LEADING OFF: Angels play the second game (1-0) of their second road trip of 2018 to Texas (April 9-11; 1-0) and Kansas City (April 12-15)...Halos have won five of six contests and eight of last 10 games...LAA is 8-3 thru 11 games to match best 11-game start in club annals (done three times previously in 1987, 1982 & 1979)...Best mark after 12 games is 9-3 in 1982 & 1979...PLEASE NOTE: Tomorrow night's game will air on KCOP to accommodate the NHL playoffs...Following the road trip, Angels return home to face Boston (April 17-19) and San Francisco (April 20-22).

KNOW THIS: Angels' offense leads the Majors with 68 runs scored, 110 hits, 41 extra base hits, 18 HR and 189 total bases...Andreton Simmons leads A.L. with 10 runs and 17 hits.

FUN FACTS: Sunday's home attendance of 44,742 marked the largest day game total (regular season) since the renovation in 1998...With two RBI last night, Albert Pujols (1,924 RBI) passed Jimmie Foxx (1,922 RBI) for sole possession of 9th in MLB career RBI (baseball-reference.com).

PITCHING IN: With Jaime Barria (bar-EE-uh) getting the nod for his Major League debut tomorrow, it will mark the seventh different starting pitcher in the first 13 games of the season to tie the Club's franchise record in 2001...The last A.L. team to use 7+ starting pitchers thru first 13 G was the 2014 Rangers.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday Shohei Ohtani was named the American League Player of the Week...He is the first Angels player to win the award since Matt Shoemaker claimed weekly honors for the period ending July 17, 2016.

SHOHEI'S DAY: On Sunday Shohei Ohtani (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 12 SO, 91 pitches/59 strikes) retired the first 19 batters faced...Third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (Steve Woodard, MIL in 1997 and Juan Marichal, SF in 1960)...Third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (Ken Brett in 1973 and Babe Ruth in 1916)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since Jim Shaw for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).

SHOKKKKKKKKK OHTANI: 18 total strikeouts this year tie Angels record in first two career pitching appearances (also, Tim Lincecum)...12 strikeouts Sunday tied the American League record for a player in one of their first two games as a pitcher (Fortugno in 1992 and Elmer Myers (Philadelphia A's) in 1915...Third Angels rookie with 12+ strikeouts in a game (Fortugno in 1992 and Jorge Rubio (15 SO) in 1966)...Ohtani logged 25 swinging strikes among the 91 pitches he threw on Sunday -- the most by any pitcher in a game this season. Sixteen of those came on his splitter (MATT OLSON – STATCAST).

FROM MLB.com: Ohtani retired the final eight A's batters he faced in his Major League pitching debut on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum. Combined with 19 straight Oakland batters he retired on Sunday before giving up a single to Semien, Ohtani retired 27 A's in succession spanning the two starts.

FISH FACTS: On Sunday Mike Trout scored his 700th career run; fifth Angel all-time to do so...Only eight players have hit 200 home runs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season all-time: Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.

BACK TO COMING BACK: Four of eight wins on season have been in comeback fashion (Halos led MLB with 47 comeback wins in 2017)...LAA erased a 6-0 deficit to win 13-9 Friday - second straight April Angels overcame 6-run deficit to win (also April 9, 2017 vs. Seattle).

THIS N' THAT: Halo relievers rank second in A.L. with a 2.63 ERA (51.1 IP – 15 ER) and lead the circuit with a .197 BAA...LAA has committed just two errors thru 11 games...Halos hurlers have issued 51 free passes to lead the A.L. (2nd in MLB, Atlanta 53).

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Ohtani has set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, Chris Davis, Tom Murphy and Matt Kemp).

PLAYER POINTS: In March/April-May across last two seasons, Zack Cozart is batting .329 (71/216)...Shohei Ohtani is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games with an AB and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (Bobby Bonds in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since Babe Ruth (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - STATS LLC)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since Babe Ruth on June 13-14, 1921...Ohtani became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC)...Prior to Ohtani, the last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both Bullet Joe Bush (Red Sox) and Clarence Mitchell (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders (STATS LLC).

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .539 (1,578-1,349) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history...Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter).

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 19 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HR joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez.

2,000 RBI: Pujols enters today with 1,924 RBI (9th all-time)...Only three players have ever reached 2,000 in an MLB career: Hank Aaron (2,297), Babe Ruth (2,214) and Alex Rodriguez (2,086) – BASEBALL REFERENCE.

@ TEXAS: Halos lead 2018 series 1-0...First of three stops in Arlington in 2018 (also Aug. 16-19 & Sept. 3-5)...Texas won the 2017 season series 11-8 (LAA was 4-5 on road) and also won the 2016 season series 10-9...Halos are 8-11 in last 19 G in Arlington.

ROYALS ON DECK: Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1 and have won seven of last eight games vs. Halos...LAA is 7-13 in last 20 matchups spanning back to 2015...Halos were swept in a three-game series in last visit to KC (April 14-16, 2017)...Angels are 2-7 in last nine meetings at Kauffman Stadium...LAA leads all-time series 290-286...Pujols is a career .310 (110/355) hitter with 23 HR and 77 RBI in 92 career games vs. Kansas City.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

 (1968) Angels played the shortest nine-inning road game in team history in a 1-0 loss at NYY (1:43).

April 11
 (1990) Mark Langston and Mike Witt combined to pitch a no-hitter vs. Seattle; (1961) Angels collect their first ever victory in their inaugural game, a 7-2 decision at Baltimore...Ted Kluszewski and Bob Cerv hit back-to-back home runs in the first inning – the first ever home runs for the Angels.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP TYLER SKAGGS

1-0, 1.64 ERA

Seeking first win vs. Rangers since July 13, 2014

- Making third start of the season and second on the road...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Wednesday vs. Cleveland after tossing 4.2 innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with two walks and five strikeouts.
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **EARLY SUCCESS:** In 12 career regular season starts during March/April, is 4-1 with a 3.35 ERA (75.1 IP – 28 ER) and 61 strikeouts...The 3.35 ERA is his best ERA for any month.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has not allowed a home run the first time through the batting order in a game (162 PA), but has yielded 12 HR in 159 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. TEXAS:** In eight career games against the Rangers, is 2-2 with a 6.57 ERA (37 IP – 27 ER)...In his four starts vs. Texas last season, was 0-1 with a 7.79 ERA (17.1 IP – 15 ER)... Is seeking first win vs. Rangers since July 13, 2014...His two wins vs. Texas are tied for his second most against any opponent (most is three wins vs. Houston).
- **AT GLOBE LIFE PARK:** In three career starts at Globe Life Park, is 1-0 with a 9.00 ERA (12 IP – 12 ER)...Made two starts in Arlington last season, going 0-0 with a 7.71 ERA (7 IP – 6 ER)...Suffered right oblique muscle strain on April 28, 2017 at Globe Life Park and was on disabled list until Aug. 5, 2017 following the injury.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** In four Cactus League appearances, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (11 IP – 11 ER) and 13 strikeouts...Also appeared in intrasquad and minor league games for Angels this Spring.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

CAREER NOTES:

- Owns a 14-21 career record with a 4.49 ERA (326.2 IP – 163 ER) and 279 strikeouts in 59 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.

Will be making Major League debut tomorrow night...Made one start this season for Triple-A Salt Lake on Saturday vs. Albuquerque and allowed one earned run on two hits with two walks and two strikeouts in two innings pitched (exited after a rain delay)...Appeared in five games (one start) for Angels this Spring and went 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 IP – 5 ER) and 12 strikeouts...Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in Angels organization... Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.

AGE: 28

- Earned first win of season last night after retiring both of his two batters faced and stranding the bases loaded.
- Has opened the year with five shutout frames across his six outings.
- Is in sixth Major League season and fifth with the Angels...Made Opening Day roster for fourth straight year.
- During Spring Training, appeared in 10 games and boasted a 2.38 ERA (11.1 IP – 3 ER)...Recorded 12 strikeouts and did not allow a home run.
