METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the .500 mark for the third time this season...Have lost three-straight games at Citi Field and six of their last eight contests overall...The Mets went 10-18 during the month of May after going 17-9 through March/April... New York is 12-14 at Citi Field this season.

MAY: Four teams in the NL East were in first place at some point during the month of May (Mets, Phillies, Braves and Nationals)... According to Elias, since realignment in 1994, the only other season in which four NL East teams were in first place in one month in May or later was 2002, when four teams held the top spot in May (Mets, Expos, Marlins, Braves).

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets have scored 39 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 39 eighth-inning runs are tied for the second-most in the majors with the Dodgers...Atlanta leads the majors with 41 runs in the eighth-inning.

HOME RUNS: The Mets have homered in seven of their last eight games...New York has 12 homers during this stretch...The club has 18 homers in its last 14 games and 28 long balls in its last 22 contests.

NIMMO POWER: Brandon Nimmo has 10 extra-base hits and seven RBI in his last 10 games (five doubles, one triple, four homers)...Nimmo driven in a run in a career-best four straight games...He has a career-high six homers this season in 115 at-bats...Nimmo had six homers combined over his first two seasons (2016-2017) in 250 at-bats...Nimmo is tied for fourth in the majors with four triples.

NIMMO-METRICS: Brandon Nimmo is third in the majors in wRC+ with 179, behind Mookie Betts (212) and Mike Trout (198).. wRC+ stands for weighted runs created plus and quantifies a player's total offensive value...The formula credits the hitter with the value, measured by the impact on run scoring, of each outcome (single, double, etc.) and accounts for ballpark effects... It is scaled so the league average is 100 and every point above 100 is one percentage point better than the league average... Nimmo leads the NL and is tied for sixth in the majors with a 1.004 OPS (min. 140 plate appearances) and is fourth in the majors with a .431 on-base percentage.

AMED ROSARIO: Is batting .318 (14-44) with eight runs scored, three homers, one double, one triple and six RBI in his last 13 games.

TRIPLE CABBY: Asdrubal Cabrera leads the Mets in home runs (10), RBI (34) and batting average (.303)...He is one of four players leading his team in all three triple crown categories...Along with Brandon Belt of the Giants, Manny Machado of the Orioles and Eddie Rosario of the Twins...Courtesy of Elias.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Cabrera is 13th in the National League with a .303 batting average...He is sixth with 26 extra-base hits, tied for sixth with 15 doubles and tied for 12th in RBI (34)... Cabrera is tied for 12th in the NL with 10 home runs...Cabrera did not hit his 10th home run last year until August 27 (104 games).

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Batted .289 (22-76) with three home runs, seven RBI and a .341 OBP in 25 games in May.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 8-2 vs. the Cubs at Citi Field since the 2015 postseason.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



ZACK WHEELER: Has tossed 6.0 or more innings in six of his nine starts...Wheeler has 41 strikeouts in his last 33.0 innings (six starts).

METS STARTERS: Have not allowed a run in their last three starts (totaling 12.0 innings)...Over their last 13 games, New York starters are 4-1 with a 2.55 ERA (19 earned runs/67.0 innings)... Those starters have combined for six scoreless starts.

BULLPEN: New York's bullpen is 1-6 with a 7.83 ERA (29 earned runs/33.1 innings) in its last eight games.

JEURYS FAMILIA: Ranks fifth in the majors with 14 saves and has the third-most saves in the majors since 2015 (114).

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is hitting .313 (20-64) with four homers and eight RBI with a .405 OBP over his last 18 contests...He has at least one hit in eight of his last nine starts, going 10-30 (.333) with two homers during that span.

MESORACO MASHING: Devin Mesoraco has 10 RBI, scored 11 runs and has a .537 slugging percentage in 17 games since joining the Mets on May 8...Mesoraco became the ninth Met in franchise history to hit five home runs or more in his first 15 games with the team and the first since Neil Walker in 2016... Research courtesy of Elias.

TODD FRAZIER: Went 1-3 with a single and one RBI while playing 5.0 innings at third base last night in his first rehabilitation game for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League at Reno...Frazier has been on the Disabled List since May 8 with a left hamstring strain.

ANTHONY SWARZAK: Is scheduled to pitch tonight for Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast at Reno...He tossed 1.0 scoreless inning, allowed one hit, did not issue a walk and struck out two on May 29 in his first ML rehab game...Swarzak has been on the Disabled List since April 2, with a strained left oblique.

SIX YEARS AGO TODAY: Johan Santana threw the first no-hitter in team history beating St. Louis, 8-0, at Citi Field on June 1, 2012...Santana struck out David Freese for the final out...The Mets had gone 8,019 regular season games without a no-hitter.

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

LAST TIME OUT: Was dealt his third no-decision of the season in an 8-7 Mets setback on May 27 in Milwaukee...Wheeler threw 6.0 innings, surrendering four runs, earned, on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts...Has punched out six or more in each of his last four outings...Has issued two or fewer walks in five of his nine starts this season...Tossed a season-high 110 pitches, his most in a start since throwing 114 pitches on September 1, 2014 at Miami.

VS. CHICAGO: Wheeler will face the Cubs for the fourth time in his career and third time at Citi Field...Made his last appearance against Chicago on June 13 of last season, throwing 1.2 innings, giving up eight runs, earned, on six hits while walking three and tallying three strikeouts in the shortest outing of his career...Overall, in his previous three starts against the Cubs, he is 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (10 earned runs/15.0 innings) including a scoreless, 6.2-inning start at Wrigley Field...Has 20 strikeouts and nine walks in his career vs. the team.

AT CITI: Wheeler will make his 35th-career start at Citi Field and his fifth this season...Is 0-4 with a 7.36 ERA (18 earned runs/22.0 innings) at home this season...In 34 career home starts, Wheeler is 8-19 with a 5.19 ERA (107 earned runs/185.2 innings)...Has fanned 184 and walked 88 batters at home...Last season, he was 2-5 with a 5.88 ERA (32 earned runs/49.0 innings) in 10 home starts.

WHEELING & DEALING: Wheeler surpassed 400-career strikeouts in his last outing, the 75th start of his career...The righthander is one of five Mets pitchers to record at least one strikeout in each of his first 75-career games (also Matt Harvey, Dwight Gooden, Dillon Gee and Jacob deGrom)...He joins Harvey, Gooden, deGrom, Sid Fernandez and staffmate Noah Syndergaard as the only pitchers in franchise history to record 400 or more strikeouts in their first 75-career games.

CAREER-BEST STRIKEOUT PACE: Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.64 K/9 ratio (405 strikeouts/421.2 innings)...In his nine starts this season, he is striking out batters at a rate of 9.54 K/9 (53 strikeouts/50.0 IP)...Has fanned seven or more batters in five of his nine starts this season, including three of his last four outings...His 53 strikeouts are a career high for strikeouts produced in his first nine starts of a single season in his career.

RISP-ECT: Since his debut in 2013, Wheeler has held opposing batters to a .251 batting average (94-375) with runners in scoring position...This season, opponents are 16-46 (.348) with RISP...With runners in scoring position and two outs, opponents have hit .195 (33-169) against the righthander, including a .125 (2-16) mark this season...Has allowed five homers to 447 batters faced in RISP situations (1.1% HR rate with RISP) in his career...Only six of the 145 active pitchers with at least 400 batters faced with runners in scoring position since 2013 have allowed fewer homers in those scenarios (Lance McCullers Jr., Dellin Betances and Brad Ziegler have allowed three homers each and Vance Worley, Jared Hughes, James Paxton have surrendered four home runs each with RISP).

VS. NL CENTRAL: Wheeler owns a 4.12 career ERA (33 earned runs/72.1 innings) in 13 starts vs. the NL Central...Has held his opponent to two or fewer earned runs in eight of his 13 starts against the division (allowed one or no earned runs five times)...Has eight games with seven or more strikeouts against NL Central squads (one double-digit strikeout game, August 15, 2014 vs. the Cubs).

2017: In 2017, he made his second-career Opening Day roster after missing the entire 2015 and 2016 seasons...Went 3-7 with a 5.21 ERA (50 earned runs/86.1 innings) in 17 start...Placed on the 10-Day D.L. on July 24, retroactive to July 23, with a stress reaction in his right arm and did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (4-0, 1.52)

LAST START: Pitched 7.0 innings of one-run ball, yet was left without a decision after the Mets fell to the Braves, 4-3, on May 28 at SunTrust Park...Was his seventh no-decision of the season, tied for second-most in the majors...DeGrom lowered his ERA to 1.52 for the season (11 earned runs/65.1 innings), the lowest mark in the NL.

IN deCITI: DeGrom tomorrow makes his sixth home start of the season...In his five starts at Citi Field in 2018, he is 2-0 with a 1.45 ERA (five earned runs/31.0 innings)...That is the second-lowest home ERA in the NL, behind only Jake Arrieta's 0.84 ERA at Citizens Bank Park...Is 24-16 with a 2.26 ERA (93 earned runs/370.0 innings) in 58-career starts in Queens...His 2.26 ERA in his home ballpark is the best all-time among all pitchers with at least 120.0 innings pitched at Citi.
