WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last seven games and six of 11 as they continue a seven-game homestand tonight vs. American League Central division leader Cleveland.
- RHP James Shields, who owns a 2.89 ERA (9 ER/28.0 IP) over his last four home starts, take the mound for the White Sox.
- The Sox opened the homestand last night with a 4-0 loss to the Indians.
- Following this four-game series, the Sox conclude the homestand with three games vs. Detroit (6/15-17) before taking a brief three-game trip to Cleveland (6/18-20).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last trip to Minnesota (2-2) and Boston (2-1) from 6/5-10 and 2-1 vs. Milwaukee on their last homestand from 6/1-3.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- James Shields needs 6.1 IP for 2,500.0 in his career ... Shields has thrown at least 6.0 IP in nine straight starts, his longest streak since 9/9-15-5/25/16 when he went 13 in a row.
- The White Sox bullpen has thrown 19.2 consecutive scoreless IP dating back to the ninth inning on 6/5-2 at Minnesota and owns a 2.37 ERA (24 ER/91.0 IP) over the last 28 games.
- Sox starting pitchers own a 3.24 ERA (21 ER/58.1 IP) over the last 10 games (since 6/2).
- The Sox have not homered in their last six games.
- The White Sox are 8-19 at home vs. Cleveland since 5/19/15.
- José Abreu ranks second in the major leagues with 25 doubles, including 20 in his last 32 games.

AVI ON ASSIGNMENT

- OF Avisail García, who has been on the disabled list since 4/24 with a strained right hamstring, will begin a rehab assignment tonight at Class AAA Charlotte.
- García, a 2017 American League All-Star, is hitting .233 (17-73) with one home run and four RBI in 18 games this season.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Carlos Carrasco combined with three relievers on a two-hitter as Cleveland shut out the White Sox, 4-0, in the series opener.
- Lucas Giolito suffered the loss, allowing four runs on four hits and four walks over 5.0 IP.
- Xavier Cedeño, Luis Avilán, Bruce Rodón and Héctor Santiago (1.0 IP each) combined for 4.0 scoreless IP in relief, extending the bullpen's scoreless streak to 19.2 IP.
- Kevan Smith and Charlie Tilson collected the only hits for the White Sox, who were shut out for the seventh time this season and held to a season-low tying two hits.

PITO FIRST AT FIRST

- José Abreu leads all American League first basemen in fan balloting for the 2018 MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard ... Abreu has received 267,812 votes to lead Boston's Mitch Moreland (241,889) and Detroit's Miguel Cabrera (173,174).
- Abreu is the first White Sox player to lead at any point in the balloting process since Frank Thomas won the fan election at first base in 1996.
- He would be the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan-elected as a starter to the All-Star Team, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).
- The 2018 Camping World MLB All-Star Ballot, which is available exclusively online and via mobile devices at MLB.com, all 30 Club sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark mobile apps, will be accessible until the voting ends on 7/5 at 11:59 p.m. (ET).

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox are holding the opposition to a .157 (13-83) average with RISP over 11 games in June, including a .083 (3-36) mark over the last four games.

WHITE SOX VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS

- The Indians lead the season series, 4-0 ... the teams play seven games in 10 days from 6/11-20.
- The White Sox are batting .200/.261/.360 (25-125) with a 6.55 ERA (24 ER/33.0 IP) and have been outscored, 29-10.
- The Sox have lost 10 of their last 11 games against Cleveland, including five in a row at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The White Sox lead the all-time series, 1,080-1,064 ... they are 569-500 at home (112-112 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 511-564 on the road (96-107 at Progressive Field).

WHITE SOX-TRIBE TIDBITS

- Former White Sox owner Bill Veeck (1959-61, '76-80) owned the Cleveland Indians from 1946-49.
- Jim Thome, who will be inducted into Baseball's Hall of Fame in July, played for Cleveland (1991-2002, '11) and Chicago (2006-09) ... Thome currently serves as a special assistant to White Sox general manager Rick Hahn.
- Omar Vizquel, who manages Class A Winston-Salem, played with the Indians (1994-2004) and Sox (2010-11).
- Indians first base coach Sandy Alomar Jr. (2001-04, '06) and OF Melky Cabrera (2015-17) both played for the White Sox.
- Cleveland 2B Jason Kipnis is a 2005 graduate of Glenbrook North High School in Northbrook, Ill.

LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- The White Sox are 9-17 against the American League Central in 2018, going 1-7 at home and 8-10 on the road.
- The Sox are 300-394 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-35).

BULLPEN RELIEF

- The White Sox bullpen has thrown 19.2 consecutive scoreless IP dating back to the ninth inning on 6/5-2 at Minnesota and owns a 2.08 ERA (7 ER/34.1 IP) in June, the third-best mark in the major leagues.
- Joaquin Soria owns a 0.00 ERA (10.1 IP) over his last 10 appearances, converting all four save chances with three hits allowed, two walks and 12 strikeouts.
- Jace Fry has posted a 2.12 ERA (4 ER/17.0 IP) and .131 (8-61) opponents average in 17 appearances since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 5/4.

DOUBLE VISION

- José Abreu ranks second in the major leagues with 25 doubles, including 20 in his last 32 games (since 5/8) ... Abreu is on pace to hit 63 doubles this season, which would tie Detroit's Hank Greenberg (1934) and Pittsburgh's Paul Waner (1932) for the fourth-highest total in major-league history.
- Abreu, who hit a career-high 43 doubles in 2017, needed just 62 games this season to reach 25, which tied Bibb Falk (25 in 1926) for the fewest in Sox history to reach that milestone.

ON THE ROAD TO OMAHA

- White Sox draft choices INF Nick Madrigal (first round, Oregon State), LHP Konnor Pilkington (third round, Mississippi State) and RHP Davis Martin (14th round, Texas Tech) have helped their teams reach the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.
- Oregon State (49-10-1) will play North Carolina (43-18) in Game 1 on Saturday, 6/16 at 2 p.m. CT on ESPN.
- Mississippi State (37-27) will play Washington (35-24) in Game 2 on Saturday, 6/16 at 7 p.m. CT on ESPN.
- Texas Tech (44-18) will play Florida (47-19) in Game 4 on Sunday, 6/17 at 6 p.m. CT on ESPN2.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,341 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, two more than the second-place New York Mets (1,339) and 42 more than Oakland (1,299), the next-closest American League team.

STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 54 stolen bases this season and rank second with an 83.1 (54-65) success rate.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 137 bases, which would be 11 less than their combined total of 148 from 2016-17 ... they have not led the majors in steals since 1966 (153).

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox are tied for the American League lead and tied for third in the majors this season with 19 triples ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their highest total since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez leads the major leagues with seven triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 15th appearance (14th start), ninth start at Guaranteed Rate Field and first vs. Cleveland ... is looking to record his first win since Opening Day (3/29) at Kansas City.
His 12-start winless stretch is the longest of his career ... previous mark was 11 from 7/4-9/4/17 with the White Sox.
Has allowed six homers in his last two starts, compared to four in his first 12 appearances of the season.
Is 0-3 with a 4.19 ERA (16 ER/34.1 IP), 1.17 WHIP and .230 opponents average (29-126) in his last five starts (four quality) ... has worked 7.0-plus IP and allowed three runs or less in four of the outings.
Is tied for seventh in the American League with six no decisions.
Ranks 69th all-time in major-league history with 2,137 strikeouts, 12 behind Dennis Martinez (2,149) for 68th all-time (see chart at right).
Is 10-26 with a 5.71 ERA (199 ER/313.2 IP), 238 strikeouts, 68 home runs allowed and a 1.50 WHIP over 57 appearances (56 GS/24 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in games started (2nd, 364), IP (2nd, 2,369.0), pitches thrown (2nd, 37,275), quality starts (T4th, 223), shutouts (5th, 9), opponents GDP (5th, 194), complete games (T5th, 22), strikeouts (8th, 2,033) and wins (11th, 133).

LAST START

- Lost his third consecutive start on 6/7 at Minnesota after allowing seven runs on eight hits with two walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.
Surrendered a two-run home run to Eduardo Escobar in the first inning, a solo shot to Ehire Adrianza in the second and two-run homer to Eddie Rosario in the fourth.
Had his streak of 7.0-plus IP starts snapped at four ... worked at least 6.0 IP for the ninth consecutive outing ... his seven runs allowed matched a season high (also 4/20 vs. Houston).
Left the game with the White Sox trailing, 7-2 after throwing 99 pitches (66 strikes).

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

- Has been charged with a loss or no decision in his last 12 starts, with his only win this season coming on Opening Day (3/29) at Kansas City ... the 12-start winless stretch is the longest of his career.
The winless stretch is the second-longest active, and overall, in MLB behind Minnesota's Kyle Gibson (13) ... Miami's José Ureña went 0-7 in his first 12 outings this season before earning a win in his 13th start.
Is 0-6 with a 4.76 ERA (40 ER/75.2 IP), .233 opponents average and 2.02 run support average (17 RS) over his last 12 starts.

WARMING UP WITH THE WEATHER

- Is 0-4 with a 4.25 ERA (25 ER/53.0 IP), .208 opponents average and 1.06 WHIP over his eight starts (six QS) since 5/1 ... has worked 7.0-plus IP four times and allowed three runs or less in six outings.
Ranked among the MLB May leaders in opponents SLG (5th, .252), opponents average (6th, .173), hits per 9.0 IP (6th, 5.40), opponents OPS (6th, .500), WHIP (T10th, 0.93) and opponents OBP (11th, .248).

HELP WANTED

- Has received one run or less of support in his last five starts (zero three times) and three or less in each of his last 11 (1.40 RSA; 11 RS/70.2 IP) since 4/11... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
The 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support is his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13 consecutive starts; 1.90 RSA, 16 RS).
Received a 5.46 run support average (71 RS/117.0 IP) over his 21 starts last season, compared to a 3.22 mark (65 RS/181.2 IP) in 2016 ... his 4.60 career RSA is the ninth-lowest among active pitchers.
His 3.22 RSA in 2016 was the lowest in baseball and the lowest of his career.
Owns a 4.31 RSA (150 RS/313.0 IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (56 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (15x), one (9x), two (10x), three (7x), four (4x), five (3x) and six-plus (8x) ... has received one run or less of support in 42.9 percent (24-56) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 10 home runs this season, including six in his last two starts ... allowed three homers in each of his last two starts after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
Has allowed 77 homers since 2016 and 110 since 2015 ... his 110 homers allowed since 2015 are tied with Kansas City's Ian Kennedy for the most in MLB.
Allowed 27 home runs last season, his fewest since 2014 (23) ... surrendered a major-league leading 40 home runs in 2016 after leading baseball with 33 in 2015 ... became the first pitcher to lead MLB in homers allowed in consecutive seasons since Tom Browning in 1988-89.
Has allowed 1.70 homers per 9.0 IP since 2015 (583.1 IP), the third-highest mark in the major leagues.

FEELING INDECISIVE

- Is tied for seventh in the American League with six no decisions this season ... his 73 NDs since 2011 are tied with Texas' Cole Hamels for the most in the major leagues.
In his six no decisions this season, Chicago has scored a total of 10 runs, including two runs twice, one run once and zero runs four times ... the White Sox are 3-3 when Shields receives a ND.

OPENING DAY HONORS

- His season debut marked his eighth career Opening Day start following four with Tampa Bay (2008-10, '12), two with Kansas City (2013-14) and one with San Diego (2015).
Is 2-2 with a 4.98 ERA (26 ER/47.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts in the eight OD outings.
Is tied with the Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw for the fourth-most Opening Day starts among active pitchers ... joined Edinson Vólquez as the only active pitchers to start season openers for four different teams (STATS).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has made 20-plus starts in every MLB season, joining Cole Hamels and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers since 2006 to accomplish the feat ... recorded at least 10 victories, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts each season from 2007-15 ... was an AL All-Star with Tampa Bay in 2011.
Is 3-6 with a 5.46 ERA (36 ER/59.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts over 11 career postseason starts (four quality starts) ... pitched in the postseason with Tampa Bay (2008, 2010-11) and Kansas City (2014) ... made three World Series starts with the Rays (2008) and Royals (2014).
