HERE'S THE STORY

- The D-backs are 5-1 vs. Rockies this season, including a 3-game series sweep @ Coors Field from June 8-10... Arizona has won 12 of its last 15 regular season games vs. Colorado.
The D-backs have won 8 consecutive games @ Coors Field, tied for the longest win streak by the D-backs in an opponent's stadium in club history...
The D-backs are 24-15 (.615) since May 28, tied for the second-best record in the NL with the Cubs, behind only the Dodgers (.658; 25-13).
Arizona is 24-18 (.571) on the road, the best winning pct. in the NL this season.
Paul Goldschmidt has hit .381 (53-for-139)/.476 OBP/.748 SLG with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 23 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1.

SUNDAY'S RECAP

- The D-backs lost vs. Padres, 4-3, in 16 innings.
Paul Goldschmidt went 3-for-6 with a double and a walk, A.J. Pollock was 2-for-3 with 2 RBI and Jeff Mathis went 2-for-6 with a double and a RBI.
Zack Greinke did not factor into the decision, allowing 2 runs on 6 hits and 5 strikeouts in 4.1 innings... Arizona's bullpen combined to throw 11.2 innings, allowing just 2 runs.

MR. GOLDSCHMIDT AND MR. CORBIN GO TO WASHINGTON

- Major League Baseball announced on Sunday that 1B Paul Goldschmidt and LHP Patrick Corbin were named to the NL All-Star Team in the 89th Midsummer Classic on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, DC.
Goldschmidt is making his D-backs-record sixth All-Star appearance (2013-18), surpassing the 5 by Luis Gonzalez and Randy Johnson... he is the only NL player to make each of the last 6 All-Star teams, and 1 of 3 players in the Majors to do so (also: Mike Trout and Salvador Perez).
Corbin is making his second All-Star appearance (also: 2013) and is 1 of 4 D-backs left-handed pitchers to earn an All-Star selection, along with Randy Johnson (1999-2002, '04), Wade Miley (2012) and Robbie Ray (2017).
This is the D-backs' second straight year with multiple All-Stars (4 in 2017) and 12th time in club history.

IN CASE YOU MISSED THE MARATHON

- The D-backs played a 16.0-inning game vs. Padres on Sunday, tied for the longest game in team history @ Chase Field in terms of innings (3x, last: April 3, 2013 vs. Cardinals), as well as the second-longest game time (5:31) this season (5:46 on April 2 vs. Dodgers).
D-backs pitchers recorded 20 strikeouts, 1 shy of the club record (3x, last: April 22, 2004 @ Brewers).
Jeff Mathis made his third career pitching appearance (1 ER in 1.0 IP), and his first since July 25, 2012 vs. A's as a member of the Blue Jays... recorded his first career strikeout (Carlos Asuaje).

TAKING THE SHOW ON THE ROAD

- Arizona is 24-18 (.571) on the road, the best winning pct. in the NL this season ahead of Los Angeles (.561; 23-18), Colorado (.560; 28-22) and Milwaukee (.558; 24-19).

THE GOLD STANDARD

- Paul Goldschmidt has hit .381 (53-for-139)/.476 OBP/.748 SLG with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 23 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1, ranking among the NL leaders in average (1st), OBP (1st), SLG (1st), OPS (1st, 1.224), extra-base hits (1st, 24), runs (2nd), home runs (T-2nd) and walks (T-6th).
He is a lifetime .326 (72-for-221)/.418 OBP/.615 SLG hitter with 18 doubles, 2 triples, 14 home runs and 62 RBI in 55 games @ Coors Field.
He recorded his 20th home run of the season Saturday vs. Padres, his sixth career 20-homer season, matching Luis Gonzalez's team record.
Goldschmidt has 4 career seasons of 20+ home runs and 50+ RBI before the All-Star break (2013, '15, '17-18), making him 1 of 4 players to have 4 such seasons since 2013, joining Giancarlo Stanton (5), Nelson Cruz (5) and Edwin Encarnacion (4).

THESE GUYS IN THE PEN HAVE BEEN MIGHTY

- Arizona's bullpen leads the Majors with a 2.47 ERA, ahead of the Astros (2.66), Yankees (2.69) and Cubs (3.12)... the D-backs bullpen also ranks third in opponent average (.218), on-base pct. (.291) and slugging pct. (.338).
Archie Bradley has not yielded an earned run in 19 of his last 20 outings with a 0.48 ERA (1 ER in 18.2 IP)... leads the Majors with 23 holds.
Yoshihisa Hirano has allowed just 1 run in his last 29 games (0.36 ERA), posting a .198 opponent average in that time... is tied for third in the Majors with 20 holds.
Andrew Chafin has held opponents scoreless in 12 of his last 13 outings (0.79 ERA; 1 ER in 11.2 IP).
T.J. McFarland, who leads all NL relievers with 59.1 innings, has posted a 0.47 ERA (1 ER in 19.0 IP) over his last 11 games... his 59.1 innings are the most in team history by a reliever before the All-Star Break (previous: Byung-Hyun Kim, 58.1 in 2001).

THE BIG THINKER TAKING HOME HARDWARE

- Yesterday, Minor League Baseball announced Sócrates Brito was named the Triple-A Player of the Month for June.
Brito led all of MiLB in extra-base hits (20), OPS (1.392), slugging pct. (.902) and tied for first in runs scored (27) last month, led all Triple-A players in home runs (10) and total bases (74), while his average (.415) and on-base pct. (.490) were both ranked second in the Pacific Coast League.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP SHELBY MILLER (0-3, 9.00)

- Making his fourth start since returning from Tommy John Surgery on June 25.
Is 2-4 with a 5.94 ERA (33 ER in 50.0 IP) in 9 career starts vs. Rockies... last appeared vs. Colorado on Sept. 12, 2016 (ND, 4 ER in 5.0 IP).
Took the loss in his last outing on July 5 vs. Padres, allowing 3 earned runs on 5 hits with 7 strikeouts in 5.1 innings.
