TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 10, 2004: In a game at Colorado, Bernie Williams collects his 2,000th career hit off the Rockies' Jason Jennings.

June 10, 2002: Marcus Thames homers off Arizona's Randy Johnson on the first pitch he sees as a Major Leaguer in the third inning of the Yankees' 7-5 win at Yankee Stadium.

June 10, 1994: Pink Floyd performs the first of two consecutive nights at Yankee Stadium.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 11, 2010: In a 4-3 win over the Astros at Yankee Stadium, Andy Pettitte joins Whitey Ford and Red Ruffing as the only three pitchers to win 200 games in pinstripes. The 37-year-old left-hander also eclipses 3,000 career innings pitched in the game.

June 11, 2003: Roy Oswalt, Peter Munro, Kirk Saarloos, Brad Lidge, Octavio Dotel and Billy Wagner set a Major League record for the most pitchers to combine on a no-hitter as Houston blanks the Yankees, 8-0. It marks the first time the Yankees had been no-hit at home since 1952.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the finale of their three-game Subway Series at the Mets (2-0 so far)...are 7-1 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore (postponements on 5/31 and 6/3), a split doubleheader in Detroit on Monday (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15) and a two-game sweep in Toronto from Tues.-Wed...will begin a six-game homestand on Tues., starting with 2G vs. the Nationals (Tues.-Wed.) and 4G vs. the Rays (Thurs.-Sun)...the team will then make a one-day trip to Washington on 6/18 to resume their suspended game from 5/15 and play a makeup game for their 5/16 rainout before returning to the Bronx for 3G vs. the Mariners (6/19-21).

- ▶ **At 42-18 (.700), have the Majors' best winning percentage...** is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ **Trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21** (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 27-19, the Yankees are 33-9).
- ▶ **Are a season-high 24G over .500...** are 24G over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2012 season at 28G over .500 with a 95-67 record.
- ▶ **Marks the ninth time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 42 wins over their first 60 results...** each of the other eight Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42)...joins the 1998 team (46-14) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 60G start over the last 65 seasons (since 1954).
- ▶ **Over their last 15 completed series (since 4/19), are 13-1-1.**
- ▶ **Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5** (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 11-3 so far.
- ▶ **Are 15-9 vs. the AL East and 27-9 vs. all other divisions.**
- ▶ **Are a Major League-best 33-2 (.943) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season.**
- ▶ **Have the Majors' second-most wins (42) despite playing just 61 games (tied for fewest).**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Mets, 4-3, at Citi Field on Saturday...have won four straight and nine of their last 10...trailed 3-0 after the first inning, but held the Mets scoreless over the remainder of the game...**RHP Domingo Germán** (6.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 0BB, 9K, 2HR, 1WP, 1HP) tied his career high in strikeouts...went 0-for-1 with 1BB at the plate...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3, 1BB) drove in the Yankees' first run with a solo HR...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-4) tied the game with a two-run HR in the sixth...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4) hit a game-winning solo HR in the eighth.

GO AHEAD: The Yankees have a go-ahead HR in the seventh-inning-or-later in each of their last four games, their first time doing so in franchise history...are the first Major League team to accomplish the feat since Detroit from 9/13-16/14 (also four straight).

- ▶ The Yankees have hit a go-ahead HR in the *eighth-inning-or-later* in each of their last three games, their first time doing so since 8/29-31/77 (three straight - Chambliss, Rivers and Nettles)...two of the 3HR by the current team have been hit by **RF Aaron Judge**...Judge had just one go-ahead HR in the eighth-or-later over his first 239G.
- ▶ Have come-from-behind in eight of their last nine wins (since 5/29)...have 19 comeback wins this season, the second-most in the Majors (Boston-20).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.54), HR (103), HR per game (1.69), SLG (.467), OPS (.803) and walks (244)...rank second in runs (338), OBP (.335), XBHs (233) and total bases (981).

- ▶ Have homered in 49 of their 61 games, the most in the Majors...are on pace to hit 274HR...the MLB single-season HR record was set by the 1997 Mariners (264).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 17-5 in their last 22 completed road games and 20-9 (.690) away from home in 2018...are 29-15 in 44 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 7-2-2 in their first 11 road series this year and 11-3-2 in 16 road series since 8/22/17.

ROAD TESTED: Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.04 ERA (75.0IP, 17ER) on their current road trip.

- ▶ Have allowed a run in just two of their last 33.0IP (4ER).



HOPE WEEK 2018 (June 11-15): This year marks the 10th annual HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of

good will provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 30-12 (.714) during the event...have won 18 of their last 22 games during HOPE Week.

NATIONAL AFFAIR: RHP Luis Severino is 2-0 and has not allowed an earned run in 2G/1GS vs. the Mets (10.2IP, 5H, 2R/0ER, 4BB, 14K) in his career...earned the win on 8/17/17 at Citi Field (6.1IP, 4H, 1R/0ER, 3BB, 9K, 1WP)...recorded his first Major League hit with a bunt single in the fourth off Steven Matz and scored his first run.

- ▶ **Is 5-0 with a 0.79 ERA (45.2IP, 4ER) in 8G/6GS in Interleague play...** has at least 6.0IP and 8K in each of his six starts, tied for the third-longest such streak in Interleague history, trailing only Randy Johnson (12GS from 6/13/97-6/8/01) and Max Scherzer (6GS from 8/9/16-present).

- ▶ Has not allowed an earned run in three straight Interleague starts, tied for the second-longest such streak in Interleague history (Jaime García - 4GS from 6/8/14-5/11/16).
- ▶ Overall, is 7-0 with a 1.85 ERA (68.0IP, 14ER) in his last 10GS.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers did not allow a run in 3.0IP on Saturday at the Mets (1H, 2BB, 6K)...own a 15.1 scoreless inning streak since 6/4 (7H, 5BB, 20K, 1HP).

- ▶ Since 4/21, **Yankees relievers** have posted a 2.36 ERA (137.0IP, 36ER) with 174K, the second-lowest bullpen in the Majors over the span (Milwaukee-2.34).
- ▶ Over his last 7G, **RHP Dellin Betances** has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (1H, 5K, 1HP, 11K).

NATIONAL PASTIME: The Yankees are 3-1 in their first four completed Interleague games this season...are 0-1 in Interleague play since 7/25/17.

- ▶ Have won six straight games vs. the Mets, their second-longest winning streak against them (7G, 6/30/02-6/29/03)...are 14-4 in their last 18G vs. the Mets.
- ▶ Have won 8-of-9 Interleague road games since 5/5/17.

GET OUT THE BROOMS: Are 2-0 at New York-NL and will tonight look to complete their eighth series sweep this season (had 10 in 2017)...would be their third straight series sweep over the Mets (since 2017)...the Yankees are one of four teams yet to be swept this year (also Boston, Houston and Seattle).

THE GLEY-HEY KID: Since his debut on 4/22, **2B Gleyber Torres** leads Major League rookies 11HR and 29RBI and ranks third with a .303 (43-for-142) batting average.

- ▶ Has 11HR this season, tied for 10th-most in AL history through a player's first 41 career games...is tied with Shane Spencer (11) for third-most by a Yankee through 41 games (Gary Sánchez and Kevin Maas-14 each).
- ▶ Each of his 11HR have come in the ninth spot in the lineup, tied with Alfonso Soriano (11HR in 2001) for the most by a Yankee in the No. 9 slot (credit: YES Network).

MIGGY, MIGGY, MIGGY: INF Miguel Andújar hit a game-tying two-run HR in the sixth inning on Saturday...nine of his last 12H have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 3HR).

- ▶ Leads all MLB rookies w/ a .550 SLG and 31 XBH and ranks second w/ 20 multi-hit games, a .305BA and 59H.
- ▶ Is hitting .359 (28-for-78) with 13R, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR, 15RBI and 6BB in his last 21 games (since 5/12).

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton has 22HR in 54G at Citi Field, most by any visiting player...has 5HR in his last 7G here (since 5/6/17) and 10HR over his last 17G (since 4/11/16).

GARDY PARTY: LF Brett Gardner has hit safely in 14-of-15G with an AB (since 5/18)...is hitting .367 (29-for-79) with 12R, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 8RBI, 10BB and 4SB in his last 20G (since 5/11), the second-highest BA in the AL over the span.

YANKEES at NEW YORK - NL

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 2-0 vs. the Mets in 2018...the Yankees and Mets' season series features six games this season, with the first three-game series taking place this weekend at Citi Field (Fri.-Sun.)...the Mets will visit Yankee Stadium for a three-game set immediately after the All-Star break to open up the season's "second half"...the Yankees are 14-4 in 18 matchups since 5/14/14 on the heels of a six-game losing streak from 5/27/13-5/13/14, which was their longest ever to the Mets...are 31-17 against the Mets since 2009 and 68-46 all-time...IN 2017: Swept the season series vs. the Mets, 4-0...marked the third-ever season series sweep in the history of the rivalry, with the Mets going 4-0 against the Yankees in 2013 and the Yankees going 6-0 over the Mets in 2003...IN SEASON SERIES: Are 10-3-8 all-time in the season series between the clubs, with losses in 2013 (0-4), 2008 (2-4) and 2004 (2-4)...AT CITI FIELD: Are 2-0 at Citi Field this year...are 9-2 at Citi Field against the Mets since 2014, including three shutout victories...are 17-8 against the Mets at Citi Field since it opened in 2009, winning 7-of-10 season series (7-2-1)...won 6-of-11 season series at Shea Stadium...are 13-7-1 in 21 season series at the Mets, going 34-24 in 58G...the Yankees also played a three-game series against the Rays at Citi Field from 9/11-13/17 due to Hurricane Irma, going 2-1.

YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY

WINNING FORMULA: Tonight the Yankees play their six Interleague game of 2018 (are 3-1 so far, their 5/15 game was suspended)...have the second-most wins and the second-highest all-time winning percentage (229-157; .593) in Interleague history (Boston: 231-157, .595)...are 47-30 in their last 77 completed Interleague games since 5/14/14.

- ✦ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season (previous was 13: 13-7 in 2014, 13-5 in 2003, '11, '12, 13-3 in 1998)...went 8-12 in 2016.
- ✦ Have posted a winning Interleague record in 17-of-21 seasons (17-3-1 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span.
- ✦ Have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record in 18-of-21 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.
- ✦ All-time, are .500-or-better against all but two NL teams during the regular season (13-14 vs. the Phillies, 6-7 vs. the Dodgers).

THE SCHEDULE: The Yankees are scheduled to play 20 Interleague games in 2018, with the sixth coming tonight at Citi Field... are 3-1 in Interleague play so far...in addition to their annual Subway Series, which includes three games in Queens this weekend and three in the Bronx in July, the Yankees play the NL East this year...they played a home series vs. the Marlins in April (2G, 1-1) and will later host the Nationals (2G, 6/12-13), Braves (3G, 7/2-4) and Mets (3G, 7/20-22)...in addition to these three games at Citi Field, will play a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia (6/25-27) and a two-game set at Marlins Park in Miami (8/21-22)...began a then-two-game series at Washington on 5/15, but had the game suspended in the sixth...had the resumption of the game, along with their regularly-scheduled contest on 5/16 postponed...will play the resumption and the makeup at Nationals Park on 6/18.

UNFAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS: The Yankees went 7-3 in Interleague road games in 2017 (went 3-7 in 2016)...over the last 10 seasons (since 2008), have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record on the road eight times (4-6 in 2013, 3-7 in 2016)...are 103-89 (.536) in Interleague road games all time.

- ✦ Are 64-48 all time in NL East ballparks (does not include a 2-1 mark against the Rays at Citi Field in September 2017), 21-19 in NL Central parks and 18-22 in NL West parks.

ON THE HILL: Yankees pitchers struck out a Major League-best 203 batters in Interleague play in 2017...**Yankees starters** posted 3.43 ERA (120.2IP, 46ER) with 113K in 20 starts.

- ✦ **RHP Luis Severino** set a single-season franchise Interleague record with 37K and also tallied a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in four starts in 2017.

AT THE PLATE: In the history of Interleague play (since 1997), the Yankees rank first in walks (1,532) and stolen bases (290), second in OBP (.342), third in runs scored (1,911) and sixth in home runs (458)...have scored at least 9R in six of their last 24 completed Interleague games since the start of 2017...have averaged 5.45 runs per game over their last 55 Interleague games since 6/18/15 (300R/55G).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Yankees are 126-68 (.649) all-time in Interleague play at home, including 54-34 (.614) at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 25 of their last 38 Interleague home games (since 5/17/14)... went 72-34 (.679) against NL teams at the original Yankee Stadium.

PITCHERS AS HITTEES: **Yankees pitchers** are 3-for-their-last-78 in Interleague play since 5/20/14...the only three hits in that span: **Luis Severino** singled and later scored a run on 8/17/17 at New York-NL; **Michael Pineda** snapped a team 0-for-29 with a single on 5/5/17 at Chicago-NL; reliever **Branden Pinder** snapped a team 0-for-28 with an RBI double on 8/30/15 at Atlanta...Pinder's hit is the most recent extra-base hit and hit with an RBI by a Yankees pitcher...was the second Yankees relief pitcher in the DH era (since 1973) to record a hit (also Mike Stanton on 6/6/00 at Montreal)...have batted a combined .085 (37-for-434) with 9 doubles, 13RBI and 49 sacrifice hits in Interleague play.
