2015 SUMMARY

- Led the Majors in pinch hitting, at .367 (11x30), and was tied for second in RBI (11). Was also fifth in slugging (.567), tied for sixth in hits, and tied for seventh in extra-base hits (4).
- Had five outfield assists and finished season with 126 for career, second most among active players entering 2016 campaign, trailing only Carlos Beltran (139).
- Made Opening Day roster with Philadelphia; first time since 2013 with Kansas City.
- Homered on April 8 vs. Boston, first in MLB since June 16, 2013 at Tampa Bay with Royals.
- Made 71 starts: 59 in right field, 10 in left field, and two as designated hitter.
- Hit second career grand slam on June 6 vs. San Francisco, off of Madison Bumgarner.
- Made first career pitching appearance on June 16 at Baltimore; allowed one hit, two runs, three walks, a home run, hit one batter, and struck out one in 2.0 innings.
- Hit third career walk-off home run on July 19 vs. Miami, off of A.J. Ramos.
- Walk-off job came just two nights after hitting first career pinch-hit home run, also against Miami (Mike Dunn).
- Hit 150th career home run on August 5 vs. the Dodgers.

CAREER MAJOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS

- Reported to spring training in 2014 with Cleveland as non-roster invitee before signing with San Diego on March 26.
- Began season with Triple-A El Paso in Padres' system.
- Had contract selected on July 23 and appeared in 10 games, with six starts in right field, before being designated on August 11 and outrighted to El Paso on Aug. 13.
- Appeared in 81 games between Kansas City (59) and San Francisco (22) in 2013.
- Was on Royals' Opening Day roster; had a hit in 12 of first 15 appearances (.276/16x58), with three doubles, a home run, and five RBI.
- Was designated for assignment June 30 and signed by Giants on July 9.
- Had contract selected from Triple-A Fresno on July 13; made 15 starts with San Francisco before being released on August 21.
- Led Majors and tied a career high in 2012 with 19 outfield assists, his eighth straight season with at least 10 assists.
- Made 144 starts in right field, and two in center.
- Ranked second in MLB and set career high in 2011 with 47 doubles; was just one behind Miguel Cabrera for MLB lead.
- Was one of just two MLB players with at least 40 doubles, 20 home runs, and 20 steals, joining Jacoby Ellsbury.
- Tied for second in MLB with 16 outfield assists.
- Homered for 1,000th career hit on September 1 at Detroit, off of Jacob Turner.
- Tied Shane Victorino for National League lead in outfield assists (11) in 2010 with the Mets.
- Was traded to Texas on August 31 and hit 100th career home run on September 24 at Oakland, off of Bobby Cramer.
- Appeared in nine postseason games for Rangers during run to World Series.
- Hit .125 (3x24) during playoffs, going 1x8 in two games during ALDS vs. Tampa Bay, 2x10 in four games during ALCS vs. the Yankees, and 0x6 in three games during World Series vs. San Francisco.
- Opened 2009 season with Atlanta and homered on Opening Day, April 5 at Philadelphia.
- Had career-high two triples on April 12 vs. Washington, and went 3x4 with career-high three doubles on July 9 at Colorado, his last game with Atlanta.
- Traded to Mets on July 10 and batted .329 (68x207) from August 5 to end of season.
- Combined between both clubs, hit .344 (56x163) vs. left-handers.
- Following the season, underwent surgery to repair torn ligament in right thumb on November 2.
- Had sixth career two-homer game on April 12, 2008 at Washington, setting career high with seven RBI.
- On May 20 at the Mets, had streak of 370 consecutive games started snapped in second game of doubleheader; streak dated back to October 1, 2005, and was longest active streak in MLB when it ended.
- Hit second career walk-off home run on May 24 vs. Arizona, off of Chad Qualls.
- Had first career pinch hit on September 6 vs. Washington.
- Won first career Rawlings® Gold Glove after setting new career high and tying for MLB lead with 19 outfield assists in 2007.
- Also had an 89-game errorless streak from June 5-September 14.
- Was one of only five National League players to play 162 games.
- Led Atlanta with 53 multi-hit games.
- Played for Team USA during inaugural World Baseball Classic prior to 2006 season.
- Became just fourth player (seventh time) in Atlanta history to start all 162 games.

- Tied for second in MLB with 53 two-out RBI, trailing only Ryan Howard (55).
- Hit first career grand slam and walk-off home run on May 13 vs. Washington, off of Chad Cordero.
- Led MLB rookies (min. 250 AB) in **2005** with a .300 average (.77x257); among NL rookies, ranked second in home runs, fourth in doubles, and seventh in RBI.
- Also finished with 13 outfield assists, ranking second in NL.
- Had contract selected from Double-A Mississippi on July 7 and made MLB debut that night in Game 2 of doubleheader vs. the Cubs.
- Homered for first MLB hit in final at-bat of his debut (1x4), off of Glendon Rusch.

CAREER MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS

- Opened **2014** season with Triple-A El Paso in San Diego system, homering in first game on April 3 at Reno.
- Homered in three straight games from June 5-7 and batted .330 (34x103) vs. left-handers for season
- Pitched in eight games for El Paso, posting a 3.68 ERA (7.1 ip/3 er), with four walks and five strikeouts.
- Named to Midseason and Postseason All-Star teams in Carolina League in **2004**.
- Was a South Atlantic League All-Star in **2003**.
