**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets have won two of their last three games...The Mets are 3-7 in their last 10 games and after starting the year 11-1, the club has gone 9-17...New York is 8-10 at home.

**VS. TORONTO:** The Mets are 12-0 all-time vs. the Blue Jays in New York...The Mets have swept all four previous series vs. Toronto in the Big Apple (1997, 1999, 2001 and 2015)...The 12-game home winning streak is the second-longest in franchise history vs. one club...The franchise record is 14 straight home wins over the Pirates from April 21, 1986-June 7, 1987.

**WIN STREAKS:** New York's 12-game home winning streak vs. the Blue Jays is the longest such streak in Interleague history according to the Elias Sports Bureau...The Giants had two separate 11-game home winning streaks vs. Texas and Oakland...According to Elias, the last major league team to win its first 12 home games against one team was the Baltimore Orioles, who won their first 14 home games vs. Seattle from 1977-1979.

**INTERLEAGUE:** New York is 1-0 in Interleague action this year after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...The Mets will travel to Toronto on July 3-4...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 186-177...The .512 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs.

**DAY BASEBALL:** New York has the sixth-lowest ERA (3.02) in the majors during day games this season...The Mets have a .340 on-base percentage in day games, the fifth-highest mark in the majors.

**HOME RUNS:** The Mets have nine home runs in their last six games.

**ASDRÚBAL CABRERA:** Is third in the National League and ninth in the majors with a .327 batting average...He is ninth in the NL with a .551 slugging percentage, is tied for seventh with 20 extra-base hits and tied for third in the NL with 13 doubles...Cabrera is hitting .333 (31-93) with nine doubles, three homers, 19 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 23 games.

**JUAN LAGARES:** Had a career high-tying four hits last night...It was his fourth career four-hit game and first since June 6, 2017 at Texas...He had a career high-tying three RBI last night...Lagares is batting .333 (9-27) vs. lefthanders this season.

**AMED ROSARIO:** Had career high-tying three hits and a career high-tying two RBI...Over his last nine games, Rosario is batting .379 (11-29) with three doubles and four RBI.

**DEVIN MESOARCO'S BIG NIGHT:** Reached base in all five of his plate appearances last night, going 2-2 with a home run, four runs scored and a career-high three walks...The last Mets catcher to reach base five times in a game was Kevin Plawecki, who did so on September 30 of last season at Philadelphia...Scored a career-high four runs, becoming the fourth catcher in club history to cross the plate at least four times in a game (also Ronny Paulino (June 29, 2011 at Detroit), Mike Piazza (April 5, 2002 at Atlanta) and Alex Trevino (August 14, 1979 at Atlanta).

**HONORING RUSTY STAUB:** Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



**ZACK WHEELER:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in four of his six starts this season...Wheeler has 31 strikeouts in 34.0 innings of work this year.

**JEURYS FAMILIA:** Is tied for fifth in the majors with 11 saves...Familia has 111 saves since 2015, the third-most in the majors during that span.

**SETH LUGO:** Has not allowed a run in a career-high 11.0 innings dating to May 1...Lugo has 13 strikeouts during that span.

**WELCOME BACK:** The Mets welcome back outfielder Curtis Granderson...Granderson hit 95 home runs, 106 doubles and drove in 247 runs in 573 games with the Mets from 2014 until he was traded to the Dodgers on August 19, 2017 for RHP Jacob Rhamé...He is tied for the franchise record with 21 leadoff homers...Granderson signed with the Blue Jays on January 23, 2018.

**IN THE MINORS:** Peter Alonso hit two home runs last night, including a walk-off in the bottom of the ninth to give Binghamton a 6-5 win over Erie...Alonso has three homers and six RBI in his last three games...Overall, he is tied for the Eastern League lead in home runs (11), is second in RBI (33), second in slugging (.695), and third in batting average (.367)...Alonso has three career multi-home run games as a professional and two have come against Erie (also: August 30, 2017).

**EQUIPMENT DRIVE:** The Mets are teaming up with the Baseball Tomorrow Fund for their annual Equipment Drive at Citi Field on Sunday, May 20 before the Mets take on the Arizona Diamondbacks at 1:10 p.m...Any individual that donates either three baseballs, three softballs, a glove, a helmet, set of catcher's equipment or bat will receive a voucher redeemable for two tickets to select Mets home games in 2018...Items most in need are: baseballs, softballs, bats, gloves, catcher's equipment and helmets.

**EDUCATION DAY:** The Mets in conjunction with the American Museum of Natural History will host over 6,000 New York City students today...American Museum of Natural History astrophysicist Jackie Faherty and chemical marine biologist Mandè Holford will be on hand to educate the youngsters.

### MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Wheeler today makes his seventh start of the season and first of his career vs. the Toronto Blue Jays...Was dealt his second no-decision of the season, May 9 at the Reds in a 2-1 extra-inning loss at Great American Ball Park...Pitched 6.0 innings, surrendering one run, earned, on four hits with seven strikeouts and three walks...Was his third quality start of the season and third start with at least seven strikeouts.

**WHEELING & DEALING:** Through his first six starts of the 2018 season, Wheeler owns an 8.2 K/9 ratio (31 strikeouts/34.0 innings)...Has fanned seven or more batters in three of his six starts this season, including two of his last three outings... Set a season-high with nine strikeouts, April 29 at San Diego...His 31 strikeouts are the second-most he has produced in his first six starts of a single season in his career (had 32 strikeouts in his first six starts of 2014).

**AT CITI:** Wheeler today will make his 33rd-career start at Citi Field and his third this season...In his last home outing, tied career-highs with eight runs and 10 hits allowed, May 4 vs. Colorado...In 32 career home starts, Wheeler is 8-17 with a 5.12 ERA (100 earned runs/175.2 innings)...Has fanned 168 and walked 85 batters at home...Last season, he was 2-5 with a 5.88 ERA (32 earned runs/49.0 innings) in 10 home starts.

**RISP-ECT:** Since his debut in 2013, Wheeler has held opposing batters to a .242 batting average (87-360) with runners in scoring position...This season, opponents are 9-31 (.290) with RISP...Has allowed four homers to 430 batters faced in those situations (0.9% HR rate with RISP) in his career...Only three pitchers with at least 400 batters faced with runners in scoring position since 2013 have allowed fewer homers in those scenarios (Lance McCullers Jr. has allowed two homers and Dellin Betances and Brad Ziegler three each)...With runners in scoring position and two outs, opponents have hit .195 (32-164) against the righthander, including a .091 (1-11) mark this season.

**BY INNING:** This season, Wheeler has a 12.00 ERA (eight earned runs/6.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA dips to 3.54 (11 earned runs/28.0 innings)...Wheeler has a career 5.38 ERA (43 earned runs/72.0 innings) in the first inning...From the second inning on, his career ERA is 3.70 (137 earned runs/333.2 innings).

**2017:** In 2017, he made his second-career Opening Day roster after missing the entire 2015 and 2016 seasons...Went 3-7 with a 5.21 ERA (50 earned runs/86.1 innings) in 17 start...Placed on the 10-Day D.L. on July 24, retroactive to July 23, with a stress reaction in his right arm and did not pitch the remainder of the season.

### WHEELER'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Selected by the San Francisco Giants with the sixth overall pick in the first round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets, along with cash considerations, in exchange for outfielder Carlos Beltran on July 28, 2011.
- » Made his Major League debut on June 18, 2013 at Atlanta...Became the third pitcher in team history to earn a victory while throwing 6.0 or more shutout innings in his major league debut.
- » Led the Mets in starts (32) and strikeouts (187) in the 2014 season.
- » Threw a three-hit shutout in the Mets' 1-0 victory over the Marlins on June 19 at Marlins Park...Became the youngest Mets pitcher (24yr, 20d) to throw a 1-0 shutout since Dwight Gooden threw two of them in 1985 at age 20 years and 240 days old.
- » Was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on April 21, 2015 through the end of the season while recovering from Tommy John surgery...Missed the 2015 and 2016 seasons.
- » Returned to game action in 2017 after missing the 2015 and 2016 seasons recovering from Tommy John surgery...Made his second career Opening Day Roster...Allowed one run or fewer in six of his 17 starts.
- » His 2017 season ended when he was placed on the 60-Day Disabled List on September 23 after two stints on the 10-Day Disabled List.

## FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (3-0, 1.83)

**LAST START:** Returned from the 10-Day Disabled List (hyperextended right elbow) in his last outing, May 13 at Philadelphia...Needed 45 pitches to complete the first inning, walking three batters and fanning two while inducing 20 foul balls...Was removed after 1.0 inning, the shortest outing of his career, for precautionary reasons after a one-hour rain delay coupled with the 45-pitch first inning.

**DON'T LET THEM SCORE EVEN ONE RUN:** DeGrom enters Friday's start riding a 19.1-inning scoreless streak that began on April 21...That is 1.0 inning shy of a career-long streak (pitched 20.0-consecutive scoreless innings from July 28-August 7, 2016)...His current streak is the second-longest in the majors (only Sean Newcomb, 20.0-straight scoreless innings, has a longer active streak).

- Played in his 300th career regular season game on May 8...He's the first player drafted in 2014 or later to reach the 300-game plateau...The only other draftees since 2014 to have played in at least 200 MLB games are Alex Bregman\*, Trea Turner, Kyle Schwarber, Andrew Benintendi\* and Dansby Swanson\*...Research courtesy of Elias (\* indicates a player drafted in 2015).
