FISH BITES

The Marlins continue a six-game homestand tonight with the second of three games against the New York Mets. LHP **Caleb Smith** is making his third start of the season, and first career appearance against the Mets. New York is countering with RHP Jacob deGrom, who in 12 previous starts against the Marlins has gone 4-4 with a 3.77 ERA (74.0/31); 1-4 with a 5.85 ERA (40.0/26) over his last seven. Following this series, Miami will enjoy an off-day Thursday and close out the homestand with a three-game series against the Pittsburgh Pirates. At the conclusion of the current homestand, the Marlins will hit the road for a two-game series against the Yankees (April 16-17), a four-game series in Milwaukee (April 19-22), and a three-game set at Dodger Stadium (April 23-25).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

Miami dropped a 4-2 decision to the visiting Mets, despite out-hitting them, 9-6. The Mets struck for two runs off **José Ureña** in the second inning, and added to their lead with a solo tally in the third. Down 3-0 in the fifth, **Derek Dietrich** stepped to the plate with one out and the bases loaded and stroked a single to left to score the Marlins only run of the inning. The following inning, **Brian Anderson** drove home **Starlin Castro** with a double to left to cut Miami's deficit to one. However, that would finish the scoring for Miami. Dietrich lifted his season average to .311 with a 3x4 night, and **Miguel Rojas** added two hits from the two spot in the order. **Ureña** was saddled with his second loss of the season, allowing three runs on five hits and a walk, while striking out four over 5.0 innings.

VS. METS

The Marlins went 12-7 vs. the Mets in 2017, including a 7-3 mark at Marlins Park. The 2017 season series win was the first since going 11-8 in 2013. Miami's production against New York last season was the best against a division opponent in several years. The 12 wins were the most since 2010 (13 vs. WSH; 12 vs. NYM), their 100 runs scored were the most since 2010 (102 vs. NYM), and their 193 hits were the most since 2007 (194 vs. WSH) - **Stats LLC**. Miami has won four of the last five against the Mets, including a three-game sweep at Marlins Park from September 18-20. The Marlins are 104-103 against the Mets in South Florida (30-28 at Marlins Park), yet trail the all-time series, 199-216.

CAPTAIN FOR A DAY

As part of Autism Awareness Month, the Marlins, in partnership with South Florida Ford, are hosting 18-year-old Steven Ramirez as Captain for a Day. This afternoon, Steven will meet with Marlins outfielder **Derek Dietrich** and take a tour of the Marlins clubhouse, ending with a stop at his own locker containing a custom jersey. Steven will then meet the team for stretch and watch batting practice with manager Don Mattingly, prior to getting a behind the scenes tour of Marlins Park. As Captain for a Day, Steven will also be delivering the Marlins lineup card prior to the game. Steven will return Sunday for Autism Awareness Day powered by South Florida Ford, and will throw out that day's first pitch. Activities for Sunday include: MVP Suite 41 will be designated as a Quiet Room, a sensory-controlled calming area, available to guests who require a space to avoid over-stimulation; Miami Children's Museum will be on-site conducting a free autism-friendly sensory activity for kids in Section 223; and Miami-Dade County Public Schools for Autism Support will also be in Section 223 distributing collateral and other information as part of the Autism Resource Fair.

LONG ROAD HOME

Starlin Castro has recorded at least one hit in each of his first seven home games this season, extending his hitting streak at Marlins Park to 15 games. His streak is currently tied for the second-longest hitting streak ever at Marlins Park, equaling those of Marcell Ozuna (2016), Dee Gordon ('15), and Jose Reyes ('12). A hit tonight would tie him with Christian Yelich as co-owner of the longest hitting streak at Marlins Park; Yelich went 16 consecutive games from August 11 to September 18, 2014. - **Stats LLC**

STILL STREAKING

Starlin Castro had an eight-game hitting streak to start the season snapped Sunday in Philadelphia. However, he did draw two walks. With his hit last night, Castro has reached base safely in all 10 games played this season, marking the seventh longest such streak to begin a Marlins career. **See chart at right**

SHOWING HE BELONGS

Marlins rookie third baseman **Brian Anderson** leads all Major League rookies in hits (11), doubles (4), walks (8), and RBI (9), and is tied for the lead in runs scored (8). He ranks second among National League rookies in average (.289) and on-base percentage (.426), and ranks third in slugging percentage (.474).

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER

Through the first 10 games of the season, Miami's bullpen has worked a Major League-high 54.2 innings, ahead of the Angels (51.1). Marlins relievers are tied with Milwaukee for the National League lead in strikeouts (53), and are tied for second in the Majors, behind the Yankees (63).

TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami will have the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. Over the first month plus, the Marlins are facing the Cubs, Boston, Philadelphia, the Mets, Pittsburgh, the Yankees, Milwaukee, the Dodgers, and Colorado in that stretch. However, from May through September, the Marlins have the third-easiest schedule, with opponents combining on a .485 record. - **Stats LLC**

YEAR OF THE FAN

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tonight, the third of 25 dates this season where a fan (or fans) will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game will be April 14 vs. the Pirates.

Caleb Smith is making his third start of the season in game two of this three-game set. Made first career Opening Day roster after going 0-2 with 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip/11 er) in six Spring outings (two starts). Acquired by Miami this offseason, along with INF Garrett Cooper on November 20, from Yankees.

According to Inside Edge, has the third highest swing and miss percentage on pitches in the strike zone at 32.1%. Kenta Maeda leads with 33.3%, just ahead of Shohei Ohtani (32.8).

Is making first career start and appearance against the Mets, and just his second career start against a National League East opponent.

Made first career start against Philadelphia in last outing, April 5 at Citizens Bank Park, allowing three runs and two hits with a career-high six walks and four strikeouts over 3.0 innings.

In first start of season, March 30 vs. Cubs, allowed just one run and four hits with three walks and eight strikeouts over 5.1 innings. Established single-game career highs in innings and strikeouts. Contest went 17 innings, tied for third-longest game by inning in Marlins history.

In fifth professional season, made combined 28 appearances between three levels in Yankees organization, going 9-2 with 3.24 ERA (119.1 ip/43 er). Opened season with one relief appearance for Double-A Trenton, on April 9, allowing one run and three walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings.

Promoted to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on April 13. Entered rotation for RailRiders and went 8-0 with a 2.07 ERA (87.0 ip/20 er) in 16 appearances (15 starts), including a 7.0-inning complete-game shutout on June 18 at Buffalo, allowing just one hit and two walks, with seven strikeouts.

Earned International League Midseason All-Star honors after leading International League starters in average against (.205), ranking second in ERA (2.20), and third in WHIP (1.02) in first half.

Took loss in Triple-A ASG in Tacoma on July 12, allowing four earned runs on five hits over 1.0 inning.

Won five consecutive starts from June 13-July 4, posting 0.91 ERA (29.2/3) and in turn earned first selection to Major League roster on July 16.

Made MLB debut with Yankees on July 17, taking loss in relief (3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

Made first MLB start in second outing, on July 23 at Seattle (ND, 3.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so).

Optioned to Scranton/WB on July 30 after three outings (two starts); would make six more relief appearances for Yankees over course of three more call-ups (August 13-14; Aug. 15-31; September 3-16).

Placed on 10-day disabled list on Sept. 16 for remainder of season with viral infection.
