Tyler Clippard...The club has 11 saves which is tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

RUNS SCORED TIX PROMO: For each run scored by the Mets during the six games on this road trip (Cincinnati & Philadelphia), fans will save \$1 off tickets for select seats during the next homestand May 15-23 when the Mets host the Blue Jays, Diamondbacks and Marlins...Fans can already save \$7 off Baseline Box and Bud Light Landing seating areas while supplies last...Tickets will be available at mets.com/runs approximately one hour after the game on Sunday, May 13.

- » Missed the entire 2008 season after undergoing surgery on his left hip
- » Blood clot in left arm (on 15-Day D.L. from June 18-August 13, 2013)
- » Left flexor strain (two 15-Day D.L. stints in May and June-July, 2015)
- » Tommy John Surgery (2015)...On D.L. from July 22, 2015-September 17, 2016.
- » Non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right hand...Underwent surgery on March 20, 2018 to remove the bone.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his second major league start of the 2018 season, his first-ever start at Citi Field, May 3 vs. the Braves...Suffered the loss in his home debut in a 11-0 Mets defeat...Threw 4.2 innings and gave up six runs, earned, on 11 hits...Struck out three batters and walked two...Had not allowed eleven hits in a game since August 24, 2014 for Kansas City at Texas...Became the first Mets starter to allow at least six earned runs in each of his first two starts of the season since Bret Saberhagen did so in 1992.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Jason Vargas made two starts for the Mets in 2007, his last coming on July 3 at Colorado...According to Elias, Vargas became the fifth Mets who went 10 or more years between appearances with the club when he started on April 28 at San Diego...The others to do so: RHP Jason Isringhausen, RHP Bob L. Miller, catcher Kelly Stinnett and RHP David Cone.

VS. CINCINNATI: Vargas' start against the Reds is his first in over 12 seasons...Last pitched against the Reds on April 18, 2006 as a member of the Florida Marlins...In two career starts versus Cincinnati, Vargas owns a 5.23 ERA (six earned runs/10.1 innings)...Both starts came in Cincinnati at Great American Ball Park...In his last start versus the Reds, Vargas received a no-decision in the Marlins' 12-6 win after pitching 4.0 innings, allowing six runs, five earned on seven hits...Struck out two batters and walked five.

MAY: Vargas is 20-10 with a 3.49 ERA (107 earned runs/276.0 innings) in 48-career May games (42 starts)...His .667 win percentage in the month of May is his highest of any month, as are his 20 wins while his 3.49 ERA is his best in any single calendar month...Went 3-2 in May last season with a 3.12 ERA (12 earned runs/34.2 innings)...Allowed one or no runs in each of his first three starts in May last year.

SPRING TRAINING/REHAB: Made three Grapefruit League appearances before suffering a non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right (non-throwing) hand...Underwent surgery on March 20 at the Hospital for Special Surgery...Had a 4.15 ERA (four earned runs/8.2 innings) in Grapefruit League play...Pitched 4.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on three hits with four strikeouts in a rehab start with Triple-A Las Vegas on April 23.

ALL-STAR-WORTHY 2017: At the All-Star Break last season, Vargas led the American League in both wins (12) and ERA (2.62), while ranking among the league leaders in WHIP (1.15, 11th) and walks per nine innings (2.12, eighth)...Won seven consecutive starts from May 27-June 30, 2017...Pitched a complete game shutout on June 2 vs. Cleveland, his 12th career complete game and seventh shutout...Was the first pitcher in the majors to reach 10 wins, doing so in his 14th start on June 18...Posted a sub-2.00 ERA in both April and June...Was 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (nine earned runs/41.0 innings) in his six June starts with 23 strikeouts and nine walks.

VARGAS' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
- » Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
- » From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only Mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
- » Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
- » Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
- » Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
- » Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017...Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
- » Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
- » Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (2-2, 5.79)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his second loss of the season in the Mets' 8-7 setback vs. the Rockies on May 4 at Citi Field...Pitched 6.0 innings, tying career highs with eight runs and 10 hits allowed...All eight runs were earned...Also surrendered a season-high two home runs...Pitched into the seventh inning for the second time this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Wheeler will be making his fourth road start of the season...In his first three road starts, he is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (seven earned runs/16.0 innings)...The Mets have won each of his three away starts in 2018.

- Over his last 14 games dating to April 20, Bruce is batting .309 (17-55) with five extra-base hits, seven RBI and five runs scored...Has also hit safely in each of his last eight road games dating to April 20, hitting .394 (13-33) with two homers, seven RBI and five runs scored in that time.
- Returns to Cincinnati for a second time since being traded away from the Reds to the Mets in 2016...Played 1,220 games with Cincinnati over parts of nine seasons...Hit 233 home runs and drove in 718 during his time with the Reds...Has 136 career homers at the Great American Ball Park, second-most in the park's history to current Red Joey Votto, who has 144 career homers there...His 384 RBI at GABP are third-most in the park's history.
- Made his 14th career start and 16th appearances at first base on May 4 vs. Colorado.
- Had an eight-game hitting streak from April 20-May 1 and batted .353 (12-34) during the run with one double, one triple, one homer, five RBI and four runs scored.
- Homered in the 10th inning on April 24 at St. Louis to give the Mets the lead...Was his 16th career go-ahead home run in the eighth inning or later...Also recorded his first triple as a Met on April 24.

- Is hitting .324 (24-74) with six doubles, one triple, three homers, 16 RBI and 10 runs scored over his last 18 games dating to April 16.
- Hit his sixth homer of the year on May 4 vs. Colorado (29th game)...Didn't hit his sixth homer last season until June 12 (49th game).
- Dating to August 25 of last season, Cabrera is batting .342 (82-240) with 22 doubles, 11 home runs, 45 RBI and 38 runs scored (66 games).
- Recorded 34 hits in March/April, the sixth-most by a Met in team history and most by a Met in March/April since José Reyes had 36 hits in 2011.
