RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped their third consecutive game to the Indians last night, losing 5-1. Leonys Martin finished a triple shy of the cycle, going 3x4 with a double, a home run and a RBI. Daniel Norris took the loss for Detroit, allowing four runs on seven hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 3.0 innings. Drew VerHagen pitched 2.1 shutout innings in relief, while Daniel Stumpf also worked a scoreless inning. The Tigers and Indians conclude their four-game series tonight. Following tonight's game, the Tigers return home for a 10-game homestand, which includes three games vs. New York (AL) (April 13-15), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

ROSTER MOVES: Following last night's game, the Tigers optioned OF Mikie Mahtook to Triple A Toledo. In a corresponding move, the Tigers today have recalled LHP Chad Bell from Toledo.

MARTIN'S THREE-HIT NIGHT: Leonys Martin had a season-high three hits last night, finishing a triple shy of the cycle. The three-hit game was Martin's first since September 28, 2016 at Houston. He also belted his first home run as a member of the Tigers last night, hitting his first roundtripper since August 16, 2017 vs. Baltimore.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Drew VerHagen worked 2.1 shutout innings of relief, walking two and striking out one. Since not recording an out in his season debut on March 30 vs. Pittsburgh, VerHagen has not allowed a run in his last four appearances, throwing 7.0 straight scoreless frames..Miguel Cabrera did not commit an error in last night's game, extending his errorless streak to 100 games. Cabrera's last error came on May 12, 2017 at Los Angeles (AL).

FULMER AMONG THE BEST SINCE 2016: Tonight's starting pitcher Michael Fulmer has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since making his Major League debut early in 2016. Dating back to April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks fifth among active American League pitchers with a 3.34 ERA.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: First baseman Miguel Cabrera is within striking distance of two Hall of Famer's on MLB's all-time hits list. He is currently only one hit shy of tying Jimmie Foxx for 78th place, and nine shy of Ted Williams for 77th (see chart below):

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers have dropped the first three games of the season series to the Indians and have now lost 10 straight games to Cleveland dating back to September 1, 2017. Detroit went 6-13 against the Indians last season, including a 3-6 record at Progressive Field. The Tigers have struggled at Progressive Field in recent seasons, going 5-16 since the start of the 2016 season.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 3-3 on their first road trip of the season after sweeping three games against the White Sox and losing the first three games to the Indians. Detroit went 30-51 (.370) away from Comerica Park last season.

ON DECK: Following tonight's game, the Tigers return home for a 10-game homestand, which is tied for their

longest homestand of the season. The homestand includes three games vs. New York (AL) (April 13-15), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22). The Tigers and Yankees split six games last season, but New York (AL) won two-of-three games played at Comerica Park.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with an 4-7 (.364) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,046 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers successfully challenged a call in the second inning of Tuesday's game and are now a perfect 5-for-5 in replay challenges this season. Among teams that have challenged three-or-more plays this season, the Tigers are one of only four clubs to have a 100% success rate, joining Chicago (AL), Kansas City and San Francisco.

THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY: 1960 - The Tigers acquired Norm Cash from the Cleveland Indians for Steve Demeter. In 1961, Cash led the American League with a .361 batting average, and went on to hit 373 home runs for the Tigers in 14 seasons.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his third start of the season tonight in the series finale at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer earned his first win of the season on Saturday at Chicago (AL), throwing 5.1 shutout innings with six hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts.

VS. CLEVELAND: Fulmer has faced the Indians five times in his career and has a 2-2 record with a 6.04 ERA (25.1IP/17ER) and 15 strikeouts. He picked up the win in his only start vs. Cleveland last season on July 9, tossing 6.0 innings and giving up three runs, two earned, on seven hits with one walk and one strikeout.

ON THE ROAD: Fulmer has made 29 road starts in his career and has compiled a 13-13 record with a 3.44 ERA (180.1IP/69ER) and 143 strikeouts. In 12 road starts last season, Fulmer was 4-8 with a 4.14 ERA (76.0IP/35ER) and 57 strikeouts.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Fulmer will make his fifth career start at Progressive Field tonight. In four previous outings here, Fulmer has posted a 2-2 record with a 5.73 ERA (22.0IP/14ER) and 12 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fulmer has started 21 games in his career against teams from the American League Central and has a 9-7 record with a 4.03 ERA (127.1IP/57ER) and 95 strikeouts. In nine starts vs. divisional opponents last season, Fulmer was 5-3 with a 4.25 ERA (59.1IP/28ER) and 42 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .230 (147x640) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .243 (149x612) against him. In 25 starts last season, righties batted .225 (74x329), while lefthanded hitters posted a .264 (76x288) batting average.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Fulmer allowed just 13 home runs in 164.2 innings pitched last season, leading the American League with 0.71 home runs allowed per nine innings. Fulmer posted a homerless streak of 73.2 innings during the season.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fulmer finished the 2017 season tied for fifth in the American League with one complete game, while he was sixth with a 1.15 WHIP and 2.19 walks per nine innings and ninth with a .243 (150x617) opponents batting average.

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City and he joined Philadelphia's Zach Eflin and Colorado's Jon Gray as the only Major League rookies to throw a shutout last season.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his second start of the season tomorrow night in the series opener vs. New York (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on Sunday at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

VS. NEW YORK (AL)/AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made three career starts against the Yankees and has a 0-0 record with a 5.52 ERA (14.2IP/9ER) and 17 strikeouts. In two starts vs. New York (AL) last season, Fiers went 0-0 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2IP/4ER) and 14 strikeouts. Fiers has started two games in his career at Comerica Park, posting a 0-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP/2ER) and nine strikeouts.
