TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a first-half-concluding 2-team, 6-game road trip with the second of three at Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...will also face NL West rival Colorado in a 3-game series prior to the All-Star break...recently concluded a 3-team, 10-day, 9-game homestand going 6-3 against Kansas City (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Colorado (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 10 of their last 14 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have also won 17 of their last 28 games, 24 of their last 37, 28 of their last 43, 33 of their last 49 and 35 of their last 53...Seattle is 43-24 in its last 67 games, 48-27 over its last 75 games and 53-31 in its last 84 games...Seattle is 17-16 during the day and 40-19 at night...Seattle is 31-17 at Safeco Field, 26-18 on the road.

- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 38-14 (.731) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors this season...the Mariners are 26-11 (.703) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 12-3 (.800) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning pct. in MLB).
- **First Things First** - **Dee Gordon** is batting .342 (26x76) when leading off a game this season.
- **Herrmann's Hits** - **Chris Herrmann** has reached base safely via hit or walk in 6 of his 8 starts this season... he has reached base twice via hit or walk in 3 of those 8 starts...the Mariners are 5-3 in Herrmann's 8 starts.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 42-11 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-24 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 24 of their first 30 series, posting a series record of 18-6-6.
- **On the Road** - the Mariners are 26-18 (.591) on the road this season...their .591 road winning percentage is T3rd-highest in the Majors (also: New York-AL), trailing only Houston (.696/32-14) and Boston (.667/34-17).

COLLECTING WINS...**Marco Gonzales** is T4th in the American League with 6 wins since May 17...in that span he is 6-2 with a 2.60 ERA (19 ER, 65.2 IP) with 53 strikeouts in 10 starts...overall this season he is 9-5 with a 3.64 ERA (43 ER, 106.2 IP) in 18 starts...with a win today Gonzales would become the 10th pitcher in club history (done 15x) to record at least 10 wins prior to the All-Star break and the first since **Félix Hernández** recorded 11 wins before the All-Star break in 2015...he would join Dave Fleming (1992), **Hernández** (3x, 2013-15), Freddy Garcia (2x, 2001-02), Randy Johnson (3x, 1993-94, 1997), Mark Langston (1987), Gil Meche (2003), Jamie Moyer (2003), Joel Pineiro (2003) and Aaron Sele (2x, 2000-01).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR...DH **Nelson Cruz** (.264/74x280, 39 R, 10 2B, 3B, 53 RBI, 10 HBP, 32 BB, SB), RHP **Edwin Díaz** (47 G, 0-2, 35 SV, 2.30 ERA/12 ER, 47.0 IP, 13 BB, 78 K) and OF **Mitch Haniger** (.274/90x329, 46 R, 17 2B, 2 3B, 18 HR, 65 RBI, 4 HBP, 42 BB, 4 SB) have been selected to play for the American League in the 89th annual Major League Baseball All-Star Game on Tuesday, July 17, at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C. ...this marks **Cruz's** 6th career All-Star selection and his 5th in the last 6 seasons (also: 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017), while **Díaz** and **Haniger** each received their first All-Star selection...strength and conditioning coach **James Clifford** will also represent the Mariners on the AL All-Star team training staff.

#SENDSEGURA...**Jean Segura** has 37 multi-hit games this season, T3rd-most in the Majors (Nick Markakis-ATL & J.D. Martinez-BOS, 38)...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of at least 3 hits...Segura has more multi-hit games (37) than games without a hit this season (22)...among Major League leaders, Segura ranks 2nd in hits with 116, trailing only Houston's Jose Altuve (124)...he also ranks 4th in the Majors with a .329 (116x353) batting average, behind Mookie Betts-BOS (.346/98x2283), Altuve (.335/124x370) and Martinez (.331/111x335).

ROAD WARRIORS...Seattle boasts 2 of the top-8 players in the American League in batting average on the road this season...**Jean Segura** (.348/58x168) ranks 3rd in the AL with a .348 road average, while **Nelson Cruz** (.323/43x133) ranks 8th...**Kyle Seager** (38) and **Mitch Haniger** (34) rank 3rd and 4th respectively among the AL leaders in road RBI...**Seager's** 12 home runs on the road also rank T4th in the AL.

SEAGER BELIEVER...dating back to June 26, **Kyle Seager** has hit safely in 9 of his last 13 games, including 6 multi-hit contests...during this 13-game stretch, he is batting .356 (16x45) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI and 4 walks.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 35 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 78 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 85)...**Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break**, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 34 saves rank 2nd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break, behind Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38)...of Díaz's 35 saves, 20 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 1-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 43-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

CLOSING IN ON 100...**Jean Segura** (116) and **Dee Gordon** (96) have each recorded at least 96 hits this season...with another 4 hits, Gordon would join Jean Segura to become the 8th set of teammates in franchise history to record at least 100 hits prior to the All-Star break and first since a trio of Mariners recorded at least 100 hits in 2008 (Ichiro Suzuki - 119, Jose Lopez - 113 & Raúl Ibañez - 101)...the Mariners have also had 2 players record at least 100 hits in 1979 (Bruce Bochte - 106 & Willie Horton - 106), 1997 (Edgar Martinez - 106 & Joey Cora - 101), 1998 (Alex Rodriguez - 117 & Ken Griffey Jr. - 103), 2000 (Alex Rodriguez - 109 & Edgar Martinez - 101), 2001 (Ichiro Suzuki - 133 & Bret Boone - 110) and 2003 (Ichiro Suzuki - 137 & Bret Boone - 114).

HALF DOZEN...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in 8 of 10 games vs. the Angels this season, batting .359 (14x39) with 8 runs scored, 1 double, 6 home runs, 10 RBI and 1 walk...his 6 home runs vs. a single opponent are T3rd-most in the Majors this season (also: Eddie Rosario, 6 HR vs. CLE), trailing only Matt Davidson's 7 home runs vs. the Royals and A.J. Pollock's 7 home runs vs. the Dodgers...his 6 home runs vs. the Angels in a single season are also T3rd-most by a Mariners player in club history (also: Bret Boone, 6 HR in 2003), trailing only **Nelson Cruz's** 10 home runs in 2016 and Alex Rodriguez's 7 home runs in 2000.

AS YOU KNOW...**Mitch Haniger** hit his 18th home run and recorded his 65th RBI of the season last night vs. the Angels...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Haniger is only the 8th Mariners player (done 14x) in franchise history to record at least 18 home runs and 65 RBI prior to the All-Star break and first since Raúl Ibañez (20 HR/70 RBI) accomplished this feat in 2006?...he also joins Bret Boone (2001 & 2003), Jay Buhner (1996), Alvin Davis (1984), Ken Griffey Jr. (4x; 1994, 1997-99), **Edgar Martinez** (2x; 1996, 2000), Alex Rodriguez (2x; 1998, 2000).

ABOUT GONZALES...

- 26-year-old left-hander is making his 19th start of season, 41st career appearance (33rd start) and 6th career start vs. the Angels.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 seasons (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program.
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado.
- Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

LAST START...pitched 2nd consecutive quality start in W#9, a 4-1 Mariners win vs. Los Angeles-AL on July 5...allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 2 walks with 7 strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...has lasted at least 6.0 innings in 4 consecutive starts...in his last 2 starts has allowed just 2 earned runs across 15.0 innings of work (1.20 ERA) while striking out 14.

GOING THE DISTANCE...tossed 1st career complete game on June 29 vs. Kansas City, allowing just 1 run on 6 hits and 0 walks while striking out 7 batters across 9.0 innings...became the 2nd Mariners pitcher to throw a complete game this season (James Paxton, 2x)...held the Royals scoreless until the 9th inning.

GAS IN THE TANK...has pitched 6.0-or-more innings in 12 of his last 14 starts and 13 of his 18 starts overall this season...is 8-3 with a 2.91 ERA (29 ER, 89.2 IP) with 19 walks and 75 strikeouts in his last 14 outings...prior to 2018, Gonzales had only reached the 6.0 inning mark in 1 start, on Aug. 30, 2014 vs. Chicago-NL with St. Louis (6.0,3,1,1,2,5).

NO FREE PASSES...has issued just 22 walks compared to 94 strikeouts across 106.1 innings pitched this season...ranks 5th in the AL (10th in MLB) with a 1.86 walks-per-9.0-innings ratio...is 8th in the AL (16th in MLB) with a 4.27 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle.

2017 AAA RECAP...combined for 13 AAA starts last season, 11 with AAA Memphis in the Cardinals organization and 2 with AAA Tacoma after being acquired by the Mariners...was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 22 walks in 13 combined starts...went 6-4 with a 2.90 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 17 walks in 11 starts with Memphis...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts and 5 walks in 2 starts with Tacoma.

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, compiling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program when he was selected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, earned John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

POSTSEASON GLORY...added to the Cardinals roster for the 2014 National League Division Series vs. Los Angeles-NL...made 3 appearances in the NLDS, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk...picked up the wins in Game 1 and Game 4 vs. the Dodgers...became the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002)...in the 2014 NLCS vs. San Francisco, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (3 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk in 3 appearances.

ML CAREER...in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c), is 14-8 with a 4.41 ERA (90 ER, 183.2 IP) with 158 strikeouts and 55 walks in 40 games (32 starts)...originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University.
