The Mariners and Astros meet for the 10th (3-6) of 19 games this season...they will play 2 more head-to-head series: Aug. 20-22 in Seattle and Sept. 17-19 in Houston...since 2013, the Mariners are 32-15 (.681) when scoring at least 4 runs vs. Houston.

**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip with the first of 4 games at Houston...began the trip by going 1-2 at Texas...will also travel to Oakland (3 G)...went 2-5 on a recently-concluded 2-team, 7-day, 7-game homestand vs. Houston (1-2) and Toronto (1-3)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners are 10-19 (7/4-current) since winning a season-high 8 straight games (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have won 25 of their last 51 games, 32 of their last 60, 36 of their last 66, 41 of their last 72 and 43 of their last 76...Seattle is 51-39 in its last 90 games, 56-42 over its last 98 games and 61-46 in its last 107 games...Seattle is 21-19 during the day and 44-31 at night...Seattle is 36-24 at Safeco Field, 29-26 on the road.

- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .354 (34x96) with 22 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 walk and 2 HBP when leading off a game this season...his 34 hits to lead off a game are the most in the Majors.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 42-17 (.712) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 28-14 (.667) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 46-15 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 19-35 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (57-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (55-0).
- **Bullpen Bullies - Edwin Díaz** has not allowed an earned run over his last 16.0 innings spanning 15 appearances (6/25-c), while Alex Colomé has an active 15.1 scoreless innings streak over 15 games (6/30-c).

**HOUSTON, YOU HAVE A PROBLEM**...in 3 starts vs. Houston this season, James Paxton is 3-0 with a 0.87 ERA (2 ER, 20.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts and 4 walks...he has held the Astros to 1 run or fewer in each of his 3 starts, while working at least 6.0 innings in each outing, including 2 starts of 7.0+ innings...among pitchers with at least 20.0 innings pitched vs. any single opponent this season, Paxton's 0.87 ERA vs. the Astros is the 2nd-lowest, trailing only Justin Verlander's 0.82 ERA (2 ER, 22.0 IP) against the Los Angeles Angels...dating back to the start of 2016, Paxton is 6-3 with a 2.59 ERA (17 ER, 59.0 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 13 walks in 10 starts against Houston.

**MARQUEE MATCH-UP**...tonight's starting pitcher match-up features two of the top starters in the American League: James Paxton and Houston's Justin Verlander...Paxton and Verlander each rank among the top-15 AL leaders in ERA, strikeouts, opponents average against, WHIP, walks-per-9.0-innings, strikeouts-per-9.0-innings, strikeout-to-walk ratio and quality starts...among AL leaders, Paxton ranks 5th in strikeouts, 5th in K/9.0 IP, 5th in K/BB, 7th in WHIP, 10th in opponents average against, T10th in quality starts, 13th in ERA and 14th in BB/9.0 IP...among AL leaders, Verlander is T1st in quality starts, 2nd in ERA, 2nd in WHIP, 2nd in K/BB, 3rd in strikeouts, 3rd in K/9.0 IP, 3rd in BB/9.0 IP and 4th in opponents average against.

**PITCHING IN**...Mariners starting pitchers lead the Major Leagues in fewest walks-per-9.0-innings, averaging just 2.19 BB/9.0 IP (162 BB, 665.0 IP)...they rank ahead of Cleveland (2.20/174 BB, 710.0 IP), Los Angeles-NL (2.29/157 BB, 618.1 IP) and Oakland (2.52/175 BB, 624.0 IP)...among all starting rotations, the Mariners 162 walks are 2nd-fewest (Los Angeles-NL, 157), while their 665.0 innings pitched are 3rd-most, trailing only the Indians (710.1 IP) and Astros (708.9 IP)...Seattle starters have also combined for the 4th-best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the Majors with a mark of 3.54 (574 K, 162 BB)...they trail only Cleveland (4.25/740 K, 174 BB), Los Angeles-NL (4.12/647 K, 157 BB) and Houston (3.75/821 K, 219 BB).

**BOOMSTICK, BABY!**...since July 27, Nelson Cruz has hit safely in 10 of 12 games, including 5 multi-hit games...he has also homered in 6 of his last 13 games, highlighted by multi-homer games on July 28 at Los Angeles-AL and May 2 vs. Toronto...in his last 13 games, Cruz is batting .294 (15x51) with 9 runs, 1 double, 8 home runs, 15 RBI, 1 HBP, 3 walks, a .345 on-base percentage and a .784 slugging percentage (1.130 OPS)...over that span, he leads the Major Leagues in home runs, while ranking T2nd in RBI (also: Joey Gallo-TEX), 6th in slugging and 11th in OPS.

**THE MARK OF ZUNINO**...over his last 11 games, dating back to July 27, Mike Zunino is batting .351 (13x37) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs and 7 RBI...he recorded his 7th career multi-home run game yesterday at Texas; his 7 multi-homer games are tied with Jim Presley for 13th-most in club history...among all catchers (primary position), Zunino ranks 3rd in the Majors with 16 home runs this season, trailing Yasmani Grandal-LAD (20) and Salvador Pérez-KC (19).

**SOLVING VERLANDER**...several active Mariners have had success against Astros starter Justin Verlander, including 3 players who are batting at least .300 in their career vs. the right-hander: Denard Span (.386/17x44), 2 2B, 3B, BB), Chris Herrmann (.333/2x6, 2B, RBI, 2 BB) and Kyle Seager (.320/8x25, 3 2B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, 2 BB)...Seager and Nelson Cruz have each hit 3 home runs off Verlander, tied with 6 others for 7th-most among active players.

**HISTORICALLY GOOD**...Edwin Díaz is 42-for-45 (93.3%) in save opportunities with a 1.96 ERA (12 ER, 55.0 IP) with 91 strikeouts and 15 walks in 55 appearances this season...Díaz is currently only the 5th pitcher in American League history (done 6x) to record at least 40 saves and 90 strikeouts with an ERA under 2.00...he joins Bryan Harvey-CAL (1991), Dennis Eckersley-OAK (1992), Francisco Rodriguez-LAA (2006), Greg Holland-KC (2x, 2013 and 2014).

**STREAKING**...Alex Colomé has an active 15.1 scoreless innings streak, dating back to June 30...during this span, he is 1-0 with 10 holds with 18 strikeouts and 5 walks in 15 games...his 15.1 scoreless innings streak is tied for the 5th-longest active streak in the Majors, while ranking 2nd among Mariners pitchers this season...his active scoreless inning streak is the 3rd-longest in his career, trailing only a 21.2 innings streak (16 G, 8/4-9/5/15) and a 21.0 innings streak (19 G, 5/4-6/15/16).

**AS YOU KNOW**...James Paxton is 6-3 with a 2.59 ERA (17 ER, 59.0 IP) in 10 starts against Houston since the start of 2016...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Paxton's 2.59 ERA is the lowest of any pitcher vs. the Astros over that span?...he ranks ahead of Ricky Nolasco (2.81/10 ER, 32.0 IP), Sean Manaea (2.82/19 ER, 60.2 IP) and Cole Hamels (3.18/20 ER, 56.2).

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 23rd start of 2018, his 97th career MLB start & 12th career start against the Astros tonight.
• Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
• Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
• Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
• Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
• Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
• Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
• Pitched 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
• Is 4-2 with a 2.59 ERA (21 ER, 73.0 IP) in 12 career GS in August.

LAST OUTING...

tossed 7.0 innings and allowed 3 runs with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts in his 2nd start since returning from the 10-day DL on 7/30...has pitched at least 7.0 innings in 5 of his last 6 starts with 4 quality starts during that span.

JUST A MINUTE...

is 3-1 with a 2.65 ERA (10 ER, 34.0 IP) with 8 walks and 33 strikeouts in 6 career starts at Minute Maid Park...his 2.65 ERA ranks 7th in the Majors among active players with 6+ starts at Minute Maid Park, trailing Sean Manaea (1.91), Yu Darvish (2.16), Adam Wainwright (2.20), Mike Leake (2.27), Gerrit Cole (2.52) and Zack Greinke (2.61).

LEADERBOARD...

ranks 6th in the Majors with an 11.48 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ratio (170 K, 133.1 IP)...his 7 games with 10+ strikeouts are T4th-most in the Majors, tied with Justin Verlander-HOU and trailing only Max Scherzer-WAS (12), Chris Sale-BOS (10) and Trevor Bauer-CLE (10)...Paxton ranks 5th in the AL (8th in the Majors) with 170 strikeouts, trailing Sale (207), Bauer (206), Verlander (204) and Gerrit Cole-HOU (202).

THE RIGHT STUFF...

has held right-handed hitters to a .200 batting average (80x401), while lefties have batted .304 (28x100) against Paxton this season...righties hold an OPS of only .598 against him this year, while lefties have posted a mark of .827...for his career, Paxton has limited righties to a .632 OPS, while lefties have recorded a .728 OPS against him.

HE'S BACK...

activated from the 10-day disabled list on July 30...originally placed on the DL on July 13 with lower back inflammation...has made 2 starts since his return, posting a 1.93 ERA (3 ER, 14 IP) with 16 strikeouts and 1 walk during that span.

NO-NO...

pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
• Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.
• Marks 4th Mariners no-hitter since 2012, tied with SF for most during that span.
• Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK

recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 on 8/8/97 vs. CWS...became the first pitcher in Mariners history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

WHIFF...

recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernández (1) and Paxton (1).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)... recorded a career-high 12 wins and 136.0 IP (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...spent 2 stints on the 10-day DL (5/3-30/17, 8/11-9/15/17)...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July; named AL Pitcher of the Month...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season.

CAREER...

is 39-25 with a 3.34 ERA (206 ER, 555.1 IP) with 579 strikeouts in 96 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP MIKE LEAKE (8-7, 4.16 ERA)

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season tomorrow vs. Houston...has thrown 7.0+ innings in 7 of his 23 starts this season, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings...recorded his 14th quality start of the season in his last start, and has now recorded a quality start in 4 straight games dating back to July 15th...went 4-0 with a 2.63 ERA (14 ER, 48.0 IP), 28 strikeouts and 5 walks over 7 games May 10-June 12...2017: Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...CAREER: In 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c), is 91-84 with a 4.00 ERA (705 ER, 1587.1 IP) with 1,071 strikeouts and 371 walks in 261 career games (256 starts)...is 1 of 4 pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17 (also: Ian Kennedy, Jon Lester and Max Scherzer)...originally signed by Cincinnati with the 8th overall pick of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University...vs. HOU: Has appeared in 14 games (12 starts) against Houston in his career...is 6-5 with a 3.67 ERA with 57 strikeouts in 12 games as a starter against Houston...recorded a quality start while tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 3 runs in his last start against Houston this year on July 31.
