AT HOME: The Brewers are 33-21 at home, going 9-5-3 in series play.....after a 2-6 start, the team is 31-15 over its last 46 home games.....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22 and a season-high 3-game home losing streak from 4/7-4/16.....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 30-27 on the road, going 9-6-2 in series play.....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11 and a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15.....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (283-289) and third full season.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 18 replay challenges, going 4-14.....their last challenge (lost) came on 7/15 at Pittsburgh as an out call at third base involving Lorenzo Cain stood.....went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #45 - RHP JHOULYS CHACÍN (23gs, 10-3, 3.45)

CHACÍN AT A GLANCE: Jhoulys Chacin, 30, will be making his team-leading 24th start of the season and first against the Dodgers....Chacin last started last Saturday at San Francisco and picked up a 7-1 victory (7ip, 3h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 6k, 1hr, 1hbp)....the team is 16-7 in his starts.... he has made 7 quality starts....opponents are batting .224 (104-for-465, 10hr)....Chacin signed as a free agent on 12/21/17....he is signed through the 2019 season....his name is pronounced "yo-LEASE sha-SEEN"....bio is on p. 81 of the media guide.

LAST SEASON: Chacin went 13-10 with a 3.89 ERA in a career-high 32 starts with San Diego....his 13 wins and career-high 153 strikeouts led the team....he held opponents to a .235 batting average (157-for-667, 19hr), which ranked ninth in the National League....the Padres went 18-14 in his starts....he had 16 quality starts, tying Luis Perdomo for the team lead....Chacin went 9-5 with a 2.93 ERA over his last 20 starts (116.2ip, 38er).

CAREER: Is 69-70 with a 3.88 ERA in 218 games / 190 starts (1150.2ip, 496er)....is in his 10th Major League season....has pitched for Colorado (2009-14), Arizona (2015), Atlanta (2016), LA of Anaheim (2016), San Diego (2017) and Milwaukee (2018).

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 4-3 with a 3.91 ERA in 12 starts (71.1ip, 31er)....prior to this season had not pitched at Miller Park since 2014....is 4-2 with a 3.46 ERA in 9 starts this season (52ip, 20er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 29-39 with a 4.15 ERA in 109 games / 92 starts (541.2ip, 250er)....is 6-1 with a 3.45 ERA in 14 starts this season (75.2ip, 29er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Is 11-8 with a 4.03 ERA in 25 games / 24 starts (140.2ip, 63er), including 2-1 with a 4.56 ERA in 5 starts last season (25.2ip, 13er)....Chacin has gone 5-4 with a 4.08 ERA in 11 career games / 10 starts at Dodger Stadium (57.1ip, 26er).

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is a .193 (60-for-311) hitter with 1 HR....homered on 9/20/13 vs. Arizona (2-run off Randall Delgado)....has 10 walks and 69 strikeouts.

THIS SEASON: Is batting .194 (7-for-36) with 1 RBI....has 3 walks and 10 strikeouts....has 5 sacrifice bunts.
