## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 24-15 record is tied for the club's second-best 39-game start all-time with 2002 and 2008, behind 26-13 in 2000... their best 40-game starts are 27-13 in 2000 and 25-15 in 2002 and '08.
- ♦ The D-backs have the NL's best record (.615) and Majors' third best behind the Yankees (27-12, .692) and Red Sox (27-12; .692).
- ♦ Arizona suffered its first series loss yesterday, having opened the season with 10 victories and 2 ties, the third-longest streak of not losing a series by a Major League team at any point of the season since 2017.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is batting .321 (27-for-84)/1.067 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 8 homers, 21 RBI, 7 walks and 4 stolen bases in his last 22 games since April 18.

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs suffered their fourth consecutive loss and conceded their first series of the year after losing to the Nationals, 2-1.
- ♦ **Troy Scribner** (0-1) lost in his D-backs debut after allowing 2 runs in 3.2 innings...**T.J. McFarland** tossed 3.0 shutout frames...**Jorge De La Rosa** (0.1 IP), **Yoshihisa Hirano** (1.0) and **Andrew Chafin** (1.0) combined to throw 2.1 perfect innings.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** went 1-for-3 with a double and a RBI...**David Peralta** was 1-for-4, extending his hitting streak to 6 games.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** was ejected for the first time in his career in the eighth inning (tossing bat).

## NATIONAL AUDIENCE

- ♦ Tonight's game can be seen on ESPN's Sunday Night Baseball, the first time a Sunday night game has been played @ Chase Field since Aug. 31, 2008 vs. Dodgers...the D-backs last appeared on Sunday Night Baseball on July 10, 2016 @ Giants (a beardless Archie Bradley made the start for Arizona).
- ♦ Other notes of interest:
  - The D-backs have played 747 regular-season games at home since their last ESPN Sunday Night appearance @ Chase Field.
  - Arizona's roster contains 3 players that appeared in a Major League game in 2008 (Jeff Mathis, Zack Greinke and Jorge De La Rosa).
  - **Torey Lovullo** was the manager at Triple-A Buffalo in 2008.
  - **Paul Goldschmidt** was entering his junior season at Texas State University in 2008 and would go on to win his first of 2 straight Southland Conference Hitter of the Year titles.
  - **Archie Bradley** had just received his driver's license, having turned 16 years old 21 days prior.

## BACK IN THE SADDLE

- ♦ **Jake Lamb** will make his first rehab appearance today with Single-A Adv. Visalia, his first game action since suffering a sprained left AC joint on April 3.
- ♦ **Shelby Miller** pitched 3.0 perfect innings with 5 strikeouts (32 pitches in the game, 18 additional in bullpen) vs. the A's in an extended Spring Training game at Salt River Fields Friday, his first rehab outing since undergoing Tommy John Surgery on May 10, 2017.

- ♦ D-backs starters have posted a 2.85 ERA (42 ER in 132.2 IP) with a .209 opponent average in 22 starts @ Chase Field this season, including allowing 3 or fewer runs in 20 of 22 games.

## BACK IN THE SADDLE

- ♦ **Zack Godley** changed the way he threw his curveball in 2015 after discussions with then teammate, and tonight's opposition, Jeremy Hellickson.
- ♦ Opponents are batting .227 (15-for-66) with 1 home run off Godley this season...ranks second among Major League starters by throwing a curveball 39.9 pct. of the time, behind only Lance McCullers Jr./HOU (45.6).

## SET THIS PARTY OFF RIGHT

- ♦ Arizona suffered its first series loss yesterday, having opened the season with 10 victories and 2 ties, the third-longest streak of not losing a series by a Major League team at any point of the season since 2017 [source: STATS LLC]:

- ♦ The D-backs were the first NL club to win their first 9 series of a season since the 1907 Cubs' won a Major League-record 11 straight, and the first in the Majors since the 2001 Mariners (won 9) and the 1978 Tigers (won 9)[Source: Elias Sports Bureau].

## EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is batting .321 (27-for-84)/1.067 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 8 homers, 21 RBI, 7 walks and 4 stolen bases in his last 22 games since April 18.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders this season in SLG (1st, .641), go-ahead RBI (1st, 12), game-winning RBI (T-1st, 5), extra-base hits (2nd, 24), total bases (2nd, 91), RBI (2nd, 33), homers (T-3rd, 11), OPS (5th, .995) and stolen bases (T-5th, 8).
- ♦ He also ranks second in the NL with 2.1 wins above replacement (WAR), trailing only Max Scherzer/WSH (2.8), and ahead of Nick Markakis/ATL (1.9), Tommy Pham/STL (1.9), Kris Bryant/CHC (1.8) and Freddie Freeman (1.8).

## THE NAME IS DESCALSO...DANIEL DESCALSO

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** is hitting .353 (18-for-51)/1.085 OPS with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 12 RBI, 8 walks and 2-hit-by-pitches in his last 19 games.
  - Among NL players since April 21, he ranks fifth in average, sixth in OBP (.438), seventh in OPS and ninth in SLG (.647).

## 4-TUNE TELLING

- ♦ The D-backs are 18-1 (.947) when scoring 4+ runs, the best mark in the Majors ahead of the Angels (19-3, .864), Yankees (25-5, .833), Astros (20-4, .833), Pirates (20-4, .833), Mets (15-3, .833) and Cubs (15-3, .833)...Arizona has won 13 straight games when scoring 4+ runs, 21 of 22 games (since Sept. 26, 2017), 25 of 27 (since Sept. 13, 2017) and 35 of 40 (since Aug. 22, 2017).

## ON-DECK: MILWAUKEE BREWERS

- ♦ D-backs went 4-3 vs. Brewers in 2017, including 2-1 @ Chase Field...Arizona is 8-4 in its last 12 games vs. Milwaukee at home.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** hits .396 (57-for-144)/.503 OBP/.701 SLG with 17 doubles, 9 homers and 31 RBI in 40 games vs. Brewers.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP PATRICK CORBIN (4-0, 2.12)

- ♦ Is 4-0 with a 1.32 ERA (5 ER in 34.0 IP), 44 strikeouts, 6 walks and a .122 opponent average in 5 starts at home this season.

**#13 • NICK AHMED • R/R** **6-2 • 195 • 28 (March 15, 1990)**  
**WSH Series:** 1-11 **Homestand:** 1-11

- ◆ 6 home runs have equaled his 2017 total (played 53 games due to 2 hand injuries).
- ◆ Hit his first inside-the-park homer on May 9 @ Dodgers (15th all-time by a D-back).
- ◆ Had a career-high 5 RBI on March 30 vs. Rockies, tying D-backs record for a shortstop (also: Stephen Drew, April 28, 2011 vs. Cubs).
- ◆ His 36 defensive runs saved at shortstop ranks third in the NL since 2015, behind Brandon Crawford (49) and Addison Russell (49).
- ◆ Rated by *Baseball America* as the NL's second-best defensive shortstop in 2017.

**#5 • ALEX AVILA • R/L** **5-11 • 210 • 31 (January 29, 1987)**  
**WSH Series:** 0-5 **Homestand:** 0-5

- ◆ His 3.03 catchers ERA is the second best in the NL behind Pedro Severino/WSH (2.73) [min. 125.0 IC].
- ◆ In 2017 with the Tigers and Cubs, had 13 doubles, 14 homers, 49 RBI in 112 games.
- ◆ From 2010-17, ranked second in the AL with 133 catcher caught stealing (Salvador Perez, 135) and fourth with a 29.3 caught-stealing pct.
- ◆ 2011 AL starting catcher in the All-Star Game and Silver Slugger Award™ winner.

**#3 • DANIEL DESCALSO • R/L** **5-10 • 190 • 30 (Oct. 19, 1986)**  
**WSH Series:** 3-12, 2B **Homestand:** 3-12, 2B

- ◆ Is batting .353 (18-for-51)/.438 OBP/.647 SLG with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 12 RBI, 8 walks and 8 runs scored in his last 19 games.
- ◆ Has gone 6-for-17 (.353) with RISP in his last 15 games.
- ◆ Had an extra-base hit in a career-high 5 straight games (4 2B, 1 HR) from May 5-10.
- ◆ Hit the go-ahead, 3-run homer in the 12th inning on May 8 @ Dodgers.
- ◆ Made his fourth career pitching appearance May 4 vs. Astros (0 ER in 0.2 IP)...hasn't allowed a baserunner in 3.0 career innings, the first position player in the live ball era (since 1920) to retire 9+ consecutive hitters [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Has made 20 starts at third base, 3 at second base and 2 in left field.
- ◆ Since 2010, ranks among active NL pinch hitters in plate appearances (1st, 252), times on base (1st, 75), home runs (T-3rd, 5) and hits (4th, 46).

**#1 • JARROD DYSON • L/L (juh-ROD)** **5-10 • 165 • 33 (Aug. 15, 1984)**  
**WSH Series:** 2-5 **Homestand:** 2-5

- ◆ 7 of his 15 hits are for extra-bases (3 2B, 2 3B, 2 HR).
- ◆ Homered twice in a 3-game span from April 24-26 after hitting 1 home run in his previous 62.
- ◆ Is 1 of 3 players in MLB with 20+ steals in every season since 2012 (also: Elvis Andrus and Jose Altuve).
- ◆ Ranks seventh among outfielders since 2012 with 68 defensive runs saved [min. 4,000 innings]...is fifth among center fielders in that time (48) [min. 3,000 innings].

**#44 • PAUL GOLDSCHMIDT • R/R** **6-3 • 225 • 30 (Sept. 10, 1987)**  
**WSH Series:** 1-11, 2 BB, R **Homestand:** 1-11, 2 BB, R

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS:** T-4th in BB (26).
- ◆ His RBI on May 9 @ Dodgers was his first since April 21 vs. Padres.
- ◆ Third in 2017 NL MVP voting...hit .297/.404 OBP/.563 SLG with 34 doubles, a career-high-tying 36 homers and 120 RBI in 155 games in 2017...won his third Rawlings Gold Glove Award® and third Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Award™...among NL leaders in runs (3rd, 117), RBI (4th), walks (4th, 94), extra-base hits (4th, 73), on-base pct. (5th), OPS (5th, .966), go-ahead RBI (T-5th, 29) and total bases (6th, 314).
- ◆ Has made 5 straight NL All-Star teams, the first D-back to do so, and the only NL position player to make each of the last 5 All-Star teams.

- ◆ Is hitting .250 (8-for-32) vs. left-handers.
- ◆ Has appeared in 21 games at third base and 2 at second.
- ◆ Is 1 of 5 players from Arizona State to play for the D-backs (Willie Bloomquist, Jake Elmore, Jake Barrett and Tuffy Gosewisch).
- ◆ Played in a career-high 71 games with the Red Sox in 2017, hitting .211 with 9 doubles, 4 home runs and 27 RBI.
- ◆ Ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Defensive Infielder in the Red Sox' organization from 2013-16 plus Defensive Player of the Year in 2014.

**#4 • KETEL MARTE • S/R (kuh-TELL)** **6-1 • 185 • 24 (Oct. 12, 1993)**  
**WSH Series:** 3-10, 3B, BB, HBP, R **Homestand:** 3-10, 3B, BB, HBP, R

- ◆ Has not committed an error in his 35 games in 2018 (149 TC; 30 G at 2B and 5 at SS).
- ◆ Is batting .267 (16-for-60) vs. left-handers.
- ◆ In 2017, hit .260/.345 OBP/.395 SLG with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 5 homers, 18 RBI, 29 walks in 73 games...Postseason (4 G): .412, 2 3B, 1 HR, 2 RBI...first player to triple from both sides of the plate (in the Wild Card Game vs. Rockies).
- ◆ Signed a 5-year contract with 2 club options with the D-backs on March 27.

- ◆ Has reached base via hit/walk in 6 of his last 8 games, hitting .261 (6-for-23) with 1 double, 2 runs scored and 3 walks.
- ◆ Had fifth career walk-off with a 15th-inning single on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ Since 2005, ranks sixth among active players with a 3.75 catchers ERA [min. 5,000 IC].
- ◆ In 2017, was fourth in the NL with a 3.51 catcher's ERA and a 34.5 caught stealing pct.

- ◆ Is 6-for-20 (.300) with runners on base.
- ◆ Played in 5 games for the D-backs in 2017...recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1.
- ◆ In 78 games between Triple-A Rochester and Reno last season, threw out 40.7 percent of attempted base stealers (24-for-59).

- ◆ Has made 21 appearances in right field, 6 at second base, 2 in left and 1 at third...is hitting .316 (6-for-19) at second base.
- ◆ Hit the 10th game-tying home run in franchise history with 2 outs in the ninth inning on April 2 vs. Dodgers (off Kenley Jansen).
- ◆ Since 2013, is tied for seventh in MLB with 83.3 stolen base pct. [min. 50 attempts].
- ◆ Set career-highs with 25 doubles, 12 home runs and 51 RBI in 2017.

- ◆ Has a 6-game hitting streak (.346; 9-for-26) with 2 home runs, 3 RBI and a .970 OPS.
- ◆ Is hitting .412 (14-for-34)/.475 OBP/.676 SLG with runners on base.
